

AN ANZAC DAY Memorial like no OTHER

Soon after five in the morning on Wednesday April 25th three other Roleystoners, plus two blowins from Kelmscott and one from Darlington, purposefully climbed Snow Lion Hill.

As I trudged up behind them the intermittent sparkle from their LED head lamps reminded me of fireflies flitting through an African night of my youth.

But this was not Africa. This was southern China.

We were climbing up Snow Lion to a platform which we knew commanded a most spectacular view of the Li River and the surrounding limestone karst towers.

There on the platform we waited for dawn to break so that we could conduct our own ANZAC Day service.

The sleepy silence was broken now and again with our murmurings as we prepared our little ceremony. From way down in the dark below echoes of a cock crow wafted

Slowly the world below and around us emerged. The blacks and black-greys of the night began dissolving to reveal a mist covered landscape. There behind the darker silhouettes of the nearest limestone towers in the east, a pale grey sky lit up a magical scene.

A number of tower peaks pierced through a flat grey cloud. The furthest summit began to glow pink and grey. This was followed by a bird's muffled 'cheep' then two and then soon: a dawn chorus!

Our already raw emotions were jangled into pity and sadness as bugle sounds of 'The Last Post' cut into the scene. The wonders of modern technology: Graham's ipod, attached to a mini speaker, was playing.

#### Targa Tasmania - Roleystone is well represented

Local Classic Triumph enthusiast Bruce Pollock (navigator) and his long term friend Gavin Adams recently competed in the Targa Tasmania rally. Their aim was just to finish but the result was far better than they had expected - and they had a wonderful time:

Being a motoring enthusiast, the pinnacle of automotive events is without doubt the tarmac rally series which includes Targa Tasmania.

This event is supported internationally with entrants from many parts of the globe. The format of this event covers many competition 'special stages' ranging from just a few, up to nearly 60 km in length. These stages involve some of the most winding and twisting roads imaginable. To be competitive, the driver needs assistance from a navigator who 'calls' the stage in order to guide the driver through hidden hairpins, blind corners and crests where the road can rapidly disappear unless adequate warning to the driver is delivered in time. Unfortunately for a few, there were a number who did not complete their stage due to the calls being inaccurate, too late or that the driver just did not respond. A very expensive lesson for those in that situation.

The car we drove was a 1968 Triumph TR5. This car has been successfully campaigned in other tarmac rally events, but never Targa Tasmania until this year.

To prepare the car took many months of re-building, restoring and plenty of pre-planning in order to try and eliminate any weak spots. But as many in motor sports very well know, there are just some things you cannot be prepared for. Such was the case for our old Triumph, we failed to complete 2 stages due to mechanical 'issue' and on the second last day a valve spring in the engine broke reducing our capacity to remain competitive. We are so very grateful to the resourcefulness of our service crew who sought another valve from an old workshop near Strahan and had us up and running again for the next and final day. A tribute to bush mechanics if ever there was one. The spring came out of an old motor bike!!!

Our aim was to simply finish. 5 days of shear torture in an old car took its toll as we now have a lot more rattles and squeaks than when we began.

On arriving at the Wrest Point Casino on the final day to drive through the



finishers arches, the sense of relief was almost overwhelming emotionally.


We were extremely pleasantly surprised to learn we had won our class and were presented with a very impressive pewter reminder for posterity.

#### Phil Helps Create Life Saving App

Phil Aked, a retired pilot now living in Araluen, along with Senior Constable Ian Davidson recently came up with the idea that has led to the development of an in valuable tool for search and rescue. The Police Air Wing Helicopter is frequently asked to find people who are lost in varying circumstances and this tool (soon to be available as an app) will provide a wonderful boost. It will soon be available and everyone is encouraged to download it, and the best news is that it will be free. It will be available as an Android application at first, but, hopefully, iPhone will follow.

Expertise was needed to develop the App, and this was provided by Edith Cowan University School of Computer and Security Science students and has now been developed into the finished product.

