Len Woodland is passionate about his orchids. This passion paid off in September with Len being awarded the ultimate prize at the 19th Australian Orchid Show held at the Burswood for one of his plants. The champion is a spectacular example of Red Nelly Devil, a cymbidium hybrid.

This show is only held every three years and it is rotated around the states. Strict quarantine regulations determine that Western Australian growers are often unable to get their blooms and plants into shows when they are held in other states, so this is a one in twenty year event for our orchid growers.


Len is the president of the South East Orchid Society. He displayed numerous blooms but had been prepared to have these in the society's display. Other members of his group viewed his plant and encouraged him to submit it for judging. The result came back 'Champion Cymbidium Hybrid' in the show. To win this award he had to beat a large number of entries. He has also been presented with a medallion to celebrate his success.

Len is keen for other gardeners to join the SE Orchid Society.

'We are a very friendly group and we are always seeking new members. We are happy to mentor new growers and people will find all the questions are answered - many of our members are experts in their field.




Some of the staff like Guy (pictured with James) have already learnt some sign language and they are excited about getting the opportunity to learn some more so they will soon be embarking on a course to learn Auslan signing. 'Communication with deaf people is important : it opens a window to an unknown world. Another culture almost. The roses needed pruning, the veggie patch needed turning over, it seemed everywhere we looked there was more work to be done.

Then as the due date drew ever closer, we experienced a week of rain and wind resulting in a call to the

tree loppers to remove 2 very large trees which had become unstable. So more raking, cutting and trimming up to clean up an area which we had hoped would not require any further effort.

So, the open days arrived. The sign boards went up out on the street, the plants received their final watering and the leaves which seem to be endless were swept up as we awaited the arrival of visiting gardeners. And they came!!!!! We had around 220 gardeners over the 2 days, our visitors book has some utterly brilliant comments and nobody went away disappointed.

We have asked ourselves after putting our tired feet up, would we do it again??? Probably not for a while, but the experience has left us much better people.

The other side of this experience which leaves us with a very warm feeling is the selfless gestures from our friends the Simpsons and Rob and Kerry Fidock who all took 'shifts' assisting with the arrivals and guiding of the visitors through many of the garden rooms.

It must be said also, that many of our visitors had already been to the other 2 'opens' and the very positive comments on how well the gardens had been presented made us very proud to be in such esteemed gardening company.



## Spring at The Park

The springtime 'festival when you do not have a festival' at Araluen has been a wonderful success. This spring has been special with the early arrival of warm temperatures and some magic weather over the previous four weekends providing excellent conditions for flowers and tourists.

Visitor numbers were up with the numbers in August going from 4,502 (2011) to 7,264 (2012). September numbers have really increased with 17,096 visiting in 2011 and this was up to 30,771 by the 23rd September. These visitors were treated to the Park in full splendour with over 100,000 tulips plus a wonderful display of annuals, Camellias, Azaleas, Magnolias, Rhododendrons and loads of other cool temperate blooms. These increased numbers did result in increased income for the Park but not as much as would have occurred if the Department of Conservation had not rejected the request to increase entry fees over the Spring time.

Traffic management has gone extremely well in 2012. On most days the increased car numbers were parked within the Park and on the old YAL site. On those days when extra parking was needed the cars were parked on the northern side of Croydon Road. (On two occasions, patrons breeched this requirement, however this was dealt with expediently). There was rarely any queuing and the traffic process occurred without incident. The entry off Croydon Road was seen as very successful and allowed normal access for most residents and businesses in the area.

Congratulations to the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation, the staff and volunteers at Araluen for the success of this occasion. The City of Armadale has really embraced The Park and has made the tulip theme central to its spring marketing campaign and City staff have given full support to the Park staff. Particular accolades go to the businesses and many residents of our locality who made this year's Tulip time such a success despite the lack of publicity and the lack of support from some state government departments. This has been a wonderful example of our community embracing a well loved icon. We hope the two government departments with the responsibility for governance of Araluen Botanic Park (the Department of Environment and Conservation and the Department of Planning) reflect on this success when they make decisions on future events and improvements for Our Park.

