

### Filming The Waiting City

Local lad Denson Baker is verging on fame and fortune as a Cinematographer! He has had a stellar career in film and has most recently been the Director of Photography for a film 'The Waiting City' to be released in Australian Cinemas on the 15<sup>th</sup> July. (His previous film was the very prestigious award wining film: The Black Balloon).

Denson grew up in Kelmscott/Roleystone and went to Kelmscott Primary School; a school built by his great-great grandfather Thomas Buckingham Jr. Denson is a sixth generation 'Buckingham'; the original settlers of the area and can trace his ancestry back to the first family to farm in Roleystone!

Denson went to John Wollaston Anglican Community School, then Central Institute of Technology, Northbridge. He fondly remembers his time with the Roleystone theatre; performing in the 1992 junior workshop of 'The Green Wizard'.

Denson then moved to Sydney to study cinematography at the Australian Film, Television & Radio School and following that he was the Director of Photography

on several feature films including 'The Black Balloon'. He has also shot music videos, commercials and documentaries all around the world including: England, the United States, Germany, Italy, South Korea, the Pacific Islands and New Zealand. Most recently he has been in India shooting 'The Waiting City'.

In 2002 Denson won the AFI award for Best Cinematography in a Non Feature for the Perth short film 'Jack'. He now lives in Sydney and has an agent in Los Angeles but he frequently 'comes home' to spend time with his family. Denson's dream is to: 'one day shoot a feature film back in my old hometown.'

'The Waiting City' is about an outwardly happy Australian couple, Ben & Fiona, who journey to Calcutta, India to collect their adopted baby. On arrival they find that the arrangements at the agency have yet to be finalized and they have no option but to wait in this chaotic, foreign place. As the Indian city pulls them in each separate and unexpected directions, the vulnerability of their marriage begins to reveal itself and they are forced to confront their deep secrets. 'The Waiting City' is written and directed by Claire McCarthy and brings together an incredible Australian cast including Radha Mitchell (Finding Neverland, Pitch Black). Joel Edgerton (Animal Kingdom, The Square, Star Wars: Episode II & III) and Isabel Lucas (Transformers: Revenge of the Fallen). ### Catherine Feeds Red Dog Crew

has just returned home after completing a dream job. She was contracted to do the catering for the production of Red Dog, an \$8 million family movie being shot in the Pilbara. 'It was hard work but a fantastic experience' Catherine recalls. 'I had to cater three meals a day for between 50 – 80 people. The meals had to be varied and there was a big demand for fresh ingredients and gluten free alternatives. Plus it was real challenge to prepare and serve food with all that red dust. Still it was great and I had some great compliments about the food!' Pictured above: Catherine with 'The Red Dog Statue' in Dampier. Red Dog was a red cloud kelpie that became a legend after roaming thousands of kilometres during the 1970's hitching rides in cars, trucks and on trains and making friends along the way. He was beloved to many people across the North West.

The film is based on the 2002 short novel Red Dog by Louis de Bernieres - best known for his story Captain Corelli's Mandolin - which he wrote after seeing a statue dedicated to the famous dog in Dampier, WA.

### Danni's a Sound Guru

Danni Close has spent her life in Roleystone: 'I always had the space to delve into my various creative projects as a child, an opportunity I just don't think I would have had growing up in the city.'

This creativity is being seen as she is currently creating sound effects for 'The effect of gamma Rays on Manin-the-Moon Marigolds' playing at the Phoenix Theatre. And she wants everyone to come along and listen to her creativity with sounds.

Her interest in sound design started at Kalamunda SHS with 'Oh what a Lovely War'; she was assigned the job of sound designer. The production called for extensive sound effects including explosions and gunshots. 'I had a ball creating the soundtrack for it.' After high school, she attended WAAPA to study Sound for Performance.

Danni loves acting and has tried to balance this with 'behind the scenes tech work'. Her local acting roles with the Roleystone Theatre have included: playing the highly strung Nurse in The Spotted Man and the young Betty in The Crucible.

