SKATE PARK ACTION

There were many local issues raised in the recent pre-election phase and many of us hope that these come to fruition.

One promise from Labor to: 'provide seed funding of \$50 000 to help rejuvenate the Roleystone Skate Park, ultimately achieving its expansion and re-design in cooperation with local organisations,' is now under threat with a hung parliament.

You must be prepared to wait a while; it is not a fast process from either website. Still it is definitely worth it if you want back copies.



After a long period of planning, the amalgamation of the two Roleystone schools is now one step closer with the commencement of earthworks at the District High School site.

The school has long been known for its beautiful native bush surroundings and thus all clearing was carefully monitored to ensure that the bare minimum occurred. Prior to this occurring the school's Bushranger troop and a range of enthusiastic staff, engaged in frenetic activity to transplant a number of spectacular grasstrees to new locations.

Two major grasstrees were shifted to the font of the school. Others were sent to a renowned grasstree nursery for rejuvenation.

The excavators moved in on Wednesday 18th August, clearing great swathes of bushland for the two major classroom blocks, play areas and an additional undercover assembly area. The building program will also include refurbishment of the library burnt out in January.

Bulldozing Ahead at Roleystone College

Another step towards the amalgamation has been that the combined School Council has sent a proposal to the Nomenclature Committee that the name for the new school be Roleystone College.

TELSTRA SCAM

This is a response from Telstra after a very authentic email was received purporting to be from Telstra requesting billing clarification on line.

I understand you are concerned with the email that you have just received.

Firstly, thank you for bringing this to our attention and I can confirm that the email you have received is a hoax and hasn't been sent from BigPond[®] and we do take a number of steps to attempt to block these sorts of emails getting through to you.

BigPond never asks members for their account details, personal bank or credit card details by following a link in an email. If we needed you to update any payment information, we'd ask you to log in to 'My BigPond' through our website. My BigPond is a secure site, verified by the padlock that appears in your internet browser's status bar.

The Passing of a Son of Early Pioneers Vale Fred Pound (31/7/29 – 9/8/10)

Fred Pound was born in Roleystone to early residents, Daphne and Jim Pound. The Pounds started the Croyden Valley Tea Rooms and orange orchard on Croyden Road. Fred was the middle brother between Mervyn Pound and youngest brother Ray (dec) who farmed the property over many decades.

Fred lived at the property until he won a scholarship to study at Perth Boys School (boarding at his aunt's home which is where Macdonalds is now, on the corner of Canning Highway and Berwick St in South Perth). He went on to study architectural drafting and rose high in his profession. He had a full life being a member of the Australian Institute of Building Fellows -Australian Institute of Architects, founding member of Melville Glades Golf Club, Past Master and Life Member of Lodge Thistle, East Fremantle Freemasons.

In his working life he was a Head of

Department of Architectural and Building Studies at TAFE WA, Resident Architect -Fremantle Bi-Centenary Heritage Project, Joint Architect 3000 student TAFE College Seremban and Mt Kiara, Malaysia Building coordinator and Operations Manager for 12 projects over Malaysia, Nepal, China and East Borneo.

Fred married local girl Marjorie Pool and they moved away from Roleystone,

however he always referred to himself as a Roleystone boy.

For his 70th birthday the family negotiated to return to the refurbished Croyden Valley tea rooms (now a private residence) to celebrate a life well lived.

Split Norfolk Island Pine's Days Are Numbered

residents As drive west down Brookton Highway just past the Brookton Valley shops, they may have noticed the spectacular and very old Norfolk Island pines.

One of these is bifurcated, perhaps indicating it was struck by lightning many years ago causing the top of the tree to grow

into the unusual two prongs. This makes it exceptionally unique.

