



Mike had a long, busy and productive life. He was a teacher from 1960 to 1995 and Deputy Principal at East Maddington Primary School for the last 15 years. He built and sailed yachts and model boats and built and flew model planes. He was involved in numerous organisations.

In 1980 he and his wife Margo bought a bush block in Roleystone. Together they designed and built a passive solar house. Mike did much of the internal woodwork as well as building a pergola and a chook shed mainly from recycled materials. Apart from all his other hobbies and interests, Mike was one of the founding members of the Roleystone Dieback Group (now Roleystone Bushcare) for which he designed and made the first tree injectors.

These have been superseded, but Ian Colquhoun has said that one of them is to be donated to the Armadale History House Museum.

He also obtained a trailer for the group and set it up with all the group's equipment including a tank of water. For many years he was responsible for keeping it in his front yard and cleaning and checking its contents.

He was also a founding member of the Shire of Roleystone Karragullen Feasibility group. The group's meetings were held in his house in Valley View Rd (mainly for ease of parking).

He and Margo took on the task of researching the feasibility of road maintenance in the projected shire. He helped to prepare the Feasibility Study document which was presented to the community.

With other members of the group, he door knocked to obtain the necessary signatures to get a plebiscite on forming the separate Shire. The then Act required the signatures of over 50% of the resident ratepayers. That requirement was achieved but the City of Armadale claimed that there were less than 50% of the required

This was mainly because the electoral roll was hugely inaccurate with some people listed twice on the roll, (Mike and Margo were on the roll twice under both Beilby and Bielby), many people on the roll who no longer lived in the area (there was one house where the roll showed



5 different resident families) and many people long dead.

The City counted the raw numbers on the roll, even counting the non-resident electors specifically excluded by the Act.

(It's probably a good thing it didn't succeed as Roleystone and Karragullen would have been swallowed up by Armadale again under the present government.)

Mike had suffered lung problems for most of his life, especially the last two decades. He was also diagnosed with Parkinson's last year. By this year he was almost completely incapacitated, able only to shuffle around the house or sit and read or watch TV. This was intolerable to a person who had been as active as he had been. As one of his last contributions to Roleystone, he gifted many of his workshop tools to the Roleystone Men's Shed. But he was too infirm to even visit the Shed and talk.

His mind was as sharp as ever but life had become a burden to him so he ended it with his usual decisiveness. Margo was beside him holding his hand as he died. He will be sorely missed by friends and family but they respect his decision.

Time For War On Med Fly!

It is now time for producers and residents to stand side-by-side in this season's war on Med Fly!

With our reduced access to our usual defences, the community must now act as one if the local fruit production industry is to be saved. Controlling Med Fly does not have to be expensive or overly time consuming. Your local retailers (IGA and Roleystone Hardware) have traps at much cheaper prices than the big garden

warehouses, so why not save money and support local businesses? We will be informing producers about the best ways to protect our crops and we are more than happy to do the same for you. Remember, Med Fly do not just attack fruit, they will attack over 260 types of fruit, vegetables, flowers and nuts, so if you grow something, please consider it as a potential host.

Measures include:

Trapping - purchased or economical home made traps (which can be constructed in mere minutes) should be hung at selected places in your yard.

Baiting - Minimum of once per week. Mix a bait and your selected killing agent in a knapsack and apply 'splotches' (a mist is no good) to both fruiting and non-fruiting plants alike.

Monitoring - Always monitor trap numbers and if you see an increase, increase the frequency of baiting to twice per week.

Physical Barrier - Cover your tree to the ground with netting (weave must be less than 1.8mm) such as flyscreen, shadecloth or mosquito netting. This is a key element to protecting your crop.

**Hygiene** - Pick up any fruit that has fallen on the ground, or been struck on the tree. Place in a sealed bag in the sun for 5 days, or boil or freeze the fruit. Never throw it in the bin untreated as the maggots will just develop at the tip and return to the Hills. Tree Management - If trees have grown too high for you to pick or maintain under control, cut them back to manageable levels.

Abandoned Trees - report abandoned trees, which are a perpetual source of fruit fly, to DAFWA on (08) 9368 3333.