As a sound designer she needs to work closely with the director, to discover what feel or atmosphere they want in different scenes. 'From there, I scurry away to my sound dungeon and either search for, or create the music/sound effects that best captures that feel or atmosphere. I always try to record my own sound effects, as commercial CD's often don't suit the situation.

So what attracted her to Marigolds?

'It was really love at first sight - the first time I saw the name of the play, I just knew it was bound to be awesome! Then after I read the script, I was really attracted to the characters and how the story developed.' 'And for me, this will be the first play I have composed the music for, and that is a scary, yet exciting challenge.'

So Danni wants everyone to go to see local theatre productions: 'We truly have some amazing local talent in this state, and if there was one thing I can recommend to anyone, it's to go see the productions that

Ron was known widely and affectionately as Mr Bear and his wife Jackie as Mrs Bear. During his working life he was a well-respected professional working for Woomera and Carnarvon Tracking station. Later his technological expertise enabled him to work for

Computer Age and the Apple Centre in Perth. Following the end of his working life Ron became a passionate and enthusiastic volunteer.

Both Ron and his wife Jackie were involved with Araluen Botanic Park. Ron manned the gate at many Spring Festivals ensuring that disabled people were able to access the park. Ron loved Roleystone and served as a volunteer with the Roleybushcare group injecting trees for many years. Ron will be greatly missed.

As World Cup fever hits Australia, Roleystone can celebrate their own World Cup Masters champion. Our very own John Hunter has just returned from Phuket playing in the Football Senior World Cup - and Australia won gold! Eight national teams competed: Thailand, Iran, England, Armenia, Australia, the USA, New Zealand and Taiwan. Australia played Iran in the final and they won with a score line of 4-1, a great result as the Iranian team had four ex World Cup players playing for them. The rules stipulated that each team's goalkeeper must be at least 38 years of age, with the remaining members divided as follows: three between 38 and 44, four between 45 and 49, and three aged 50-plus.




### ROLEY SUPER MUMS

I also heard from friends, who have recently left the district after spending their lives here, that the lack of options for their young adult children, was the main reason they left. Further correspondence on this subject including what, if anything, we should do about it, is welcome.

My major point of grievance this month concerns 'signs'. I, like most folk who live here, love the vistas of Roleystone: the natural bush, the rural surrounds and the lovely homes and gardens. What I cannot abide are the plethora of ugly signs.

Signs on properties for sale, if it is on the property for sale and not on another, seem reasonable to me. But it should only be one sign per property and it should come down after a reasonable time, once the sale is complete. There is a 'leader sign' for a property for sale off Brookton Highway that is over 2 kilometres from the property itself. To me this is just 'sign pollution'.

Owners are welcome to advertise whatever they will, on their own properties, but I prefer not to see signs on public open space and Council land.

I find the signs that spring up on road verges can be distracting to drivers and certainly detract from the beauty of the area. I also understand from talking to the traders at at venues 'off Brookton Highway', that sometimes the delay in acquiring effective, Council approved signage, means that a shop owner, must make Jacoby not only for the way he battled to temporary alternatives.

Sadly for some of them, they have also been repeatedly fined for their signs. However, anything that makes this vote of thanks to the Chairman bought the particularly dangerous stretch of road easier to traverse and less distracting to motorists, is to be welcomed.

> But I wonder: 'are they being unfairly targetted'; 'is this level of fining happening over the rest of Roleystone'? 'If so, why are there so many non-approved signs around on other verges'?

While I understand that signage to distracting and I get quite cross when or ring Gordon on 9382 033.

'Garage Sale' signs on cardboard boxes nailed to lamp-posts, one week later when wet and dog eared, are not attractive. (There are still signs up around town advertising 'signing up for football' with dates in February).