These stately pines were planted approx 100 years ago beside Vera and Ron Buckingham's house and shop at 2 Armstrong Road in Kelmscott. This shop was at its pinnacle in the post war decade, providing valuable items to the many migrants who resided at the migrant camp across the road. Many would have sheltered under the shade of these stately trees. (The house originally known as Clover, was built around 1900 for Ron's father, William Buckingham. The front of the building started life as a tearoom and was converted to a shop in the late1940's.)

The pines are mentioned in the City of Armadale's Municipal Heritage Inventory entry for Vera Buckingham's House and Shop as part of the aesthetic value of the site.



Sadly it has now been determined that the bifurcated tree is unsafe. Not only are some branches too close to powerlines and need to be pruned back but an independent Arboriculturalist, John Banks, has confirmed that the tree is unstable. The tree is starting to weep sap from the bifurcation. This indicates that the area is structurally unsound and that there is a high possibility that one or more of the leaders could separate and fall. If the leader on the house side falls it may very well take out the shop, which also has significant heritage value.

The comments of the Community Heritage Advisory Group (CHAG), a group that consists of community representatives, Councillor representation and officers of the City of Armadale who provide advice to the City on heritage matters, has been sought on the tree.

Jarrah Ward Councillor Pat Hart, a Member of CHAG, who is passionate about the history of the area said: 'I know how historically sensitive this tree is with many of our long-term residents and how visually significant it is."

'Given however the arboriculturist's report on the tree and the associated risks tabled, it is a very difficult one. I know that many residents would like it to stay, but the issue of duty of care once the risks are identified does not give many options.'

She has requested that the tree's history and associated photos be logged in at History House for future reference.





BUCKINGHAM DECENDENTS MOVE BACK TO ROLEYSTONE

Pauline and Steven McGregor have just moved into the area having purchased a home in Butcher Road. For Pauline this is a case of 'returning home' as she is a descendent of the original inhabitants of the area, the Buckinghams.

She was very interested to read the article in the July edition on Denson Baker - the cinematographer for 'The Waiting City'; she discovered a long lost relative.

Pauline's grandmother's maiden name was Grace Buckingham. In her words: 'She was a wonderful lady who married a Brookton chap called Bob Thompson and spent most of her adult life in Brookton running the family's sheep farm.'

Grace attended Kelmscott Primary School in the 1920s. She died about 17 years ago. Grace Buckingham's father was John Buckingham whose father was a brother to the original Thomas (and Hannah) Buckingham of Roleystone. The McGregor's daughter Maree works at the RCC three days a week.





Following on from last month's story about the early days of Karrragullen.....

The railway arriving in Karragullen made it a more prominent town than its neighbour Roleystone. For many years the young orcharding community thrived until some government decisions based around the water supply for Perth, seriously limited its existence and any possibility of future growth.

A typhoid epidemic in the 1890's lead to the widespread belief that 'minimal human occupation should occur within a catchment area providing a water supply'. This lead to major ramifications to the township of Karragullen that lasted over the next forty years, as many early orchards and mill settlements in this area lay on the catchment streams leading to Canning Dam.

The history of this resumption was that the young colony of Perth lacked a regular safe water supply. The Victoria Reservoir was built with the water from streams passing timber settlements including Canning Mills and Bartons Mill (on the outskirts of Karragullen). These mill settlements were producing quantities of effluent that, for many years, found its way into the water supply*.

During the 1890's there were a number of deaths attributed to typhoid in the new colony. 89 deaths occurred in 1896, 134 in 1897. Over 3500 cases were reported in only four years in this decade. The typhoid epidemic also struck the Canning Mills settlement causing numerous deaths. This epidemic was largely blamed on the polluted water. Twenty years later this memory underpinned government policy when they started to plan to build Canning Dam.

From the memoirs of Palliser Smailes, the son of a Karragullen pioneer orchardist: 'Talk began to circulate that the Government were planning to clear all settlers off the proposed catchment area in the early 1920's.'

'14 properties were affected; 2 properties Illawarra and Rokewood were exempt; 12 others were not so lucky and were resumed.'

