Although it rained part of the day, it didn't dampen the married couple's spirits. Many local hills residents also attended the wedding.


Angelo and Rebbecca met at the annual Karragullen Field Day 4 years ago, where it was love at first sight. Well done to you both.

# Life Membership for Zyg


Our congratulations to Zyg Woltersdorf! In the Roleystone Theatre's



# The Heat Affects Local Fruit Crop

Early in this year's stone fruit season we were all alerted to the very real threats facing the fruit industry with the threat of Mediterranean Fruit Fly. This has not been the only threat.

In early January a representative for the Hills Orchard Improvement Group, Brett DelSimone was interviewed by Graham Mabury from 6PRs Nightline on some of the other threats this summer. For those who missed it, here is an abridged account of the interview:

Graham's questioning about the increased warming and the effect on fruit with the high temperatures orchardists have faced this year.

Brett responded: 'When the temp gets above 35 degrees the sap stops flowing in deciduous trees and the tree shuts down. The fruit loses its natural protection and the fruit gets sunburnt.'

'Fruit can handle a day or two of 40 degrees. Long extended periods leave the exposed fruit, especially those on the top, very vulnerable.'

'The fruit shrivels and turns brown, basically the fruit has been cooked and its flavour has been changed. Pears, Apples and Plums are most susceptible. This can pose a significant risk to orchardists with many reporting losing over 10% of their crop this year.'

Graham then went on to ask about the increased rainfall over the summer months and questioned Brett about whether this had helped.

'There is a small window of optimum growing conditions and rarely do growers get this. Small amounts of rain can help. Up to 10ml of rain can revitalise the trees and doesn't cause too much damage. However heavy rain during the growing period can be a source of major problems'

'Also there is the added problem of an increase in diseases. The moisture promotes a fungus called brown rot which loves humidity. The opening of the WA borders to imported fruit led to the importation of the fungus from South Australia when they started importing cherries.'

'This is extremely devastating and left untreated can take out 90% of the crop.'


Brett reflected that it: 'Has been a challenging season but Hills growers are pretty adaptable and will overcome our challenges.'

Graham asked about where all the good quality peaches have gone? Brett responded: 'Some of this is based on changed varieties and some is about correct picking. If growers have not harvested correctly it may not be as tasty. The customers have a role


here and can question their retailers'.

'Once things were only eaten seasonally. Supermarkets are increasing the fruit availability and with improved storage under controlled atmospheric conditions this has allowed for fruit to be available through the year. A lot of people have lost contact with the reality that if it is not in season then it will not taste as good.'

So the most important thing for consumers is: 'Support your local growers, buy fresh, buy in season and buy Western Australian wherever you possibly can.'

# JINKERS AND WHIMS

HOT OF THE PRESS FROM THE PICKERING **BROOK HERITAGE SOCIETY.** 

Jack Bradshaw has been working on a book about the history of forestry in the jarrah forests of WA for a number of years and has finally completed it.

Gordon Freegard from the Pickering Brook Heritage society believes he has done an exceptional job. 'It

covers mainly the equipment used and how it was used, from the pit sawing and axes right through to the modern day powered machinery.' 'It includes 120 photos including some local photos supplied by the Pickering Brook Heritage Group.'




His pre-amble on the back of the book reads.

'Jinkers and Whims' traces the development of the methods and machines used to harvest the forests of Western Australia over the last 150 years, from first settlement to the present day, from horse and steam power to modern mechanical harvesters. It describes the bush workings and logging operations that underpinned W.A.'s sawmilling industry - once the third largest industry in the state behind wheat and wool. It is also a tribute to the skill and innovation of the bushmen and engineers who brought about the changes and who designed and built those weird and wonderful machines that were unique to the industry and to this part of the world."

'This book contains many historical photographs and provides a timely record of the developments that took place before the details of their existence and their operation fade from memory.

# MASTER PLAN - PLEA FOR GATHERING PLACE

After the disposal of Robin Road Green (Old primary School Oval), we will lose a valuable outdoor place in our township for small gatherings such as ceremonies, markets, fundraising and concerts.

During the public comment period more than 160 residents sent in submissions to plea for saving the green. Shortly we will not have an adequate place with power and water near the town centre to accommodate a small gathering of 100-400 people.

