




Number of Sales in Roleystone

# John Re-visits His Dad's Mountain

In mid-September, Roleystone's own John Meharry was invited to join a crew who have re-visited WA's Highest Peak and placed a plaque on its summit to celebrate the discovery 46 years ago. Mount Meharry is located in the Hamersley Ranges within the south eastern part of Karijini National Park in the Pilbara.

Mount Meharry is named after John's Dad, William Thomas ("Tom") Meharry (who died in 1967), the Chief Geodetic Surveyor for WA. The Mountain was discovered by Surveyor Trevor Markey and his party in 1967 and Tom Meharry directed the survey party and performed the calculations that confirmed the mountain was the highest peak in Western Australia. Prior to this, Mount Bruce, 62 km northwest of Mount Meharry, was thought to be the highest but Meharry is 15 m (49 ft) higher!

After Tom Meharry's sudden death the peak was named after him. NB In 1999 and in 2002, Gina Rinehart, daughter of Lang Hancock, applied to rename the mountain after her father but this request was declined on both occasions.

Here is John's story of the trip:

A surprise phone call on Thursday 5th September from Phil Richards of MHR Surveying, asked me if I would like to be part of a group he had organized to build a more permanent stone cairn. This was to include a plaque to honour all surveyors and my father. I was delighted to accept.

I flew by Qantas jet to Newman and then by helicopter to Coondewanna Airport to

stay at BHP-Billiton Area C packsaddle campsite.

With a 6:30am start some of the surveyors and I drove for about 2 hours via Juna Downs Road and a rough 4WD track to the summit of Mount Meharry. Other members of the group flew by helicopter to the summit in about 15 minutes. There were 3 Curtin University Surveying students and their supervisor Tony Snow, Ken Leighton and Kent Wheeler from Landgate(DOLA), 4 surveyor friends of Phil Richards (Cliff Whitworth, Gerry Gorman, Greg Fleming, Wayne Garwood), Susan Standen (ABC Open producer Pilbara), Jasmine Bamford (North West Telegraph), also Rochelle van der Meer (Heliwest Operations) and Brad Irons (Heliwest pilot).

We collected many ute loads of rocks while others constructed the new cairn. The utes were left at the summit of Mt Meharry and the crew were ferried by helicopter back to

camp on Saturday afternoon.

On Sunday we were flown back to complete the cairn, secure the plaque and celebrate the completion of the Mt Meharry Project 2013. The vehicles returned to camp and others flew by helicopter.

On Monday morning 16th September we said goodbye to everyone. I certainly enjoyed the experience and companionship. I then made my way back to Newman and finally back home to Roleystone.



Tuesday, 10th September 2013 at approximately 9.30am travelling the last down-hill bend of Heritage Drive just before swinging right to stop @ Croyden Road -

skid marks, looks like a tradie's ute rolled over.....

smoke billowing out, engine noise.....

belongings, rubble thrown out amongst the crash site.....

I pull-over safely....

as I cross the road towards the embankment...I see 2 or 3 people using their mobiles to ring emergency services....

so instinct & body language tells me that it's under control.....

I get to the crash site.....

I immediately communicate with 2 key people......Lee first & then "B". KEY from engine removed by "B" who is talking to the driver, engine & smoke still going......

I ask the man his name and think I hear "Rob"......

I hold his hand & his fingers are moving, I tell him he's doing really well - emergency service will be here in a few minutes...

Rob acknowledges.....

I'm so thankful he is talking & staying with us. Those little trees saved the ute from rolling down, down & down. "B" is reassuring him, checking all around the vehicle. Lee is somehow co-ordinating with everyone, quietly, courageously checking through her first-aid knowledge. She can't see any blood. Engine stops turning over finally.....

I guess 5 minutes has passed

I move away as another lady, who is a nurse, stops and goes down to the crash scene to speak with Lee & "B" and get status from a chap who lives close by.....scampers up the embankment.....he heard an almighty BANG!!!

