

Paul Peacock In London Anniversary of 'Les Mis'

In September Roleystone singer Paul Peacock was invited to fly to London. Here is his story.....

On the 22nd of September at 1.10am I boarded a Singapore Airlines flight bound for London and to be honest, I was very excited and just a little bit nervous. I was on my way to perform in the 25th Anniversary Concert of Les Miserables.

The concert had come as a bit of a surprise to me as I only had about 3 weeks notice that I had been offered the job! I had spent 4 years with Les Miserable's, performing in the Asia-Africa tour, 1st British National Tour and the London West End production. I felt that this was a great way to round off my association with the show, it would also be a

great opportunity to catch up with some old and very dear friends.

Our first rehearsal was at the Queens Theatre. It was like a 'who's who' of the West End and it was wonderful to see so many familiar faces. Getting 170 actors who haven't seen each other for over 10 years to sit down and shut up was like herding cat's into the sea, but once we were all settled down we slipped back into the old rhythm of the show. I must admit it was an incredible feeling to be singing with so many wonderfully talented people.

On Saturday the 2nd of October we moved to the 02 Arena for a very long day of rehearsals. It was also the first time the entire company of nearly 300 performers got to see the venue and sing with the huge 83 piece orchestra. The rehearsal ran from 10am to midnight and everyone was very tired but still very excited. The 02 Arena in London is enormous, the stadium holds over 20,000 people and the outer canopy is so big it holds dozens of restaurants, bars, cafes and night clubs. Between shows over 40,000 people would be milling around under its roof. (*Pictured left: Paul with the audience of 1000's behind him - wow.*)

Even before the concert started there was a real buzz in the stadium and when the orchestra struck the first chords of Les Miserable's the 20,000 strong crowd burst into applause. The atmosphere was electric, for the next 3 hours they were treated to amazing performances from Alfie Bo, Matt Lucas and Lea Salonga to name just a few. The show ended with the

original cast of Les Mis coming onto the stage to a standing ovation. The highlights are too many to mention but you can see for yourself when the DVD comes out next month. It was one of the most amazing nights of my life and I felt so incredibly lucky to have been a part of it.

I would like to thank everyone who kindly donated money to help fund my trip. Special thanks to the Araluen Golf Resort, Roleystone Real Estate, and Brian and Sandy Weir at Roleystone Family Meats for their generous donations.

Gerry Travels to India in the Fight Against Leprosy

Should I tell you about the horrendous traffic with constant horn blaring and five lines of traffic - cars, trucks, bicycles, motor cycles and motorised trishaws fighting for space on a two lane road, avoiding cows and dogs?

Would you rather hear about the caring, committed and compassionate doctors and nurses who treat the lowly villagers with their weeping ulcers, sores, clawed hands and cataracts? The Leprosy Mission is there to treat all leprosy patients, who traditionally have been outcasts, with dignity and efficiency. The hospital provides follow up care which is not available in Government Hospitals.

I could write about the indescribable filth, excrement and foul water in the slum community living on the mountainous rubbish tip in Delhi. Or I could highlight the generosity, delight and willingness to help others that we found in these communities. The generosity of the village leaders, the delight on the faces of the children as we took photographs and distributed a few gifts and the willingness of small groups to work together to share goats and initiate small business ventures. Certainly a land of contrasts - India will open your eyes to both ends of the spectrum of life. An exciting and intense experience is a "given" to any visitor but I was blessed to be part of a group working with The Leprosy Mission and as such, was able to be in an "operation" theatre watching a tendon transplant procedure,



to interact with leprosy sufferers who had rather horrendous injuries, to visit people and children in slums (they call them communities) and see the work done by the Leprosy Mission, to be involved with delightful young men and women learning a trade at the Vocational school in Bunkurra (where I was part of a march through the streets, waving placards and shouting slogans such as "Leprosy is not a sin" "Please don't hate lepers").

Although 95% of the world's population have a natural immunity to leprosy and although there is a cure which will render the leper non infectious within 48 hours, the stigma and shame associated with being a leper makes it very difficult for a poor afflicted villager to seek medical help.

Often by the time the patient presents, surgery is the only treatment left. It is humbling to see how, patiently and respectfully the doctors treat their patients, how skilfully, with limited equipment, patients are cared for and it is gratifying to know that in a very, very small way, I am part of this wonderful work.

In India, people are not disabled - they are differently abled.