**Communication** - Offer to help a neighbour or a friend with their trees.

### **Editorial**

LINDA MOORE SEPTEMBER 2013

I have inherited a latent History gene. I think it is only just surfacing now that I am in my 'more mature years'.

I clearly recall as a spotty and quite arrogant 16 year old telling the venerable and hugely respected Ivor T. Birtwistle (who contributed a huge amount to our area and West Australia in general) that 'kids of my generation don't give a hoot about History'.

Five years later I had developed a greater appreciation that was piqued when I travelled overseas to view the amazing Pyramids and the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers - the sites of the dawn of civilization. After visiting Europe and seeing some amazing sights where world changing events occurred, I returned full of passion and informed everyone that Australia had no 'real history'. History that is less than five hundred years old was of no consequence to me - then.

My Mother was the Curator of History House Museum in Armadale for over twenty years and she smiled wisely and waited for my latent local history and genealogy gene to click in. Well Mum, it has happened! I can certainly declare that it has surfaced - with a vengeance.

These days, I find the stories of the pioneers of our local area amazing. I often stand and stare and imagine how a scene was viewed by folks: 50, 100 or even 200 years ago. What were their lives like, did they feel and love and laugh like we do today? How would I have coped with their challenges? These are the questions that make History interesting to me.

A lot of this interest has fed my regular inclusion of snippets in the Courier labelled: 'From The Archives'.

We have such a rich trove of stories from our area but without re-visiting and documenting these stories they fade as the old people who hold these stories as memories pass on.

Recently, I discovered a newspaper report on a visit to the Canning Timber Mills (the first instalment was printed last month and it is continued this month see p32 -33). I often despair about the unkempt condition and disarray of the historic site of Canning Mills.

This was a hugely important location and it is a travesty that we have done little to preserve what is left or educate our local residents about why it was significant. Most folks do not even know where the site of the Canning Mills Settlement is and when they visit, there is little to show them what they are looking at.

Canning Mills is not alone. On my wall I have a beautiful pre-1900's picture of Buckingham's Mill. It is a fabulous picture but as we drive over the 'new bridge' and admire the immense engineering feat, spare a thought for the first industry that occurred in this location. This Timber industry at the time contributed a significant proportion of Western Australia's income.

#### **WHY SRI LANKA**

Ken and Jean Henrickson and Maureen and Kelvin Oliver organised a private guide and his van for a 19 day tour of Sri Lanka. 'Papa' of 'Srilankaroundtours' proved to be a good choice.

We found small private tours provide a great way to get close to the local people and their culture rather than impersonal large group tours.

Day 1 we found ourselves at the local fish market of Negombo. An open beach with dozens of old wooden boats, as often seen on our news bulletins, with dozens of fish species being gutted and filleted then spread out on hundreds of large straw mats to dry in the sun. The crows and gulls clean up the scraped out innards. Our sight and nostril senses exploded. Then in the wet fish section with even more species being dissected, Ken's eyes sparkled with all the fresh seafood. We bought some fish, prawns and other bits and took them to a local, very small, home run restaurant where the owner gladly prepared a magical local feast. Day 3 and off we go covering just under 1500km to Anuradhaapura, Trincomalee, Dambulla, then into the central highlands including the almost 'Austrian Alps' city of Kandy surrounded by misty mountains covered with tea plantations and draped with water falls. Then down to the south coast around the ancient Portuguese/Dutch city of Galle (one of the more touristy towns) before back to Negombo to fly out to Bangkok.

At Anuradhapura, Maureen and I found

ourselves at the Buddhist full moon ceremony with about 500,000 Buddhists in an area the size of the Claremont Show Grounds. An experience never to be forgotten.

We never felt unsafe or unwelcomed. With 40,000 being killed by the 2004 tsunami and many more maimed, their houses and business destroyed and a similar fate awaiting many others during the internal wars, the local people are without doubt some of the most friendly and helpful souls we have ever had the pleasure in meeting.

There were 2m long monitor lizards crossing the roads, mongooses and other exotic animals not to mention hundreds of monkeys everywhere. One morning Jean awoke to find two monkeys in a loving embrace on her balcony railing. Watching intensely she shrieked when the female lost her grip of the railing and fell 3 floors into the shrubs below. Typically the male had a scratch, turned his back and wondered off with a look of self-satisfaction.

