


Tynan is an unassuming young man who is very modest about his achievements. He credits his teachers with his outstanding success.

#### Mango Lament

The mangoes on the tree by the road are forming. It will be a light crop this year.

For the information of the high schoolers who go up the tree and pinch a few and who grabbed a long grey plastic pipe from well inside the block to knock











them down, don't bother to go after them just yet. It will be March before they are anywhere near ready.

Take them early and they will be green as grass, hard as bullets and taste like turpentine.

The tree is infected with anthrachnose, a plant disease, which affects to all mango trees sooner or later. The disease is spread by insects and people climbing all over the tree. If you have to pinch the mangoes during March, please use the pipe to get them down. It is still there under the Camellia where it was hidden last season.

Please don't climb the tree. It will last a bit longer and a few more crops will come off it if the disease is contained. It is also safer. You can see a crack developing on the eastern side, which means the trunk is starting to go on the inside.

If you get a mango that is still hard when it is taken, don't throw it down the road. That is wicked waste. I mean wicked in wrinkly-old speak, not teen ergot. Take it home. Put it in a plastic bag with some yellow bananas and the natural ethylene gas off the bananas will ripen it up.

If you find a plastic bottle with rank looking stuff in it, which smells like rotten meat and vegemite, don't smack it off into the blue yonder with a stick. It is a bait trap for fruit fly control. The fruit is still

safe to eat.

It may be a different story with orchard fruit. There is a withholding period after fruitfly control spraying before the fruit can be picked. This is to allow the chemical to be broken down into benign constituents. The fruitgrower knows if the fruit is okay. People who go for a stroll among the trees with a few shop bags for a bit of picking at night do not.

Why am I not making a fuss? I am allergic to mangoes and don't touch them but I would be lying if I said I didn't object to them being taken.

The reality is, a tree so close to the roadside is going to get robbed by somebody. However please do not be greedy.

When the population gets down to about 15, please leave those for a WW2 army vet and his wife down the road and my old aunt who is in aged care.

So here's the claimed get-out of jail clause for me.

I do not give consent for anyone to harvest from the mango tree on my property. Anyone who enters the property to access the tree does so at own risk. Injury resulting from a fall from a tree on a private property during an unlawful visit or from moving through a private property during an unlawful visit is not compensatable.



I have recently heard of the death of Mr Phil Martin. Phil was a true local pioneer. He lived much of his early life on Urch Road (in the homestead more recently known as Gerbera Vale) and has been associated with the district all of his life.

As a child I was astounded when I was told of his wartime exploits as a Dam Buster, flying with Bomber Command. I was able to interview Phil about his wartime experiences for last Anzac Day and this was reported in the April 2009 Roleystone Courier. Even more astounding to me was when he used his expertise as a photographer (he was chief photographer at the Western Australia for 38 years) combined with his expertise as a pilot to take aerial photos of the valley I grew up in.


I express my sympathy to his family especially to his children: Deb, Anne, Glenda and Owen. His was a life packed full of rich experiences.



# LIBRARY WILL BE RE-BUILT

The Roleystone District High School library, gutted by fire in early January, is already being demolished to enable the rebuilding of a replacement library. All parties agreed that it needed to be completely demolished after structural engineers assessed the damage to the structure and pad due to the heat of the fire. The demolition has been a four-stage process and by the time students resume, there will be no evidence of the fireravaged building.

Risk Cover has been very supportive and due to the school maintaining meticulous records of the contents of the library, much of the equipment and many resources can now be reordered and replaced. A temporary library facility has been set up in B block.,

Forensic evidence has established that the fire burnt most fiercely in the northeast corner, indicating that it did start in this area, however there is currently no clarity regarding the cause of the blaze. Although graffiti around the school did occur on the same evening they have not yet established a clear link between these events. Investigations are still continuing.

'The rebuilding of the library will take

time and replacement of the contents will be expensive however we are optimistic that this can be achieved with minimal impact on the school experiences of our students,' Principal, Peter Thatcher reported. 'I would like to thank all of the people who have been involved.'