Some like Pal's Father were devastated by the news. He had spent his lifetime clearing the land and the young orchard was just starting to

succeed.

'It seemed a ridiculous scheme to allow all this beautiful land to revert back to bush after all the pioneering work, just to catch rainwater for people so far away.' ... 'Deputations were formed and protests heard by the powers that be, but the result was the same. Total resumption of the land.'

Pal's Father still owed considerable money on his farm and was never able to recoup this with the paltry amount he received as compensation - £3150 for over 30 acres of cleared orchard.

(As it happened, the dam was built in 1933 and finished by 1940, but their property 'Wahroonga' was not actually resumed until 1973!)

The effects in the district were many and widespread in 1923. Values of properties fell and the school population was drastically reduced. Only the 7 orchard properties in the west of the district, that drained into the Canning River below the catchment and Illawarra and Rokewood were allowed to continue. (Many are still thriving orchards today). The others were sold to the government or abandoned.

Today many of these have been planted with pines or have since been resold. A sad testament to the many orcharding pioneers who cleared the land, only to have it forcibly resumed.

*A quote from The Inquirer and Commercial News Dec 8 1893 shows how the public were convinced that the typhoid epidemic was from Canning Mills and that any future water supply should have no public access.

'A community of several hundred souls are contaminating and befouling that which is our daily drink. It (Canning Mills) is situated within the catchment area of the water supply of the city and the draining from the mills and the settlement pour down the billsides into the brook below fouling the erstwhile clear stream making it perturbed and stinking. The brook passes directly through the main camp and when it rains the storm waters rush down past houses, privies, pigsties, stables and what not washing their refuse into the fast flowing stream and the city's reservoir.'

Bastille Day in Ruffec Charente, France <u>14th July 2010</u>

In the last ten years Jean and Ken have attended three Bastille Days in France. Experience had given them an idea of what to expect but this one was a little bit different.....

We left the house in some disarray at 9.20 as, according to the newspaper, the parade in Ruffec was due to start at 9.30. I (Jean) was worried about parking. Ken was attired in a beret and sported his Rhodesian General Service Medal on his left pocket. This created lots of stares amongst the good burgers of Ruffec!

We arrived in Ruffec at 9.25 to discover a great abundance of parking and absolutely nothing happening anywhere. We parked our little red Hyundai and took a leisurely stroll to the Marie – aka the town hall.

On arriving there we spotted a very dapper French man fully attired in the uniform of a sergeant in the U.S. 101 Airborne Division, complete with revolver and bayonette. We asked when the parade would start. With a typical French shrug he told us that the Charentaise (the local people) are completely unreliable and the event had been supposed to start at 8.30! We sat down in the square and waited to see what would happen next. After a short time a woman dressed as Marianne - the spirit of the revolution - began announcing how Bastille Day celebrates the bravery and fortitude of the French. This was followed by the arrival of four drummers who looked splendid, dressed as grenadiers in white trousers and bright Napoleonic jackets.

The average age of these people was about 65 and one of them, in particular, sported a face that suggested a life of heavy drinking. All four of them had trousers on that were so tight they looked as if they had been sprayed on. Thank goodness it wasn't a hot day! They were great drummers and performed various routines effortlessly. Unfortunately between the drummers and Marianne, continuity ran out of steam as no one else appeared! There are limits to what one can do with a drum and two



drumsticks and how many times one can do it!!

After a while army reservists arrived with a truck towing a 105mm American howitzer. Not a lot of planning had gone into this as the truck was too large to enter the square! The howitzer was detached and by some miracle fitted between the bollards on the square. Consternation occurred next as no one had attended to the howitzer since the last Bastille Day! The gun was pointed at the sky then lowered while someone inserted some sort of chimney brush. Two of the gunners shared a cigarette whilst others sandpapered the shells – apparently this had not occurred to them as necessary, even as recently as last night!