The App transmits the person's exact location via GPS, to rescue services, allows the light from the phone to be more visible from the helicopter, and has a survival guide compiled by an expert in the field. There are other features which, with one touch, allow a speedier and more efficient rescue.

The smart phone can now become an emergency beacon.

The App was nominated as a finalist in the Tertiary Student Category of the 2012 WA Information and Technology Awards. The whole development team and their partners attended the presentation on 30 March 2012, and were delighted to win in their category.

Many congratulations to all involved for an App that has the potential to save lives.

#### Exagra Asks for lists to Volunteer in Cambodia

My name is Soraya Haynes, I am 15 years old, I live in Roleystone and am currently doing year 11 at Willeton SHS. I am contacting you in regards to a volunteer placement I am doing in Cambodia during December 2012 with Australian Volunteers Abroad.

During this placement I will be working in orphanages and care centres located in the Cambodian capital, Phnom Penh. My volunteer work at the orphanages will include teaching and caring for children, and helping where I can with day to day organization and any maintenance or building needs. My parents have agreed to this trip on the condition that I raise all of the money required for airfares and accommodation myself.

Cambodia is one of the poorest countries in the world. Years of war have destroyed infrastructure and opportunity. One third of Cambodia's population live below the poverty line on less than \$1 per day, 70% of city dwellers live in slums, 45% of Cambodian children show some

degree of malnutrition and only 57% reach grade 5. Unexploded land mines left from the war and diseases including HIV, Tuberculosis, Malaria and Dengue Fever also have a terrible impact on the population.

All of this means many Cambodian children have no access to education or medicine and endure very sad and difficult lives. I really want to draw people's attention to this situation. I will be writing an article in the Courier about my trip.

I am also asking for donations. The cost of the trip is \$3269. I am working part-time and selling chocolates at school to earn the money I need. So far I have raised \$1000. I intend to raise as much money as possible so any extra can be donated to one of the orphanages. ### Naama Amran's Success

Naama Amram is currently working as in-house editor with book publisher Fremantle Press. Naama is the daughter of Ita Goldberger from Genesis in the Hills Vegetarian Restaurant. Her job involves editing manuscripts in their various stages, guiding books through the production process, and supporting the Press's publishers. Naama gets to work with authors, illustrators, designers and printers. She declares: 'it's an amazingly varied job!'

This year Naama was invited to chair a session at the Perth Writers Festival with writers Glen Duncan, Michael

Robotham and Alan Carter. The session was themed 'Portraying Evil' and was selected as a feature by ABC TV and The Monthly's Slow TV. Naama is also an author and has had a short story, 'The Exhibition', published in a beautiful book called The Kid on the Karaoke Stage & Other Stories. Naama has been invited to read from this and other stories at several events including performing at Cottonmouth, which is a regular spoken word event in Perth.

Naama pinpoints the decision to pursue this career in September 2007, when she returned from travelling and studying in Spain. Before she went away she had been working full-time in an office and she felt like she still hadn't found her calling. When she returned to Perth she considered her options: 'I knew I wanted to work with language, and I already had a BA in Communications from ECU. After meeting with the wonderful Liz Byrski at Curtin University, I enrolled in their one-year Graduate Diploma in Writing and Publishing. That course set me off on my writing/editing/publishing journey. My teachers enlightened and inspired me.'

'By the end of the year I knew I wanted to be a literary editor. I started working as a freelancer while also volunteering with different publications to build up my skills. Together with friends from uni, we started dotdotdash – a tri-annual magazine for literature and art. We somehow had 540 people come to our first launch and the magazine is still going strong today – now in its ninth issue. In 2010 I applied for and secured one of four publishing internships offered nationally by the Australian Publishers Association (APA), which meant six months full-time work in-house at Fremantle Press. I am incredibly grateful to the APA for that chance because at the end of the internship Fremantle Press offered me a new contract! I'm pretty well in love with that place.' Naama's mother and aunt (Ita and sister Rivka) opened Genesis in the Hills Vegetarian Restaurant, in 2007 and she is amazed at how they have nurtured the arts and creativity in this location:

'I am amazed by the developments I find every time I visit – a new art exhibition, a community shop, new tables nestled in the trees. They're indefatigable! And very community orientated. My family moved to Roleystone in 2003. My mum said she fell in love with the place from the first visit. I was eighteen and studying at uni, but Roleystone for me is about family – it's the beautiful place where my family chose to live and work and be part of the community.'