'I am especially thankful to a range of school staff and community members who have given extensive hours to assist in this process. Particular thanks to: Verna Splatt, Chris Walsh, Karen Trethewey, Geoff Hoskins, Robyn Walker and Dale Diss.'

'They have provided me wonderful support. This allows us to achieve a relatively smooth start to the 2010 academic year in terms of accommodation and access in this area. Probably most would of thought this very unlikely on New Year's Day.'

In closing Peter wanted to offer his sincere thanks to those who responded to the fire: 'As the son of a career fire fighter with over 40 years in the job, I have enormous respect for the career and volunteer fire fighters who were able to keep the damage to an absolute minimum. They showed great courage, commitment and skill. Thankyou.'

He alternated between playing shortstop and fielding in the outfield. Jordan also starred with the bat. There were 7 days of competition with two games per day.


Jordan reflected: 'It was great fun. Playing two games a day really takes its toll. But it was really worthwhile.'

# Kaarakin Gets Funding Boost

Glenn who is the President of the Black Cockatoo Preservation Society of Australia Inc, is also Chairman of Wildlife Australia.

Glenn stated: 'Lottery West has been a life saver. We inherited a large number of kangaroos and other animals. The kangaroo population was desperately in

need of care and adequate accommodation.'

The Lotterywest cheque, to the value of \$110,000 will allow the organisation to refence the kangaroo compound and provide some much need alterations to the Park to make it safer and preserve other native species.

Glenn and his volunteers work very hard and along with their prime aim, to ensure the sustainability of black cockatoo species, they work more broadly in the conservation and care of a range of wildlife species.

This organisation took over the old Cohuna site in November 2008. The Black Cockatoo Society is still in urgent need




# **Summer Crime Trends**







# The Passing of a Roleystone Pioneer, War Hero and Newspaperman Phillip Hubert Martin **19/06/1923 - 25/01/2010**

Phillip Herbert Martin was born on the 19th of June, 1923, to Herbert and Ruby Martin, in a little cottage in Gosnells - the home of his grandparents.

Phil's older sister and brother had been born at the maternity hospital in Kelmscott and Ruby was expecting this, her third child, to also be born there. His early arrival robbed his mother of her much-looked-forward-to ride in a motorcar to the hospital.

Phil began his life on the orchard in Urch Road, Roleystone. As a little bloke, Phil bloomed on the orchard - he fished for gilgies in Stony Brook, shot greenies, rode the horse and had his jobs to do - feeding the chooks and the pig, manning the hand pump to water the orchard and making up the fruit boxes from jarrah boards. The only cloud was that he was an asthmatic and the hills environment did not suit his condition.

He began school at Kelmscott Primary School walking to and from school every day from the orchard - a relatively easy task on the way down, but an enormous challenge for the return journey at the end of the day, particularly if the weather was hot.

At seven years of age, he was sent to Southern Cross for schooling due to his asthma; Phil returned home completing his last year of school (1938) at Perth Boys.

It was during this year, back at home, that Phil met his future wife, Mavis Fuller. One of his mates asked him if he had seen: 'the good sort at the general store'. He hadn't, but he soon made the effort - he asked her out, and that was the start of a relationship that would take the next ten and a half years to culminate in their marriage.

At the beginning of 1939 Phil started work at the Mines Department but with war breaking out in May, 1942, Phil joined the Royal Australian Air Force.

Phil's highly decorated war career was largely spent in Britain flying with Bomber Command. The average life span for a bomber crew was just six missions, Phil was awarded his first Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) for completing 30 missions.

Based on his great flying skills he and his crew were invited to join the famous 617 Dam Busters Squadron. Phil won his second DFC destroying the Kembs Barrage dam on the Rhine River with 617 Squadron. He was also involved in the D-Day Landings, bombing German beach head gun installations.

Following his return to Perth, Phil needed to find work, James McCarthy editor of the Daily News asked him: Have you thought about taking pictures?' This resulted in Phil's 38 year career as a press photographer for the Daily News and later rising to Chief of Staff – Photographers, of The West Australian.

Phil and Mavis were married on the 5th of February, 1949, in St Andrews Church, in Perth

Their first residence was at River Road, Kelmscott a house that had originally belonged to Phil's parents. During that time, their four children were born: Deb, Anne, Glenda and Owen.

