

Theresia, her husband Jack and daughter Louise immigrated to Australia and arrived 17 August, 1950 and lived on Kielman's farm in Canning Vale for a short while before building their own home on 4 ¹/₂ acres in Evelyn Street, Gosnells. They even hand made the tiles for their own roof.

Soon after, she found herself without a husband and supporting her only daughter. She lived in many places and now lives in Kelmscott. Her extended family includes one daughter, 5 grandchildren, 11 great-grandchildren and 2 greatgreat grandchildren. (See below.)

When asked: 'what prompted you to become an Australia citizen?' she said: 'I love the fresh air and relaxed lifestyle. I have lived in Australia for 60 years and made my life here. I have seen my family thrive and decided it was important to officially become Australian. I feel this country has been

Roleybushcare We Salute You!

It is often the case that prophets are not effectively valued in their hometowns. So I wonder if Roleystone residents realise the importance of Roleybushcare and some of the members of this group, to the International understanding of Dieback and best practice in its treatment and management?

On July 16, 220 attendees went to the Western Australian Dieback Conference. A contingent from The Roleystone group has had an immeasurable impact on dieback management.

A significant contribution has come from Dr Ian Colquhoun who addressed the conference focussing on a worldwide perspective of dieback, including the effect of a related Dieback water mould in Chile that has affected 60000 hectares of forest and created devastation on the Kauri forests in New Zealand. It is now recognised that there are over 140 species of dieback (up from only 70 ten years ago).

In Ian's words: 'Roleybushcare is one of the most active and successful dieback action groups in the world.'

So how did Roleystone get to lead the world in this area? Once again it is largely down to Ian Colquhoun who first noticed that the Jarrah trees were dying at the Roleystone District High

> School site, over 17 years ago. (At this stage it was widely understood to be Jarrah Dieback and thought to be largely exclusive to Jarrah trees).

> Ian knew that CALM had already developed a technique to treat trees to improve their chances of survival but there was no way to get this distributed or to get the expertise out there. So Ian and some like-minded friends founded the Roleystone Dieback Action Group and they 'started injecting trees and educating the public about how to limit the spread of dieback!' The rest, as they say, is history.

> This model was very successful and became the template for other groups across the state. Later the group diversified to include other areas of bush management and thus Roleybushcare was born.

Well done to all the volunteers at Roleybushcare. Your refforts are awesome!

Yellow Pages Scam

Recently I received a fax asking me to update my details to Yellow Pages with free submission to google, the deadline given was July 2010.

I have discovered that this is a scam after 'googleing" YELLOW PUBLISHING. The fax comes from Manchester in the UK and has nothing to do with our Yellow pages. There are lots of small business being caught. One dead give away is the upside down fingers – these appear upright in the bogus fax. (Compared to the yellow pages logo). The company want all of your contact details plus they want you to pay in advance. Be aware and read the fine print before you reply to this scheme. READ THE FINE PRINT!!!

SCAM Alert: Yellow pages scheme

A misleading fax has been turning up at business premises across WA. It's for a \$129 per month scheme run under the website www.yellowpage-westernaustralia.com.

The unsolicited fax, which has an inverted version of the "Walking Fingers" logo, implies that by signing up you are agreeing to renew your business name listing with a well-known directory service.

In fact you will receive a tax invoice for \$1548 for a 12 month listing with an internet directory scheme, which is not the primary business phone listing directory the fee information is contained within the terms and conditions.

WHEN SIGNAGE IS APPROVED BY THE CITY OF ARMADALE

Following the recent articles in the Roleystone Courier about the legitimacy of signs displayed on road verges (and on private land), I requested clarification of

The following was provided to outline the

The City of Armadale's Town Planning Scheme No 4 allows the display of one advertising sign per property, for sale

Directional signage is not permitted, as it is considered detrimental to the amenity of a residential area. In addition there are traffic safety and "visual pollution" issues associated with this kind of signage.

The community's right to amenity is protected by the City's Signs, Hoardings and Billposting Policy & By-Law:

- 1. No commercial advertising signs or hoarding shall be permitted in Road
- 2. Moveable or portable signs, in a street or public place are prohibited
- Signs are not permitted if they do not relate to the land use or occupancy

of that land (i.e. advertising that promote premises elsewhere).

While the City supports business, there needs to be a commonsense approach to advertising.

There are options other than directional signage - such as advertising in local newspapers and the internet - to inform potential property buyers.