A wide range of locals have influenced and helped Naama into her career:

'Tony and Betty Winder across the road have been wonderful neighbours and friends to us. And I met one of my best and wisest friends, Galatee, through her mother in Roleystone. Artist Susan Angwin has been a great supporter of dotdotdash. And Gabby Lammers, daughter of our family friend Jenny, is a gorgeous musician I often see in Perth. There's a ton of creativity in Roleystone.

I've also met a lot of people through Genesis. I think there's a really open vibe in the community and in my experience people are always happy to have a chat and learn about each other. I think this openness





and curiosity about the world around us is fundamental to writing and storytelling.'

'My family has supported my choices every step of the way. In the words of one of my favourite bands, Tinpan Orange: 'They are to me like a hand is to a glove'.'

'Mum has worked with the arts for as long as I can remember. My dad, too, was a fierce advocate of the arts in Israel, where I was born. In fact, dad was directing the summer camp of an organisation called Matan (Arts and Culture Project for Youth) when mum went into labour – so my first days in the world were spent among dancers and musicians! But more recently, Genesis is of course a great supporter of the arts, including local musicians, visual artists and writers. They've stocked dotdotdash magazine right from Issue One without charging us any commission and they let us use the space for workshops

– a great help. And then there's my grandmother Leah – she supports me with words of encouragement, soul-nurturing food and an outrageous wealth of proverbs in seven languages. My aunt and uncle, cousins, brothers – we're all there for each other to grow and learn together.'

Naama wants to help others tell their stories with impact. She also wants to spend more time with her own writing moving from short stories to the long form.

'My family is a great inspiration to me as I make my choices in life. Integrity, creativity, engagement, kindness and dedication are things I strive for. I learned from both of my parents that whatever it is you do, you should try to do it well – and always dare to be who you are.'

Roleybushcare would like to encourage everyone to use this season to plant some plants endemic to our area. They have provided a wonderful poster showing some of the best types to plant - see page 24.

The recent news from the City of Armadale's Development Services Committee to give approval to the rezoning of the Old Primary School site has offered our community a real Win-Win solution.

Most residents were clearly in favour of the land going towards Aged Care. The different voices that argued for retention of the bushland west and south of the oval (this was obviously strongly supported) and for retention of the oval (referred to as The Green) also seemed to have had their arguments heard.

My understanding is that there is some discussion for at least a proportion of the oval to be retained to utilise the recycled sewage and that this oval space may be available for use by the wider community.

Thus the recommendation is that the land is offered with some restrictions. Of course this still needs to pass the full Council Meeting and the Planning Commission and also we need to wait until the developer submits plans, but we are on the way. My thanks to everyone who worked hard to achieve this result.

Our community is renowned for strong involvement in decisions and I believe that this nearly always results in a better outcome. However I must speak against the

tactics employed by some recently.

I am not a fan of the inflammatory email, the casual blog that incites others to harrass our representatives or even the 'way out there' text message. Sometimes I cringe at what people say; these unhelpful comments seem especially prevalent on the largely anonymous social media.

Unreasoned argument does more to create division and just does not achieve a successful outcome. So all who feel passionately about a cause should have the opportunity to have a say, but then they should listen and let our elected decision makers weigh up what is best for our community.

One of the great parts of my job is that I can share the excitement when someone wants a 'good news story' published.