All in all, an exciting, heart warming and to some extent a troubling trip. I could, of course mention the food! You can see in the picture that I gained a few kilos!

I recall many Sunday school events on this land and I am sure many across our community share many happy memories of events held at this location. It seems to me rather disturbing that this, quite sacred land, should now be sold for residential purposes.

In 1910 Mrs Peet donated 15 acres of land to 'the local church'. This gift enabled the early residents of Roleystone to construct their place of worship. Thus the original 'Congregational Church' was built on this land around 1912 and subsequently a range of other buildings were constructed, all with a vested history in the church and the community.

The fifteen acres were in three blocks: School house number two was constructed on the most western block, the old church and the church buildings are sited on the middle block. The third 10 acre block has recently been subdivided into two - this block was once the site of the old camp school and is now an unofficial car park and bushland. These are the two that are now being offered for sale. However, it is not our local Community Church that is selling the blocks – in fact many local parishioners would prefer they were not sold.

In 1976 many of the congregational

churches joined with other churches to form the Uniting Church. The local Roleystone congregation opted to not join the Uniting Church, instead deciding that they would remain an independent Congregational Church, subsequently becoming a Community Church in the Churches of Christ movement. In 1976 the deeds of all the land went with the Uniting Church, as the local church group was not incorporated.

Over the next few decades the Community Church did become incorporated and did manage to re-acquire the two western blocks. Sadly the Uniting Church, with no presence in the local community, has decided to put 'their land' on the market. This will now be sold and land that was donated to the community of Roleystone will now be sold to give profit to a church with no presence in our community. This just seems unjust to me. The money raised from the sale of the land will be used to establish churches in the new areas around the southern corridor.

A comment from Pastor David Bardsley: 'We see the sale of this land as very disappointing, especially as none of the funds raised will be used for the benefit of the local community. However our stance is that we have no intention of moving in the near future. We have a strong community focus and we fully intend to develop the church for the community. We are enthusiastically pursuing renovating the old church for use as a community and heritage centre.'

So what do you think?

I urge you to write to the Uniting Church or to the Courier, if you too oppose the sale of this land, obviously gifted to OUR community.

UNITING CHURCH RESPONSE TO EDITORIAL REGARDING SALE OF LAND.

The following response is provided by Robert Locke, Associate General Secretary Resources, Uniting Church in Australia, Synod of Western Australia.

For almost 100 years, this land (Lots 501 and 502) has been held by the Uniting Church, Synod of Western Australia and prior to formation in 1977, by the Congregational Union. The transfer of land bequeathed by Mrs Peet occurred in May, 1913.

The now Roleystone Community Church withdrew from the Congregational Union in December, 1969, but part of this land (Lots 15 and 50) were transferred to the Roleystone Community Church in 1973 and 1977.

The Uniting Church has explored many uses for lots 501 and 502 over many years, including as a camp site. When the Uniting Church discerned that this land was no longer required, it has always been the preference of the Church to sell the land to the Roleystone Community Church at market value. Regrettably, in June this year, the Roleystone Community Church withdrew from negotiations to purchase the land due to an inability to agree on market value.

In 2008, the crown resumed an area of 4,619 square metres of this land as a recreation reserve. It is incumbent on the Uniting Church to ensure good and faithful stewardship of this gift and funds from the sale of this land will be used to continue and enhance outreach to the community within the metropolitan area of Perth.







Teacher of the Year Finalists

Ms Ruby Rajor of Roleystone District High school has reached the final stage; being a State Finalist in the WA Education Awards 2010. Ruby is one of only four teachers remaining in the competition. Another well known Roleystone resident Mady Colquhoun, a teacher at Armadale PS, was also a finalist and reached the top ten ranked teachers in the state. BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS OF PREJUDICE THROUGH SCIENCE

RAVILA (RUBY) RAJOR, USES SCIENCE WITH A DIFFERENCE.

Unlike schools where elite students are the first to be selected for state-wide competitions in Science and other subjects, Ravila throws the door wide-open to all comers. She welcomes the disengaged student that disturbs other students' learning, the under-achieving student who hates 'bookish' learning or the girl who thinks that Science is for boys and inspires them to use their interests to be innovative. It is not to say that she does not welcome the talented and gifted. Her special gift lies in making the unmotivated eager for Science, the uninformed student to become knowledgeable about the practical application of Science and Technology and adolescent girls eager to contribute to the team.