I speak to him.....it's good to share a minute with someone about what's happening. He goes down and sees how he can help "B"

Quite a few cars going in both directions, everyone cohesive and not getting in anyone's way. I go to assist Lee's mum with traffic flow. Waiting, waiting, staying calm, but anxious. Lee tells me there is blood at the back of his head. We are so grateful there is no fire.......

because Rob is trapped upside down & wedged. Lucky, lucky man. I can hear the ambulance, fire, police.....then helicopter, getting closer.... Ambulance arrives, Lee debriefs them, also "B". The first couple of police cars arrive.....Lee chats to them. More police & they are setting up road closures. A chopper is overhead, loud noise, but comforting at the same time!..... It lands opposite on private property, fire fighters also there. Getting out their jaws of life & other equipment....Lee & "B" talk to them. Lee's mum & I assisting the police & directing two-way traffic

**THANK YOU "B" & LEE** for everything you did that morning - when in a second, things went terribly wrong for someone!!!.....

YOU held your metal & carried on in an emergency & potentially tragic circumstances....your efforts were invaluable!

(Later on I find out that when you ring emergency.......YOU need to ask specifically the services you require & also tell them what equipment they need, etc).

these few words have ended up quite long, but IT HAS TO BE.....because any accident or natural disaster......

where people like you & me (members of the community) arrive...... play that crucial role in just "helping" with everything.....

until the emergency crews arrive and take over

We don't want our names published......just a message to reinforce the message that basic "first aid training" for every individual is so important & life saving...... THE BEST NEWS is that Rob (not his real name......) is going to be well & truly OK!



# Don Randall Outlines His Position on Fenthion

At the time of publication, the APVMA had still not made a decision about the use of Fenthion in the fight against Medlfy for the 2013/2014 season.

Don Randall, as the returned Member for Canning, wants to ensure local orchardists that he is supportive of their requests to secure the safe and effective use of Fenthion into the future.

What will a Coalition Federal Government do to support orchardists? Will the spray limit be increased to three indefinitely? A Coalition Government would bend over backwards to make sure the continued safe use of Fenthion works for industry. In the short term, to address the needs of the current season, we will work to arrange a permit for the effective use of a third spray.

What guarantees can you give those worrying about their health due to Fenthion sprays?

Science is critically important in determining the safe use of Fenthion, and Fenthion has a long record of having safe, effective use.

What is the feedback you have received back from growers?

Growers were very grateful and happy to have not only local representation but also an incoming government that will provide security and stability to the future of their industry by giving clear and decisive messages that we will support them to maintain their business. We will not make any knee-jerk decisions in reaction to special interest groups that will be detrimental to their industry.

Why is this an important issue?

This is a highly important issue because if we don't protect our local industry we rely on imports from overseas, and the Coalition supports Australia being a country that makes things, grows things, and exports. Poor management of the issue threatens their livelihoods and the stone fruit industry in general – in the Hills and elsewhere. The further effect is the loss of jobs and loss of food security in Australia.

On the recent Federal Election day I was serving as a Declaration Officer at a booth in Armadale and my whole day was clouded by my first customer. He was a large, angry tradesman who was obviously not overjoyed with 'being able to exercise his democratic right to vote'. He gruffly took the papers from me and wrote some obscenity on the senate paper. No-one actually got to see what

he had written because he then tore the senate paper up, stamped on it and walked out of the polling office. Now he was obviously unhappy but the only person who witnessed this was me (and the person waiting behind in the line). His act of defiance didn't change anything!

Having worked inside elections over many years I KNOW that the only way anything can be made to change, is by voting. And being a political junkie, I feel that voting wisely (even if it means voting below the line and numbering every box!) is very important.

Well, at least it is all over for the next few years. Or is it?

No! During October we have the chance to vote in our local government elections.

The most important aspects (or at least the ones that effect our comfort on a daily basis) are actually those covered by our local Shires/Councils. Yet voting for our councillors is optional. And only about 25% of people (this rate is about 30% in Jarrah Ward) bother to do so. And it couldn't be easier - your vote is just a matter of selecting a candidate and putting the vote in the post (for free).

Does our low rate of compliance mean that only one quarter of folk notice/complain about aspects from the regularity of rubbish collection, the provision of footpaths and whether or not dogs should be free to roam our communities? I think not. It is more likely that we just forget to do it.

We have four people running for the vacancy in Jarrah Ward (see the candidate's bios on page 42 and 43). Brad Anstey, Theo den Haan, Laurie Scidone and Caroline Wielinga are all vying to join Grant Nixon as our representatives on Council. Well done to them all for having a go and for being prepared to offer their services to our community for very small remuneration. Plus, I think that all present and previous Councillors would agree, that it is often a thankless task.