#### **Response to May Editorial**

Your May 2012 editorial eulogising the Orchard industry may, like reports of Mark Twain's death, be an exaggeration. Calling for government support for orchardists to transition out of the industry is similarly presumptive. These views are no doubt genuinely held by one so impassioned from a past family association; yet editorial responsibility suggests the need for more balance.

The phasing out of dimethoate and fenthion by the federal and state governments has been flagged for years and is very much in the public interest. Persistent organic pesticides (POP's) can not only affect our grandchildren but in some cases their grandchildren as well. Aldrin, Chlordane and Dieldren were all banned a generation ago, sadly only after millions of tonnes were applied throughout the world and years after the causal links were made to millions of people suffering the debilitating effects from exposure, reported deaths from these POP's is no exaggeration.

Dimethoate is classified in North America and Europe as a Group 2 long term human toxic whilst fenthion is classified as Group 3 environmental toxic. Their use is either banned or heavily restricted in most of the developed world. The formal ban in Western Australian will be welcomed by most.

On the destruction wrought by the white tailed black cockatoos you ask a somewhat loaded question ... 'So what can they (orchardists) do when they are up against a protected and well loved enemy (cockatoos)? This must be a problem that we all need to sort out as no one wants the destruction of this already at risk bird but what can local orchardists do when their livelihoods are threatened?'

Let's all hope that the solution is not that chosen by orchardists shown in the ABC documentary "On a wing and a prayer" earlier this year. Shooting to kill is banned; shooting to frighten or otherwise scare via gas cannon is restricted by government legislation and guidelines to all but remote locations. Sacrificial plantings and netting have been shown to be effective, as are other forms of deterrent that don't offend the Environmental and Conservation legislation.

Hanrahan was exaggerating when he said we'd all be ruined, to suggest that the banning of dimethoate and fenthion or enforcing DEC regulations to protect endangered species might prove the ruin of local orchardists is, likewise, an exaggeration. To do so is to underestimate the ability of our orchardists to persist and thrive whilst continuing to serve as stewards of the land.





#### Roleystone Based Film Wins International Award

Six months ago a bush fire swept across the eastern corner of Martin, destroying property and endangering homes. Local musician and conductor Adam Brockway, together with his business partner Jeremy de Vries-Turnell, saw an opportunity to create art from the ashes. Adam, an ex-Roleystone District High School student and now resident in Martin, is a member of the pioneering Brockway family who have been resident in the Roleystone area for over 60 years. 'Naya Chorale is a first-class musical ensemble, and we wanted a first-class photo shoot to propel them into the public eye. The evening sun shining through the regrowth, together with the stark contrast of new leaves against burnt black tree trunks took my breath away. It was exactly what I was looking for,' said Jeremy de Vries-Turnell, the choir's business manager and Director of Photography.

Once the location had been found, experts in photography, art and fashion were brought in to design the concept for the shoot. The phrases "nymph-like", "otherworldly" and "the lost children" became dominant, and costumes were chosen to express this.

On the day, a convoy of cars containing a small army of choristers and photography crew drove to the end of Douglas Rd, (far enough to be considered a road trip, according to the choir!) and were ushered through hair and makeup in the living room of the Brockway household.

After that, it was a race against the clock to get all the shots needed while the sun was in the right position. The weather forecasts in the week leading up to the shoot had predicted showers for the Sunday afternoon, however in the end all that came was some moderate cloud cover - perfect light for photography!

#### COMMENTS IN SOCIAL MEDIA UNHELPFUL

Recent misinformation and negative assertions in local social media and the public arena in regard to a community group of volunteers I have had the privilege to work with over the past year compel me to offer public comment and correct some obvious misunderstanding.

Over the past twelve months I have been involved with two groups of Roleystone residents that have been working hard towards establishing a Men's Shed and a Community Garden in Roleystone.

The benefits of such facilities are enormous and will provide both activities and the potential for improved social amenity to **all** Roleystone community members regardless of age. Membership to both organisations is open to anyone over the age of 16 years. Younger members of the community accompanied by a parent or guardian are also welcome.