#### DEC Justifies Not Supporting the Spring Festival in 2012

This letter was received in response to the communication printed in the September Courier regarding Government Response: Re Tulip Festival for Spring 2012 at Araluen Botanic Park addressed to Anita Renna and Rose Carter of Brackenridge Village.

I understand that the City of Armadale's decision in 2009 to withdraw support for traffic management arrangements that had been implemented in previous spring festivals, and prohibit parking along Croyden Road, was based on public safety concerns associated with traffic management and potential vehicle and pedestrian conflicts.

The Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) has advised that despite there being no formal spring festival since 2009, the park has continued to attract strong visitation, exceeding the park's capacity in 2010 and 2011. I am aware that traffic management arrangements implemented in both years adequately addressed queuing and congestion issues, resulting in minimal disruption to local residents.

The decision to not support the reintroduction of the spring festival in

2012 was taken in the context of additional tulips being planted in the park - and new traffic management arrangements being implemented, and considered the positions of key stakeholders including the city and local residents.

DEC deemed it appropriate that the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation continue to refrain from marketing the spring period as a festival while the effectiveness of new management arrangements is determined.

DEC has advised that, despite the lack of a formal spring festival, visitation is likely to again exceed the park's capacity, resulting in traffic congestion. Given this, DEC has liaised with the City and the Foundation in the preparation of a traffic management plan for spring 2012. DEC and the City will continue monitoring events held in the park to achieve appropriate outcomes for visitors and the broader community.

#### HELPING BOBTAILS

## It is the time of the year when the bobtail lizards and skinks come out of hibernation.

They look for places that are warm and sunny in order to gain energy so they can go in search of food. A bitumen road is a perfect place and this puts the lizards in danger of passing vehicles.

Unfortunately, a basking lizard is unaware of the danger it is in and if it doesn't move it is just a matter of time before it is run over. Once it is on the move, often it finds itself unable to negotiate steep curbing, exposing itself to further danger and it wanders back and forth across the road.

Many drivers are unaware of the lizards' dilemma and as a result the animals are frequently killed. With a little effort bobtail lizards can be safely lifted by a person positioning an index figure and thumb on each side of the bobtail's neck. The lizard will open its mouth, hiss and move its head from side to side as it tries to break free, but with a firm grip it can been lifted and placed in the bush a few metres from the road. And for parents and care-givers, teaching a child to protect a bobtail is as important for the child as it is for the bobtail. **Patrick Weir and Maggie Burke**





## Local Fruit Industry Fights Medfly

A change in the availability of controls traditionally relied on by fruit growers in the past to manage fruit fly have provided some real concerns on the availability of fresh fruit this summer in WA.

As replacement controls for fruit fly have not evolved, growers are facing huge losses, even total crop losses due to this pest.

The alternative being offered is a system called "area wide management" (AWM). This system requires more than just the orchardist to be fruit fly alert. As its name indicates, it is a system that requires a large area surrounding fruit growing areas to be strictly managed for fruit fly.

This system requires all growers of fruit trees, both commercial growers and those with trees in the backyard for personal use, to carry out management work during each season to keep the life cycle of the fruit fly under control. This includes foliage baiting, fly trapping and at times cover spraying to control the fruit fly. If this management is not done regularly, then the site becomes a source of a fruit fly population explosion that can spread and affect the fruit of other growers with potential for complete damage to their fruit. If the fruit fly population is not kept low, but is allowed to spike, the commercial growers will be facing a losing battle and can face huge losses to their crops.

This means that it will be absolutely vital for all **fruit growers, including** 



backyarders to manage for fruit fly, as any single tree left unmanaged can threaten the supplies of sound clean fruit we all love to buy and enjoy. Fruit types that require management for fruit fly include stonefruit, apples, pears, citrus and includes loquats, guavas, tomatoes, capsicums and eggplant.