Although Cross Park is a fantastic oval for sport, it is too large for small community events - we have indeed tried in the past. Roleystone is brimming with artistic and musical people, if we had such a place, we can continue to encourage their activities for all of us to enjoy. Unfortunately, the need for such a Gathering Place has been omitted in the Cross Park Master plan. But public comment is open until the 8th Feb.

If you share this vision, we have to keep reminding the Council that there is something special going on here in Roleystone, and that it is worth more consideration.

One possible place worth considering as a gathering place could be the disused tennis courts. It overlooks Cross Park and the Shopping Centre. With a little effort, the loose fill could be removed and a natural rock amphitheatre could be dug in. The rock would also buffer sound for the nearby Hillendale residents. Just an idea for anyone listening, obviously needing discussion with Tennis and Netball clubs. And now she has returned to Roleystone and has become a mobile Personal Travel Manager with TravelManagers Australia.


Being a mobile travel consultant she can come to you, or you can do all the planning over a coffee latte - all she needs to book your dream is her laptop.

# **Dumper Caught**

At approximately 9.30am on Sunday 6th January I was out on my mountain bike when I stumbled across a male person dumping rubbish in bushland on a Churchman Brook Dam service track. 

#### **INCREASED TRUCK TRAFFIC ON BROOKTON HIGHWAY**

Darling Range electors may be interested to know that there will be vastly increased truck traffic on roads in their area as a result of the recent Government decision to close the 700 kilometres of Tier 3 rail lines.

This will mean that grain will have to be transported from across the Wheat belt to Forrestfield and the Kwinana Grain Terminal and one of the roads with increased traffic may well be Brookton Highway.

WA Labor will allocate \$30million over the next three years to keep Tier 3 grain rail lines open and trucks off our roads.

The Wheatbelt Rail Retention Alliance has estimated the rail closure will put between 57,000 and 85,000 extra truck movements on our roads annually. There is significant community concern about the impact of closing the train lines. This issue will be of major concern to people across the Darling Range electorate.

WA Labor has consulted widely with stakeholders involved in this issue to determine the State Government contribution necessary to keep the lines operating. \$30 million over three years will help the rail network operator and users of the lines to reach a commercial agreement to keep the Tier 3 rail lines open.

Only the election of a McGowan Labor Government will ensure the grain rail network gets the firm financial commitment it needs to keep the rail lines open. WA Labor will make it a priority to fix dangerous country roads and reduce the congestion on our metropolitan roads. Better priorities for a better future.

# Sterile Fruit Fly Release Trial Complete

The Sterile fruit fly trial provided valuable insights for future Medfly control.

The Department of Agriculture and Food's trial release of sterile fruit flies around Roleystone has finished and has provided some useful lessons.

Department senior research officer Bill

Woods said the trial examined whether treating a small buffer area of the town with sterile male flies would give some protection to adjacent orchards from fruit fly incursions. Sterile fruit flies are reared at department facilities in South Perth and irradiated so they become sterile. These sterile males are then released into known populations of fruit fly. The wild females who mate with the sterile males will lay only sterile eggs. This is known as the 'sterile insect technique' which can be used to help control fruit fly.

"The trial was designed to run for 10 weeks with the last release on 13 December," Mr Woods said.

"Initial results were promising, though by the trial's end, sterile flies were over-run by wild flies. Many of these were moving in from outside the release area where numbers had bred up on loquats, apricots and citrus."

Mr Woods said unseasonal summer rain had provided favourable conditions for an increase in fruit fly numbers. The recent extreme temperatures had some temporary impact in lowering fly numbers.

"As evidenced by our monitoring trap catches, sterile flies move up to one kilometre and were often found in traps on the adjacent orchards," Mr Woods said. "These flies are indistinguishable from wild flies unless looked at under ultraviolet light where fluorescent dye markers can be seen."

To control fruit flies in Roleystone next season, Mr Woods suggested that industry, in conjunction with householders, needed to apply an area-wide baiting scheme in September and October to reduce flies emerging from the ground to very low levels, before sterile release could be effective.

Such baiting schemes have been successfully managed by local governments in other shires.

"Sterile flies are just one weapon for use against the Mediterranean fruit fly," Mr Woods said. "It is not a silver bullet.

Sustained baiting by commercial growers and surrounding residential areas, plus scrupulous orchard hygiene to remove breeding sites, are essential.