How does she do it? This is 'Ravila Magic'.

She breaks down the barriers by finding out what 'fires' each student's imagination and then shows them how Science, in its many forms, can channel their passion, talent and careers. Students say that she is 'different' in the way in which she makes learning 'fun' and - she is different. Ravila uses her 'Multi-dimensional Approach' which involves using either community-based projects where students in outback Kalgoorlie work to revegetate land or in a variety of programs that build team spirit and culminate in state and national competitions. The lead-up to each competition is linked to working with community mentors, university scientists, engineers and other professionals as students are mentored in each facet of teambuilding, problem-solving or technical ability. It involves students who have failed to achieve the minimum benchmarks in national or state tests working as a team using their practical skills to complement the other members in the team. It brings the community to the school and takes the school to the community through Science.

Does the magic work? When pitted against state and national competition, again and again, students from this small secondary school take on goliaths in the form of elite independent schools and win ... or nearly win every time! The secret lies in the words of this unique Indian teacher who says: *'I am continually encouraging students to use investigations and authentic learning where they actively learn in many ways from different sources.'*

She doesn't **break** new ground or **break** records. She **makes** students feel successful through Science where others saw failure. This is how Ravila (Ruby) Rajor uses her legacy to break down barriers of prejudice through Science.

CANNING RIVER SUMMER RELEASES

Perth's dams have received the lowest inflows on record this winter. These inflows are much lower than the previous recent dry seasons of 2001/02 and 2006/07. This means less water available for Perth's drinking water supply.

As you may be aware, the Department of Water instructs the Water Corporation to release water from the Canning Dam in summer to provide some base flow in the Canning River. However, as this water is treated scheme water, such releases put pressure on Perth's drinking water supply.

The Lower Canning River surface water allocation plan was recently released and details the department's management response in low rainfall years. As Perth received a much lower than average rainfall this winter, the department will be implementing this management response and we will be reducing the volume of water released into the Canning River this summer by 50%.

There will be a reduced base flow release which will allow us to provide some flow similar to what would

occur under natural conditions, whilst conserving precious drinking water.

You will notice lower flows in the Canning River over the coming summer. If you currently take water from the Canning River for stock or domestic purposes the Department is seeking your cooperation by asking you to reduce your water use by 50% to reflect the reduced summer flows.

Where alternative water sources are available (such as scheme water, bore water or stored rainwater) we ask that you use these before taking water from the Canning River.

In addition, as the water in the Canning River during summer is essentially scheme water, you are required to adhere to the current sprinkler restrictions for scheme water users.

THE FLOWERING BALGA - A WARNING



Perhaps the Courier can help me as I am hoping a local flora lover may be able to substantiate this observation. I am referring to an ancient wonder, the local grasstree, blackboy or *Xanthorrhoea preissii*, with the common name Balga.

My observation is that this season they seem to all be in flower. I have never seen the balga bloom so prolifically. Every bush I see has a magnificent spear (or lance) and they are flowering in countless numbers.

Firstly I wonder if this is an accurate observation. Secondly, I think that nature often warns us of things to come, such as the flowering of the Marri. Animals are said to know well before hand if there is an earthquake coming. Could this prolific flowering indicate something is about to happen?

This photo of a Balga spike was taken by Debralee Webb and sent in to show the proliferation of insects on the spike, including moths and butterflies. Does this indicate that these species are involved in the pollination of the Balga. As Ben says it certainly is 'an ancient wonder'. Ed

More History of Karragullen... The Burning Father Christmas

This story is adapted from the memoirs of Ken Smailes, (published in the Roleystone Courier in October 1995). With Christmas and summer just around the corner this story comes from Karragullen over 60 years ago....

It was 1947 and there was a polio epidemic scare – people were being warned not to congregate in enclosed places for fear of the disease spreading. It was Christmas time and the weather was stinking hot and the locals decided to give the kids a treat. Santa could come to them. It was planned that Santa would come to Illawarra, Carinya, Smailes Mill, Karragullen and Canning Mills; sitting on the back of a truck and decked out in full regalia.

Another truck went first, loaded up with lollies and icecreams. The second truck followed with Father Christmas (Doug Macdonald an Illawarra farm hand) giving out presents. Before they reached Smailes Mill they decided to 'stop for a smoko'. Father Christmas lit his cigarette but it was hot and dry and the cotton beard went up in flames.