Although the activities or components of AWM are not new to the commercial fruit growing industry, their efforts will need to increase this season without an effective backup cover spray to produce sound fresh fruit.

They are calling on everyone who has any of the fruit trees mentioned above, no matter what distance they are to a commercial orchard, to assist them by also implementing strict fruit fly management. This will need to commence from the time fruit has set on the tree.

Citrus tree management for fruit fly is also required through the winter as this is where fruit fly hang-out till the new spring / summer season begins.

This management is not a huge task but it is crucial that it is done regularly to support our WA Fruit Growers. If it is not possible to manage a fruit tree for fruit fly, it is highly recommended that the fruit tree is removed. It really is that important to the possibility of enjoying those delicious fruits this coming summer. This coming season there will be trials in place run by the Department of Agriculture and Food to endeavor to test other more effective ways to combat this pest. However, while this work goes on, we all need to do our part to control fruit fly if we want to see freshly produced produce available in the shops.

Fruit West in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA), grower groups statewide, local government and regulators is coordinating information sessions and the distribution of "how to" information on Medfly management. The priority is to help the community control fruit fly numbers to continue to keep grower businesses alive and viable.



#### SPRAY BAN LOOMS AS MAJOR THREAT

One of the biggest threats to the production of quality fruit from our Hills Orchards is looming. I am the owner/manager of the oldest and one of the largest orchards in the district Illawarra; we have a very proud history of fruit growing over the last 120 years. This year I am very concerned that although I have orders and the season has been excellent so far, I have little confidence that I can produce quality fruit to fill these orders.

The looming threat to ban the sprays we currently use to protect our fruit from Medfly is a huge concern. I remember back when I was a child and despite extensive baiting programs, every now and again fruit fly outbreaks destroyed the crop. A lot of fruit was marketed that was struck (ie marked by fruit fly). But standards were different then and consumers were happy to accept some level of damaged fruit. Today consumers want perfection - and the ban on these sprays has removed our ability to produce perfect fruit.

What also concerns me is that the void left by the absence of WA fruit will easily be filled. Imported fruit is available and many of these locations do not have the same regulations or the same insect threats. So please assist us in our campaign to save our industry.

## **Politicians Support Local Orchardists**

It is easy to take for granted the high quality fruit that is grown in the Perth Hills - we are very fortunate to have some of the World's best produce on our doorstep. However orchardists in our region are facing a serious problem which has the potential to cripple the industry in the next few years and this is an issue that has ramifications for us all.

Fruit growers have long relied on cover sprays such as Fenthion and Dimethoate to control the notorious Mediterranean fruit fly or Med fly as it is commonly referred. The Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) have recently handed down a review of Fenthion and they intend to impose a ban on the product within weeks. Sadly, APVMA banned Dimethoate last year and looks very likely to remain prohibited. The likely ban of Fenthion will have enormous ramifications on Perth's fruit growing industry as it is the last remaining tool to combat fruit fly.

Industry representative bodies are working hard to lobby APVMA to overturn or at least suspend the looming ban of Fenthion and I am supporting them in this quest. To take away the growers only remaining weapon to control fruit fly before a replacement is identified is irresponsible and leaves orchardists little chance of combating any outbreak in the future.

The WA Department of Agriculture and Food (DAFWA) are in the process of rolling out a concept known as Area Wide Management as an alternative to Fenthion. If the effort to suspend the ban of Fenthion through APVMA is unsuccessful, Area Wide Management will be the only known tool that is available to growers. Therefore, it is essential that we make these trials as successful as possible. The trials are to take place in Jarrahdale and Roleystone. Here is where Roleystone Courier readers can play a vital role in the success of the Area Wide Management trial and in doing so help our local growers. Many readers may

so help our local growers. Many readers may have one or two fruit trees in their backyards. Some will be well maintained and will have been the source of great fruit over the years. Others, however, will be breeding grounds for med fly and you will have noticed that the tree will not have provided you with edible fruit for some time.