I commend the agencies that provide advertising space to locals eg at the shopping centre and in many publications, websites around town. Surely this is a better place to advertise? It does require organisation (and perhaps some cost) but it does keep our environment less polluted. So what do you

#### The West Australian 7 Dec 1909


A meeting of the Canning Mills Railway League was held at Rokewood Orchard, the owner Mr Frank Laverack presiding. The Chairman said he hoped the government, who had decided to take over the line from Pickering Brook to Canning Mills would survey a townsite at the terminus, which would prove a great help to business people who wish to start businesses in the district. Mr Tom Price of Illawarra Orchard suggested that the new townsite be called Mooretown in honour of the Premier and that the line would be taken over in time to get the stone fruit to market. The secretary reported that already there were some 20 - 30 persons looking for land in the district, although it was only one week since the Premier announced the intention of the government to take over the line. The settlers of the district had to thank Mr get the line but also for the great interest he showed in the fruit industry generally. A meeting to a close.

NB The township was named Karragullen not Mooretown! I was 'so nearly' famous!

Alannah MacTiernan wants to hear what Roleystone residents think can be done to build on improvements in the facilities around the Jarrah Road shops and Cross Park. Alannah, who is now Labor's candidate for the Federal seat of Canning wants to build on earlier work.

In 2007 when she was the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, the state government and the City of Armadale committed over \$1M to revitalising the centre of Roleystone. Improvements which were completed in 2008 included: improved traffic management and additional street parking and lighting on Wygonda and Jarrah Roads; improved connections and footpaths between

community facilities, including seating and landscaping; upgrading the Roleystone Community hall; construction of new toilet facilities south of Cross Park; improved sporting and safety lighting in the Cross Park precinct; refurbishment of netball and tennis courts; and upgrades to the existing playground and skate park.

In addition the owners of the Jarrah Road Shopping

Centre invested heavily inimproving the amenities for shoppers.

"A great start was made to revitalising the community facilities around the Jarrah Road shops and Cross Park in 2008 but more can be done to enhance the village centre feel. I want to hear how locals think. I can make Roleystone an even better place to live".

Ms MacTiernan represented Roleystone as an upper house member for four years in the early 1990's and has represented the neighbouring electorate of Armadale since 1996. "I have always maintained strong links with Roleystone and am keen to advance Roleystone's interests in the Federal Parliament".


On the 1st of July, Tim Johnston and Tanya La Monte will celebrate one year as owners of the Network Video store in Roleystone.



The City of Armadale presented a WA Junior Rangers Bravery Award to Saskia Bravery Jolly, a 14-year-old girl who was attacked by a dog while visiting her friend's home by WARA to assist in Roleystone last December.


The WA Junior Rangers Awards program is conducted with the psychological recovery of children who have been attacked by dogs.

We indulged in the ½ price rates and took a 5 star hotel for a bit of luxury as we knew we would not see that in Nepal.

On many occasions we found ourselves being ushered through customs in KTM and offered very special treatment because we had a child. Cheaper accommodation, food discounts, bumped to the front of the line. It was nice to take advantage of that.


We travelled light and easy with one pack (80L) holding all of our clothing and toiletries; it was very full! We also sported a Dueter child's hiking pack purchased on EBay for \$100; very beneficial to get a child off the ground and out of danger.


We didn't pre-book any accommodation or tours in Nepal; there is absolutely no reason too. Best to travel with a Lonely Planet book, which is a thorough and diverse guide to all the 'ins and outs' of everything you need to know including accommodation, rates, tours, travel distances, how to get from A to B, and the best restaurants.

We took accommodation in KTM that was in USD \$20 p/n, we

wanted to get an idea of the quality and cleanliness. You are always welcome to see the rooms and barter a price before you commit. KTM for 4 days was enough! It was very hectic, bustling, noisy, dusty and dirty. But it was good for shopping and had amazing foods to sample with many different restaurants.

Chitwan National Park was our next stop. We took a private vehicle and paid for a package at a resort where everything was included. We felt safe with this and we were still getting our bearings on the culture of Nepal. Chitwan was a wonderful and educational experience Continued on page 26.





#### GARDENING NOTES

# Half way through another year, the rainfall has been scarce but very welcome when we get it.

I'm not sure if it was the sparse watering or the extra sun, but my camellias seem to have a lot more flowers than previous years. Some of the blooms are much bigger, real show-bench winners.