"Trials will begin in Jarrahdale soon, testing different fly release techniques, spacing and density. Once we are happy with a technique we can begin releases on larger orchard blocks."

# HOIG responds to DAFWA Sterile MedFly Release Trial

The Fruit Fly Action Group commends DAFWA for initiating sterile Mediterranean fruit fly release trials, but have grave concerns with the process implementation, effectiveness of equipment used and the lack of consultation with the Hills Orchard Improvement Group.

Action Group spokesman, Brett DelSimone, said "This is only one tiny piece of a system to reduce fruit fly population pressure, it will not eradicate the pest or

provide a viable solution on its own. The entire Area Wide Management system, of which sterile release is a component, will take years to be fully functional, DAFWA have admitted that to us. Local fruit growers do not have that kind of time to spare when their businesses are under immediate threat."

Mr DelSimone disputed the results of the DAFWA trial (as published in some media outlets earlier in January). "Our own Cera Traps are catching 5 to 10 times the number of fruit fly that DAFWA is reporting, bringing into question the validity of the traps used by the Department" he said.

Mr DelSimone added "A Hills orchardist who conducted a trial using fruit fly baits as recommended by DAFWA, was advised by the Department to apply cover sprays of the pesticide fenthion to avoid further damage to fruit when he suffered serious fruit fly stings. Even with the cover spray, the grower suffered substantial losses to fruit fly maggots. Baiting alone is not an effective fruit fly control."

"It is undermining the good work home gardeners are doing with garden hygiene to give them a false sense of security that the release of sterile fruit fly on its own is an effective control measure," Mr DelSimone said.

"Government departments are well versed in advising growers and home owners how to act, but important government responsibilities such as removal of abandoned orchards are at a near standstill," he concluded.

# Road Improvements Improve Access to Roleystone CC

The City of Armadale is working towards redeveloping the road network around Roleystone District College to provide roads which have greater connectivity, increase driver safety and better manage local traffic.

Roleystone District College now has additional parking on Brooks and Raeburn Roads and new footpaths to accommodate the pedestrian traffic stemming from the school. The total upgrade cost of \$315,000 has been funded by the City of Armadale and the Department of Education.

To accommodate the increased traffic flow around the College, roundabouts at the Caprea Street/Brooks Road and Brooks Road/ Raeburn Road/Hassett Road intersections will be constructed this year. These costs are anticipated to total \$310,000.

The Caprea Street/Brooks Road roundabout is currently under construction and is expected to be completed by the start of the school year in February.

Design plans for Brooks Road/Raeburn Road/Hassett Road have been approved by Main Roads WA, subject to the conversion of Hassett Road into a left-in only access road off Raeburn Road.

Property owners on Hassett Road will be consulted prior to construction. All works are expected to be completed three months after designs are finalised and Hassett Road residents are consulted.





## RAINBOW LORIKEETS CAUSE FRUIT DAMAGE ACROSS HILLS ORCHARDS

The Rainbow Lorikeet, a parrot endemic to the east coast of Australian, has now arrived in mass in Roleystone and the surrounding areas this year and is doing extensive damage to local fruit crops.

Although the Lorikeet arrived in Perth as early as the 1960's their numbers only rose to plague proportions in the past ten years and have only recently entered the fruit growing areas in the Perth Hills. The birds are smaller than any native parrot, very brightly coloured and travel in large flocks. They compete for nesting spaces in Western Australia with the native parrot the Western Ringneck or 28. Because of the danger they pose to our native bird populations and the economic impact they pose to orchards and grape production, they are a declared pest and can be destroyed. (Applications must be made.)

Paul Casotti of Raeburn Orchard in Roleystone, believes this is the worst year he has seen for damage to his crops by



these pests.

'Once they take a bite of a piece of fruit it is useless and it will start to rot.' Paul said. The Department of Agriculture and Food will

soon meet with the WA Local Government Association to discuss how to lower bird numbers.


## **CLARIFICATION RE-JOYCE ARNOTT ARTICLE DEC COURIER**

'It was most unfortunate that we needed to close the restaurant part of the business at this time. At this stage we do not have any intention of reopening the restaurant but the other parts of the business are



#### **ORIGINS OF THE ROLEYSTONE THEATRE**

With the Roleystone Theatre celebrating its 80th year in 2013, (it was established in 1933) the Roleystone Courier will supply some snippets of the history of this wonderful theatre over this year.