Co-location would provide these two groups with mutual benefits both financially and in community interaction and integration and to this end they have been working together researching possible sites around Roleystone that would provide adequate suitable land to develop these community facilities. The search for a suitable site is ongoing and no one site has yet been agreed to or promised. The groups are in constant discussion with the City of Armadale and other Roleystone community groups in relation to potential sites and mutually beneficial interaction.

It is disappointing that from time to time some in the community seem to want to limit our social growth and improvement to by getting "stuck" on a single issue project rather than a whole of community approach. It is disappointing when an

individual supporting one already funded project belittles the efforts of others. It is disappointing when misinformed knee jerk comment on the intentions and efforts of any group is made in public or social media without any prior discussion with the particular group on the area of concern. To denigrate the efforts and work of other community members, particularly in public or social media can only be considered a disincentive and detrimental to achieving ongoing positive community involvement.

It was even more disappointing to me as a community member when recently both the Men's Shed philosophies and the conduct of the project group, was denigrated and belittled in social media and subsequent public comment by inference, innuendo and misinformation.

We live in a unique part of Perth and have in Roleystone, Karragullen and surrounding areas a physical environment second to none but one which I believe is in need of improvement to our limited social amenity for all ages. 

## POWER TO WEIGHT RATIOS | Helen Morton MLC

LITTLE WEIGHT BEHIND POWER-TO-Weight Restrictions

At the last state election, the Liberal Party committed to thoroughly investigate the merits of power-to-weight restrictions for novice drivers. At the time, we may have been criticised for not implementing restrictions; however, good policy should be about making informed decisions, rather than blindly accepting what is popular at the

Once in government, this commitment was fulfilled and a thorough independent study was carried out through the Road Safety Council, with some interesting findings. In all, 11,321 serious injury crashes in W.A. from 2001-2008 where analysed, and of those crashes, only 0.2 per cent involved a 17 to 19 year old driver in a high performance vehicle. In considering the research, the Road Safety Council recommended that the Government not introduce power-to-weight restrictions as they were unjustifiable and had little, if any, road safety benefits.

The proposed power-to-weight restrictions only exist in Australia and similar interstate schemes have placed a burden on the public because such restrictions are complex and create costs and confusion amongst car buyers, sellers and users, particularly in

regard to shared vehicles. It is also interesting to note that of all the states that have introduced such restrictions, none have evaluated their effectiveness in reducing road

When dealing with road safety, there are many policy options to choose from and although saving lives is something we all want, pushing for policies without evidence or consideration can be counterproductive. Evidence based measures provide us with the best means of making our roads safer and in terms of improving novice driver safety, the Barnett Government has already followed the Road Safety Council's recommendations on mobile phone bans, passenger restrictions and increased hours of supervised driving experience.

#### A SMART APPROACH TO GREENWASTE

Twelve months ago Wes and Lindsay Parfrey realised that what many in this area need was a regular green waste collection. They are from the foothills and are keenly aware of the problems of living on bush blocks.

'Green waste accumulates and local hills' residents want to keep this under control. Plus householders want the waste removed, in summer it can be a fire risk, stacks of green waste can be unsightly and for many, regular trips to the tip can be inconvenient and expensive.' said Lindsay. So they decided to set up Southern Recycling. They give you a large (240L) wheelie bin and they come and empty it once a fortnight. The cost is \$8 a pickup or \$4 per week! Plus all of the waste is recycled into mulch. Leaves, lawn clippings, tree and bush prunings - can all be disposed of in an easy manner.

With a wheelie bin you can take it to where you are gardening, fill it up and leave it out the front for collection. They reasoned that this was easier to use than a garden bag - plus the regular removal means that householders don't have to worry about the waste. 


