


The happy couple along with their guests enjoyed a wonderful meal, great music and dancing. To top it off there was a surprise fireworks display.

Thank you one and all; may God bless you richly.



Many residents who have driven down Brookton Highway over the last month have been impressed by the very twisted grasstree spikes near the entry to the Roleystone Theatre. One of the grasstrees has five twisted spikes - the others have their flower spikes tall and unbent.

So why has this occurred? Neighbour John McSweeney of Creative Driveways is impressed but has not provided any special treatment to the grasstrees. Local wild flower expert Kim Fletcher suspected that the spike was damaged in its development and he thought it might be native wasp damage.



This has been supported by Lesley Hammersley The Director, Horticulture Conservation at the Botanic Gardens & Parks Authority. 'The bending of grass trees spikes can be caused by a range of factors but generally it is in response to an injury. The two main factors are insect damage such as sap sucking wasps or other insects, and environmental factors such as a falling branch or strong winds and hail during the flower spike's development stage. Although an injury may only appear minor while the spike is in its juvenile stage, it is generally magnified as the spike grows to maturity, and often results in a curled spike."

So how many spikes can a grasstree have? In favourable conditions (especially after fire) apparently they can have at least two spikes per head. Vern Bettenay, using his 90 years of knowledge of the local bush, recalls that the biggest in the district was a 12 spiker - called the Twelve Apostles - it was sited near the bridge below Araluen. Sadly this grand plant was destroyed in a very hot bushfire in the 1960's. Does anyone know of any other fine examples of this ancient and spectacular species?

Some wag has obviously been collecting hub caps over many years.

The artwork 'Hub Cap Alley', is on the corner of Knuckey Dr and Peet Rd. Perhaps the message is to drive slowly or lose bits of your car - or your person!

Due to the diligent and well conducted fight led by local Hills orchardists from the Hills Orchard Improvement Group, Western Australian orchardists will be allowed to use Fenthion (commercially sold as Lebaycid) to combat Medfly for the 2012/2013 season. There will be a separate label attached to this product for use on commercial orchards in Western Australia

This permit has been granted for 12 months and over this time orchardists will need to strictly align with the spray conditions. The industry has a system of random and independent measurements of chemical residue in the fruit provided for sale and if this is shown to be exceeded in any circumstance, this extension will be seriously jeopardised. All orchardists have been made aware of the importance to align strictly to the labelling instructions. Use of the spray in WA on apricots, peaches, nectarines and cherries is limited to a maximum of two sprays only and with a withholding period of 7 days before sale.

The AVPMA (the government agency determining the safe use of chemicals in the Australia) was only convinced to review this after strong evidence was presented about the comparative safety of this chemical and the self regulation and strict adherence to regulations shown by the WA industry. The Western Australian growers clearly established their controlled and lower use of Fenthion compared to the use by Eastern States growers.

We would like to express our appreciation to the Roleystone Courier for bringing the issue of the orchardists battle with fruit fly to the attention of the community.


We really need the assistance of everyone in the fight against this pest and as the stonefruit season begins in earnest, we plead with all of you who have any type of fruit tree, to manage this for fruit fly. Information for how to do this can be found on the DAFWA website.

Already indications are that the fruit fly pest pressure will be high this season, as we began our first pick of peaches with the discovery of fly infestation. It is baffling where these flies have come from, as traps were not showing their presence and many components of area wide management, including sterile fly releases, were being carried out.

We plead with you to help us to keep fly numbers low and prevent them from having hosts in which to breed and increase in numbers. We really are relying on the community to assist us with this, so that we can continue to grow the delicious stonefruit the hills is known for.

They have lived within the City of Armadale since August 1972 and now they live at Harrisdale.







A Pioneer Passes Away Shirley Brown (11/2/1926 – 3/11/2012)

Shirley Elaine Brown was born the oldest child of Albert & Laurel Winstanley, sister to Val, Laurel and Don.