Thus it would appear that many signs that exist around town are clearly contravening these bylaws. Leader signs for Real Estate Agents are clearly against the law.

The bylaws indicate that so are casual signs for club registrations, market days and garage sales. While prosecution of 'offenders' may clearly create some grief (particularly if 'the offender' is a club or community organisation) the display of events far after they are over is clearly annoying us all.

I am not asking for a billboard free, sign free environment just that whoever puts them up realises that many people are offended by our environment being so polluted. So please be responsible.

RESPONSE TO AIRCRAFT NOISE OVER THE HILLS AREA

There have been many letters to the editor in the Roleystone Courier expressing concern about aircraft noise over the hills over the past year. Residents from Roleystone to Byford will now have direct access to an independent voice to air their concerns about aircraft noise from Perth airport.

I am sure Canning residents will welcome the recent Gillard Government's announcement that Ron Brent had been appointed as the nation's first independent Aircraft Noise Ombudsman. Mr Brent has been Deputy Commonwealth Ombudsman since 2003.

Mr Brent's appointment will allow residents living under flight paths to have their complaints about aircraft noise properly and fairly dealt with and will lead to aircraft operators being required to reduce noise impacts.

Perth Airport's flight paths have changed as a result of decisions made by the Howard Government. Unfortunately there was no opportunity given to our hills residents to be involved in the process that led to that change. The Ombudsman now provides the right opportunity for our residents' concerns to be heard.

I'll be inviting the Ombudsman to our area as soon as the election is over so we can get all the issues on the table as soon as possible.

Eco Friendly Farmer

Chris Oliver is choosing to live a 'rural good life' on his own terms. Chris semi retired in 2001 and is now fully involved in his acreage off Eugene Place in Karragullen. He grows cherries, nuts, stone fruit, apples and pears.... plus some other things too.

Trees and our local soils fascinate Chris and readers who want to chat about these topics should make contact with him. He will be very happy to have a yarn with you about his favourite subject.

Chris has been involved in running his orchard for 22 years and this came after a lifetime of teaching all aspects of horticulture at both TAFE and UWA. With nearly 30 years of lecturing in Horticulture, including fruit tree production and soil science, it is not surprising that he became passionate about fruit trees.

Chris' main interest lies in pruning and regenerating trees to give them a new lease of life. He is particularly interested in pruning and tending old fruit trees using tree surgery techniques; nutrition including fertilisation and controlling pests and diseases to bring trees back to health. So don't give up on that old apricot tree – Chris may have the answer.

A walk around Chris' orchard reveals how he has combined his horticultural knowledge with experience about what works in 'his location'. With his farm high up on laterite gravely soils he has spent many years building up his soil to allow him to grow fruit successfully.



He reflects that many early orchardists coming into the district chose the deeper, more fertile loam soils in the valleys, so he has had to make the best of what he has.

Chris is not totally organic, realising that occasionally sprays are a necessity, however he keeps chemical treatments to a minimum, preferring more ecologically friendly strategies to keep pests at bay. Still with kangaroos, parrots, silver eyes, stumpy lizards and a multiplicity of bush animals that all seem to love 'fresh fruit' eternal vigilance is needed.

He does not only 'do trees', he will prune your roses, show you how to graft and bud your plants or just give advice about irrigation or garden development.

Chris is a real gentleman and has a wonderful knowledge about horticulture and even shows empathy with trees. He is married to Janet and has two sons. One son Luke has followed his Dad's lead and he is a Landscape Supervisor with a Perth landscaper.

Readers who need help or advice with their trees should give him a call on 9397 5686 – he certainly knows his trees.

Chris will be the guest speaker at the Organic Growers meeting in August and will be talking about growing and looking after Nut trees.




Taj Turns One







Maybe I could even link it to my previous article about Roleystone being considered boring and people feeling lonely and alienated. However with all these factors running through my head while I type away, nothing brings me any closer to an answer or a solution. But what I

do believe is that death is an inevitable part of everyone's life no matter the generation, age or gender.

I also do not think that these death rates have to do with the younger generation and their wayward ways. At present the depression count of people 16-25 in Australia is 160,000 and the road count gets higher every day. I believe that this was also the case many years ago, it is just that depression is now more recognized that the figures are being highlighted. Depression has always been there as have drugs and cars, though perhaps now, due to modern record keeping, it all seems more prominent.