# The Importance of Soil Health in Relation to Plant and Human Health



# REZONING FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL SITE

At the time of writing this article to meet the Roleystone Courier deadline the Roleystone Karragullen Seniors Housing Committee are absolutely delighted to report that the rezoning of the Roleystone Primary School site went through Council's Development Services Committee on Monday night with ease. It now has to be formally approved this coming Monday night, 28 May at a full Council meeting. As it has the full support of our two Councillors with no real concerns from other councillors, we have no reason to believe it will not go through. The rezoning application then goes onto the WA Planning Commission for their approval and then onto the Minister for Planning for the final sign off.

The Government will then put the site out for sale by tender. Once it is purchased we can expect to see what the new owner's development proposals may be. The development proposal will have to go through Council processes. This could mean at least another 18months to 2 years.

The City believes that the support is a clear indication of the work done to this point and that the community see aged persons' development as critical. The Seniors housing committee wish to thank all residents who have supported them in many ways and for all who sent submissions in. We also acknowledge and thank Council Officers for their excellent

A security guard found a cardboard box sitting outside the door of Armadale Shopping Centre in early April.




The mother cat Amber that is very affectionate is also available for adoption at only \$90 with all her vet work done.



At this stage the report has only been seen by the Development Services Committee and is still to be seen by full Council and then passed onto the State Government for comment. The rezoning proposal that was advertised to the public was for "restricted" residential use the restriction on the residential use was that it was for "aged or dependent persons dwellings" not regular family homes. This restriction was considered appropriate because of the need for additional aged persons accommodation & the advantageous topography & location of the site.

The density allowed for aged persons accommodation in an unsewered area is R12.5, which equates to 40 dwellings. The City may grant the 1/3 density bonus (for a total of 60 dwellings) for aged persons accommodation but this is dependant on approval by the Health Department and provision of additional private open space. The City received 187 public submissions. Approximately 65% of residents were in favour of the aged persons accommodation proposal and 55% for retention of the western/southern bushland. The oval & bushland are iconic to the community; many residents & their children have attended the school and been to the autumn festival & concerts in the park. The trees themselves are

also a much admired part of Jarrah road, quintessential to Roleystone. As the site is unsewered, the greatest constraint on development of the land has been the waste water treatment ^ this has limited the

number of dwellings and required a certain area of land not to be built upon to irrigate the treated waste water from that many dwellings. So far the recommendation is that the rezoning for aged persons accommodation will go ahead, the western/southern bushland will be preserved and the City is reserving the right to create a "public access easement" over the bushland & oval in the future when the land has been sold to a developer (and detailed planning of the site commences). A public access easement would enable restricted public access dictated by a written deed whilst still leaving the ownership of the land with the developer (a necessity for the irrigation area). This is another milestone in the long journey for additional seniors accommodation. Next we await the State Government's comments and then a developer.

Cross Park and Springdale Park have just started the master planning stage of their future. This is part of an across city strategy to look at the management of Armadale's assets. This is the opportunity for Roleystone residents to write to the City about their needs and aspirations for both Cross Park and Springdale Park.

### Skate Park Update

Although some residents claim a new skate park was "promised" several years previous, the Council only endorsed the redevelopment 11 months ago in June 2011.

There may have been "needs" previously identified but no budget. One year ago something called the "Public Open Space Strategy" funds for "Precinct I" were finalised by the last sales of public open space within our locality. These funds were combined with "cash in lieu" funds from developers of Chevin woods.

This total pool of money was only to be spent on public open space in Roleystone. Thanks to past & current councillor lobbying, one item is to receive the majority of these funds - the skate park redevelopment.

In a locality where over half of the voting population are over 55 years it was determined that such a significant portion of the funds should go to the youth because the youth here are relatively isolated and at risk of "negative social and emotional effects" and this has a ripple effect to the rest of the Community.

So far there has been public consultation for the skate park and a draft concept design produced. Without putting too fine a point on it, this time line is arguably pretty good for a Government body.