# This month we are looking at the genesis of Musical and Theatrical entertainment within our community.

Its genesis may be traced back to 1915 when the Karragullen Literary Society came into existence. *Pictured above is the first page of the minutes of this group.* 

In 1914 Members and friends of the Canning Hills Fruit Growers Association put on the play 'Our Nelly' at the home of the Jobsons. The Jobsons were a 'literary couple' who owned an orchard opposite the current site of Mia Flora Garden. The meeting in 1915 after this successful event, had members who were mainly early Karragullen residents (Arthur, Wilfred and Doris Bettenay, Misses Stinton and Haskill and Rod McCaskill). The Roleystone members of the group included the amazingly musically talented family of the Parkers. The Parkers included Mary Parker (later Knuckey, who was the school teacher at the Roleystone PS at the time) along with her sisters Mabel and Lillian and brother Ted.

The Karragullen Literary Society was dedicated to the 'mutual improvement and pleasure' of local residents.

The Roleystone Musical and Dramatic Choral Society was born however lapsed over the next few years. 20 years later, Mary Parker (by then Mary Knuckey) established the The Roleystone Musical and Dramatic Choral Society which was to evolve over the next eighty years into the present Roleystone Theatre (Inc).

The demise of the Literary Society in the early 1920s didn't see the end of cultural activites in the district. These were kept alive by informal evenings at the homes of various local people. It is more than probable that the idea to form a more

formal organisation for the expression of musical, literary and dramatic art had its beginnings in these private homes, particularly that of the Parker's at Hillandale'. (This homestead was located within Raeburn orchard.)

When in 1932, the South Suburban Musical and Elocutionary Society was established, Mary Knuckey sensed the challenge these competitions could provide.

Mary was a woman of exceptional musical talent and versatility with a keen desire to see cultural activities promoted and encouraged. Certainly it would have seemed to her that this competitive festival would be the ideal vehicle by which the considerable talents and capabilities of Roleystone residents could be fostered and developed. The formation of the Roleystone Choral and Dramatic Society was unquestionably due to the efforts, interest and enthusiasm of Mrs Knuckey. In October, 1933 the recently formed Roleystone Musical and Dramatic Society enthusiastically competed for the first time in the annual festival at the Public Hall at Gosnells. The young society's efforts were to meet with outstanding success despite its inexperience, much to the surprise of competitors from other participating districts.

The initial success the Society had in 1933, where members managed to win12 sections of the competition, was to be maintained throughout the remainder of that decade. THE FORMATIVE YEARS

During the 1930's the activities of the Roleystone Choral and Dramatic Society were to be determined in the main by the requirements of these annual festival competitions.

In 1934 the Society competed at the festival, which took place on 6 nights during the period between the 19th and 27th of October. They achieved considerable success.

A highlight of this particular festival was winning the section "Selection from Light Opera", with a rather ambitious production of excerpts from 'H.M.S. Pinafore. In 1937, after winning the District Choir competition for 3 consecutive years at these festivals, Roleystone was awarded permanent ownership of the prestigious R. S. Sampson cup. The Choir's training and conducting was carried out by Mary Knuckey but on occasions this duty was ably taken over by her husband Richard, a considerable musical talent too. The running of the Society and the programmes and activities carried out were in the capable hands of Mary Knuckey but she received considerable support from her brother and sister-in-law Ted and Ivy Parker.

Mary was in charge of the musical content while Ivy's contribution was to see that the drama content was not overlooked. Details of this era are rather limited and sketchy, as no records of formal meetings survive. Ted Parker held the position of President and it seems he continued in this role until 1960. He was also an accomplished singer and actor and at the annual musical festivals participated in quartette and mixed choir ensembles, as well as playing Captain Corcoran in the 1934 'HMS Pinafore' excerpts.

During this period no full scale/full length musicals were attempted, not because of lack of talent, but rather the limited facilities that the hall possessed. The stage for instance was an improvised affair and there was a high cost of producing a play or musical. Copyright fees cut far too deeply into the limited funds and beside, there was quite a hefty entertainment tax that had to be paid based on the admission prices and number of patrons attending. The staging of such large scale productions had to be left to a much later era.