Albert spent his early years living in Canning Mills attending school there while his mother worked as a cook for the Mills. He began his married life with Laurel in Victoria Park where Shirley and Val were born, however they lost their home in the depression, and moved to Roleystone looking for work. They lived in various homes in Roleystone, and while Albert was employed as a stone mason in 1933 -1936 working on the building of the Canning Dam, he built the family home on Brookton Hwy, cycling home from Canning Dam with the leftover scrapings of concrete to make the bricks. His final job was working for the Water Supply, where part of his job was walking the channel keeping it clear of debris.

Shirley attended Roleystone Primary School up until the age of 12, then left to help her mother in the home. In 1943 she got a job with Selfridges in the City, boarding with a family in Nedlands and coming home on weekends to go dancing in Kelmscott and to play tennis. She fondly recounted her days back then walking to Kelmscott to dance, and then walking back up the hill to Roleystone afterwards, sometimes catching a lift on the back of Colin Hatfield's truck.

Shirley wanted to learn the violin, so she made an arrangement with Mrs Knuckey to do housework in return for music lessons. Mrs Knuckey eventually presented her with a violin which became a treasured possession. She became a part of a group called the 'Hilarions' (see below)

After working in the city for 6 years Shirley got a job working at the Roleystone Co-op, this is where she met the love of her life Hal Brown. Hal had purchased approximately 75 acres of land in Roleystone after returning from the war, with ideas of turning it into an orchard. Coming up every weekend from South Perth to work on building a small cottage and later a much larger house which still stands on Gilmour Road. Hal was a well respected member of the Roleystone Community, throughout the years acting as Accountant to many of the orchardists in the area. He never did develop an orchard, as there was not enough water to sustain it. He dabbled briefly in raising turkey's, but mostly he just loved doing little projects and pottering around the land inventing useful gadgets. He eventually subdivided the block, which now encompasses Gilmour, Winstanley down to Welsh, up to Raeburn Roads. Hal and Shirley had four children: Margaret, Christine, Stephen and Barbara, they have 11 Grandchildren and 12 Great Grandchildren.

Shirley became a life member of the tennis club in 1977, in her later years playing with a group of friends at a private residence right up until she was nearly eighty. She also loved gardening becoming a life member of the Bergonia Society.

Unfortunately Hal passed away in 2003, Shirley never really recovered from the loss of her lifetime companion. Last year ill health finally caused her to have to leave her beloved Roleystone to be cared for at Thomas Scott Hostel Camillo, where she passed away at the age of 86 years. She will be sadly missed by all who knew her.

Firstly this month, I would like to congratulate everyone who has been involved in the Cross Park/

Springdale Park Master Planning process.

Now we are all being invited to have our say on the proposals - either by attending the scheduled meetings or by putting in submissions based on the master planning options. The preliminary work to get it to this stage has been amazing.

Getting the public recreation spaces right is vital towards the growth of our area. Our councillors (present and past) have worked tirelessly to communicate with stakeholders over this topic. I am particularly impressed with the stance Councillors Wielinga and Nixon have taken - interested readers should read their take on it, in the Council Notes on page 51.

The three Cross Park options are very similar - and they all encapsulate the main requirements of **all** stakeholders. Those who have developed it have really listened to the Clubs and attempted to incorporate their major wishes into the model.

If you haven't seen the concept maps yet I encourage you to do so. To me they have nailed it. They have retained what is important - and slotted in loads of future improvements. It all looks great!

The concept maps show a long term view - with some aspects, where finance has already been earmarked, able to go ahead as soon as the plan is endorsed. This should please those who have been keenly anticipating the revamped skate park. The proponents of the skate park had been forced to wait, which must have been frustrating, but hopefully the new location will prove far better in the long run.

Our sincere thanks also to the City of Armadale for already addressing the water and surface issues that have plagued Cross Park over many years. Over the last two months council employees have replaced the reticulation.

Other aspects on the plan will need to follow later, when funding is located. But space has been allocated.

The co-location of the sports already with a presence at Cross Park, plus allowing recreation and special interest groups to also having a stake, will be very positively perceived by many. Plus this planning will go a long way to create a hub for Roleystone. With the relocation of the Primary School, and the threat that some of our senior sporting clubs (specifically football and cricket) were being encouraged to shift to Springdale, we could have lost the community centre. This plan will make sure that doesn't happen. So once again, well done to all concerned.