Phil was so proud of his kids and never let an opportunity pass to tell everyone about their exploits and achievements.

Once all of the kids had left home, it was time to take off for foreign parts. From 1976 until 1990, Phil and Mavis travelled the world. From the time Dad retired, and when they weren't gallivanting across foreign soil, they spent every winter up north for a two to three month stay at Exmouth or Broome.

...and if you thought that Phil loved his kids, you should have seen him with his grandkids!! He adored them – loved spending time with them, 'rough housing' them and working with them in the shed. He always found them something to do, keeping them occupied and teaching them some valuable skills that they continue to pursue, like working with wood and using 'bushy' skills to do running repairs.

The death of Mavis devastated Phil. They meant the world to each other and they did everything together. They talked and laughed and worked as a team in everything they did.

The last six years weighed heavily on him, he missed his soul mate so much.

Phil spent the last three months of his life in Carnarvon, firstly with Anne and Deb, then, following a stroke and a fall, in the permanent care unit at the local hospital. The staff here called him a real gentleman, he said please and thank you and didn't spit or swear at them!! He slipped quietly away to join his sweetheart at 1pm on the 25th of January.

Now they are together, laughing, holding hands and relishing each other's company once again and whilst we are sad at his leaving us, we are so pleased that the two lovebirds are singing their song at the tops of their voices.

Thank you, Dad. for the memories, for teaching us to see the funny side, for instilling in us a work ethic that is the envy of others and for knowing that a good life relies upon having luck when you need it and recognizing the opportunity when it arises.

We miss you Mum and Dad – very much.

# Building Sensitively in Roleystone; An Owner-builder's story

Five years ago my wife and I were fortunate enough to buy an acre of uncleared land next to the Canning River in Roleystone. We wanted to build a house with some sensitivity to the beautiful area, and one that used sensible, sustainable materials.

We had a very difficult block with the land falling 30m over its length, granite outcrops and clayey gullies but we wanted the house to be on the ground and to blend in to the surrounding bush. (See photo right, clear block, July 2007).

To start with I made a detailed feature and contour survey of the house site. This made it possible to design a house that minimized the damage to the remnant vegetation and minimize earthmoving. It saved us huge amounts of money and in the end we didn't need to knock over any old trees or blackboys. We used a local contractor (Bob Moles) who was helpful, very experienced with hill sites, and was respectful of our request to minimize damage and preserve the remnant vegetation.

We both liked the look and properties of straw bale walls, and after some thorough research into its fire resistance and durability decided to use this for out exterior walls. Straw bale walls provide exceptional insulation and are finally covered with a thick lime render. The appearance of the final walls can vary from a rendered brick wall to curved natural rock-like finish. (See photo right, showing straw bale walls during construction).

I knew nothing, and had no experience in the building industry so we engaged the services of Gary Dorn, who is an architect with 15 years of experience building straw bale houses. He transformed our plans to something I could build and came up with some innovative building materials and techniques. Our roof for example, is made from sandwich panel similar to that used to make cool rooms. It consists of a 150mm layer of polystyrene

sandwiched between two layers of tin and is extremely light and strong. I used old Jarrah power poles for posts and the ridge beam, recycled bricks

and stone for some walls, and recycled timbers for doors and window frames. We also had local timber slabs and floorboards milled from logs that I salvaged from a local subdivision.

So after about 2-3 years of planning, approvals, and delays of one kind or another, we poured the footings in November 2007 and started the building of "Mukmanor". Next month: Completion of Mukmanor. *Paul Mutton*



# Ken and Jean Revisit Bali - 10 Years On!



When our children were young we visited Bali regularly. It was a cheap, fun holiday destination. In the past ten years the children have left home and Ken and I have been seduced by Thailand with its beautiful beaches and enticing spicy food.

This Christmas, using cheap airfares and booking accommodation on the web, we revisited Bali.

We stayed in Sanur where things have greatly improved. The place is sparkling clean – no plastic in sight and no drain smells aka Canal No 5!

There are still loads of little shops selling the same old shapeless beach tat. But in between there are a few trendy boutiques selling very striking clothing that is well made and available in Australian sizing.