By this time the heavens were lowering and after much messing around, the leading gunner gave the signal to fire. Coincidently there was a flash of lightening and a huge roll of thunder added to the first volley! There were meant to be twelve volleys altogether. Unfortunately rain stopped play at this point and the war (!) was cancelled for a while – despite all rhetoric concerning the way the gallant French soldiery had endured all sorts of privations!

On the other side of the square, a motley tribe of musicians had arrived sporting various instruments – some portly women, some old men and some ill at ease teenagers.

At this stage one of the army reservists hoisted the tricolour and the band struck up the Marseillaise. Ken was shaking with what I presumed was emotion at the solemnity of the occasion. I was wrong! He was shaking with mirth at the way the band murdered the finest national anthem in the world! The rendition was truly beyond belief!





Readers may have heard news of a high incidence of Parvovirus infection in dogs in the first half of this year with quite a focus around the Armadale area.

I understand from Murdoch University Pet Emergency Centre that many of the patients which were received at the Veterinary hospital were in the category of young immature dogs, which highlights the vulnerability of our new pets when we first bring them to our homes.

Recently I heard on the radio that there had also been quite a pocket of Parvovirus in the Midland area, and a media release from the Australian Veterinary Association, reports a much greater problem of Parvovirus across Australia, as vets have been treating unusually high numbers of

winter cases of this deadly dog and puppy disease this year.

Dr Graham Swinney from the Australian Veterinary Association stated that this is particularly worrying for new dog owners as parvovirus is most severe in puppies with death in around 80% of untreated cases.

This disease is highly preventable by vaccination regimes for pups and ongoing monitoring of vaccination status for older animals.

It is a good opportunity to do a microchip identification procedure as well. If you would like your pets vaccinated at home, please call Dr Judith Congrene on 0433 2137 28.

Some of the damage you do to your body IS reversible, but some IS NOT! So the sooner you quit the better. I could list the cons of smoking, but it's been done to death, so I will just end by saying that there are many ways to quit and many support mechanisms in place.

I have found the Victorian Quit website (www.quit. org.au) to be a fantastic source of information. If you want to quit, or want to support somebody else kick the addiction that is a good place to start.

Spring is here and ducklings have already started to come into care. Little ducklings can be seen happily swimming with

mum on lakes and rivers so it is hard to imagine how much trouble these little creatures are in when separated from mum. Ducklings totally rely on mum for protection, warmth, waterproofing and all other survival skills and if orphaned will die without our help. There are many views and opinions around which are confusing to all and often the poor orphaned ducklings end up without proper care.

I have a few very simple ideas that have worked for me for many years.

PROTECTION & HOUSING

Ducklings need to be contained in a quiet, secure place away from cats, dogs etc. This can be as simple as a box covered with a net or mesh. An easily changeable base of newspaper or similar will be needed and some bedding eg. a towel made into a ring shaped nest would be appreciated though care should be taken not to include any frayed cloth that the ducklings could get caught up in. Shredded paper should never be used as it is sharp and will cause paper cuts. Something to hide under such as a feather duster would also be appreciated. WARMTH

Ducklings need to be kept warm (I find

about 28-30° to be successful). It used to be as easy as deploying a light globe at one end of the box and allowing the ducklings to move from one end to the other but now our enviro friendly globes do not give off enough heat. Heat globes can be used in a similar manner though with great care and in conjunction with a good thermometer to ensure the ducklings do not cook. A thermostatically controlled situation is better.

FOOD. Chick starter crumbs in an untippable container small enough to stop the ducklings getting in and bits of grass, shredded lettuce, parsley etc. Ducklings

seldom eat for the first few days as prior to hatching they will have absorbed the remaining egg contents and will be full.

WATER: is essential but must be offered in a very small untippable container or a duckling waterer (available from stock feed stores). Orphaned ducklings lose their waterproofing very quickly and will get cold if wet and drown in big water containers.

CLEANING: Boxes, bedding, containers etc. will need to be cleaned or changed frequently.