So 2013 beckons. This year will mark 80 years of the Roleystone Theatre. This has great significance to me as many of my relatives were instrumental in its establishment and some in my family still have strong ties with the current Roleystone Theatre. I am sure this creative group will have special plans for their anniversary.

Just reminding all readers that we do not produce a Roleystone Courier in January. The next edition will be delivered to you in the first weekend in February.

MEDFLY ARE HERE

Once again the Med Fly season is upon the stonefruit growers of the Perth Hills, early varieties have already shown small but dangerous numbers of infestation and this scenario could snowball to critical levels if control is not regained quickly.

It looks to be a season of high fruit fly population pressure, which would have been disastrous if HOIG and their supporters had not fought to keep our only effective Med Fly control, Fenthion. The temporary reprieve for commercial growers in Western Australia regarding the use of Fenthion to treat Med Fly does not include home gardeners. They now cannot access the most effective cover spray for Med Fly, but can use trapping and bait spray. Cera Traps are an extremely effective method of trapping Med Fly, they are used in orchards and are also available to the home gardener. These traps are in stock for an extremely reasonable price from local retailers such as Roleystone Hardware and Giumellis in Pickering Brook.

Over time the Department of Agriculture and Food (DAFWA) hopes that if home gardeners are vigilant it will assist in ridding an area of Med Fly by reducing the population that makes its way into the properties of commercial growers.

Home gardeners should seek help and advice from the DAFWA and their local councils, via their websites and direct communication. If households are having trouble controlling Med Fly, please use these sources of information.

Send pictures of any Med Fly infested fruit along with a short description of the methods used in attempting to control this voracious pest to their State and Federal representatives, as well as to the State and Federal Ministers for Agriculture. As growers of quality local fruit we need our community's support in convincing our politicians that we need a chemical cover spray to protect against crop annihilation.

STOLEN POULTRY

I live in Simons Drive, and I want to warn other Roleystone residents of a poultry thief in our area, and hopefully find out if anybody else has been hit by this person/s.

For the last 4 years we have had our Chinese geese stolen. It is always in early November and always during stormy weather.

The latest theft was earlier this month, on a rainy Saturday night they stole our male breeder and then next night they came back for the rest, 2 females and a remaining male. Sometime earlier in the week our eggs and a 2 week old gosling were stolen.

I heard my dog barking aggressively at approx 11.45pm that night. Sure enough, when I awoke this morning, the rest of my geese were gone. Each time the circumstances have been the same, early November, on a stormy night. I have seen a white 2wd Hilux trayback ute sitting outside our property twice within the last 2 weeks before the theft. Interestingly, a vehicle of the same was seen parked in the area for 2 of the past 4 thefts.

I have called the police each time, only to have them laugh at me, when I have told them what has been stolen. They inferred that it's not worth a report. They think its a joke, however I do not.

These geese sell for \$100 each. This time they got 4. That's \$400 worth of poultry. In the past raids they have stolen many more, with one theft being worth \$2300.


They took all of our breeding stock plus a clutch of 23 fertile eggs. As a result of these thefts, I have incurred losses worth over \$4000.

I am most upset, as I treat these birds like members of my family. I feed and care for these birds and to have this happen so many times is devastating. Originally they were an Easter gift to my husband, from me. I have now replaced these birds 4 times, only to have them stolen each time.

Has anybody else experienced the same thing?

Vale Doug McPherson

Doug McPherson of Croyden Rd Roleystone, passed away at the age of 93 on Sunday evening 18 November. (Doug created the 'little area of paradise' on the corner of Heritage Dr and Croyden Rd.)

A resident in the valley for over 50 years, Doug and his wife Margaret, who passed away 7 years ago, created an iconic property on the Canning River. For several years he participated in the Open Gardens scheme, helping to bring avid gardeners to Roleystone. He has hosted some 34 weddings at the property over the years. Both he and Margaret were active in volunteer work at Araluen Botanic Park up until about 10 years ago, helping out in the shop and the gardens.

Some 30 years ago when the pumps failed at the State Trout Hatchery in Pemberton with the resultant loss of almost all fish stocks, trout eggs and sperm were taken from the fish in Doug's trout pond on the property to restock. This was a significant contribution from Roleystone at the time.