As he used his arm to smother the fire he went up like a Catherine Wheel. Ken Smailes helped him put the fire out by throwing the burning jacket into the bush starting a small but deadly bushfire.

Father Christmas was not destined to finish his round that year. He was rushed off to hospital, with bad burns and there he remained for three months. The locals became very wary of flammable Father Christmases after that eventful year.

Vale Hazel Mortimer

Hazel Catherine Gambrell was born in Wyalkatchem on 8th Aug 1925. She died in late September 2010.

She lived on a farm 20 miles North East of Wylie with her parents and 5 siblings. Her school days were spent in Mandurah and then Hazel became a wool classer working about the area. In 1950 her Dad bought a farm in Rushy Pool near Narrogin, and it was there that a handsome shearer named Alf Mortimer, came into her life. Apparently Alf never looked much at women till Hazel came along and then he was smitten.

They were married in Narrogin in 1954 when she was 28. The couple had five children: Christine, Winsome, Aileen, Laurie and Maureen. With the children suffering bouts of asthma the local doctor advised them to look at moving to the hills, where the air was cleaner and the environment healthier.

In October of 1967 the Mortimers moved to Karragullen. They ran an orchard and supplemented their income with wood cutting. Dad chain sawed the wood into foot blocks and Mum used the splitting hammer to make the blocks smaller which made loading easier! Mum had quite a green finger and loved her garden, she always had flowers everywhere. She could grow things that the rest of us killed. The grandkids loved picking strawberries with her into ice-cream containers, eating as many as went into the container!

Life on the orchard grew more difficult and they moved into Roleystone. Hazel became involved in the CWA and was secretary/treasurer and made lots of friends.

When asking people about Hazel, one thing that echoed through friends and family was that she was always loving and kind and made you feel special. She was an old fashioned lady with old fashion values and had a certain way of doing everything, even if it meant washing the car with a bucket just before going out. It had to be done because 'you don't go anywhere with a dirty car!' She did what she did for the love of her family.

In 2004 Hazel and Alf had their 50th Wedding anniversary and according to Alf they 'scrubbed up pretty good'. Hazel had the time of her



life! Just 4 months after, Alf passed away. The next 5 years were difficult for Hazel as she was hospitalized over many occasions, different care facilities with dozens of carers, until she passed away peacefully in late September.

In her prime Hazel was a strong, vibrant, energetic, loving woman with many talents. She loved her family beyond all else. She worked hard and should be proud of her efforts. Sleep peacefully Hazel.






I just wanted to let the people of Roleystone know how much I enjoyed the Open Garden at the Bettenay family orchard Irymple, in early October.





Ellenwood has developed slowly over 17 years with water conservation as an integral part of its design. Water is provided by 2 rainwater tanks and a bore which is limited.

Along with water concerns we share the garden with the local rabbits, bandicoots and kangaroos. Unfortunately their appetites are not restricted to the lawn (which we don't mow).

The position of the house was selected where there was a natural clearing. We had decided we would not have trees overhanging the house. The initial garden was designed with several Chinese Tallows along the northern aspect with lawn bounded by miniature agapanthus, salvia and yellow daylilies. The pond and wisteria arch were established because the presence of rock made it difficult to plant a garden. The standard roses planted behind the wisteria arch against the house are Softee. The inspiration for the

Sachmo and Iceberg roses along the front of the house came from the Gosnells Hotel. Seafoam climbs along the front veranda, a red Pierre De Ronsard has been recently planted on the corner. Stephanotis climb up the pillars of the veranda.

In 2007 the lawn was removed from the northern area due to water concerns and the existing plants repositioned. In winter, when the roses are dormant, the colour is provided by the camellias and many hundreds of bluebells and daffodils.

On the western side of the house we built a stone circle along with 2 rose arches covered with the climbing rose 'Pinky'. Initially the garden was established with herbs, but with my love of roses they were replaced with a circle of Seduction. A weeping mulberry and



two camellias form a back drop for this garden.

The southern aspect of the garden incorporated the development of a pool and a pergola. The lawn has been reduced to its current size by the establishment of a fountain surrounded by shade plants which include Clivias, Clematis, Azaleas and Rhododendrons under the 2 Prunus Nigra. Ellenwood is continually evolving as plants age and shade is created or removed.