So please take the time to make your decision and cast your vote. Our community will be better served if folk have taken the time to understand what passions, skills and strengths our Councillors bring to the position. The October Courier is again packed and of course it is spring time and show time coming up. Wishing you all the best for spring and I hope you enjoy the read.

# Jean Patricia Ritter 1924 - 2013

Mrs Jean Ritter aged 89, passed away on Friday 13 September 2013 - peacefully and with family by her side, at Murdoch Hospital. Mrs Ritter lived with her husband Paul and six children on Brookton Highway, near the Roleystone/Kelmscott border from 1965 to 1980.

The family came to Australia when Paul was appointed from Nottingham, England as the first City Planner of Perth.

Mr and Mrs Ritter met at Liverpool University in England. Mrs Ritter graduated with science and educational qualifications and became a biology teacher, at Liverpool's Aigburth Vale High School for girls.

Mrs Ritter made a major contribution to educational and community life in Western Australia. She was secretary of the School Council at Kelmscott Senior High School during some of its fledgling years from 1976-1979. Mrs Ritter was also Chairperson

of the Kindergarten Teachers Training College in Perth for 7 years, a member of the Management Committee of the Lady Gowrie Centre, assisting the early education of children in the 1970's and the chair of the Association for the Welfare of Children in Hospital (AWCH) that obtained greater parental access to hospitalised children.

Since 1975, Mrs Ritter was a Member and then a Fellow of the Australian College of Educators.

Mr and Mrs Ritter moved to Kalamunda in 1980. She lived in the same house until her passing. Mr Ritter had passed away in 2010.

Mrs Ritter's interest in education never dissipated and she was a member of and contributor to the University of the Third Age (U3A) for a number of her later years.

One of Mrs Ritter's passions was creating and stitching her own free form tapestries, for which she won an award and was commended by Dame Joan Sutherland. The tapestries are viewable at Painting with Wool, Spontaneous Tapestries by Jean Ritter - http://www.jean-rittertapestries.id.au/index.html

Her six children, 16 grand children and five great grandchildren survive Mrs Ritter.



# THE ICE ADVENTURERS ARE BACK

In August, Jessica Hayes and Gavin Zimmer went to Bolivia in South America to attempt to climb four summits: Pequeno Alpamayo (5379m), the right wing of Condoriri (5630m), Huayna Potosi (6088m) and Illimani standing at 6462m!

They were climbing as part of the Telethon Adventurers.

Unfortunately Jess Hayes made no summits. She reached Huayna Potosi high camp at 5135m and Illimani high camp at 5500m, having struggled with altitude and gastro.

However the rest of the team did amazingly well! Gavin Zimmer reached the summit of Pequeno Alpamayo, Huayna Potosi and Illimani. Gary Kingston summited Pequeno Alpamayo, the right wing of the Condor (5630m), Huayna Potosi and Illimani. Baz Everest summited Huayna Potosi. This was Baz's first

ever summit! Theo Wye summited Pequeno Alpamayo and Huayna Potosi.

'I'm so proud of the boys! They did the Telethon Adventurers and all their family and friends proud!' Jess the Team leader said.

'The coldest, longest, hardest and most enjoyable thing I have ever done,' Gav reflected.


'Having climbed in Nepal, Africa and Europe I thought I knew what I was in for, but our main goal Nevado Illimani, put me in my place! At around 6300m on summit day, already having climbed for 5hrs and just seeing the first ray of light, I genuinely considered turning back. The summit was covered in thick dark cloud; the -25deg C wind was giving me frost nip through 3 layers of gloves and the altitude was keeping me to a 5 step, 10 breath pace.'

'I quickly realised this was more serious than the "brochure" made out. Of our 8 person team 1 stayed in La Paz and 2 had left base camp and returned to the city due to illness. With our deteriorating health from 17 days high in the mountains and the fact that none of us were keeping much fluid down, another 3 team members decided they would sit tight at high camp. This left Gary and me being in the best shape (did I mention not keeping fluids down) so we decided we had to at least try for the summit. Somehow, amazingly, Gary made his 4th summit of the trip and I made my 3rd. We got back down safely and happily collapsed in our tents.'