Doug's work on landscaping around the restricted and vegetation tangled river course in the 1960s significantly reduced the flooding that was a regular phenomenon in those

days, with floodwaters sometimes covering the road and stopping traffic access.



SAVE OUR COUNTRYSIDE

We recently held a garage sale in Roleystone and had 4 TV's for sale or to give away. No one was interested. I contacted the City of Armadale to see what I could do with these items.

To take a TV or computer screen to the C of A Tip and you do not have an 'Electronic Tip Pass', it will cost you \$14 or 1standard tip pass. Two tip passes are included with the verge junk flyer which are hand-delivered to every householder prior to the area's junk collection. The City pays \$1.05 per kilogram to recycle TV and computer screens. Most of them are 20-30kg, some are up to 60kg giving a disposal cost of \$20 to \$60. Residents only pay \$14 per screen or provide a tip pass, so this is a considerable subsidy.

Also, the Roleystone Greenwaste Site has six drop off days per year which includes electronic waste (this is done to cater for hills residents). The Commonwealth Government is setting up a scheme supported by manufacturers and importers to dispose of electronic waste. This scheme is being rolled out in WA next year and Armadale is likely to be a collection point.

When electronic goods are dropped off at the Landfill facility, the Drop n Shop does test and recycle saleable electrical and electronic goods.

Why not have 'electronic waste' included in the verge pickups? Well, screens were collected during the verge collection two years ago but many were being vandalised or smashed to take the copper coil from the back of the tube. Broken glass became a problem to clear from the verge and the screens could no longer be recycled. Instead of dumping electronic goods at verge collections residents are encouraged to do the right thing and dispose of these items at the landfill through the year. Nearly 4,500 TVs and computers were deposited at the landfill by responsible people last year. 3,000 of these used tip passes, whilst the remaining 1,500 were happy to pay \$14 per screen.

I look forward to the proposed collection points or drop off centres in the near future so until then I encourage everyone to utilise the services we have here in the City and to help keep our area beautiful.





JOYCE ARNOTT WORKS Across Our District

Joyce was invited to join the Roleystone Community Alive Group, in her role as Roleystone Community Youth Worker, by coordinator Evie Molson.

For many years Evie worked tirelessly in Roleystone to bring about awareness on suicide. Her role included bringing together community members across Roleystone in the Roleystone Community Alive Group.

Late in 2011 Evie Molson was appointed One Life Community Coordinator for the Armadale region, which was an extension of her Roleystone work.

Once employed with One Life, Evie started researching the needs of the Armadale community. She met with community organizations in Armadale and put together a Community Action Plan for the Armadale Community.

Evie resigned as Community Coordinator in April 2012. A huge, somewhat belated, thank you Evie for your wonderful efforts.

Evie suggested they employ Joyce Arnott to carry on her role.

Since then Joyce has been busy. In her words she has been: 'holding parent workshops in Armadale primary schools and running resilience programs (with Paul Hasleby) at local schools. I have also been applying for grants and assisting with the formation of the Roleystone Men's Shed and Community Garden.'

One Life is the name of the WA suicide prevention strategy. There are six action areas to guide suicide prevention activities:

- Improve the evidence base and understanding of suicide prevention
- Build individual resilience and capacity for self-help
- Improve community strength, resilience and capacity in suicide prevention
- Take a coordinated approach to suicide prevention
- Provide a targeted suicide prevention activities

Joyce is one of the many Community Coordinators employed in WA. In her words: 'Everyone of us has a role to play in suicide prevention.'

'Whether you are a mother, a father, an auntie, uncle, teacher, nurse, youth worker, grand parent, government worker, social worker, councillor, Chaplain, community member or neighbour.'

'We all have the capacity for building resilience in ourselves, our children, our youth, our family and our peers.'

We have the ability to build strong relationships and develop social connectedness through trust, cooperation and mutual understanding.' Well said





WATER RELEASES INTO THE CANNING UNDERWAY

The Department of Water commenced water releases into the Canning River in early November.