As Lilian Munday, Mary Knuckey's sister pointed out in 1979 in her reminiscences of those earlier times. 'The Gilbert & Sullivan operas were unfortunately under copyright and could only be staged by the Gilbert & Sullivan Opera Society. As soon as copyright was lifted scenes from G & S were included in concerts.

This is now no longer the case. Although the musical element was significant in the clubs earliest repertoire, drama was not neglected. In the first year Roleystone entered the festival competitions (Oct 1933) both the Under 16 and Over 16 'dramatic section' was won by Roleystone the be 'Roleystone innior'

under 16 group being referred to as the 'Roleystone juniors'. The winning play in the over 16 section was 'Aunt Pricilla' and this was represented as part of the programme of the 'Grand Concert' held at Gosnells on the 17th November, 1933. The following year Roleystone presented two plays in the adult section 'Among the Tea Leaves' and 'A Midsummer jest'. These entries were awarded 2nd and 3rd respectively. In the same year the Roleystone junior Dramatic Club performed 'The Matchmakers' and was awarded 1st place.

The varied talents of Mary Knuckey became very evident at these festivals, not only was she the conductor of the mixed and ladies choir, she was an accomplished accompaniste for solo and small ensemble singers and participated as a soloist in the soprano and mezzo sections, in duets, trios and quartettes and prose readings, recitation, impromptu and stump speeches as well. In these early years the society had the good fortune to possess a talented and strongly developing younger generation within its ranks.

The existence of a Roleystone Junior Drama group is evident of this. The eisteddfods were an ideal outlet for these young members to demonstrate their abilities, often with great success. The 3 boys of Mary and Richard Knuckey, Curnow, Lloyd and Ken competed continuously throughout this period in various capacities.

In the 1933 festival, Lloyd played the violin while he and his older brother, Curnow teamed with their parents in a quartette for 4 wind instruments. In 1934 Curnow competed in at least 6 sections including recitation, solo singing, the instrumental ensemble and piano solo and duet. In the instrumental ensemble, for under sixteens, Cumow and Lloyd were joined by youngest brother, Ken and cousin Neil Parker, to play 'Good Morrow' all the boys were under 12 years old.

An indication of the enthusiasm and dedication shown in those times was the formation of a performing party of young people 'The Orange Pierrots; made up almost entirely of the offspring of the original Parker family - the young members of the Parker, Knuckey, Munday and Bettenay families. They presented a well rehearsed and received public concert in 1933 in the Roleystone Hall, much to the delight of their admiring parents. A play from the programme, 'Mr & Mrs Pepper', was later performed as an entry in the 1933 South Suburban Musical and Elocutionary Society's annual festival. The cast was entered under the title of Roleystone juniors and came first in the one-act play Under 16 section. In this way the foundations of the Roleystone Choral and Dramatic Society were fashioned and set, strong foundations which were to withstand the foibles and follies of the next 60 years.

# How Is Roleystone's Climate Changing?

#### This extract below was written by Bruce Buckley and published in the Roleystone Courier in 2008. The graphs on this page show that five years later things are indeed heating up and our rainfall is decreasing.

#### Bruce was then Senior Meteorologist at the Bureau of Meteorology.

There is little doubt from the historical records that there has been a marked change in the climate of the southwest region of Western Australia. There have been very large decreases over the southwest of the state with almost as dramatic increase over the north.

Temperatures have also changed from 1910 to present based upon temperatures measured at weather stations across the southwest of the state. All of these stations have long periods of recording and are regarded as being quite accurate. Any location (such as the official city records) that may have temperature changes caused by urbanisation or site changes are excluded so that the trends identified are realistic.

Although there are temperature oscillations from year to year and decade to decade, there is a temperature increase evident in this record that is consistent with the predictions of climate change that have been widely covered by the media for several years now. The chances of this being pure chance is now extremely slim.

Some of this change can be attributed to natural climate variability but there is increasing evidence from around the world that human influences are accelerating these changes.' **This data bears out his 2008 summary.....** 

Some interesting context: Bruce was a former Head Boy of Armadale SHS and spent a lot of his childhood in this area. His mother Edna Buckley was born in Roleystone. He now predicts the weather for international sporting events. He was the meteorologist assigned to the Olympic Games London team and helped steer our sailors to Gold medals. He knows his weather!