The hotel we stayed in was fantastic! We had a gorgeous little Balinese style bungalow with a high rattan roof and some lovely Balinese masks on the wall. The bathroom was

a lovely courtyard outside and we cleaned our teeth whilst looking at the stars.

The restaurants have improved out of sight. For the first time ever I didn't catch "Bali Belly"! There is now a good selection of food at reasonable prices. Beer is cheap A\$2.50 for 650 ml bottle. Wine is marked up 500% - we knew this and brought 6 litres with us – no problems with customs at Bali airport!

The people are friendly and charming, many of them speak good English and their culture seems to be intact. We saw Legong dancing and temple processions just as they were ten years ago. We were in Bali for 18 days and will return there as soon as possible. It is still a great place for a family holiday and it is oh so cheap!!.







Stretching For Fitness

# Exercise, exercise and more exercise... But what about stretching for fitness?

The time we spend working our bodies and burning through excess calories to get closer to our health and fitness goals can cause our muscles to become tense. While I often write about the importance of exercise, I tend to miss out talking

about the importance of STRETCHING!

Stretching is just as important to your wellbeing as maintaining an active lifestyle. Stretching properly during and after exercise and as a part of daily life can help prevent injury, aid in the healing process, improve recovery time and can help relax the body.

It is important to spend JUST as much time stretching as you do working out!

In my job, I assess people's fitness on a daily basis and very few people have the flexibility that is required to keep their bodies injury resistant and comfortable. Most have tension and prior injuries that may have been avoided if they spent more time stretching!

In many cases where people have lower back pain, they also have a great deal of tension and inflexibility through the glutes (butt), hamstrings (back of the legs), calves, quadriceps (front of the legs) and hip flexors (front of the pelvis).

An easy way to assess your

flexibility is to sit on the floor with your legs out in front of you. Keeping your legs straight, lean forward from the pelvis. Without hunching your back, you should be able to reach your toes comfortably. If you have trouble doing this, then you need to stretch more!

Increasing your flexibility will improve your mobility and your ability to perform energetic tasks, hobbies and exercises.

One of the most common mistakes with stretching is the belief that you should stretch BEFORE exercise. Stretching when your body is cold can actually cause injury. You can damage tendons, ligaments and muscles as your body is not prepared when cold.

Stretches are actually more effective once you have warmed up!. Starting your exercise at a low intensity and then stretching once warm, will allow you to achieve a deeper, more beneficial stretch. You should always end any fitness routine with a good stretch of all the muscles you have used in the workout.

#### REMINDER FOR OFF-ROAD VEHICLE USERS

Owners and riders of off-road vehicles (ORV) such as trail bikes are reminded that in the City of Armadale, ORVs can only be used on private land with the permission of the land owner.

There are no public lands within the City of Armadale where off-road vehicle use is permitted.

Under the Control of Vehicles (Off-Road Areas) Act 1978, penalties including impounding of the vehicle and a \$1000 fine apply for those caught using ORVs in areas where this activity is not permitted.

The City's Ranger Services staff and police act on reports of illegal ORV use.

Residents have recently complained about trail bike riders in the Darling Range Regional Park allegedly chasing kangaroos. Mayor Linton Reynolds said:

'This is totally unacceptable behaviour. The City works hard with the State Government, volunteers and residents to preserve its precious bushland reserves and the biodiversity that exists in them. It is illegal to use off-road vehicles in any reserve within the City of Armadale.'

'Unauthorised ORV use is associated with antisocial behaviour and

criminal damage and can cause damage to flora and fauna, create noise pollution and increase the fire risk.'

'Council is discussing with the State Government additional ORV areas, but there are a number of designated public areas within the Perth metropolitan region where off-road vehicles can be used legally and ORV owners and riders should stick to these areas.'



# Rheumatiod Arthritis Part 2

Another month has flown by and I trust you had a wonderful Christmas and a very happy and safe New Year.

To start this year off I am writing about specialized treatments for rheumatoid arthritis a follow-up to the last article. Unlike the treatments discussed last month these medicines attempt to modify the disease progress of rheumatoid arthritis in an attempt to reduce or halt joint damage.