Declining rainfall has resulted in lower natural flow levels. This year there is to be a 10% reduction below current usage.

As the majority of the Canning's summer flow is from scheme water, all non-commercial users (riparian) have been requested to observe the current sprinkler restrictions for scheme water users. All licensees and riparian users have been encouraged to implement water efficiency measures.

This 'Middle Canning River Surface Water Allocation Plan' (report 37-September 2012) sits under the Rights in Water Irrigation Act 1914 and is subject to enforcement provisions. This includes a \$10,000 fine and an additional \$1,000 for each day of continued non-compliance.



WA GREENS WANT PERTH HILLS RESIDENTS TO ALSO BE CONSIDERED FOR FIRE COMPENSATION

WA Greens East Metro MLC Alison Xamon WA believes that residents of the Perth Hills whose homes were damaged or destroyed in the Roleystone area fires of February 2011, deserve compensation from the State Government.

'More than 100 homes were burnt or destroyed in these fires yet the Government claims no-one is entitled to any compensation because Government agencies were not liable,' Ms Xamon said.

'The Government compensated people in Margaret River and Toodyay for their properties with ex-gratia payments because of the failings of Government agencies such as the DEC and Western Power.'

'How the Government can now say they have no responsibility to the people of Roleystone-Kelmscott is hard to comprehend.'It is true that the initial spark was not the Government's fault.'

'However, the Keelty report, which examined how the fires got so out of control, exposed a staggering litany of failures by Government agencies that resulted in a scathing indictment of FESA.'

'Keelty particularly raised concerns about

the way the fire was managed on the day and the many ways in which the procedures, particularly the Westplan–Bushfire, were not followed.'

"The report made 55 recommendations, and concluded that resources were not deployed in an optimum way because of "a series of shortcomings on the part of senior FESA management."

'The Keelty report asserts, residents assert, and I assert, that had Government agencies done their job properly, the scale


of this disaster could have been mitigated. The residents of Perth Hills have been left high and dry.'

'I am calling on Government to show some compassion by acknowledging that its agencies seriously mishandled the situation, and by reconsidering its position not to provide compensation.'

Advocare

Normally people who care for, or support, older Australians can be relied upon to provide quality service and act in the best interests of those they care for. When this is not the case, people need to know they do have rights, that those rights are protected and that help is available.

Often people are reluctant to speak out and assert their rights against the very people they rely upon for care. Furthermore, people may also worry about the loss of care or companionship and are embarrassed to tell others about their concerns. With this in mind, everyone needs to be reminded that care providers have obligations to those they care for, and that under no circumstances is elder abuse acceptable.

Unfortunately, around 1 in 25 people over 65 years of age experiences abuse or is mistreated by someone they trust.

Although abuse is traditionally recognised as physical in nature, it can take many forms, which include, but are not limited to: financial or material abuse (using property or money without permission), emotional abuse (verbal threats of punishment or abandonment and

intimidation), sexual (sex without consent, interference and harassment), social abuse (restricting social freedom and isolation from family and friends), and neglect (failure to provide essentials, including food, shelter, care and emotional support).

If you live in an aged care facility or in the community with the Home and Community Care (HACC) Program, are eligible for either service, or are being, or at risk of being, abused by someone with whom you are in a relationship of trust (e.g. family and friends), then state-wide support is available through "Advocare".

As an independent advocacy agency, Advocare seeks to advance and protect the rights and best interests of those who receive care services or those experiencing elder abuse. Advocare offers a state-wide service to help people assert their own rights and advance and maintain their own best interests where possible.

In instances where people are unable to act for themselves, Advocare may provide support to others to advocate on behalf of that person, or work directly with agencies and people who are involved with the person's care or who can help safeguard their rights. Advocare can be contacted on Freecall number 1800 655 566 and have an office in both Perth and Geraldton.

GARDENING NOTES JEAN: 9397 5547

It's nice that the creek is still flowing and hopefully if we have some rain, it will continue to do so throughout the summer. I love seeing the little waterfall along Brookton Highway, as it shows the water flow.