## Fly The Aussie Flag Proudly – Get Yours Now!

With Australia day just gone we have all seen the proud flying of the Australian Flag - on cars, on homes and worn on your shirt. Federal MP Don Randall wants to let local Roleystone residents and organisations know that they can obtain a flag to fly throughout the year simply by contacting his office.

"It's important constituents and community groups in the electorate are aware they have the opportunity to mark days of national significance, by proudly flying the Australian Flag," Mr Randall said.

"However, two other very important flags are also available from my office for commemorations, being the Aboriginal Flag and Torres Strait Islander Flag."

Mr Randall said each financial year, under Commonwealth guidelines, 50 flags could be presented to individuals, while each community group in the electorate was entitled to display one. "Community groups that are eligible to request a flag include schools, churches and other not-for-profit organisations and associations that display the flag on their premises, or in halls and meeting rooms," he said.

"Humanitarian aid workers undertaking official visits or duties overseas and family members, or ex-service organisation representatives, are also entitled to obtain a flag for use at the funeral of an Australian war veteran, for example."

Mr Randall said other items constituents might be interested in, such as booklets of Australia's national symbols and recordings of the National Anthem were also available on request by contacting his office.

He said the Australian Flag was unique as it was the first ever flag to be chosen in an open public competition.

## MAKE YOUR VOTE COUNT

Join with our newest citizens on Australia Day and enrol to vote in this election year! The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) will be helping thousands of our newest citizens to enrol to vote on Australia Day and, with a federal election to be held in 2013, is also urging all Australians to make sure they are now correctly enrolled.

AEC Community Engagement Manager for the divisions of Brand, Canning and Fremantle, Danny Wallace said a federal election must be held in 2013 so now is the time for all eligible voters to make sure they are enrolled to vote or, if they have recently moved, to check that their address on the roll is up-to-date.

"Some people missed out on their vote at previous federal elections because they were not enrolled, or didn't check, until it was too late. By enrolling or updating your address now you will be ready to vote whenever the election is called," he said.

"It's a simple process to enrol to vote, and you are then enrolled for local, state and federal elections."

To enrol to vote, go online to <u>www.aec.gov.au/enrol</u>, complete an enrolment form, print and sign it and return it to the AEC.

To update your address on the electoral roll, complete an enrolment form online at <u>www.aec.gov.au/enrol/change-address</u>

To check if you're enrolled to vote, visit <u>www.aec.gov.au/</u> <u>check</u> or call the AEC on 13 23 26. The AEC website has contact details for people wishing to speak to someone in another language.

Paper enrolment forms are also available at any AEC office, Australia Post outlet, Medicare or Centrelink office.

Danny Wallace said it is compulsory for all Australian citizens 18 years and over to enrol to vote and you must be enrolled for your current address to vote in the federal election. Federal provisional enrolment is also available to 16 and 17 year olds in preparation for being able to vote as soon as they turn eighteen years of age.

Western Australians who are currently 17 years of age may also enrol provisionally now, and vote in the upcoming State election if their 18th birthday occurs before or on election day, 9 March 2013.

## GARDENING NOTES JEAN: 9397 5547

Summer is here, plenty of time to keep out of the garden, only doing the necessary work. Early mornings and evenings, are the easiest times when the weather is really pleasant.

But do take care of snakes that you could walk on in the dark. My neighbours sighted one this year near the creek, and last year I saw one about two metres long near the edge of my property. I think the one I saw was probably a Dugite. I didn't think I had left a hose on the drive-way, when it moved I realised what it was.

I have put in a few Frangipani plants this year, having got the previous year's plants through the winter successfully. If they can survive the winter in Alice Springs, I felt it was worth a try. Some have been in the ground for over four years now. There are so many really pretty colours and the perfume is stunning. They require very little water throughout the year.

My friend from Albany has struck a number of Hydrangea cuttings for me. I definitely will not plant them in the same area as the frangipanis as Hydra means water and they are the garden barometers as they droop when they need watering. Just prior to Christmas I had the five large conifers removed from along my side fence. A few years ago a very large

branch broke from one of the conifers, coming down on the side of the house and breaking its fall on a large Camellia tree. Fortunately the camellia was flexible and no harm was done. They had to go!

I guess they provided about twelve tonne of wood chips which will be great mulch when it breaks down. Unfortunately it is hard to realise just how much shade they provided to my neighbour's garden.