With fragrant, spicy and varied curries to mix with gorgeous fluffy rice and fresh roti breads for breakfast, lunch and dinner we were in curry heaven. But after the first 10 days or so we were becoming curried out so we began to seek alternative local specialties. Unfortunately the range of other foods in a limited number of restaurants was somewhat restricted.

Sri Lanka may not be a shopper or gastronomes paradise but it's more. The scenery from coast to misty mountains is beautiful, the soft green carpet of rice paddies, the people are lovely, it's not westernised and above all it's honest. If you want an old Asian experience go to Sri Lanka but use a local family based tour operator. *Kelvin Oliver*







"It was such a special experience and I feel very fortunate to have been able to make even the smallest difference in these remote communities," said Ms Downing.

Principal Anne Ford says it is important that John Wollaston students develop a wider sense of community.

"The benefits to participants in terms of an opportunity to serve others, develop interpersonal skills, and perhaps most importantly, reflect on one's own life, were a significant catalyst for personal growth."

#### ADELANE COMMENTS....

The best aspect for me personally was being with the kids. They make you feel like you are the most important person. So I made sure that I did the same for them. Every single kid was so happy and they would be more fascinated with a balloon rather than a video game. The kids love education and they take nothing for granted.

I now have another family whom I hope to visit again. This trip has allowed me to personify poverty. I have met people in this situation. The thing that hit me the hardest was that they were happy, regardless of their circumstance. I feel a passion to help all in poverty, even at home in Perth

where we have homelessness.

Overall, even though there were times of difficulties, I am pleased I went as now I am more focussed on what to do in the future. I would recommend this to anyone who wants to see change in these amazing communities. But remember it will also change you.



#### Letter to the Editor US Fruit Imports

Locals would be well aware that the first ever shipments of US stonefruit have arrived on Australian shores and retail shelves. Whilst consumer choice has to be and is respected, there is always a down side to produce

California is home to 17 different species of fruit fly, the worst being Suzuki Fly. A pest that caused over US\$500m of crop losses in 2008 alone. A pest so genetically superior to our own Med Fly that it would most likely eliminate it from our backyards due to its vastly quicker breeding and reproduction period.

This at a time when local growers are struggling to control Med Fly in our own orchards due to restricted applications of our best defense, fenthion. The residential population has been left with even fewer options. Whilst there are quarantine protocols in place to reduce the risk of Suzuki Fly entering Australia, no system is perfect and no one is willing to give us any guarantees of protection from this vicious pest. This is not an industry trying to protect its market share, it is an industry trying to protect itself from new pests and diseases.

So next time you are considering a choice at the retail shelf, remember a dollar spent on foreign produce is a dollar not spent on local produce and that dollar spent on foreign produce just may be the one that opens the door to pests and diseases entering our country. At a time when industry is desperately trying to reduce chemical usage, these risks are the last thing anyone needs. Consumers or producers!







Owner and editor of the Roleystone Courier, Linda Moore, writing under her maiden name Linda J Bettenay, has released her first book!

Only 1 year ago, Linda's husband Mike found out that his grandfather had been brutally murdered.


Some sections of the story take place in our local area. The Narrogin Inne, the Canning River Valley and Buckingham's Mill all feature

Mike had always been told that his grandfather died in an airplane crash, a hero performing his duty in the First World War. The reality was that he had been shot in the back by a trusted employee in Wubin, Western Australia, ten years after the war had ended. The murderer had also brutally abused his wife and their three children.

Upon exploring the true story, the family uncovered a fascinating mix of deception and misunderstandings but interspersed with wonderful acts of humanity and kindness.

'This was an amazing story and right from the beginning I wanted to research and understand not only what occurred but why it happened to such a lovely, apparently normal, family.

Our own involvement in it led to our



initial interest but the more we explored the more we uncovered a spellbinding yarn; the radically different understanding and treatment of the mentally ill in that era, created this situation. The murderer today may have received treatment so perhaps this event would not have happened and my husband's family's history would have been radically altered,' surmised Linda.

'I was also horrified when I read about the graphic reporting of the crime in the newspapers of the day. In 1928, these publications put our worst scandal rags into perspective, they invaded every aspect of the victim's privacy. The morality of reporting the exact truth despite the devastating effect on a victim is a theme that still resonates in every reporter's mind today,' Linda reflected. 'So after seeing the very public exposure of a very private humiliation, I can better appreciate why the story was kept hidden and not talked about. The strict morality of the time and the shame of the abuse led to the family weaving a fabric of subterfuge to keep the story quiet,' Linda recalled.