The garden is very spring-like at present with so many blossoms out. We have sweet-peas, nasturtiums, woodbine, lilacs, Hippeastrums, Philadelphus, lots of different day-lilies, geraniums and carnations. Plus so far, I have no aphids on the roses.

The lovely Princess Lillies (Alstroemerias) are a treat and my neighbour has a lovely hedge of these in their yard. Most times when I buy them I forget the colours, so I got the grand-children to write out the names and colours. Camellia is a soft creamy colour, Sara is pink, Anouska is purple, Diana is apricot, Louise (not flowering but I think rich red) and Elaine is a pale orange/red.

What I like with these, is that you can cut through the roots, separate and get extra plants from each pot, making them a pretty good buy.

The tomatoes and strawberries I planted a month or so back, are starting to produce fruit. Also the bulbs I bought in Bunbury have given lovely Sprekelia flowers (these are Jacobean Lilys). Last year's Larkspurs have self-seeded, so there is a section where these have come up again, close to the roses, so that is also looking good. Behind this section is the Dais (Cotinus Cogryia) not as big yet as the one at Araluen but very attractive with its feathery, browny/ purple plumes.

I went to Araluen yesterday for a picnic luncheon. This is a wonderful spot but I think every bush-fly from the district wanted to join our chicken feast. Hopefully we distracted them from the two weddings that were being held there.

I know I have said it before but we are so lucky to have Araluen Botanic Park on our doorstep. It's a real credit to all. I'm sure you can all find an excuse to have a day out, it is lovely all year and the Snapdragons are a feast for the eyes. The roses are still wonderful at the moment and well worth a special visit.

Building in Fire Prone Areas

With the bushfire season upon us, we posed some questions to the City of Armadale about what had changed in regard to building regulations. Here are some responses from the Mayor Henry Zelones:

What are the changes to the building code (released in April 2012) for those people living in bushfire prone regions and what ramifications does this have for building a home in Roleystone?

The Building Act 2011, introduced in April this year had many changes but these did not relate specifically to bushfire prone areas or to the enquiry into bushfires. Building Codes of Australia change over time as new developments and standards are introduced. National legislation requires replacement buildings to address current standards. Some of the homes affected by the fire were decades old and naturally there have been changes between building standards in 1979 and those now in place.

Neither of the new versions of the Building Act or Building Code introduced additional requirements specific to people living in bushfire prone areas.

Do any of these changes need to be implemented on pre-existing homes before sale?

No, approvals are only required for new structures.

What areas of Roleystone, Karragullen and Bedfordale are bushfire prone areas?

Roleystone, Karragullen and Bedfordale are considered to be at risk of bushfires, to various degrees ranging through low, medium, high and extreme.

How has planning altered its procedures to ensure that those rebuilding after the bushfires are able to do so with a minimum of paperwork and administrative holdups.

The City recognised the importance of the rebuilding process and the necessity for minimal disruption to the issuing of approvals. Fees were waived in the immediate rebuilding period and applications for rebuilding given priority attention. Building and planning applications from fire affected properties continue to be dealt with efficiently, with approvals issued in a timely manner.

The City's Building and Planning Departments have been working with residents and offering expert advice and assistance, especially in offering advice regarding rebuilding in bushfire areas.

The City has recently become a one-stop-shop for residential and commercial building approvals. The City is now able to coordinate both stages of a building approval, making the process more efficient and organised for applicants.

Irene has a real interest in dealing with children's


dental health and her quiet and gentle manner indicates that she will be excellent at this aspect of the work.





SPRINGDALE AND CROSS PARK MASTER PLAN

What's it all about? Well you actually! It's all about YOU.

Making a "Master-Plan" for an area just means making a good plan that takes into account what YOU the community need now and what YOU the community may need in the future.

Cross Park currently has an assortment of sporting & community facilities. It started in the 1950's with the cricket club and has grown to include football, tennis, netball, karate, Pilates, Community Hall, Guide Hall, Family Centre, Seniors' Centre, Volunteer Fire Service, Skate park & playground.

There is already a lot at Cross Park.
So why do we need a "Master–Plan" now?
Several things have been happening over the last few years that have led to a need to rethink Cross

1) The turf has been getting worse.