GARDENING NOTES

JEAN: 9397 5547

This year I have had the privilege of attending several of the gardens open with the Open Garden scheme. Each garden is different in that every gardener has strong likes and dislikes in the plants that they choose to grow. Often a variety of different plants are available from these gardens. You have seen how they grow and which position suits them best, so you can work out if the plant is suitable for the area and climate you want to grow it in. Sometimes we buy plants then have to work out where to put them. Often these plants sit around waiting until the gardener has a chance to make a home for them. Most importantly we need to prepare the soil so that the plant can settle in without being shocked by new soil and conditions.

I wonder how many plants were lost by the heavy frosts throughout the winter? If damage occurred then the plants ought to be making new growth by now. Now is the time to prune off the damage and give the plant a tonic such as Seasol. Hibiscus were badly affected, also I thought I had lost my Heliotrope, this lovely fragrant plant was set back at the top but is coming away beautifully with the spring weather. The deep purple blooms are very fragrant and make a charming little border plant,

planted next to orange or yellow, it contrasts beautifully.

Cliveas that are flowering may still be carrying seeds from last year so pick them off. You can wash the jelly like substance from the seeds then plant them out in a quality seed raising mix.

Now that cliveas and roses are blooming, get out to nurseries to select any new varieties whilst they are in bloom. In fact go for a walk around the district and see which plants are thriving in the area and then try to purchase these varieties. Pelargoniums are making spectacular displays at the moment. These are such an easy fuss free plant to grow, once they are in all you have to do is occasionally prune them back (around March).

Repeating the same plant in a number of different locations in your garden is more attractive than using every different plant known to man. With a lack of cohesion, the garden will be a mish-mash of bits and pieces. Sometimes this happens early in the piece when we just dot in things we are given with no thought to the overall effect that we want. If the foliage is good then you will have a successful garden at all times even when varieties are without blooms.

For many years a statue of Dick Wittington and two cats stood proudly in the grounds of the little cottage 'Passing Clouds', at the corner of Peet Road and Brookton Highway. The statue proudly proclaimed the distance from Roleystone to London.



Assisting Pets- Kennel Cough Judith Congrene

The "kennel cough" conversation usually starts off by the owner telling me when they ring requesting a home visit, that they are very concerned about the terrible hacking cough they are hearing in their dog. Typically there is phlegm being coughed up and the dog sounds like it is choking and gagging, all at once.

As I question the owner about the symptoms and the

history, it comes to light that the dog has just come back from a stay in kennels. That little snippet of information sometimes casually added in to the conversation, gets the diagnostic alarm bells ringing that this problem is most likely kennel cough.

Kennel cough is generally not the serious and life threatening disease that parvovirus infection is in dogs. However if it is not treated competently and adequately, the patient's condition can deteriorate with the development of pneumonia. The hacking cough can be very debilitating to the dog and very frustrating to the owners not knowing what to do.

I think it is definitely worth a consultation to examine a dog even when it is likely that it is kennel cough because antibiotics and

other symptomatic relief can be prescribed. In many cases however, after examining the dog, I may advise just giving the dog honey several times a day. Wonderfully, this can be adequate treatment to assist the dog through the course of the symptoms, and I have heard happy feedback from clients who were surprised and relieved that this simple remedy worked. At other times, I consider that antibiotics are highly advisable to minimise the serious consequences of this highly contagious disease. It is necessary to have adequate vaccination status prior to taking your dog to kennels or when taking them out to shows or mixing with other dogs. 

What's Causing that Cough?

A chronic unproductive cough defined as a cough lasting longer than 8 weeks, certainly affects quality of life when it starts to disturb sleep. It can also result in urinary incontinence in some women and cause fainting in the elderly.

Invariably the cough is a sign or symptom of an underlying condition. In most cases (up to 90%) it is either asthma, a post nasal drip or gastro-oesophageal reflux disease (GORD).

Other causes include:

- Chronic obstructive airways disease, including bronchiectasis, emphysema, and pulmonary fibrosis
- Infections including pneumonia or bronchitis, legionnaires disease
- Cigarette smoking
- Environmental allergens, such as dust, smoke, ash or pollens
- Medications
- Lung cancer
- Heart failure

When treating the cough it is important to identify the underlying cause.