'But now, nearly one hundred years on, I feel that this amazing tale needs to be told. Our state has been built by inspirational people and often these people were responding to events they did not choose. Secrets Mothers Keep tells the story of some of these amazing pioneers.'





#### From The Ai

Last month we published the first part of 'A Visit to Canning Jarah Saw Mills,' first pubished in the West Australian, 5th December

This month we include the second part of that article.

Inside the Mill there is a large volume of waste material. Some of this is used for fuel at the settlement but sufficient wood is allowed, perforce, to run to waste at the mills to supply Perth city.

The timber turned out from the mills include jetty piles, sleepers, joists, beams and planks of all kinds, flooring boards, scantlings, posts and rails, and in fact everything that is useful in the different branches of building,

The contract for sleepers for the Yilgarn Railways is held by the Company.

The mill is essential to railway construction. These are being turned out at the sleeper mill alone at the rate of about 900 per day over a 10 hour period. In the Yankee mill, which was the first I visited, there is an engine of 40 horse power, with

a large tabular boiler, and the machinery here, as elsewhere at reflect that it had taken the mills, is of the best many years for this



The way was strewn with fallen trees and huge logs, six or seven feet high; piles of fencing poles and posts, neatly stacked and heaps of fuel.

Away in the distance we heard the constant tapping of the axes of the fallers and the occasional dull thud of a tree, as it was brought to the ground.

Mr White, the Mill Manager, informed us that the company is still extending its branch lines, and some of these pass through absolutely virgin forest, hitherto untouched by the axe or saw.

At a distance of about three miles from the main camp, we stopped at the Number One sleeper mill where we found

another considerable settlement. Here were piled huge stacks of sleepers and a steam cross-out saw was busily doing the work of a dozen men with unerring exactitude. Leaving this mill we returned to the train.

This time we mounted the engine and It seemed almost sad to our last glimpse as we were whisked away was of the portly form of Mr McLarty, the Government Inspector, passing the sleepers. We crossed and re-crossed the now famous Munday's Brook, which does not seem improved with contact with the mills.

> Proceeding up the line we are met by a small puffer or locomotive. We passed siding after siding, with piles of timber of various kinds, shapes and sizes.

> The palms, blackboys and vegetation generally were in luxuriant profusion, while the rich chocolate soil and the many brooks and streams, demonstrated that here is

one of the most fertile spots to be found anywhere in Western Australia.

The engine stopped and we dismounted and strolled away into the bush, the tall trees towering above us, and almost shutting out the sky in places.

Some of these giants had been laid low, and we passed fallers hacking at the trees with their axes from rough stages several feet above the ground.

It seemed almost sad to reflect that it had taken many years for this timber to grow and this was now being taken for good.

The veritable kings of the forest, would be dethroned, but against this was the mental picture of fertile orchards and vineyards, which will assuredly clothe the sides of these ranges just as the once forest-clad Pacific slopes are now covered with orange groves and trout farms.

Remounting our snorting steed we proceeded back to the main camp and visited No 3 mill, yet another human hive of industry and mass of whirring, whirling machinery. Here another of the irresistible steam crosscut saws was at work being driven by an 80 indicated horse-power engine.

We passed into the large blacksmith's shop, where all the most important branches of smithy work are carried on, and into the workshops, where the company make, their own wagons and then into fine stables, where between thirty and forty horses are accommodated.

These are the animals belonging to the mill but besides them a number of teams are hired during busy times, the latter, to the number of about 150, including bullocks.

There is not an idle man at the Mill. Everyone is working as if prosperity depended

on his own individual exertions and everyone seems contented. Strikes and disputes, I learn, are

Strikes and disputes, I learn, are unknown, for the men know when they, are well off and well-treated. It is, in fact, a model business!

Those who are anxious, to acquaint themselves with the conditions of labour and life on a timber mill in Western Australia cannot do better than visit the Canning Jarrah Saw Mills.