One of the problems that I do encounter with the single semi double varieties is the little birds that swing on the edge of the bloom utilising the flowers as a perch while they eat at the pollen. It is more apparent on the lighter coloured ones, thus indicating a need to grow the deeper coloured more sun hardy varieties. I would recommend that you endeavour to buy only plants well potted up to 175mm or 200mm; it is hard to establish the smaller ones before summer.

I notice Irises are now available, either potted up or as rhizomes, in the case of the tall bearded varieties. When grown in full sun, these stunning charmers are a real dry climate type plants, needing very sparse watering. Also there are many new drought tolerant grevilleas, correas and eremophilas. All of these plants are bird attracting.

If you have potted plants that you do not

want, a lot of churches schools and charities have sections where they sell plants. I felt so guilty cutting my rosemary hedge and not potting up some of the cuttings. It was simply a matter of not enough time to do it all. If anyone needs pieces, please feel free to give me a call.

I was given a hoya the other day. Falsely I believed they are best left to become pot bound to produce flowers, but the people of the hoya and epiphyte society tell me this is not so. Like any other plants they need maintaining to make sure they get enough nutrients in order to flower.

Helen and Cob Hedley, from Pioneer Gardens Nursery have invited the Camellia Society to put on a camellia display and show on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8th August. I hope you will avail yourself of this opportunity. Otherwise try to get to Araluen to see all the wonderful winter flowering plants. We are so very lucky to have a world-class garden on our doorstep.

I hope you have found plenty of good reading matter for these longer evenings, I recommend 'Two Dogs and a Garden' by Dr Derilie Cherry. It is a beautiful book with excellent photography and one you can pick up and put down at will.

### More from Eden Seeds

For those who want to have years of pleasure from the vegetables grown from your Eden seeds.

Collect ripe fruit. Tomatoes and cucumbers crushed and soaked in a bowl of water for three days will allow the seeds to wash free from the flesh. Simply rinse a few times, floating off the flesh and skin leaving the seeds at the bottom. Dry the seeds in the

sun making sure the seeds are not attacked by insects! When dry, place in an envelope and write the

date and the seed variety. Place these in a plastic container and store in the crisper in your fridge. It is also a good idea to provide some desiccant in your container (powdered milk will do). Make sure your plastic container or glass jar is sealed and if stored in this manner, you will have good germination over many years.

The Roleybushcare Group have a web site and their contacts are easy to find if you need advice or information involving our natural reserves. The majority of people in Roleystone and Karragullen live here because of all these outstanding natural assets and as a community it is important that we do what we can to ensure they are managed and enhanced for the future. Congratulations to all Roleybushcare members and others in our community for their commitment to what are the jewels of Rolevstone.

Having spent the last two months writing about possums as unwanted guests in roof spaces I had hoped to change subject, but a visit from my neighbour with his possum problem was too good not to share.

My neighbour asked for advice about a possum living in his garage roller door which was obviously experiencing 'a sort of washing machine effect' every time the door was opened or closed. After looking at the situation we concluded that it would be virtually impossible to possum proof the garage and went on to look at the roller door. The door was even less possible to possum proof. We looked at the door mechanism and found few possibilities for the possum to get trapped or become injured. Catching and relocating the possum to a box in the garden seemed futile as we could not secure the garage or door it would just return. Eventually we decided to leave the possum in his home and with my neighbour offering to open and close his garage door slowly. What a great neighbour!!

Obviously there are not always solutions

to wildlife issues but if we can compromise and work together a partial solution can usually be reached.

As a wildlife carer I get all sorts of calls about wildlife issues and problems but really can only deal with problems related to orphaned or injured wildlife and can only offer advice on other issues which may or not be accepted.

Frequent wildlife problems which I have limited abilities to address are:

- An injured duck swimming on a lake: if it's swimming I can't help until it is caught.
- A bird flying inside a shopping centre: only solution is to turn off lights and open a door for it to fly to the light or wait for it to tire enough to catch.
- A bird flying with wire around its leg: little can be done until it is caught.
- An injured kangaroo seen on the move – little can be done until it slows or stops.

Wildlife carers are just dedicated people who try their best to help all our precious orphaned or injured wildlife, unfortunately without the help of a magic wand.