At the same time, as part of a City wide investigation into its public buildings & infrastructure, the City is also investigating several of its older main communityactivity centres. The first two to receive funding in February this year were Cross Park-Springdale in Roleystone & John Dunn-Rushton Park Kelmscott. There has been a long history of accumulated infrastructure at Cross Park and before anything else is added a "Master Plan" will be prepared to guide future additions/ renovations in the park. This is to make sure new additions, such as a new skate park, are placed in their most optimal position relative to existing and proposed new City/community buildings.

This long term planning of Cross Park is seen as a logical way to ensure optimal use of the park into the future. The aim is to make it a better place for all users together as a community, not as mutually exclusive entities.

Although this process is to take a few months, there is no real delay to the skate park because it is happening concurrently to the other finalisation details of the skate park.



It finally arrived! One Tuesday in May, amongst several boxes of goods and chattels belonging to our son Richard and his wife Kesiah, an old, battered wooden box was delivered.

The portable reed organ which was used to accompany hymn singing in the street when my home church walked in witness at Pentecost is now in our hallway. It's much smaller than I remember. But then just about everything I remember from childhood has shrunk over the years. It's dirty too. I suppose that's only to be expected as it has lain ignored and forgotten in some obscure spot in the old Weslyan Methodist chapel for over half a century.

To play it you have to raise the keyboard in the box, unfold the supporting legs, secure them upright, and then peddle on the foot bellows. Air goes up channels inside the wooden legs to the reeds and pressing a key produces a note through one reed – it works like a mouth organ or accordion. There are some bits missing and it now wobbles dangerously, the joints in its legs threatening to fold inwards at any moment. So it was with some trepidation that I tried it out. Not a squeak.

Then I found the on/off lever. To my great amazement and delight a sound could be heard – middle 'C' played true and clear. For sure there are several notes that don't play but

that's only to be expected with reeds that haven't had air through them for so long. The surprising thing is that any of them play at all.

Above the keys there's an engraved notice "Sold by the Weslyan Methodist Sunday School Union". I can imagine the anticipation and excitement as funds were collected, the order placed and the new instrument delivered to my forebears at Haughton Green. Perhaps the children collected coins in a bottle like ours at the Community Church do. Perhaps they had a special fund raising occasion. Or perhaps they just asked folk to give what they could afford to buy the instrument. Imagine being the first person to press the keys and play a hymn - it would have to be "Onward, Christian Soldiers!" But then imagine being the last person to close it and store it away, no longer

It's not hard to draw some deeper thoughts out of all this. I am continually surprised by the number of people I meet and hear about who have had a Christian input in their upbringing. They have heard about Jesus, maybe from parents, maybe at school, maybe at a Youth Club. Some have even taken part more seriously in Church activities. But over the years, their spiritual life has become less and less significant. It's now hidden away gathering dust in some forgotten corner of their life, labelled "No longer of use". What will it take for the reality of life to take hold? Our physical bodies quite clearly don't last forever - I can now wheeze like an old organ too when provoked! But what about our spirit? Is flesh and bone, a collection of molecules spinning around, all that there is to human life? People who genuinely answer "yes" to that question seem few and far between to me. And if you are one of those agree that there is indeed more to life, maybe it's time to dig out the stuff hidden away, dust it off and get it working properly. There's quite a bit at stake - eternity, I do believe...

#### Astronomical Highlights June

Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

As in early May, so again in early June: the waxing Moon is the dominant evening object as it heads for full phase on the 4th, the Monday holiday. That's not all – there'll be a partial lunar eclipse. And the Moon will be near perigee.

So we'll have a big full moon with a "bite" taken out of it by the Earth's shadow. Mid-eclipse will be at 7:03pm on the 4th. Lunar eclipses happen when the Sun, Earth and Moon are aligned, in that order, and the Moon passes into the Earth's shadow. This can only happen at full moon but we don't see an eclipse with every full moon because of the way that the Moon's orbit is inclined to the ecliptic (the plane of the Earth's orbit).