## GARDENING NOTES BY JEAN EVANS

Some time ago I bought red and blue potatoes from the local IGA, mainly with the intention of tasting them but also to try to grow a few. Well, last week the Roleystone Garden Group, visited Jetto's Patch in Maida Vale, and I was inspired to plant them, even though it was pouring with rain. So I went out, dug over patches in a heavily grassed area with lots of sour-sop, pulled out a few of the more resistant weeds and put the potatoes in. I did so as Michelle had advised, so that the mulch and the potatoes would aerate the soil and smother the weeds. Later, I will mulch it quite heavily then put some added manure on top. I had previously planted legumes, potatoes and Jerusalem artichokes in the area.

Jetto's Patch is a delight, where trees grow close together and vegetables are grown under the trees. The ground had fallen chokkos and these were starting to grow again, plants that to my eyes were weeds but each had a set purpose.

The dragon cactus was being grown for its delicious edible fruit but it also has lovely flowers. Passion fruits drip down over the trellises. There are Pawpaws, Babacoa and Pepino. A wonderful perennial squash that has already been there for five years, grows rampantly along the ground and up along fences and trellises.

There is wonderful large leafed greeny/purple mustard, lush stands of rocket, and some hundreds of different varieties on a quarter acre block.

At the most unproductive time of the year. the patch produces at least eight different fruit and this contrasts with about 32 varieties in the more productive seasons.

The rain poured down while we were there and the drain-pipe from the verandah sloped down to end as a cascade above the fishpond where tadpoles and frogs breed happily. The pond has trellis over it so I do not think there is any danger of the pond occupants becoming bird food.

They have about 6 hens in a section they call 'Pooh Corner'. These birds are so content they are not interested in worms or snails except when they are let out to forage. I liked the idea of treasuring the chick weed and other plants and lots of things are managed not weeded out. As we get older we at least have reasons not to pull everything in sight. That will be my excuse anyway.

On Monday I once again looked around the Camellia patch at Araluen. I hope all of you will take time out to see the wonderful garden at our disposal and enjoy a spell with nature. We had a grafting session at the Camellia Society meeting that night and I wanted some of the rarer varieties that are only grown in the Park. Of course, I obtained permission to get the few cuttings that I needed!


Looking around my garden I am delighted by the number of daffodils that are blooming. The yellow looks so good against the purple of the Iris Germanica. I have been busy trying to plant up magnolias in the garden. We saw a beautiful pink, full-flowered one in Kalamunda Road today as we made our way home. I think the ones I purchased are smaller flowering than the solangeas. I also managed to buy a Ribes Sanguinea (a red flowering currant), some more Blueberries, a white luculia and a Gordonia axillaris.

I think the rain has eased off, so maybe I will wander back out into the garden, or maybe I will look at some of the books, that would make great Father's Day reading.

## **Controlling Mediterranean Fruit Fly in the Backyard and Orchard**

Mediterranean fruit fly or Medfly is a serious horticultural pest in the Perth Hills and southern regions of Western Australia. It attacks a range of cultivated fruits including some fruiting vegetables.

The first sign of Medfly damage is often larvae-infested or 'stung' fruit. Stinging is caused by the female laying eggs into unripened or ripe fruit.

Larvae may develop from the eggs, depending on when they are laid and the fruit type. For example, stings can occur in apples and peaches when they are unripe, but the eggs do not hatch at this stage. As the fruit ripens the eggs can develop.

Fruit trees such as stone fruit (apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines) can be difficult to grow free of fruit fly in areas such as Perth where Medfly populations are high. Backyard fruit can be a significant source of Medfly to commercial orchards where they occur close to each other. Therefore, it is vitally important for everyone to control Medfly.

At the September meeting of Roleystone Organic Growers, Ernie Steiner from the WA Agriculture Department will be discussing a variety of solutions to control

> Medfly, including hygiene, traps, exclusion strategies and spraying. He will also be talking about the Fruit Fly sterile insect program.

> Ernie has a Diploma in Agriculture and has 37 years' experience in the WA Ag Department. He has worked in entomology for 30 years and is also the Community Liaison Officer for Fruit Fly, so he is well qualified in this area.

> The Roleystone Organic Growers meeting will be on Wednesday September 11th, at 7.30pm in the Roleystone Family Centre, 19 Wygonda Rd, Roleystone. Entry \$3, members are free. Enquiries to Lisa 9399 2312.