'The whole trip was a great success, the team got along incredibly well with everyone reaching the highest point they had been. Some had more luck with illness than others and that went hand in hand with their summit bids. However, the main and most important part of our trip was that we have raised over \$15,000 for childhood cancer research, and I'd like to thank everyone who has supported us with their donations.'

Some words from Jess:

'Bolivia is the most beautiful country I have ever been to. We toured the city of La Paz, visiting the music museum, Moon Valley, Killi Killi lookout and Plaza Murillo. We got to visit Copacabana on the shores of Lake Titicaca, get blessed by an Aymaran Catholic priest on the lookout before heading to the top of Holy Mountain - Cerro Calvario (4023m) where we watched the sun set over Lake Titicaca, taste freshly caught and cooked trout, hike the spine of Isla del Sol - playing hide and seek among Incan ruins.'

'We camped at the shore of Lake Chiarkhota in Condorriri national park, practise ice climbing, abseiling, walking with crampons and self arresting. We were followed by one of the porter's dogs, almost from where we were dropped off, up to Illimani base camp, and then to high camp the next day. It was like a Kelpie and all it had on it was a little scarf on its neck. It was gorgeous! He kept tugging at the straps on my backpack and chewing our trekking poles and tried to sneak in to the tent at high camp (it was freezing).'

'The team had the opportunity to attempt four summits. We drove through Palca which is a large canyon where you have incredible views of Illimani. To top it all off the whole team mountain biked down Death Road on our last day!'

'The team had raised just over \$15,000 for Telethon.' The last event on their schedule was to be held on Wednesday the 18th of September at Rydges Hotel Perth, hosting Mountaineer Tim Macartney-Snape, Australia's most celebrated mountaineer but have had to postpone until March 2014 for multiple reasons. 
us into the Christmas spirit and of course Roleystone's very own Paul Peacock will be up on the stage!

# Visit to Ashendon Forest Causes Extreme Concern

On 10 September we took a diverse group of people into Ashendon Forest within the Canning River catchment on the outskirts of the Perth Metropolitan Area. To say that the group was appalled at what they witnessed of the destruction and proposed destruction of forest is an understatement.

The timber industry is in crisis because the "amount of waste versus quantity of quality timber that can be extracted from the forest", has reached an unsustainable limit.

The damage now caused, and the waste created in the logging process, has to be seen to be believed.

"Business as usual" is not a suitable response to the issue of forest management in WA's South West native forests.

The proposal to log between 1,500 – 2,000sqkm of forest over a 10 year period at a cost to taxpayers of over \$9M per year versus the opportunity to gain an income from carbon credits at a rate of up to \$400M per year, would appear to be a "no brainer". The government and the Forest Products Commission must look at the information available and enter into discussions with the public about how best to utilise the wonderful forest legacy we can leave for future generations.

The issue must be resolved in 2013 before

we are locked into another destructive 10 year logging cycle.

To prop up an un-economic and destructive industry with taxpayer funds, rather than making an effort to move into the modern world of plantations for timber and forests for their myriad of other uses including climate change mitigation and profitable carbon storage, is to sell short a wonderful State asset.

It would be better if, in this round of discussion on the future of our forests, we engage in a rational dialogue rather than the destructive adversarial approach taken to the issue during 1995 – 2001 when, only after dangerous conflict, the issue of logging Old Growth Forest was resolved.

It is understandable that timber industry workers fear the end of an era.

However they, more than anyone else, know that we have pushed our forests to their limit. Their long term employment will be in plantations for timber and in the enormous task of maintaining and protecting the native forests, which they have grown to respect and enjoy.





From The Archives

This is the last part of the article: 'A Visit to Canning Jarah Saw Mills,' first pubished in the West Australian, 5th December 1893.

Something more remains to be said in regard to the Zig-zag railway, a journey on which is an experience not to be missed by visitors and residents of the colony.

This piece of engineering, was surveyed by Mr White and stamps him as a man of great ingenuity.

Its cost of construction was considerable, but it stands the exceptional wear and tear due to the grades and curves remarkably well. Some of the grades are as much as 1 in 25, and the descent is remarkably interesting and stirring.

Whilst the journey is exciting there is no cause for alarm the drivers and guards are experienced so there is

little danger.

Something like £100000 has been expended and all of this is foreign capital.