RHINITIS AND HAYFEVER: Rhinitis (swollen mucous membranes in the nose and sinuses), causes excessive production of mucus resulting in a runny nose, post nasal drip with the need to frequently clear the throat, especially when lying down and can result in a constant throat clearing cough. Worse at this time of year due to the increased pollen counts in the air, the best treatment is not a cough mixture but an antihistamine. The choices are many but include: Claratyne, Zyrtec, Aureus and Telfast. If the post nasal drip and cough is worst at night, sedating antihistamines such as Phenergan might be more effective. In addition to these medicines very low dose cortisone nasal sprays can be used throughout the hay fever season.

ASTHMA: often occurs in conjunction with hay fever, and may present only as a dry, hard cough, especially in the very

young or old. Although the causes and trigger factors of asthma are varied, the cough with asthma often occurs at night, after exercise or exposure to cold air. The cough is the result of chronically swollen airways which makes it difficult for asthmatics to empty their lungs properly. Treatment with low dose inhaled corticosteroids (eg Flixotide) or combination inhalers such as Seretide and Symbicort which also include long acting bronchodilators (airway openers) can often reduce the cough in minutes. Because asthma is a chronic condition, long term use of these inhalers is necessary and correct inhaler technique is vital. Ask your Pharmacist!

GORD: Apart from a chronic cough, heartburn, acid regurgitation and a bitter taste in the mouth can occur. Losing abdominal weight, reducing fat, caffeine and chocolate in the diet and stopping smoking can help with this condition. As well as these non-medicinal treatments use of tablets known as proton pump inhibitors (Zoton, Somac, Nexium, Acimax etc) will treat the cough if it is the result of GORD.

SMOKERS COUGH: Often improves considerably as quickly as 8 weeks after quitting. Commit and quit because you can! Ask your pharmacist or visit your doctor or use online helps such as www.quitline.org.au www.quitbecauseyoucan.org.au

There are times when a cough suppressant is effective. A post viral cough can linger 1-3 weeks after the common cold. Judicious use of cough suppressants such as: Codeine Linctus, Rikodeine, or Durotuss but are not without side effects such as drowsiness and constipation.

So if you do have an annoying cough that seems to go on for ever check with your pharmacist so that you get the right treatment.

On 19 October 2010 the Western Australian Government made history as the first in Australia to apologise to women, their children and families affected by past adoption practices.

This apology acknowledged the trauma and suffering of mothers who were forced to adopt their children between 1940 and 1980 as a result of unsupportive Government policies.

My office had a call from one such mother recently and her story is representative of the tale told by thousands of unmarried mothers who were forced to adopt their children. Forty years ago, at the age of 15, my constituent was forced to give up her child.

Throughout the term of her pregnancy, she was prevented from seeing friends or neighbours in order to avoid embarrassing her family. Upon the birth of her son she was denied any opportunity to see, hold, name or otherwise bond with her son.

For this mother, the trauma and humiliation of a teenage pregnancy and the adoption of her son have had lifelong consequences. Even to date, this mother grieves for a son and relationship she never had. Whilst this mother did eventually make contact with her estranged son, nothing can bring back the time they have not shared growing up together.

I wonder if you have heard former Member of Parliament, Shelly Archer, speak about her experience of teenage pregnancy? It's a very different story to that

From The Archives: A Sad Tale of Roleystone

AS REPORTED IN THE KALGOORLIE ARGUS,
10 AUGUST 1909
CHILD'S SUSPICIOUS DEATH.
CORONIAL INQUIRY.

Perth, August 6.

Last week, as a result of certain information, Detectives Sampson and Fraser inquired into the circumstances surrounding the death and burial of a female infant, and the body of the child was exhumed for a post-mortem examination.


The inquest on the body was resumed this afternoon. The mother of the child deposed, said she had been a month at the residence of Mrs Reed, at Roleystone when she gave birth to a child. She did not know what became of the baby.

The mother of the previous witness said she and her daughter stayed at Roleystone 'a few months' ago. She did not suspect that her daughter was in a certain condition. She went there because she thought a trip would do both of them good.

Amy Reed, married woman, living at Roleystone, said the father and mother of the girl had visited her twice. When she agreed to take the girl, her mother wanted her to take an oath that she would not tell anybody, and the witness did so. The mother subsequently visited the witness' place an average of three times a week.

On the morning of the birth of the child the girl called out to her: 'It has come; it is here.' The witness fainted and when she recovered consciousness the girl said: 'It is cold; come and take this away.'

The witness wrapped the child in a sheet and put it under the bed, and subsequently buried it. On July 29 she showed the detectives where the body was buried. She did not know it was wrong to bury it in the way she did. She did not look, when wrapping it in the

Wild Gossip

Kangaroo road hits are very upsetting and stressful for all involved particularly the injured animal.