There is insufficient water & drainage to sustain the heavy use. Springdale, with more water & better drainage, was built for the heavy use of the senior football club but was taken up by the junior football club and teeball/baseball clubs. The Master-Plan was to investigate swapping senior & junior football clubs, but neither club wants to

move from their current grounds. As a short-term measure the reticulation at Cross Park has been upgraded to a more efficient system but fixing the drainage would apparently require replacing the oval and several feet below it.

2) The antisocial activity around the skate park.

Although funding has been secured for a new skate park, the sustained antisocial activity around the existing skate park, that has often reduced the community's access to the area, has meant the location of the current skate park has come under scrutiny. Planning principles dictate that youth spaces should be provided, but they must be in highly visible locations. The new Armadale skate park, along a road & opposite a shopping centre, has been a celebrated social success due to its well planned location and the Master-Plan aimed to copy that achievement here.

3) The new Men's Shed & Community Garden Groups want a home at Cross Park.

Recent community workshops & surveys have shown great interest for the ever more popular activities of a Men's Shed & Community Garden. The two groups are now formed and taking new members. For those that thought Cross Park had it all, these new types of activity were overlooked. They suit community involvement for the less sport-focused community members and provide for an interactive heart to Cross Park with the year round almost daily activity they bring. Other proposals



Pro Bono: Baggage David Bardsley

Dear Friends

With very mixed feelings we have just about completed another home move, this time to Bridgetown. Each time the same questions arise as we try to reduce the amount of packing we have to do.

Do we really need this or that? Some answers are relatively easy but ornaments and pictures...? Some are lovely, genuine works of art - others are less so but given to us to remind us of people, occasions or places. Our Romanian friends over the years have been especially generous but our tastes diverge somewhat. Sadly, we have ended up discarding some things.

Much of the stuff we consider essential is also quite unnecessary. If we have to, we can do without it. We discovered this when we went to live in a tiny apartment in Hong Kong. We arrived with two suitcases and four small boxes and we still struggled to squeeze them into our unit. But we lived there very happily indeed for two years. It made us realise just how much "extra baggage" surrounds our lives. This extra baggage becomes a real physical burden when we are on the move, on a journey to somewhere.

Spiritually we are always on a journey – the journey of life itself. And sometimes we carry round a whole truck load of extra baggage which gets in the way of proper progress. In the Bible, one writer refers to this journey as a race and we are encouraged to "throw off everything that hinders ... and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." The race he refers to is the spiritual movement in this life towards the goal of eternal fellowship with God which, broadly speaking, is the objective of all the World's religions. He goes on to say that some things "entangle us" and it's a great picture of a runner trying to win a marathon but wearing all the wrong gear and stumbling through barbed wire, stuff which the runner himself acquired. Not the best way to win Olympic Gold!

In fact that particular runner isn't even going to finish the course never mind win the race. But it's so much like what we all do spiritually.

The problem is that this spiritual baggage is not something we can sort out for ourselves. As in our physical lives it seems we can't help accumulating stuff. But this stuff is serious - it separates us from God, even though we might not want it that way. We don't "love God with all our heart", we don't "love our neighbour as ourselves". And when we don't, we end up doing things which separate us from God – the Bible calls it "sin". We all do it, without exception, and there's not a thing we ourselves can do about it. God knows that and the solution is found in Jesus, the one and only Son of God. When he died and rose from the dead, he dealt with the sins of all people for all time. The cross wasn't a nasty accident - it was God's way of removing the extra baggage and the barbed wire from our lives. All we have to do is accept that and believe it, following God's guide book - Biblical truth - to help us walk in the right direction on life's journey. It's actually quite simple no matter how complicated some Christians have managed to make it. At least it's a darn sight simpler than reducing the pile of boxes we've had to shift down here. Why not give it a go?

Astronomical Highlights December

Are you even the slightest bit apprehensive about the purported ending of the Mayan calendar cycle on the solstice this month? I'm not. Time and time again, when you're involved in astronomy, you encounter insecure people who ask for confirmation of some or other prophesied disaster; and when you say that nothing's going to happen, you get accused of covering up secrets that "they" are hiding from ordinary people. Who are "they"? Beats me.