Corticosteriods: Generally Prednisolone or Prednisone tablets are employed although slow release injections (such as Depo-Medrol) can be used into joints. Steroids are powerful anti-inflammatory agents, which also reduce the activity of our immune system so joint swelling and pain are quickly controlled. They should however only be used for short periods due to severe side effects (fluid retention and worsening diabetic control, poor wound healing and Osteoporosis).

DMARDS: (disease modifying anti-rheumatic drugs) are many and varied in the modes of action but include: Methotrexate, Plaquenil, Sulphasalazine, Gold, Arava, Cyclosporin, and Azothiaprine.

The purpose of such medicines is to suppress our immune system, slow the process of the disease and block some of the destructive actions of the inflammatory chemicals (cytokines) the body produces. Many of these medicines are used to treat other conditions. Because of their effects on the body their use is often limited by the side effects. Generally these medicines are slower in their onset taking from 1-6 months for reduction in joint pain.

Methotrexate: a cytotoxic anti cancer drug interfering with cell reproduction it is used in low doses once weekly in severe rheumatoid arthritis taking 3-6 weeks to work.

Plaquenil: an anti-malarial is a useful alternative to methotrexate. It is however necessary to get regular eye tests as it can cause eye damage.

Arava- is an immunosuppressive medicine reducing the release of the inflammatory cytokines. Arava can however cause liver problems, hair loss, and suppress bone marrow.

Biological DMARDS: These are highly specialized medicines, which block the action of TNF (tissue necrosis factor) which has been found to be one of the main inflammatory chemicals causing the inflammation and joint destruction found with rheumatoid arthritis. One such example is Etanercept (an Enbrel injection), which competitively inhibits the action of TNF on the surface of cells. It needs to be given twice weekly. The great advantage is there are far less side effects and far more people respond well to treatment (up to 70%). Another example is the injection Remacade. It binds to TNF and neutralizes it.

Although these medicines are expensive they really improve the quality of life for someone with rheumatoid arthritis.

#### PATIENTS FOR PATIENT SAFETY DECLARATION

Did you know that approximately 500 people are killed or suffer serious harm in the Australian health system every week? Have you experienced, or had a family member experience, unintended harm in the health care system? The ongoing impact of this often-preventable harm is significant. So significant in fact, that the World Health Organisation (WHO) has developed a global alliance to make patient safety a public health priority.

July 2009 saw Australia commit to this global alliance with the inaugural Australian Patients for Patient Safety Workshop held here in Perth. The workshop was the 12th in a global program launched in London in 2005. From the Perth workshop has come the Perth Declaration for Patient safety. This declaration is a call to action to make patient safety a priority, and central to

decision making in patient care. The Declaration is included in this edition of the Roleystone Courier as a separate flyer. Please take the time to read this Declaration. I'm sure you will agree with me that it's a fantastic document.

My personal experiences have lead to my strong belief that patient and carer empowerment is the most effective tool in preventing avoidable harm in health care. My father died as a result of a preventable, hospital-acquired injury and my mother died as a result of a hospital-acquired



Winners of the first week of competition were The Executive ahead of All Stars and Darters. We are grateful to the Anile family for their support and to our volunteers for their help in



#### Astronomical Highlights for February

February's a funny old month: you can't help but wonder how the heck there came to be just one such wonky month in the calendar, when all the others get to own 30 or 31 days each.

Greg Lowe Perth Observatory

Poor old Feb can't ever encompass a complete lunar cycle of 29.53 days, no matter how it tries. Never can it have a 'blue moon' such as January just did and March also will, this year.

The way the moon's phases happen in 2010, February doesn't even have a full moon. The major phases this month are: last quarter on the 7<sup>th</sup>, new moon on the 14<sup>th</sup> and first quarter on the 22nd. No moon for Valentine's Day.

Teachers, the period for evening moon observing will be from the 17<sup>th</sup> to the 28<sup>th</sup>. Full moon's on the night of Feb 28<sup>th</sup> – Mar 1<sup>st</sup>, with 100% phase occurring just 38 minutes after midnight.