If you hit a kangaroo or see one hit it is important to stop and assess the situation – safety to all

being the first priority. You may need to stop other vehicles to help with the situation or traffic management. If the kangaroo is dead, it needs to be moved away from the road to prevent further accidents (I usually grasp the tail and pull). Then check for pouch young, which if found will need warmth, quiet and urgent help. Please contact your local wildlife carer or shelter for immediate advice.

If the kangaroo is alive and injured urgent help is required – call the DEC 24hr Wildcare Helpline 9474 9055. Your call will be transferred to a volunteer who will ask questions, assess the situation and organise appropriate help.

It is important to give clear directions to the accident scene including cross street names, other helpful details etc. (Incorrect information will delay the arrival of help). It is also important to follow any advice or instructions given.

If possible stay at the scene to ensure that the area is kept quiet and the animal is undisturbed.

When help arrives it is important to follow

directions and offer support whilst the attending volunteer decides on the best course of action to be taken. Sadly, in most cases, injured kangaroos are not fixable.

Never attempt to move or transport an injured kangaroo as it is way too dangerous for all involved and will cause the injured animal further pain and stress. All injured kangaroos need to be helped at the accident site.

On several occasions injured kangaroos have been dumped in our drive when we were not home, I can only begin to imagine the pain, stress and horror these poor animals suffered and dread to think of the outcome if one had been simply stunned and recovered enough to run on the road.

Please get help to the roadside for injured kangaroos.



Council supports the continuation of the consultation process with the sporting clubs based at Cross Park and Springdale Park with the aim of developing a strategy for sustainable use of playing fields in the Roleystone area, that includes the potential relocation of the Roleystone Senior Football Club to Springdale Park. It will receive a further report on the future use of Cross Park once a preferred approach has been identified.

5. Proposed Warehouse, Rokewood Way

Council approved the application for Planning Approval for a Warehouse (Cold Storage and Packing of Fruit) on Lot 65 (7) Rokewood Way, Karragullen subject to a range of conditions.

6. Placement of Sheds on Properties Adjoining Battle-axe Blocks

Cr Hart briefed the Development Services Committee that "... When neighbours lodge an application for a shed they are allowed to place it next to the battle-axe blocks with only 1 metre clearance from the fence. The visual impact on the battle-

axe blocks is severe and there is no opportunity to request vegetative screening due to the policy or the 1 metre distance. The impact of larger than normal sheds is even more severe". A review of conditions for the placement of sheds on properties abutting battle-axe lots was referred to the Development Services Directorate for action and / or report back to Committee.

7. Bus Shelter, Jarrah Rd

Council has been advised by the PTA that the Bus Shelter Grant Scheme has been replaced by the Bus Stop Accessible Works

Programme, and that Council's submission for replacement of the bus shelters at Jarrah Road (near Andreas Road) was unsuccessful. Council will request the PTA to consider replacing the existing concrete bus shelter as part of the 2010/2011 Bus Stop Accessible Works Programme.

8. Councillor's Items

Cr Hart requested that the Draft Lease Agreement between Hills Orchard Improvement Group and the City of Armadale be referred to the City Strategy Committee.

Late News: ROLEYSTONE KARRAGULLEN SENIORS HOUSING

90 residents attended a public meeting at St. Christopher's Anglican Church Saturday 30 October.

This was called by the committee investigating opportunities for the Roleystone Primary School site to advise results of the questionnaire that had been circulated previously. A presentation by Trudy Hodges CEO Dale Cottages clearly showed that costs associated with high and low care accommodation was not financially a viable proposition. An overview of responses to the questionnaire showed the majority of respondents wished to stay in Roleystone/Karragullen for the long term. Kelvin Oliver a local Town Planner gave an overview of the processes involved with the rezoning and the critical need

to have State Government support.

Cr. Hart proposed the motion: The committee to proceed with rezoning of the Primary School site to Special Use – Seniors Accommodation with the proviso that prior to this occurring an amount of \$2,000 be raised from the community to cover the costs of the rezoning application, seconded by Chris Johnstone and carried unanimously.

Pro Bono: "Total Immersion" David Bardsley Minister Community Church



The rather stately Land Rover Safari stood on our drive looking quite pristine. But the insurance assessor's perspective was somewhat different. "Fraid it's a write off, mate. There's so much water in the instruments, I'm surprised there's no fish swimming in them! What on earth happened?"