### INTIMATE PARTNER ABUSE - OF MEN

### Helen Morton MLC

Historically, government policies have been based on the assumption that the vast majority of perpetrators of domestic violence are male and the vast majority of victims are female.

The policies and services of current governments are still based on this position and whilst there is good evidence for this, research is now being undertaken on the nature and extent of abuse of men.

Domestic violence (also known as Intimate Partner Abuse or IPA), knows no boundaries of gender, geography, socioeconomic status, age, ability, sexual preference, culture, race or religion. Nor is IPA just physical – it can be expressed in other ways, such as emotionally or verbally, with similar devastating effect. The research found that there aren't many tailored services available for male victims of IPA. In addition, the work exposed some unique barriers to men seeking services, including shame and fear of not being believed, resulting in underreporting of the extent of this abuse.

Relationships in which partners use violence need to be supported to change, as it is these environments, which are

clearly the most harmful to children.

The study was a partnership between the Family and Domestic Violence Unit and the Men's Advisory Network and was funded by a Lotterywest grant.

### Assisting Pets By Taking Notice

### As a mobile vet, I come to your house and ask a lot of questions!!

If you have called me to make an appointment for a home visit, it is generally because your pet is sick and you need some professional assistance to restore health and wellness so that your beloved pet can get on with a happy, healthy life. On the other hand, the home visit may have been arranged to give an annual health check and vaccination to an animal that is well without any apparent symptoms of ill health.

In either case, after the meet and greet routine at the front door, the business begins of establishing what is going on with your pet. Even if the animal is well, it is a good time to review its general health, diet, and daily behaviour. If an animal is unwell, you may have a very good idea of what the problem is, especially if the symptoms have been experienced before. Sometimes a health problem begins at certain stages of life as ageing occurs, and

these may be new symptoms not seen by the owner previously.

A very important part of the consultation process is the physical examination of the animal, but this generally comes after my initial observation of the animal from a distance. This happens naturally whilst I am gathering information from the owner - this is where the "taking notice" part comes in. It is really helpful to me if you have some information about your pet's normal behaviour, respiration, appetite, mobility, skin condition so that we can identify what is different and start to determine on the animal's history and its clinical presentation, what action to take in terms of treatment, further investigation, prognosis etc.

By taking notice of your pet each day, you can establish patterns of normal behaviour and more easily notice, when something is different. If you would like me to come and visit your pet at your house, please call Dr Judith Congrene on 0433 2137 28.





At the July meeting of the Roleystone Organic Growers, Executive Coordinator Michelle



### Pro Bono: Nanga Revisited! David Bardsley Minister Community Church



"The river winds to the left and then back to the right. The big bridge should be at the narrow bit just past the bends - the railway track went along the other side up to Yarragil."

Nothing. There was no sign of the bridge or the railway formation. Brambles had grown all over the place and, off the walk trail, it was hard to find our way through. But Bob wasn't one to give up so easily. He had been born and bred in Nanga and we had been walking around the old mill site for a couple of hours already.

It had taken Bob some time to get his bearings in the area. So little remained of what had been a bustling, thriving wood mill with its railway yard, horse paddocks and workers' houses. The lie of the land and the occasional old pine tree which had been there for donkey's years helped Bob finally get orientated. Then we set off in earnest. Here was the mill site itself, there the butcher's shop. "And this was where my house used to be," he declared with some satisfaction. "It was bigger than most as my grandfather was the manager." Some rusting bits of chimney in the creek and a few metres of abandoned rails were the only evidence of what used to be, other than the railway formations and some unnaturally flat areas - "the mill site tennis courts, there's others at the school and the town site."

In next to no time at all, everything that men had built in that beautiful part of the forest had gone. The work and money that had been poured into harvesting timber was prodigious. And now...nothing. CALM had come in with dozers and rippers, planted fast growing pines in regimented rows, placed picnic tables, numbered the camp sites and peppered the place with eco friendly loos. Nanga was now a place for recreation and amusement instead of hard yakka, winning wealth supplying sleepers for the South African railways.