Jupiter's long spell of dominance as the brightest evening planet has come to an end. It is now very low in the west in the evening twilight and will pass from view within the first few days of the month. Mars has taken over. It's bright and orange in colour and stands out low in the ENE at dusk early in the month.

As the weeks go by you'll find that Mars is getting steadily higher, if you observe at the same time of night (say 8:30pm). Its nightly motion takes it steadily across the northern sky, culminating well up in the north around 12:15am on Feb. 1st, 11:10pm on the 14<sup>th</sup>, and 10pm on the 28<sup>th</sup>. You can interpolate between those dates. In the early morning hours you'll find Mars in the NW sky.

The other planet of note is Saturn which is an evening object now. Admittedly a late evening object to begin with, but rising earlier and earlier as the month wears on. Saturn rises in the east at about 10pm in early February, 9pm midmonth, and 8pm at the end of the month. It culminates i.e. is due north and reaches its highest altitude around 4am on Feb 1st, 3am on the 14th and 2am on the 28th.

When a celestial object is at its highest, you should get the clearest view because you'll be looking through the shortest slice of atmosphere.

Gazing at the same object when it's low in the sky, you'd expect to have a poorer view because you're looking through a longer slice of the atmosphere. Also it's the bottom layer of the atmosphere: the thickest, murkiest and unsteadiest part. *Happy star gazing.*

Council was advised the WAPC and the Department of Planning have prepared a new Multi Unit Housing Code to establish provisions for multiple dwellings.

Council note release of the Multi Unit Housing Code Discussion Paper and Explanatory Guidelines, and will make a submission supporting the initiative in principle but highlighting the identified areas requiring modification.

#### 13. Restricted Access **Vehicle Routes**

MRWA are finalising the latest Class2/3 Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Routes and have requested the City of Armadale review these routes within their boundaries and provide advice.

Council requested MRWA to implement changes, including on Albany Highway, removing the RAV route from Brookton Highway through Kelmscott to Tonkin Highway, and on Brookton Highway, removing the RAV route from Albany Highway to Canning Road.

#### to Look Back....

In the first month of the new decade and ten years into the new millennium, it is timely to look back. All of these events have been reported in various editions of the Roleystone Courier.

FIVE YEARS AGO

In late January/ February devastating bushfires threatened the community of Karragullen. The whole community and especially our emergency service volunteers, rallied together to protect our area. (See photo: Karragullen area.)

William Buckingham's homestead, lovingly restored by local historians and volunteers over this decade, celebrated its 125th anniversary. (The Buckinghams were the first residents of Roleystone. The Gwynne family of Roleystone are decedents of William Buckingham).

Ten years ago

- Many in our area were still reeling at the shock announcement to close the Karragullen Primary school at the end of 1999, ending nearly 100 years of education in this township.
- Locals gathered in huge numbers to attend a huge New Year's Eve Community party.
- The town was happy with the announcement that the shopping centre would undergo 'Revitalisation'.

#### Twenty years ago

- The Roleystone Family Centre was opened.
- Nineteen years ago Ian and Mady Colquhoun advertised for 'others with an interest in the environment' to join with other like minded people in the newly created: Roleystone Naturalists Club. Today this is Roleybushcare.

#### One hundred years ago

The little Roleystone Primary School that had opened in 1905 with 9 pupils was forced to close when the numbers dipped, (it was reopened again a year later).

Looking forward, looking back; the Roleystone Courier is still reporting on items of interest across our community.



I heard a discussion on talk-back radio about how fast time went these days. I pondered about this and then it dawned on me.....

I often wondered why it took so long to reach the age of 18 and then 21 and then 25 but after this, time just raced past.

I have discovered the reason: a diabolic plot has been uncovered.

When I was 25, we went metric and without telling anyone, time was also metricated. There is only 10 months in a year (I don't remember March or October last year)!

I offer further proof: when I was young, people over 60 were incredibly old and wrinkled and yet today, I notice that 60 year olds are quite youthful, energetic and party animals.

Of course, they are really only 51.2 years old - in the old money!

The government has allowed this state of affairs because it suits them to be able to claim that we are all living longer because of their health policies etc but really it is because an age of 80 (our supposed life expectancy) is really only 68.4 - not even the expected 3 score years and ten!