Although I do not feel that I am an expert on this subject, it does make me wonder and think and then wonder some more, as to why all these things happen. The stats above are mind boggling. Everyone knows someone, suffers from depression or has died

The lead article in the first ever Roleystone Courier released on October 10th 1977 (yes, we are 33 years old this month!) would have told readers the answer to the question posed in last month's Courier about where the original Buckingham property was.

The first Courier had the following story: 'In the very early days of WA's history the Buckingham family purchased the whole of the Roleystone Estate for less than 2 shillings an acre. Mr Buckingham and his son walked from Perth and back to inspect the property. They built their first home on the Canning River near Croyden Road. They farmed the south side of the river growing wheat and raising cattle. ...

Mr Thomas Buckingham's cottage is at the base of the Araluen Golf Resort.




Some History of Karragullen....

Karragullen was officially named in 1912 with the opening of the Karragullen Railway Station.

The word is an Aboriginal word meaning Red Gully and was suggested by Daisy Bates as the most appropriate name for this location. The first train to arrive was greeted with great ceremony and the ribbon across the line was held by Mabel Parker and Doris Bettenay.

Karragullen was the end of the line for the Upper Darling Range Railway, which was built in the late 1800's to transport timber, mainly jarrah, to Midland junction. The route covered about twentyone miles and stopped at over a dozen small towns and sidings along the way.

The well-known zig zag formed part of the line. Many early pioneers recall the slowness of the train as it went up the zig zag. They could get off the train and cut through, picking wildflowers on the way and catch the train as it caught up to them.

For many years the railway terminated at Canning Mills and several small 'log lines' were set up to carry the logs to the main line.

The timber cutters worked in gangs at spot mills, taking firewood and cutting sleepers, mainly for the export market. Jarrah blocks paved many of London's streets in those days. These connecting train lines were not permanent and were ripped up as the commercial sized trees were stripped from an area.

Illawarra orchard was selected in 1891and following this, other orchards were started over the next 15 years putting increased pressure on the need for a more permanent line to service the flourishing orchard industry.

With the extension of the train line, Karragullen became a busy thriving railway town with contractors loading the trains with timber three times a day, during the week. The trains ran on the weekend too, with two trains on Saturday and one on Sunday. They were the lifeblood of Karragullen; everything came to Karragullen via the train: mail, food, goods, people and even livestock. It was quite a social event for the locals to go to

meet the mail train each evening. Everyone had his own undisputed hitching post for his/her horse.

A row of timber and Hessian huts sprang up beside the line. The station itself stood where the liquor store is today.

The early pioneers did not only work – the Karragullen Literary Society was formed in 1915: On March 31st 1915 a meeting of members and friends of 'The Canning Mills Fruit Growers Association who took part in the play 'Our Nell' was held. Mrs Jobson suggested that

they should form themselves into a society for 'Musical Improvement and Pleasure'. Present were: Mr and Mrs Jobson, Messers: Hanbury, Stinton, Ferguson, The Parker family: Mary, Peter, Lillian, Alfred and Mabel, The Bettenays: Doris, Arthur and Wilfred and Rod MacCaskill.' Taken from the inaugural minutes of The Society.

The first Karragullen hall was opened in 1921. Harvest festivals were held annually and dances were held every Saturday. 'Dances, fights and much beer drinking' recalled Lyle Portwine, an early resident. The first Church Services were held in a packing shed. The first athletics meeting was held in 1922 (apparently wood chopping was a very popular event!)

The glory days of Karragullen were numbered as a government ruling followed after the determination to develop a dam to provide water for Perth – this was to be Canning Dam. The ruling determined that no human habitation would be allowed in the catchment and as a result many of the orchards were resumed. This had a decimating impact on the township of Karragullen with over half the population leaving over a ten-year period. More on this another time.....

The good old days of the railway line ended in 1949 when the trains stopped running due to a nationwide coal strike. Within three years the tracks and sleepers had been pulled up, the loggers had gone and Karragullen's future was written.

An interesting point about the railway line and station comes from Palliser Smailes memoirs: When the railway was extended from Canning Mills in 1911, two miles of construction had been authorised. But the money ran out before the two miles was completed.

The station was thus built half a mile short of where the townsite was gazetted (near today's Rock Inne site) thus the townsite was always 'rather spread out'.





The Beech Famil Holiday in Nepal



Continuing Shannon Beech's story of trecking in Nepal with a 3 year old.