Please consider the benefit that will be attained by tackling fruit fly in your own back yard. Not only will you be contributing to the success of DAFWA's Area Wide Management trials (and in doing so provide a huge helping hand to growers in the area) but you may even find that your fruit tree yields produce for the first time in years! Traps and baits are relatively inexpensive and are available at Bunnings, or local suppliers: A Giumelli & Sons (9293 5444) or Hills Cold Store in Pickering Brook (9293 7162). The fruit fly problem is without doubt one of the most important community issues that the local area has faced in some time. The imminent banning of Fenthion is a huge problem for growers and they require your help and support - it is no exaggeration to say that their livelihoods rely on it. THE FRUIT INDUSTRY NEEDS TIME

This letter, addressed to **Hon Joe Ludwig**, **MP** Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry and was supplied to the Roleystone Courier by the Hills Orchard Improvement Group.

I write regarding an issue raised with me by representatives of the Western Australian stone fruit growing industry and the Fruit Fly Action Group.

They are concerned by a proposed ban of the use of fenthion, as a tool for control of the Mediterranean fruit fly. As this proposal recommends adopting area wide management as an alternative to using fenthion, I make the following points on behalf of the local industry:

More than half of the individual component parts of an area wide management response are beyond the control of the growers and require significant resourcing and support from the Barnett State Government, which has not been forthcoming.

The season has commenced and invoking a ban mid-season seems unfair and is very likely to have a significant, negative financial impact on the industry.

The effectiveness and safety of the proposed alternative chemical controls are questioned by the industry.

The consultation period prior to the proposed ban appears to be very short and inadequate. There is potential for a negative outcome on the industry, if this season is jeopardised by the ban.

Noting the apparently legitimate and reasonable concerns expressed by representatives of the Western Australian horticulture industry, I request that you reconsider this matter with a view to providing the industry with a longer lead time and better suite of alternative measures to counter the threat of Mediterranean fruit fly.

Trail bike riding is a recreational sport that is loved by many, from young children on pee-wee mini-bikes to mature motocross aficionados. For Perth, a growing population and increasing sales of off-road motorcycles and quad bikes means we have more trail bikes than ever, and this is causing angst within communities.

The introduction of significantly cheaper imported bikes and quads from China has led to impulse buying by many families with little consideration as to where the bikes will be legally ridden and how they will be transported there. Unfortunately, this has led to an increase in riders riding illegally in forests, along local roads and foot paths and in metropolitan bushland areas.

My office receives complaints about young riders on unregistered trail bikes, and beyond the noise of the bikes, the main concern is for the safety of the riders and others in the area. Unfortunately, since the riding is already illegal, other legal safety requirements, such as helmets and lights, are often forgotten and safety equipment like mirrors are removed.

My colleague, Tony Simpson MLA, Member for Darling Range, has been working with the Barnett Government to resolve this issue through the implementation of a State Trail Bike Strategy. This will help establish more places for riders to access safely and replace the patchwork of policies that currently exist, with a consistent unified approach.

Often people do not bother reporting illegal trail bike riding because they do not believe it will result in riders being prosecuted, particularly under age riders. The advice from Tony has been that even if people are unhappy with the outcome of their complaints they should still continue to report any inappropriate riding to the Police as this helps maintain a register of when and where these activities occur and allows better targeting of police resources.

Resolving this complex issue requires the involvement of many Ministers and agencies that rely on public feedback.

## FIRE PERMITS NOW NEEDED

Residents are reminded that permits are required to burn off from 1st October to 30 November. After November 30 there is a total fire ban in the area. These periods may be extended or shortened in the event of unseasonal weather conditions and this will be advised in the press or ring Ranger services on 9399 0111. Permits can be obtained from the Ranger Services at the City of Armadale Administration Centre. Permits are issued for a maximum of 3 consecutive days and not issued for properties under 1200 sqm in size.