Yes we get a lot more morning light and the breezes blow through well and I can enjoy the beauty of their garden. They have a wonderful garden of hibiscus and roses with hedges of green conifers, kept low and lusciously green. I feel much safer with the conifers gone as the fire risk is reduced. During the school holidays, I have played the good grandmother and had the two seven year old grandies to stay. In return they have taken care of the chooks and planted out quite a few seedlings which are looking bright and pretty. I have them the first half of the week and they go home from Wednesday to Sunday. They have really appreciated seeing how the garden grows. Mostly we are putting in sun-hardy plants like vincas and gazanias, plus quite a few calibrachioas.

I have a spot that doesn't get any water and this we have planted with aloes. I have used soil solver to turn the sand into a friable loam. Where I couldn't get 'soil solver' I used 'sand to soil' but without good results, it left the ground like clay in a lake. I must be honest and say this was at my brother's property in Albany.

I hope you are all enjoying a lot of summer reading. I received some bulb catalogues from Chambers at Boyup Brook and was pleased to see the variety of hippeastrums available. Crocus, Nerines, tulips, hyacinths (about ten different varieties) daffodils, Dutch iris, scillas, anemones, ranunculus, Muscari and fritillarias, plus dwarf iris. Lachenalias and baby gladiolus. As well as alstroemias and the cottage garden varieties of scilla, ixia eranthis babiana . Then there is a huge selection of day lilies and liliums. All these plants have been grown in Western Australia and so are acclimatised to our conditions. Along with Allens bulb farms at Parkerville we are well serviced for healthy, happy locally grown bulbs.

During February the garden show, presented by the various garden societies, will once again be presenting their favourite blooms and plants at the Cannington Dog's Arena. This is one to definitely fit into your calendar. This way you get the best varieties and the best advice. Good Gardening



## **BACK TO WORK**

I would say Happy New Year but by the time you get the Courier, one 12th of the year will have gone already.

With the hot weather we have had, and the examples we should have learnt from the 2011 devastating fire and the bushfires happening in the Eastern States our blocks should be immaculate.

Unfortunately as I travel around Roleystone I see some properties that haven't learnt anything from these fire experiences. Preparation is the key to your survival so decide what you will do if a bushfire threatens.

Have a bushfire survival plan, act on the fire danger ratings and survive by monitoring conditions so if a fire starts you know what you are going to do.

Back in May 2012 the Council recommended an amendment to rezone the Robin Rd Primary School to Seniors Housing. The Council requested the Minister for Planning to grant the final approval for the amendment, which included some conditions that were suggested by our community regarding the protection of the significant trees to the west and south of the oval. The Minister has to my mind, somewhat

softened these conditions.

The Council amendment and conditions can be read on the CoA website, Development Services agenda, 14 Jan 2013 pages 126 - 129 with the Ministers modifications on pages 130 - 131.

The CoA is also working to better manage local traffic around the Roleystone District College.

Roundabouts are to be installed to accommodate the extra traffic flows and to increase driver safety.



The draft concept plans for Springdale and Cross Park are out for comment until 8 Feb 2013.

The purpose of this Master Planning Project is to provide an overarching framework to guide the future development of these two parks. These parks will become sporting and community hubs that can be places where the community can come together to have many of their sporting, recreational and community needs met.

Copies of the draft concept Master Plans are available on the CoA website.

#### Have your say on this important issue by writing to the Council or provide input via the on-line survey.

There are still some lovely green blocks around Roleystone but usually when I get up close they are covered in Cotton Bush. It is a great time to either pull or grub out these weeds, as the sun will cook them very quickly. If they are flowering put them in a plastic bag to stop the seeds spreading.

I haven't had Cotton Bush flower in Araluen for a long time but still pull out young plants every time I go for a walk and I know Caroline is doing the same near her house. We can stop this threat if we all work together.

## Seniors' Housing Update

# We have an update on the rezoning of the Primary School site for "Seniors Housing".

The Minister for Planning has written to the City of Armadale advising them to modify certain conditions in the rezoning before he can accept the proposal.

The Minister advised this is to ensure that any provisions relating to the development including a public open space contribution is fair, reasonable and in accordance with Commission policy and practice.

The details of the Minister's letter are in the Development Services agenda of 14 January 2013. The variation as requested by the Minister will be placed on Council web site when finalised. The Council officers first have to contact the Minister's office to seek further understanding of one of the amendments requested.