#### Farewell and Thanks to Mike Beilby

Last month the Roleystone Dieback Action Group (former name of Roleybushcare) lost one of its foundation members when Mike Beilby died.

Our early members hold Mike in very high regard and affection - he was such an influential member in our shakey, formative years.

I still remember the first dieback busy bee. It was held at the local high school where an area of forest had died and only 7 jarrah trees were surviving. Our aim was to inject these trees with a fungicide; but it was an extremely frustrating procedure. Our injection gear involved second-hand 'horse' syringes, small metal plates and an assortment of springs. I saw Mike's frustration when the umpteenth spring twanged into the bush. At the end Mike turned to the group and said 'I can design something that will make this job a whole lot easier'. ....and after a week or so in his shed he did.

He took some scrap metal and the brake system off a Nissan Urvan to construct the Group's first hydraulic tree injectors. He built over 20.

Later we got a grant to buy 5 commercial tree injectors (\$1800 ea). But they turned out to be just as problematic as the horse syringes. We gladly went back to Mike's injectors.

Mike was our solid backbone during the early years, making and maintaining the injectors, charging the drill batteries and looking after our trailer.....and also keeping me and others in line when we didn't use the injectors correctly or when we messed up his 'neat' trailer.

Roleybushcare and thousands of local trees we protected from dieback owe a lot to Mike's ingenuity, dedication and determination. We will miss him. However, even now I smile when I think of Mike tinkering away in his shed in the skies!

#### State Government's Council Merger Proposal

On Tuesday 30 July the State Government announced its proposed plan to amalgamate the City of Armadale with the Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire (SJ).

#### Budget time in the City is a busy time for Officers and Councillors.

There are nearly four months of meetings and workshops to balance the programs and projects across the city with the financial advice to ensure that we make the necessary decisions to progress the annual budget.

Each of the Directorates (Corporate Services, Development Services, Technical Services, Community Services and the Chief Executive's Office) produce a budget showing their goals and the financial accountability to achieve this.

Local government delivers a vast range of services and this budget allocates the resources for our professional staff to deliver the programs, policies and projects set by the community via their councillors.

These include the never ending asset management and maintenance costs of our roads, drains, parks and buildings but also the staff costs to deliver the services such as planning, building, health and community assistance to those that need it.

One of the big items this year is a landmark building to be built in the centre of Armadale.

This multi-storey building will provide office accommodation for a State Government agency, while providing much needed space for some CoA staff. This is a strategic achievement for the Armadale city centre as the extra office workers will help to keep it socially and economically vibrant and active.

The assessment of the submissions, business case costs and funding of the building have been handled very professionally by all staff involved in the process. The building should be finished by the end of 2014 and will be a great addition to the City of Armadale.

An additional step in the annual budget this year is the adoption of the Corporate Business Plan as legislated by

the WA Government. Basically this plan outlines the City's key actions to deliver the outcomes and strategies of our Strategic Community Plan, including a balanced strategic financial plan for the next five years.

All this amounts to an incredible amount of reading, cross checking budgets with other strategies and many hours of discussions between Caroline and myself to make sure, not only that we get the best for Armadale, but we do the best we can for Jarrah Ward.

I can't believe that two years have passed so quickly bringing around the biennial local government elections. With the proposed amalgamations on the horizon the outcome of this year's elections may be a little different. If a new local government is established in 2015, (it is proposed the City of Armadale will amalgamate with Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire) a commissioner would run the new entity between July 2015 and Council elections for the new district in October 2015.

From my experience of living in Roleystone, our Jarrah Ward has best been served when the Councillors are able to work together to provide a united front to the other Councillors when items need to be raised.

I look back to the time when Roger Stubbs and Deb Hopper represented Jarrah Ward to achieve great things for our region.

Jarrah Ward is quite different to the other Armadale wards and needs good communication and strong representation between its Councillors to achieve this.





Astronomical Highlights September

At this time last year there were no bright evening planets.

Now we have Venus standing out as the "evening star" (there's no such thing) and dominating the western sky at dusk. For those who like the idea of a Christmas star (there's no such thing), Venus will still be visible in the western evening sky until late December.