Will everything we've created be so systematically obliterated eventually? Were we right to make a fortune out of God's creation? Should we have ripped the heart out of the forest with mile long drag lines to improve living standards in a far off land? I was bothered by the rights and wrongs of what had been done. I still am. How do we steer an ethical course through the minefield of our modern life style? How do we live out our divine responsibility to be good stewards of God's world? The Bible points us in the right direction but specific action is up to us. I'm left grappling with questions it's easier to turn my back on. But isn't that also the joy of being truly human? We aren't machines programmed by some higher being to behave in the way he (or she!) wants. We have been given freedom and intelligence. One big question is how are we going to use these gifts...for good or for evil? To live as God intended or to meet our own selfish desires? We found the track and the remains of the bridge. Bob beamed with fond memories as we stood in the Murray on the huge baulks of timber which had once carried the traffic to and from Yarragil. God also gave us the capacity to enjoy special moments in time too!



### Astronomical Highlights May

#### Greg Lowe Perth Observatory

#### Do you feel that everything's going slowly now, as if the Earth's travelling with the handbrake on?


I'm kidding. But the first week of July is the time when the Earth's furthest from the Sun, and going at its slowest - a mere 29.3 km per second. Aphelion, when we're all of 152 million km from the nearest star, will be on the 6th, p = away from, and helios = the Sun. Did I say the nearest star? Yes. Even here, now, in the 21st century, there are some people who don't understand that the Sun is a star. It's not even a big star. That's a good thing because big stars burn themselves up at a frantic rate and end their lives in almighty explosions called supernovae. We can do without that. Life's already complicated enough.

The most obviously star like object from our earthbound point of view is Venus. Many people call it the Evening Star. It's not. It's a rocky planet; almost the same size as the Earth, and for some time to come it'll be the nearest planet. This month its distance from us will decrease from 160 million to 130 million km. The

approach will be 41 million km, in late October and early November. Anyway, you can't miss it. Venus dominates the northwestern sky at dusk. Its setting time goes from 8:20pm in early July to 8:45 mid-month and 9pm by the end of the month.

Next in order of brightness is Jupiter, which appears at the eastern horizon around midnight at the start of the month. Then, as the weeks slip by, it rises earlier and earlier: around 11pm midmonth, and 10pm at month's end. At dawn it's high up in the north in early July and works its way westward through coming weeks, to be high in the northwest at dawn by month's end.

The Moon's major phases are: last quarter on the 4th, new moon on the 12th, first quarter on the 18th, and full moon on the 26th. So it's a morning (waning) moon until the 11th, and an evening (waxing) moon from the 13th to the 26th. On the 14th and 15th it'll be within cooee of Venus: a fine sight, with the crescent moon having most of its surface lit only by the faint reflected light of earthshine.



### City of Armadale Rates to Rise in 2010-11

The City of Armadale anticipates a rates rise of about 6% in 2010-11.

Armadale Mayor Linton Reynolds said Council was working hard to find ways to contain the increase, but higher State Government charges for power, water and waste disposal would have a significant effect on the City's budget.

'Like households, Council will be paying much more this year for utilities like power and water,' Cr Reynolds said. 'Street lighting alone will cost us \$1.3 million -\$300,000 more than in 2009-10 and in addition we have the full-year effect of the higher State Government waste levy, which will increase the rubbish charge to approximately \$220 per household, up \$16 from last year. While it is apparent substantial rate increases will occur in all metropolitan councils, we are doing our very best to keep the City of Armadale's rise to an absolute minimum.'

Breakdown of the City of Armadale likely

3.8% Local Government Cost Index forecast for 2010-11;

1% growth – a limited amount to pay for new initiatives and infrastructure renewal, to lift the City's future image and capability;

1.4% (approximately) State Government utility cost increases.

For the average residential property the total rates increase will equate to about \$60 per year or \$1.15 a week.

Added to this figure are the City's separate waste services charge and the Emergency Services Levy (ESL) imposed by the State Government to pay for FESA's operations. The waste service increase amounts to \$16 and the State Government's 18% increase in the ESL will add approximately \$22 per household. The City's 2010-11 annual budget will be considered by Council at its Monday 9 August meeting.