To cut a long story sideways, the Safari experienced almost total immersion. We had acquired a 7 metre trailable sailboat which was moored down at Mandurah. But we had no trailer.

As winter approached we decided we needed to pull the boat out and got hold of a wreck of a boat of the right length on a trailer. The destiny of the wrecked boat is another interesting story but suffice to say that although our boat and the newly acquired trailer were never designed for each other, "she'll be right!"

Come the big day which was rather more windy than we would have liked, we backed the trailer into the water with the Safari, floated the boat on to it and pulled it out. Well almost. It rested unevenly and rather skew whiff on its ill fitting trailer. So we decided to re-float the boat off again and line it up better.

Then three things happened at once as we backed into the Inlet which turned an incident into a disaster. The winch handle broke (effectively locking the boat to the trailer), the wind got up and I forgot to lock the front wheel drive hubs. The boat floated. The wind caught it. The boat lifted the back of the Safari off terra firma and the whole convoy proceeded at a leisurely pace backwards down the slipway towards Davy Jones' locker.

No amount of engine power has any effect when the only driving wheels are six inches above the ramp and thrashing in water rather than on solid ground. The Peel Inlet

poured into the vehicle at a surprising rate of knots and before long it was above dashboard level. The engine stopped.

Then the drama stepped up a gear. A small voice from the back inquired, "Daddy should we get out yet?" There was a shout from the shore. "There's a little girl swimming about in there!" With remarkable speed a tow rope was produced, another 4WD vehicle was hitched up, the winch cable was cut and the Safari was towed out. Somebody fixed a rope to the boat and secured it too. The rescue was complete.

When we had all calmed down, somebody asked my daughter if she was scared. She replied, "Of course not! I was with Daddy and he wouldn't let anything really bad happen to me."

I curled up and nearly died from shame with her in my arms. But trust is a wonderful thing.

Jesus said that unless we change and become like little children we will never enter the kingdom of heaven. He didn't mean we should become childish but that we should become trusting and unpretentious in the same way that my daughter trusted me.

Of course there's more than a smidgen of difference in the two situations. Blatantly, I (along with all earthly parents) am fallible and get things wrong. Equally blatantly, God our Father in heaven is infallible and doesn't get things wrong. He is worthy of our trust. Why not give it a go?

Astronomical Highlights November

Greg Lowe
Perth Observatory

November's a funny month in terms of the distinct lack of bright and inspiring targets available for viewing with small(ish) telescopes. November's always a bit of a challenge at the Observatory, when our new public star viewing season has just begun. We try to show objects that most people can easily see; objects that in many cases the visitors should be able to find again by themselves.

Jupiter's the planet this month: it's the brightest starlike object you can see at nightfall, and it's above the horizon until well after midnight. In early November Jupiter's high in the NE sky at dusk and tracks westward through the night to be setting in the west around 3:15am. In mid-month it starts the night very high up in the north and sets in the west around 2:15am. By the end of the month it's starting out high up in the NNW at dusk, and setting at about 1:20am.

At the beginning of the month, the Moon's in waning crescent phase – morning crescents. New moon, which is really *no moon* or phase zero, is on the 6th. Teachers, if you want your classes to do one last round of evening moon obs for the year, start on the 7th and continue until full moon on the night of the 21st.

On the 21st, moonrise will occur just ahead of sunset (moonrise 6:45pm, sunset 6:59pm). Remember the rule of thumb: start a day or so after new moon and stop at full moon. The period when the Moon's waxing. If you can see the Moon at nightfall, it's waxing. After full moon, it's waning. So, the major phases are: new moon on the 6th, first quarter on the night of the 13th, full moon on the night of the 21st, last quarter on the morning of the 29th.

By way of a treat for early risers (or late stayers), brilliant Venus will come into view low in the east at daybreak in the third week of November. For months thereafter it'll be the "morning star". Venus won't be seen again in the evening sky until next September. If you want to have a chance of seeing the Leonid meteors, gaze to the north-east in the pre-dawn hours. Maximum activity occurs around the 17th, and activity usually spreads for a few days either side of that.

This year the Observatory *won't* be producing an astronomy almanac for 2011. We'll sell the one produced by Quasar Publishing: an Australia-wide model rather than a West Australian one. Data for WA are included.