So Pokhora Lake was really spectacular and so was the weather for this time of year in Nepal; cold with crystal clear days and then some days of rain. It was February and winter in Nepal. We really did miss HOT shower as most systems are run on solar or gas and not too reliable. Nepal has electrical cuts to save energy (usually between 6pm and 11pm). It was fascinating to be at a restaurant in candlelight and still be able to order most food items on the menu. All of the food is handmade and prepared fresh so there is no instant food, if you are hungry order earlier than you are ready to eat. They use lots of spice in their food! Be warned when travelling with a small child, when a Nepali waiter says it's not hot it still can be. The good point is that it is so inexpensive, we would order a few dishes to share and one would always be suitable for a little person's

Other activities we participated in over the time : Motorbike riding for 4 days, this was a beautiful way to scope the countryside and villages at our leisure. Baylin loved this but there are no real road rules so yes it is dangerous.

We attended many Yoga classes and then a live-in Yoga retreat at Sadhana Yoga. The venue, location and structure of daily activities were enlightening and easy paced, relaxing and retreating our minds and body. However the Yoga teaching/instructing was a little disappointing for us. The Nepali - Indian trained teacher, seemed well educated with 20 years of knowledge, but lacked in communicating the Yogic message to students.

Trekking was next as we approached the Annapurna Range. We hired a porter/guide/child carrier! Yes we trekked up to Poon Hill 3200mtrs above sea level. 6 days of trekking and Baylin our son enjoyed the best of it! Sitting in the Dueter backpack having the ride of his life. Kumar and Baylin became friends chatting and exchanging explanations of the environment in Nepali and English. We would trek



for 5-8 hrs a day, they were huge days and the trekking environment is not to be taken lightly. There are land- slides and rock falls, cliff drop offs, slippery icy tracks, snow and a track: 45% ascending and 45% decending and 10% flatish, to encounter.

All in all the 5 weeks our family spent in Nepal was restful and eye opening. We all gained a deeper understanding of the Nepalese and are grateful for the opportunities and clean environment we have here in Roleystone. Our views changed from this journey, to come home to a big house, with a washing machine and running hot water, power 24 hrs a day, luxury cars to travel in and toys to play with.

Touring to Nepal is not a luxury holiday and travelling with a small child is not relaxing in a way you may imagine. Nepal has been an amazing journey and a time of connecting for our family.





GARDENING NOTES

JEAN: 9397 5547

My mother gave me a useful piece of gardening advice when I first moved to the cottage in Raeburn Road: not to pull the long weeds until the danger of frost is over.

This year I was happy that I had heeded her advice because so many plants were damaged but the root zone was not affected and the plants will survive when they get their spring cutback. In my garden Hibiscus were very badly damaged, yet Camellias were unaffected; some flowers may have been spoiled but nothing to complain about.

(Try also to remember our bandicoots when weeding and cutting back as these little creatures use the denser habitats as home areas.)

I transferred some lauristinus from the last garden and since being here it has formed a lovely dense hedge, this is a plant that requires very little maintenance and even less water.

I'm quite worried about the lack of rainfall as the garden is showing so many signs of spring with almond trees in blossom and the first daffodils starting to open. It will be important to place mulch all over the

garden beds to retain whatever moisture is in the ground. If you lose plants try to replace them with much hardier and drought tolerant varieties.

The Camellia Society of Western Australia Inc will be presenting a display at Pioneer Gardens Nursery, Nicholson Road Canningvale on the 7th and 8th of August 9am to 5pm. This is your opportunity to check out varieties and also try to find out which ones you have in your own gardens. An expert will be on hand at all times to answer your questions and endeavour to sort out any problems you may be encountering.

There will be a raffle and the opportunity to win either a camellia or an azalea, maybe even a gardenia. The plants at the nursery are looking particularly attractive. Plants about 5 ft tall for \$25 - \$95. Plus there will be some varieties on special. A range of 'High Fragrance' camellias, very tall and well grown, are priced between \$23 - \$95. I have several and they coped well with full sun last summer. I would love to meet as many of you as possible during the weekend.