Ducklings survive better in groups so if you find just one the best action is to find someone with ducklings of a similar size so they can be reared and released as a group.





1. Building Statistics During June 2010, a total of 186 building licences valued at \$21,897,479 were issued, compared to 194 valued at \$26,044,120 during the previous month. The total from July 2009 to the end of June 2010 was 2606 licences valued at \$345,892,800. The total for 2008/2009 was 2243 licences valued at \$286,674,726.

2. Petition re-Karragullen Facilities

Cr Wielinga tabled a petition signed by 19 residents, the prayer of which reads: "We the undersigned residents of Karragullen are being bypassed when it comes to facilities in this area. Although Karragullen is a small community it is one where there is

reasonably high community participation in local events. Our oval is well used by sporting organisations and is also home for the annual Karragullen Horticultural Field Day. The Cubs and Scouts use our local hall on a weekly basis. 

running the place and could see the remains of the wooden axle which had been at the centre of the 7 metre diameter water wheel itself. The water used to flow on to the top of the wheel and drive it round, powering the heavy mill stone grinding the corn. The stone wheel would rumble round, pounding and pounding the corn into flour. And it was immediately clear why it had become disused. The wall supporting the water wheel's axle had subsided with the constant pounding. The massive wheel must have then canted over and been prevented from turning as it hit the side wall. All the power

and energy and industry of the mill would have literally ground to a halt as the foundations gave way. It became a wreck.

Yet again I was reminded of the need for solid foundations in all aspects of life, particularly when there's a lot of pounding going on. Physically, our structures need to be standing on firm ground. Jesus used the analogy of a house built on shifting ground to teach about the need for solid spiritual foundations too. Physical and spiritual structures share many similarities but there is also a huge difference between the two. Restoring a physical building with defective foundations is often impossible or at best extremely difficult, time consuming and costly. The old mill I explored is way beyond rebuilding. But the restoration of spiritual foundations is always only a prayer away. No matter how wrecked your life has become, the God of the Bible is in the business of putting things right. And through Jesus everyone has access to his immense power to restore us - right now. If he could do it for me, he can do it for anyone! He can do it for you. Christ, Yo



The seasons are caused by the Earth's tilt. If the planet stood upright instead of having a 23.5 degree tilt, there'd be no seasons. The weather would be much the same all year round. Spring or autumn weather all the time? Not bad!

The equinox, when the days are 12 hours long and the Sun rises due east and sets due west, occurs on the 23rd. At that time the Sun is right in the plane of the Earth's equator. This year full moon also is on the 23rd, so there'll be a "harvest moon" in the northern hemisphere. In London, for instance, moonrise time will be less than 20 minutes later each day, from the 18th to the 25th this month. In ages past the natural lighting from the full or nearly full harvest moon would give extra hours for bringing in the harvest before the onset of winter.It doesn't happen every year – there must be a full moon at or near to the autumn equinox, and the effect is greater for places further from the equator.

The Moon's major phases are as follows. Last quarter on the morning of the 2nd. New moon on the 8th. First quarter on the 15th. Full moon on the 23rd, with moonrise occurring a few minutes after sunset. Last quarter on the morning of October 1st. Teachers, evening moon obs should go from the 9th or 10th to the 23rd.

Watch for the Moon being very close to Venus on the evening of the 11th. I wonder what the astrologers will make of that? Moon right next to Venus, with Mars below and to the right of them, on the anniversary of the Twin Towers attacks. Venus will continue its role as the "star" of the evening skyshow throughout this month, standing out in the western sky at dusk. Enjoy it. Late next month it'll pass from view. The other bright planet is Jupiter, which comes to opposition on the 21st. Jupiter rises in the east around 7:45pm at the start of the month. By mid-month it's visible low in the east at nightfall. By late September it's well up and will be attracting attention by virtue of its brightness and its position, more or less diametrically opposite the brilliant Venus.