Anyway, back to the present: this month Venus will feature in some encounters worth seeing. On the 6th, Venus and the star Spica, also known as Alpha Virginis, will be side by side. On the 8th the 3-day-old crescent moon will be beneath Spica and Venus will be above and a bit to the right of the star.

On the 9th the 4-day-old moon will be above Venus and Spica, with Saturn being above and a bit to the right of the moon. The setting times for Venus go from about 8:50pm in early September, to 9:15 mid-month and 9:40 by the end of the month. Its latest setting time this year will be about 10:20pm in early to mid November.

Saturn's the other evening planet of note. It's not nearly as obvious as Venus, but is a much finer object to see in a telescope. Venus is just bright and exhibits phases, rather like the moon does. Saturn's ring system can be seen in even a modest telescope. The first view of it makes a big impression on most people.

Saturn looks like a medium-bright, yellowish star in the western sky, well above and to the right of Venus at the start of the month. Having the crescent moon go past it on the 9th and 10th will help you locate it.

On the 18th, Saturn and Venus will be side by side. After that, Saturn will be

setting before Venus. Saturn's setting times go from about 10:15pm in early September to 9:20 mid-month and 8:30 at month's end.

Mercury will be visible in the early evenings from the middle of the month. Look for it low in the west at dusk. By late September it'll be easy to spot, with a setting time of about 8pm. Jupiter is the dominant morning planet, showing out as a bright starlike object in the NE sky at daybreak. Its rising times go from about 3:45am at the start of the month to 3am mid-month and 2:15 by month's end.

Mars is the other morning planet - it doesn't look like much, remaining low in the NNE at daybreak throughout the month

Strange to relate, the stupid story about Mars looking as big as the full moon in late August is still doing the rounds, 10 years after it surfaced at the time of close approach in 2003. It was rubbish then and it's still rubbish.

The major phases of the moon in September are: new moon on the 5th, first quarter on the night of the 12th, full moon on the 19th, and last quarter on the 27th (then new moon on October 5th). On the 19th the full moon will be rising just as the sun's setting - a good time to be on a high vantage point where you can watch both sunset and moonrise; or maybe out in a boat, or on a salt lake .... anyway, in a place where you can see low down to the west and the east.

The spring equinox (the autumn one in the northern hemisphere) occurs on the 23rd at 5am WA time. That's when the sun's crossing the equator, heading south, and the days and nights are about 12 hours long.

#### Wild Gossip: Spring is Here

What a strange month it has been, it almost seems as though Spring arrived in August.

I have had baby birds coming in which normally doesn't happen until mid-September. I have also had calls regarding ducklings on the road and ducklings brought to me, which again is out of the normal time frame – obviously Spring has decided to be early this year.

If you find orphaned ducklings it is important to keep them warm and dry or they will die. Ducklings get their feathers oiled to make them waterproof by running and cuddling under mum's feathers, but without mum they quickly lose their waterproofing and so if you put them on water they will sink and drown.

I once had a duckling fetched to me by a lovely young girl who had found it near her school; she had filled her lunch box with water, put the duckling in and travelled to Roleystone by bus to bring it to me.

The duckling did survive and I told the young girl that the easiest way to provide warmth is to put it up your top and use body heat.

I received a phone call from the school inviting me to visit and talk to the pupils about emergency care and actions.

I have also had numerous marsupial

callsouts after road hits and these are usually unsaveable.

If a Kangaroo has a broken leg there is little that we can do as they go into myopathy and die usually regardless of any treatment. Possums tend to fair better and are usually treatable and bandicoots seem to be semi indestructible.

If you are unfortunate enough to hit a marsupial please stop and check if it is still alive and if it is get urgent help. If the animal is dead then be sure to check for pouch young as they will need urgent help - remember that a bandicoot has a backwards facing pouch.

If young are found, warmth is vital so again putting it up your shirt and using body heat is the answer to keep them alive until help can be found.

On the good side I had a delightful pinkie (furless joey kangaroo) brought to me still in his dead Mum's pouch as the people who found it on the road where frightened of causing harm by removing it. The lovely people took mum home to bury her on their property. The little boy is doing really well, though the constant feeds are time consuming. I also received an adorable little possum who is now really well though again time consuming.

Please contact me for help or advice about all injured or orphaned wildlife.