In a related case of solar system alignment, Venus will cross the line joining Earth and the Sun on the morning of the 6th. This is the alignment that produces the famous transit of Venus, the event that brought Lieutenant James Cook down to the south Pacific on his first such expedition in 1768-71 when he took possession of Australia for Britain.

Careful observations of the transit of Venus can be used to calculate the distances from Earth to the Sun and Venus: fundamental astronomical measurements.

When the Sun rises on the 6th, the transit will already be in progress. Venus will appear as a small, round, dark object against the bright disc of the Sun. Slowly it will move across the face of the Sun until it finally exits at 12:46pm. There won't be another transit until 2117. While you may be tempted to observe the event, we strongly recommend that you watch it safely via the internet or by casting an image onto a white screen using binoculars or a small telescope. Don't look at the Sun through unfiltered optics!!

The bright planets have gone from the evening sky. Venus will reappear as a brilliant morning object in the ENE at daybreak in the latter half of the month. Initially, Jupiter will rise ahead of Venus. By July 1st they'll be rising together. For the last few days of June and the first week of July, these two very bright planets will keep close company in the eastern dawn sky. In late June and early July, the evening viewing will be livened up a bit by the appearance of Mercury low in the WNW at dusk.

On June 21st the Sun will be as far north as it gets, from our earthbound point of view: the winter solstice. It's the time of shortest days and longest nights. If we reckoned our seasons as the older cultures do in the northern hemisphere, the solstice would be regarded as the beginning of winter.

The major phases of the Moon this month are full moon on the 4th, last quarter on the 11th, new moon on the 19th, and first quarter on the 27th. In July the full moon is on the 4th, as well. That works because the synodic period, from full moon to full moon, is 29.53 days and June's a 30-day month.

# Wild Gossip: Possums In the Roof & other Places!

The recent colder weather seems to have sent possums rushing back to live in cosy, warm rooves and my phone has been busy with people enquiring what to do about this. Unfortunately I can't

solve the problem and I certainly can't "pop over and get this \*\*\*\*\*\* possum out of the roof"! The only thing I can do is offer advice and suggestions. The first thing I suggest is to observe and try to find all possible entry/exit points being used by the possum and fully secure all but one. Finally in the early evening when you hear or see the possum leave fully secure that entry/ exit point. This can be harder than it seems as possums are very cunning. The possum living in my roof pulls the gutter away from the roof sheets and squeezes though the gap. A friend of mine, who is unable to secure the roof has had a possum living in the linen closet for several years, another has one that manages to get into the cavity wall and has poked a hole into the lounge and keeps peeping inside, another has a possum which removes roof tiles to gain entry, but doesn't replace them which can

be a problem when it rains.

There really is no simple solution unless the roof can be well secured and sometimes it can't be, obviously consulting a builder could help. Offering alternate accommodation by placing possum boxes and feeding platforms around your property can sometimes be helpful. You could even trap the possum and put it in one of the boxes on your property, then offer the odd food treat as a temptation for it to return to the box, but it still might return to your unsecured roof. Trapping, removing and relocating the possum to a different area must never be considered as it is total cruelty and illegal. A relocated possum would have no food, shelter or knowledge of the area to help it survive, also the local possums would fiercely defend their territory and would either drive away or kill this intruder.

Possums are delightful creatures, they don't eat electrical cables, are very clean and we are lucky to have them in our area. Maybe we should be looking to help them and be tolerant of them so that they will be around for future generations to enjoy. Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.

I have never had possums in my roof. I have listened carefully for their noises and analysed their movements and based on what you have said I think my nocturnal visitors are rats and not possums. So how do I get rid of these unwanted guests? I would love possums.

Dear Linda

Please don't poison the rats or use snap traps. I suggest you use a live catcher that way you know what you have caught before killing it!

We have both possums and rats in our roof but they seem to have a clear divide line between smelly etc & welcome. The more possums I can bring in the less rats I will have. Rats have just chewed though all our antenna cable and part of our electric cable costing us plenty & their faeces everywhere causing a stink. Possums are clean and I welcome them.