This is illustrated by the fact that police presently can only pursue riders on gazetted roads and in urban areas, they are unable to respond to riders on land administered by local councils or other government departments such as State Parks where the Department of Environment and Conservation are the proper authority.



## It's heavenly in the hills and what better place to be at the moment

than Roleystone. Everywhere you look plants are bursting into colour and life, another cycle starts again.

If you have been on a nursery crawl you will have noticed a number of new varieties of the old fashioned 'easy grow' plants that were grown in

our mother's and grandmother's gardens. We all know the white flowered Black-eyed-Susan *Ornithogalum*. I was delighted to find a yellow version of it. Yes it's a bulb and flowers, then goes dormant but will grow again with more flowering stems next year. Another is a perennial nemesia. These are in a group with dusky versions of the brighter colours. Then of course there are a lot of daisy varieties which do not grow too big and are certainly not rampant wanderers which take over our native bushland. Common species such as: Arctotis, Gazania and Osteospermum definitely have these tendencies and although they might look good could become real feral pests.

I took an Eastern States visitor to Araluen recently and was delighted to see the new growth coming on the Camellias we had recently transplanted, the team have done a wonderful job. I have never seen the park looking better, tulips are spreading into open areas and the camellias, rhododendrons, azaleas and the spectacular magnolias are all very showy.

The Roleystone Garden Group had a lovely outing this month at a house in Mt Nasura. I had hoped to go to Amanda's garden in Southern River for October, but it appears it will only be open on the Saturday and Sunday, October 27 and 28. We will have to put on our thinking caps but a possibility is to visit Ilda Schorer at Congella in Kalamunda. Ilda's garden has been opened often as a fund-raiser and I have formed a friendship with this determined and dedicated gardener over the years. I think gardeners are the nicest possible people.

Sufficient to say the weeds are establishing themselves very well with this lovely weather, it is necessary to eliminate them before they put out seeds and scatter them to the wind. Much as oxalis looks attractive it is very invasive and no matter how hard we try to eliminate it, it always seems to come back. Patterson's curse is another that looks lovely but is really a problem. I noticed a plant the other day but I think it got decimated with the advent of the new heavy duty power pole near our Brookton Highway drive-way. My Geraldton wax tree is looking terrible and needs a decent pruning. So much for trying to make the entrance attractive.

Enjoy the season and enjoy seeing which new plants you want to grow. Feed the garden and if we get a dry spell keep the water up, but do not overwater and try to condition the garden with less watering and the application of manures and mulches. Slow release fertilisers are the way to go and much more environmental friendly. Good Gardening. Jean

If you have any questions about dieback, local wildflowers or are having trouble identifying weeds on


your block then you will probably find someone who will be able to assist you at the field day.

### New Cat Laws Coming into Place from November 2012



## CITY OF Armadale

As part of the State Government's new Cat Act, all cats in the City of Armadale will be required to be sterilised, micro-

chipped and registered with the Council.

These new cat laws will come into effect this November and will apply to all cats in the State. Cat owners will have a one year grace period to undertake the provisions of the Cat Act.

All cat owners will need to:

- Sterilise and microchip cats over the age of six (6) months.
- Register cats over the age of six (6) months must be with their local government.
- Ensure cats wear a collar with identification and registration tags. Local governments will have the authority to enforce these laws, and may administer fines and create local laws for cat control within their district.

The City of Armadale will be taking registrations for cats from 1 November 2012.

Applications for registrations will be available to download from the City's website or to collect in person from the Administration Building located at 7 Orchard Avenue, Armadale.

Subsidies will be available for pensioners and health care cardholders to assist with the cost of sterilisation. Sterilisation/micro-chipping clinics will be organised for the convenience of cat owners and only approved breeders will be exempt from sterilisation laws.

WE THE UNDERSIGNED REQUEST THE CITY OF ARMADALE COUNCIL REMOVE THE TREE PROTECTION ORDER (TPO) 16 LOCATED ON PRIVATE PROPERTY AT LOT 801 (1) ARDROSS STREET SEVILLE GROVE 6112 WEST AUSTRALIA.