It is noted in the Executive Director of Development Services report that where the Minister requires changes to a proposed amendment, via Regulation 21(2) within the Town Planning Regulations 1967 the City is obliged to comply with the required changes. We still have a way to go before the site goes out to tender but at least we know that one component of the long process is nearing completion. I will continue to keep you informed.



### Pax: Bushfire Recollections Lesley Borowitzka



#### The second anniversary of the Roleystone-Kelmscott bushfires is upon us, with memories jagged by the news reports of the recent horrific fires in NSW, Victoria and Tasmania.

I remember at our church service that Sunday morning two years ago, we were praying for people in NSW who were victims of floods. By midafternoon came news that the fire in Roleystone was serious. Trying to find out who was safe in Roleystone and Kelmscott was almost impossible: phone calls went to answering machines, which soon filled up with messages. Mobiles ran out of battery, because there hadn't been time to take the charger.

Some friends were located at the evacuation centre in Armadale, but others had gone to friends and family and couldn't be found for days. I drove around the streets where police would allow access, trying to see whose houses were still standing. Indeed it was a miracle that no people lost their lives, but the cost in the lives of animals, domestic and native must have been very high.

Gardens tended for many years were lost and long term neighbours relocated.

Relationships were tested hard and some broke under the strain. The sound of helicopters still strikes fear into many hearts.

When the first rains came, laying the ash and washing away the smell of smoke, hope started to return and now the wonderful rejuvenation of the burnt bush is healing our landscape and some of the terrible memories.

Our hearts and prayers go out to bushfire victims everywhere.





February - the month that history heat.

The moon's major phases are last quarter on the 3rd, new moon on the 10th, first guarter on the 18th, and full moon on the 26th.

There's an occultation of Jupiter by the moon in the early evening of the 18th, when the moon will pass between us and Jupiter, obscuring the giant planet (occult means hidden).

This will be a great event to watch with small telescopes, or even with binoculars, as Jupiter and its Galilean moons progressively disappear behind the dark edge of the half moon, to reappear about an hour later as the moon moves along in its orbit.

Jupiter's the dominant evening planet. Early in the month it stands out in the northern sky at dusk and sets in the WNW about half an hour after midnight. By mid-month it's noticeably moved westwards, being NNW at nightfall and setting around 11:30pm.

By the end of the month it's NW at nightfall and setting in the WNW around 11pm.

Saturn's the only other readily visible planet. In early February it's rising around midnight in the ESE and is very high in the NE sky at daybreak. Mid-month it rises around 11pm and is almost directly overhead at first light. By the end of the month it's up by 10pm and is 'way high up in the NW at dawn. Saturn will be the "star of the show" in the Observatory's evening viewing sessions in late March and on through April. Book now: 9293 8255.

#### Wild Gossip: **Bobtails**

I hope everyone had an enjoyable festive season. I would like to thank all the lovely people who spared their valuable time to help our wildlife.

The hot weather has not helped our wildlife as, even with the most minor mishap, heat stress will soon set in and can be fatal.

Please make sure there is plenty of fresh water, in shallow containers, available on your property and if you find injured wildlife try to keep it cool until help can be contacted.

If you have aviary or caged birds they will appreciate a water misting from a spray bottle or the use of misting sprinklers to help them keep cool.

Another major issue that I have had over the past month or so is snail pellet poisoning and lots of our precious wildlife has suffered a horrible death as a result. Snail pellets kill bandicoots, bobtails, possums etc. and a wide variety of birds - they also kill dogs, cats and potentially people.

Symptoms in wildlife may vary but

usually include blue or green mouth froth or dark runny droppings (blood content) and there is usually lethargy and debilitation, sadly the frequent outcome is death.

There are many natural ways to protect plants from snails that will not kill our wildlife which I have suggested before but will try again in the hope of converting a few people.

- Create a natural barrier with crushed eggs shells or shell grit.
- Create a barrier of wood chips, saw dust, wood shavings, ash or rock salt.
- Use garlic or wormwood spray
- Beer in a shallow dish makes an excellent trap
- Hand pick and crush
- Free range some poultry
- Copper banding or barrier tape is also good.

Sorry to be repeating what I have said in the past but our precious wildlife urgently needs the use of these deadly toxins to stop.