BLUE SWIMMER CRAB LINGUINI BY DON RANDALL 320g dried linguine

5 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil plus extra for serving 1 garlic clove thinly sliced

1/2 red chilli seeded and sliced

3 tablespoons parsley chopped

4 blue swimmer crabs (cooked for 8 to 10 minutes in boiling salted water, meat extracted) or 250g crab meat salt and fresh ground pepper

Cook the pasta in a large pot of generously salted water while you prepare the crab. In a frying pan, gently heat the oil and add the garlic and chilli. Cook until the garlic is pale gold, then add the parsley and salt to taste. Stir for half a minute then add the crabmeat and juice, if any. Remove from heat, add the cooked, drained pasta and stir to coat. Add a good drizzle of oil and cracked pepper. Serve immediately.

This dish relies on quality pasta, olive oil and the freshness of the crab and garlic.

DEPRESSION AND SUICIDE

Whilst not a subject every one wants to talk about, mental illness is the third most common disease state in Australia. In fact 15% (1 in 6) Australians will be affected by depression at sometime in their life. About 6% of Australians in any one year will be affected by depression, which occurs more commonly in woman (7.1% women than men 5.3%.)

Unfortunately within society mental illness carries a stigma with it such that only about 35% of people suffering depression seek medical advice in any year. This is of great concern considering that those with clinical depression are at greater risk of suicide.

The most common age for onset of depression is 25 with up to 40% of people having another episode within a year. Many do not realise that depression is a chronic life long condition with lengthy remissions and reoccurrences throughout life. As age progresses the episodes of depression occur more frequently and last longer.

Risk Factors: are many and varied. Depression can be triggered by shortterm events or long-term personal factors. Short term factors include: Stresses such as family conflict, divorce, interpersonal conflicts, death of a loved one etc; drugs and alcohol; and medical illness such as heart attack, stroke, Parkinson's disease. Personal factors include: family history, high anxiety states, past bad experiences such as abuse and predisposing personality traits.

Symptoms: Depression presents in a wide variety of ways.

- Depressed mood
- Irritability and agitation
- Appetite changes resulting in either considerable weight loss or gain

- Inability to sleep or sleeping too much
- Fatigue, loss of energy

• Thoughts of death and suicide. Suicide: One of the significant risk factors of depression is suicide. Males are 3-4 times more likely to die by suicide than females although there is a higher incidence of suicidal thoughts in woman. People often feel so helpless and overwhelmed with their situation that they can see no way out. Alcohol and drug use when depressed, increases the risk of suicide.

Helping those with mental illness:

- Allow the person to talk
- Be a good listener.
- Be non judgemental and accept the person for who they are
- Encourage them to visit their doctor and to seek professional help
- Be there for them and support them

It was late on a Sunday morning, with preparations for Xmas in

July well underway, when frantic phone calls over the space of an hour resulted in a little, furless, Western Grey joey kangaroo (a "pinkie") being brought to my home by a lovely family. These wonderful people had cared enough to stop to check a roadside kangaroo to find a little baby in her pouch. They kept the baby warm, phoned for advice and then drove for over an hour to bring the "pinkie" to me. The care this family showed was fantastic, it gave the "pinkie" a great chance of survival and me a wonderful Xmas present!!

If you are unfortunate enough to hit a kangaroo or see one that has

been hit it is really important to stop (when safe to do so) and assist the injured animal and young if present. Obviously safety to yourself and others comes first, so always park safely and alert other traffic to the situation

(turn on hazard lights, send someone to alert traffic etc.)

Injured Kangaroo:

An injured kangaroo is in pain, terrified and potentially extremely dangerous, so it is important to stay away, keep noise to a minimum and seek urgent help by contacting a local wildlife carer, a wildlife shelter or Wildcare Helpline 9494 9055. No attempt should be made to move an injured kangaroo. When help arrives it is important to follow the directions given and offer support to this person.

Dead Kangaroo:

If the kangaroo is dead it is vital to check for pouch young and if present get urgent help.

Furless Joeys "Pinkies" need warmth to survive. The easiest way at roadside is to gently remove it

from the pouch and put it up your shirt to use body heat for warmth. Wrapped wheat packs, warm water bottles etc. can also be used but are usually not available at the roadside!

Urgent contact with and transport to a wildlife carer or facility is required.

Furred joeys will need to be secured in an artificial pouch: pillow case, t shirt etc and taken to a carer urgently. Contact with joeys should be kept to a minimum as stress will kill.

The dead kangaroo should be removed from the road to prevent further accidents.

Roadside marsupial accidents are traumatic for all involved but a little help can often save a lot of suffering and maybe even a life. Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.