The tree has grown to an extraordinary height (23.1 meters), significantly impacts on the residents and neighbours quality of life being located 3.1 m from the property line and 3.8 meters from the dwelling wall with a trunk diameter of 770mm at chest height encompassed within a 380 square meter "small" house property.

This large tree (23.1 metres) Corymbia Maculata "Spotted Gum" carries risk and a cost that is currently borne alone by the resident for the benefit of the greater community, this is neither fair, equitable or deserved. The management of a registered tree should be about managing the various impacts and benefits of a tree in its setting to ensure best community outcome. In this instance obtaining the best outcome will require the protection of private assets.

The tree is not suited to the environment of a 380m<sup>2</sup> very small and tiny back yard. The short term solution of removing the TPO and allowing the tree to be safely removed by qualified / certificated contractor is in fact the long term solution and prevents ongoing cost and provides the residents / neighbours with a measure of peace / tranquillity in the welfare of their home and family where the children (3-15 yrs) play.

A site investigation initiated by the City of Armadale (File ref PR36434) identified potential targets within the discipline of the tree that included the residential dwelling as well as pedestrian traffic being described as constant and intermittent. The recent strong winds sheared a limb off from 15 metres up that weighed 74 Kg's destroying part of a newly erected dividing fence. As the tree grows the root system will spread and in time interfere with private and public property (Footpaths, piping, fencing etc) in addition to the rooves and other private property already damaged.

#### **Pro Bono: Science** David Bardsley, Minister Community Church



#### Dear Friends

At heart I'm an engineer. My University encounter with the mathematical mysteries of fractionating columns which put petrol in your car has left an indelible mark on my persona. Now, nothing pleases me more than finding out how something works. Applying rational thought to a problem and working my way through to a logical conclusion actually delights me. "It takes all sorts..." I hear you say. Well, maybe, but I'm really happy when things stick to predictable rules which "stand to reason". That's science for you and I loved teaching it too because it made sense.

Most of our laws of science apply within a finite box, our material world. An apple falling from a tree always drops down at a certain rate of acceleration – the law of gravity applies consistently, thank goodness. Nobody yet knows how or why a big object attracts a little object but the effect of gravity is measurable and predictable. Of course if you go the moon the effect changes but it's still predictable, just that it's in a different box. The biggest scientific box of all is our universe and within that huge environment cutting edge experiments are going on to try to explain things occurring at the limits of observation. The really interesting thing these days is that scientists are observing things happening which refuse to fit any theory they can develop using the rules which apply within the known and finite universe. The behaviour of some subatomic particles appears irrational. For instance if you intercept one particular sub-atomic particle, it disappears and simultaneously re-appears at two different places at the same time.

These things are being explored using massive particle accelerators getting up close to the speed of light, which is knocking on a bit by anybody's standards. The best explanation so

far even seems to hint at parallel universes - how 'rational" is that? My engineering background is hopelessly ill suited to dealing with this stuff – the box in which it works is far too small. I even struggle to get my head round such commonly accepted ideas as astronomical "black holes"!

Like most of us, I was brought up to deal with the material stuff of life using a set of rational rules where cause and effect are logically linked. Actually those rules

only apply within certain finite limits - the boundaries of the box in which we contain our material thinking. But when I start to deal with matters of spirit and God I run into trouble because my conventional box is far too small. I have to start thinking "outside the box" or at least in a much bigger box like the cutting edge scientists.

It's not that the spiritual world and the God I know are irrational; they just operate in a bigger box. It's obvious that I'll run into trouble if I apply what I now know to be very finite rules to an infinite entity. Mind you, it didn't stop me trying for half a lifetime!

When I did eventually think of God in his proper place - outside the small minded limits of the box containing my material world - it was an amazing release and so much I had been struggling with just dropped into place. I'm really happy that an apple always falls down off the tree in my garden. I'm also really happy that the God I know always loves me.