Any self-respecting calendar ought to be based around the repeating seasonal markers, the solstices and equinoxes. Otherwise the seasons get out of whack with the calendar months. The summer solstice here, this year, occurs on Friday December 21st. That's when we have our longest day: officially 14 hours and 15 minutes from sunrise to sunset.

The dominant planet this month and next is Jupiter. It's at opposition on the 3rd: closest, brightest, and visible all night. Opposition is the alignment of Sun, Earth and Jupiter, in that order. Jupiter's the best planet to observe with your new Christmas telescope: it's the biggest planet and you can see cloud bands on it that look like the rows of stitching around the middle of a cricket ball. As well, its four biggest moons are visible as small, restless dots of light that change position

day by day. The closest of the four is Io, which whizzes around Jupiter in about 42 hours. The next, called Europa, does a lap in about 85 hours. Compare this with our sedate moon which tootles around Earth in a month.

You'll find the giant planet in the northeastern sky at nightfall. It culminates (comes to its highest) in the north around midnight in early December, then progressively earlier: 11pm in mid-month, and 10pm by month's end. Culmination is the best time to observe because when you're viewing an object at its highest, you're looking through the least atmosphere. You get the clearest view. An alternative astronomical expression is crossing the meridian which means the object of interest is in line with the imaginary north-south line on which you're standing, the observer's meridian.

The other bright planet that's visible, but not at a very convenient time, is Venus which rises about an hour and a half ahead of the sun all month. You can see it low in the eastern sky in the morning twilight (say around 4:30am).

The major moon phases are last quarter on the night of the 6th, new moon on the 13th, first quarter on the 20th, and full moon on the 28th. On New Year's Eve the waning gibbous moon will rise at about 9:25pm and be 90% illuminated.

Wild Gossip: **Bobtails**

Over the past few weeks I have been really distressed at the number of badly injured bobtails that have come into care to die or to be euthanized. I am also really concerned about the bobtail carnage on the roads and that nobody stops after running over one of these delightful creatures to get assistance.



Bobtails are a part of our community and they deserve to be respected. They eat bugs and all sorts of other nasty things that you don't want around but otherwise are relatively harmless, unless you grow strawberries which they do like to nibble. Bobtails mate for life in a weird relationship where they meet up for a month or so every year and then go separate ways. The last recorded survey of a pair of tagged Bobtails has them meeting up yearly for nine years. If you are unfortunate to run over one of these delightful creatures please stop and get assistance for it - as with all our precious wildlife.

With summer here and the festive season it is time to think about all our wildlife which can suffer badly from water and food shortages. It is really easy to deploy a few water stations around your property using low lying ones (a small dish or plant pot tray) at ground level and bigger ones higher up. Bird baths of any kind are always welcome. Mine have continual usage and provide great viewing from my kitchen and the family room. You don't need anything fancy, one of mine is an old wok sitting on a

crate, another is an old fry pan. I do have a proper one but they all seem popular. People tend to get busy over the festive season and forget our wildlife so if you normally put out water or food, please don't forget to do so as the wildlife is probably depending on it to survive. Please also remember that most professional services will be closed over the festive season so the only help you will be likely to get for wildlife issues will be from volunteers. Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.

Snakes are Out and About

Thanks to the Martins for sending in the photo below of a dugite killed on the road outside their home last weekend. They asked that readers be alerted to the increased chance of finding snakes around the outside of Roleystone homes over the early summer.

The most common snakes seen across the Perth hills area are Tiger Snakes and Dugites. They can often be found sheltering around homes and sheds or basking in the sun in the cooler part of the day. The warm weather over recent weeks is drawing snakes out of hibernation in search of food and of course the males are also out looking to breed. It

is the males that you will probably see the most. Snakes are most active when the temperature hits about 25 -32 - very common temperatures over early summer. They are also attracted to their main food source - mice. Please do not be too hasty in killing the reptiles because dugite's are protected under the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950 and to kill or injure one attracts a fine of up to \$4000. If you see a snake stand still, back away and leave the snake to make its escape. Only when people are at risk ie the snake is 'inside the home' should they be killed and only by people who have had experience in this area.