We returned by the regular passenger train from the mills, for the company, finding that numbers of persons, who had friends and relatives at the mills, were, in the habit of endeavouring to reach them by the timber trains, have arranged a regular bi-weekly service.

Trains now run to, and from the mills for the convenience of passengers, every Wednesday and Saturday, and the fares and rates are the same as upon the Government lines.

The service is comfortable and convenient, and those desirous of seeing picturesque scenery as well as a very important, industry should avail themselves of these facilities.

On the way back I stopped at the Perth yards of the company. These are extensive, covering about three acres, and are conveniently relocated alongside the Eastern Railway, from which 40 trucks discharge their hoards of timber in a few hours. This is stored, upon stagings, timber of all shapes and sizes; and builders and contractors can, without trouble select what they want in any quantity.

There is yet another yard owned by the company at North Fremantle, where 200 to 300 loads of timber are kept in stock, and here the important shipping and export business is done.

In reply to my question as to the future of this export trade, Mr Wilson said it was practically

boundless, and was almost certain to rapidly grow. In addition to the timber now so largely used for street making purposes, it should, he said, be valuable for building and railway purposes in the Mother Country, and should certainly ere long be extensively used for sleepers on the main lines of railway there.

The average durability of the creosoted fir sleepers now used on the British railways is only about three years, whereas jarrah sleepers had been known in this colony to last fifteen, which would more than make up for the extra first coat.

In regard to the suitability of the jarrah for building purposes, Mr Wilson showed me, adjoining the yard, the foreman's residence, beautifully constructed of jarrah, worked and painted in front to resemble stone, timber supports to prevent the dampness rising through the boards, and in fact an altogether suitable and pretty residence for this climate.

It has the additional merit of being 25 or 30 per cent, cheaper than a brick structure of the same size.

Speaking of the local trade in jarrah, Mr Wilson added that it was growing apace, and that the present large influx of people due to the development of the goldfields, gave the assurance that it would go on increasing.

Taken altogether, there seems a highly prosperous outlook for our important timber industry, and in this industry the Canning Jarrah Timber Company should not have the least share.

Let it be added in conclusion that already the colony is deriving considerable direct benefit from this company. In addition to the large sum which it pays in wages, over £20,000 a year, it contributes about £500 a month to the railway revenue, or about one-tenth of the total receipts, so additional interest should be felt in the fortunes of this large and flourishing concern.



# THE EARLY HISTORY OF THE RJFC 1973 - 2013

In July 1972 Alan Pearson and Jim Morrissey surveyed local boys to assess interest in playing Australian Rules Football.

On a Saturday morning soon afterwards, 20 eager boys turned up to have a run, aged from about 4 years to 12 years old. Jim Morrissey agreed to train them.

A social match was organised against Perth Centrals. Their team was under 11 years, the Roleystone team was picked from all the boys available. *Roleystone won.* In 1973 The Roleystone Junior Football Club was established by a small number of parents in the community. The first ever committee was formed: President Jim Morrissey, Vice Presidents A Lance and Ray Pound, Secretary A Pearson and the Treasurer Mrs B Lorie.

The name TIGERS was selected with the colours, black and gold, similar to the WA State jumper. Two teams competed in the 1973 season. The U10 years was coached by Joe Valenta and the U12 years by Frank Stephenson. At the end of the season a "players tea" was held in the Old Roleystone Hall.

Forty years later the Tigers are still going strong.



#### GARDENING NOTES By Jean Evans

What a delight to drive out into the countryside to see the green paddocks and the roads lined with wild-flowers.

The Swan-River-Myrtle is lovely in clumps near Roleystone, Prickly Moses all along the verges, clumps of Kangaroo Paws and even Cats Paw's and then there is the brilliant blue of the leschenaultia. It seems to be paler over in the Parkerville area than it is here.

I am so pleased with the large group of everlastings that are growing on the road reserve in front of my own garden. Most are the result of self-seeding from last year, but a friend sent me more seeds in March and I scattered them too. I only hope they will set seed next year again. One thing that I noticed as unusual is that the eye of a number of plants is jet-black, whereas most are golden yellow. If you get the chance, try to get to the wildflower display in Kings Park or one of the many country towns which have flowers on show. Friends of mine have driven across from Victoria to view flower displays in Ravensthorpe, Esperance and Kojonup. I went south to catch up with my friends taking in the wild-flower displays, featuring so many

differing varieties and species. The Esperance

Let us not make the mistake of losing our natural indigenous native plants, as so often happens along the road verges. Too often weeds have choked out the native plants and decimated what was once so special.


lifestyles and health choices. In addition, several people have asked for private screenings in their own homes for their family and friends to attend.