Both phenomena are equally rational - I don't have to leave my brain on the shelf to believe both. And the really, really good thing is that God can fix things and make things work far more effectively than any engineer I know. Of course he doesn't always do the things I want him to do; but that's another story... Yours in Christ, David



#### Astronomical Highlights October

With the onset (sounds like a disease) of the October school holidays, the Observatory staff and volunteers have to come out of hibernation, dust off their wits and their telescopes, and prepare for yet another public stargazing season. October's a funny month for breaking-in new stargazers because it's nice to show them something a bit familiar like the Southern Cross but the Cross is going out of sight; and Orion (featuring the "saucepan") isn't around in the early evening.

This month there's no bright, exciting planet in the evening, either. We'll get by. Just give us some clear evenings, Mr Weatherman!

The month begins with a big, bright, fullish Moon. Officially it was full on September 30th, but it looks full for at least a day on either side of the official 100% phase.

By the evening of the 2nd you should be able to see a shading effect on the top of the Moon as it's rising at around 9pm. It shows that the Moon's on the wane. The shadow grows day by day (night by night) and the Moon rises later and later. Last quarter, the morning half moon phase, is on the 8th when moonrise happens after midnight.

Then the waning crescent phases will take us through to new moon, phase zero, on the 15th. A fresh lunar cycle begins at new moon, and within a couple of days the thin crescent moon becomes visible in the western sky at dusk.

First quarter, the evening half moon phase, occurs on the 22nd. Full moon's on the 30th, when the full moon will rise in the twilight about 40 minutes after sunset. Always worth a look.

Mercury will come into view in midmonth, low in the WSW at dusk. In the latter half of the month it'll be easy to spot in the WSW about an hour after sunset. Higher up, but looking like nothing to get excited about, Mars will be visible in the western sky all month.

If you Google "Mars Curiosity Rover" you'll find that there's plenty happening on the Red Planet now, signifying that Mars is the only other planet in this solar system that's ever going to be worth visiting with a manned spacecraft. Conditions there are difficult, rather like being on the Moon, but the other planets are worse. Mercury's airless, barren, blighted, mighty hot on the day side and very cold on the night side. Venus is even hotter (480°C), with a poisonous atmosphere so dense it would squash you flat. Mars is not too awful.

Further out, much further out, Jupiter and the other gas planets don't offer any solid surface to land on. Who'd want to go out there anyway, so far from the Sun and Earth, so cold, so lonely ...?

Saturn's going through conjunction on the 25th. It'll be out of sight behind the Sun until further notice. Jupiter's rising before midnight now: it appears at the horizon in the ENE around 11:45pm in early October, 10:45pm mid-month, and 9:45pm by month's end. This means that it'll be found well up in the northern sky at daybreak.

Also visible at daybreak (say 4:30am or so) is Venus, very bright but very low down. It's ENE at dawn in early October and gradually slips to the right as the weeks pass. If you have a clear view low down to the eastern horizon you'll be able to see Venus in the morning twilight for the rest of the year - if you're up and about that early! On the mornings of the 3rd and 4th Venus is close to the star Regulus, Alpha Leonis.

#### Wild Gossip: **Abandoned Birds**

Baby birds are with us again, adult birds are busy gathering food to take to the nest and already some young birds have started to leave the nest, so now is the time for a few pointers to

#### help these delightful young birds to have a safe and happy future. NESTS

If you find a dislodged nest it is usually recommended that you try to reattach it as close to the original site as possible even if this includes adding additional items such as a hanging basket. Whilst the nest is being reattached or an alternative nest is being provided any babies involved will need to be in a warm, dark, quiet place - until they can be returned to the nest. Once the young are safely placed in the nest (unfeathered will need a warmth source in the nest) you should observe the nest from a distance to ensure that the adult birds are returning to care for their young. If there is no adult activity in 1 -2 hours please contact your local carer for further advice or for the young to be taken into care.