It also allows the government to allow this state of affairs - we are paying 6 lots of tax every 5 years. No wonder the Treasury is overflowing.

They want us to work longer - because they know that at 65 metric years we still have 6.2 years of work left in us.

I want Australians to be aware of this insidious state of affairs.

It was so lovely over Christmas to have the local birds bringing out their young ones to show them the area and introduce them to us.

We had magpies, honeyeaters, wattle birds, 28's, pink & greys, ravens, kookaburras and red caps visit on Christmas morning. All young birds seem to constantly be calling and begging for food, usually whilst on the ground. If they were my young I think I would be begging them to be quiet and not advertise their presence to predators. The adult birds always seem either oblivious to or very tolerant of the noise. Sadly many of these

young birds no longer visit or have been brought to me injured, usually due to cat attack which could have been prevented by the cat bib. Birds seldom survive a cat attack.

The hot weather has also taken its toll on our wildlife with lots of heat stress related deaths. We can help by providing water in bird baths and dishes in safe 'off ground' locations and in shallow ground level dishes. The baths and dishes need to be kept clean and regularly filled with fresh water.

My bird baths are in constant use and some sort of roster seems to have been implemented, it seems to start with the smaller birds like silver eyes and honeyeaters and progress

though to the larger birds. No fighting seems to take place but the next users come in and wait

My off ground water dishes as well as being used by birds are very popular with possums in the evening. My ground level water is very popular with bandicoots (even during the day). Aviary and caged birds also need extra water that is changed frequently and they also sometimes enjoy being sprayed with water.





## Pro Bono David Bardsley Minister Community Church

#### Dear Friends Living in WA is wonderful.

To any rational person, that should be a statement of the blindingly obvious. But it's not all 'unalloyed joy'. With one exception, the thing the State completely lacks is anything which might authentically rejoice in being labelled a mountain. The one glorious exception is Bluff Knoll which has all the essential characteristics of a classic mountain in every respect...except size.

The Stirling Ranges in general are little more than bumps in the grand scheme of things which stick up. It's such a pity because, for those of us who have had the good fortune to have been up close and personal with real mountains, summit encounters are amongst the most vivid and glorious memories in our personal databank. To stand on the top of a rugged crag, maybe a thousand metres or more above the valley below and to see for miles around with the sun glinting off the snow on distant peaks can leave you quite breathless. In fact one is usually breathless anyway because of the effort of getting there in the first place!

The best summit experiences don't come easily. Actually, there are a few mountains around the world with railways or cable cars right to the top and you can sit in comfort as

you are whisked upwards. No matter what means you use to ascend into the high

places, the views are equally magnificent.

But somehow the vistas which open out when you have legged it to the top have a much greater impact. The process of getting there, the path you take, contributes in no small way to the emotions generated as you take in the awesome wonder of the amazing creation around you. At least you can begin to appreciate it once your heart rate has returned to a modest gallop. And the climate plays its part too.

The days of clear skies and balmy breezes to cool your labouring body are few and far between. Mountains by their very nature attract a mixed bag of weather which can change incredibly quickly. The summits which are most readily recalled with a grin are those which we climbed in less than perfect conditions but which rewarded us with maybe only the odd glimpse of a stunning view through the clouds at the top. As you might have gathered by now, I love mountains!

Spiritually, mountains and high places are hugely significant both positively and negatively – the Bible mentions both Holy Mountains and mountain tops with pagan temples, where child sacrifice was common. In Korea there is a proliferation of Prayer Mountains, beautiful places where thousands



of Christians gather for individual or corporate prayer. More commonly throughout the world, summits are seen as the abode of capricious spirits who need to be appeased at every turn. But for me, all mountains are special places and the journey to the top is an integral part of the experience.

The solitude, the splendour and the separation from ordinary life for a while all help lift me towards a better understanding of myself and often a closer walk with God. Similarly in our walk of faith, summit experiences are magnificent and the path we take is very significant. If we wander off the right track, the summit we reach might not be the one we expect. But follow the path Jesus sets before us and the one thing we can be absolutely sure of is a stunning view at the end.



- The previous highest was 43.1° in December 1997!