I'm close by the Danube River in the south west corner of Romania with the HOST team, a joint project between folk in England and Romania which Hilary and I helped initiate some time ago. It's been picked up by others now and it's going very well by any yardstick. At its heart is the establishment of a community centre and refuge for the victims of domestic violence. The practical work in setting up the community centre in Oravita is now more or less completed. The service to the community really starts in September with the opening of the internet café, the English library and the counselling rooms. One part of the building is already being used as a meeting centre. The refuge will be available for use in September too.

But perhaps more significant than the physical stuff has been the wonderful atmosphere amongst all the young folk from both Lincoln and Oravita. They are enjoying so much being together, working on the project, playing football and basketball, camping (what thunderstorm?) and swimming in the Danube - just chilling out too. They all talk



vigorously about the future, their personal plans, about getting together again next year, about raising funds so the Romanians can visit the UK and so much more. It's a huge contrast with the situation we encountered a few years ago. I firmly believe that, having soaked the project in prayer, something special is going on and it would be great if we could tap into it here too, reaping some benefits for the youth in Rolevstone.

The Romanian kids have come out of a desperate, restrictive and hopeless regime, emerging with life and vitality and optimism. The English kids are nearly all from comfortable, privileged and relatively wealthy backgrounds. They are emerging with some understanding of how others struggle for the things they accept as normal and they're giving of themselves to make a difference. And they're all having a ball! Neither of the groups exactly parallels the situation here but there are enough common factors to imagine how the approach could be adapted and adopted.

I am ever more convinced it is a God given model and we should at least explore how we might use it to make a difference here and elsewhere, maybe linking in with another community from a different cultural background. This isn't a purely Church project; it is something to which the whole community can contribute. After all, every one of us is responsible for what this community becomes.







From time to time I wonder why such a lot of people seem to have the sort of death wish that makes them prone to believing any old claptrap about the "end of days", Armageddon, looming cosmic catastrophe, and all of that. Are their lives so boring that they hanker for a sudden, spectacular demise?

Anyway, this month brings an adrenaline buzz for such people because of the purported alignment of the planets: Mercury, Venus, Saturn and Mars will all be easily visible in the western sky after nightfall. Venus, Saturn and Mars will seem close together.

Use Venus as your reference point – it's the unmistakable "evening star" that stands out in the WNW at dusk.

Below and somewhat to the left of Venus at nightfall in the earlier half of August you'll find Mercury looking like a bright star. Above and a bit to the right of Venus in the first days of the month you'll find Mars and Saturn, looking like a pair of moderately bright stars quite near each other.

As the first fortnight of August unfolds, watch how Venus, Mars and Saturn change position: a fine example of planetary motion! They're *wanderers*. That's what "planet" means. Greg Lowe Perth Observatory

As well, the waxing crescent moon comes into that picture on the 12th, 13th and 14th. Particularly on the 13th. Will any of these planetary peregrinations have any effect on your life? No, but it's diverting to watch and to think of how it must have disturbed the ancients to see these few disorderly "stars" upsetting the otherwise constant patterns and processions of the constellations. Especially when the brightest starlike object, Venus, seems to be orchestrating the disorder. Remember Lee Marvin in *Paint Your Wagon* ? He sang, "I was born under a wandering star". Nope, Lee, under a planet. It doesn't have the same ring to it, I'll admit.

There are only five planets bright enough to be seen with the unaided eye: Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn. Jupiter misses the planet party in the western sky – it comes up in the east at about 10pm in early August, and then about 4 minutes earlier day by day. So it rises around 9pm in midmonth, and by 8pm at month's end.

The Moon's waning at the start of the month, with last quarter on the 3^{rd} . That's the half moon that rises around midnight and is highest at dawn. New moon, no moon, is on the 10^{th} . By the evening of the 11^{th} the thin new crescent moon will be visible just above the western horizon at dusk, weather permitting. Each night after that, the crescent will be fatter, higher and easier to see. It slips by Mercury on the $11^{th} - 12^{th}$, then past Saturn, Venus and Mars on the $13^{th} - 14^{th}$. First quarter, the evening half moon, is on the night of the 16^{th} (2:14am on the 17^{th}), full moon's on the night of the 24^{th} (1:05am on the 25^{th}), and it's back to last quarter again on September 2^{nd} .

Teachers, evening moon observations should run from the 11^{th} or 12^{th} to the 24^{th} or 25^{th} . *Happy Gazing.*