#### SEED SAVING

Not so long ago, seed saving was part of every garden. From ancient times until our grandparents' day, favourite strains of vegetables and flowers were renewed from year to year and generation to generation, sometimes travelling long distances with a family to a new homeland.

During the 1900's we experienced a startling drop in the number of heirloom varieties—because gardeners stopped saving and trading their own seeds. When we rely on commercial seed companies, any seeds that sell slowly simply get dropped from production and disappear.

This loss of varieties translates into lower genetic variability in our food plants. Lower variability means lower adaptability to stresses such as disease or climate change. Each time a seed variety is lost, we lose another chance to feed ourselves in a world of changing climate and shrinking resources.

You can save your own seeds for free, usually, and you can save as many seeds as you like. You can easily save enough seeds to have plenty for sharing with friends and other gardeners in local or online seed exchanges.

Trading with friends can greatly increase the number of different varieties you can enjoy—without spending a cent! Saving seeds also helps to adapt plants to your own garden conditions.

West Australians who buy seeds from some interstate seed suppliers by post, are now being hit with an additional cost, due to WA quarantine inspection charges.

Under changes to WA's biosecurity laws, The Department of Agriculture has confirmed it will extend a fee, which previously only applied to commercial importers, to anyone who brings seeds into the State. So this is another reason to learn to save your own seed!

At the October meeting of Roleystone Organic Grower Leesa Caldwell, president of Organic Growers of Western Australia and owner of The Greenhouse, a company that sells certified organic seeds, seedlings, and potted herbs, will be telling us all about how to save seeds. Leesa will be discussing the difference between hybrid and non-hybrid seeds, easy to save seeds, what seeds cross pollinate and how to avoid cross pollination, how to grow healthy seeds, characteristics of healthy seed-viability, vigour, size, and maturity, storage, harvesting seed. #### **Brad Anstey**

People who know me, know that I have already been working for part of the community. Following a successful appeal against my rates last year, it was discovered that the Valuer General Office (VGO) had incorrectly valued some vacant land properties (30) within the City of Armadale - 75% of these being in Karragullen. This error was introduced in July 2011 and caused subsequent rating assessments for these properties to be overstated by approx. \$1,000 pa (or more in some cases). I have continually challenged both the VGO and the City of Armadale on this mistake, with this issue also being raised in Parliament (in August) - that a moral obligation exists in refunding the monies to those affected.

I am pleased to announce, that this constant lobbying has finally resulted in a recommendation to Council that ALL of those affected ought to be refunded fully!

For several years now, the City of Armadale has been one of the highest rated Councils in the Perth metropolitan area. The Council's financial reports over the last 4 years have shown significant annual revenue surpluses being accumulated and carried forward into the following years' budgets indicating the Council has been unable to complete some budget programs in a timely manner. In addition to this and over the same period, the City of Armadale has doubled its Reserve accounts to over \$53M.

If elected, I will be applying close scrutiny to the program of works which make up the budget, and ensuring that clear justification exists to continue funding for them. They do NOT get an automatic approval on the simple basis that 'it was done last year'. Also on my priorities is investigating methods in which to spread the rate burden more evenly across the community than at present. As well as examining the Council's policies on accumulating Ratepayer money into Reserve accounts, and reviewing the effectiveness of the current program of works financing strategy. I will support local businesses, and encourage new business and employment opportunities for the community, and most importantly level rates comparable to the lowest in the metropolitan area.



Together we can make a difference in controlling the stray cat problem and follow the new laws set out by local government. Every domestic cat owner will need to have their Cat Sterilised, Microchipped and Registered by the 1st November.

Come along to the Roleystone Microchipping Morning, cost \$66 on the day. This service is provided by Foothills Animal Hospital. Register on the Roleystone Neighbourhood Family Centre's Facebook page and come along and get you moggie fixed up.

## Practical Response to New Cat Laws

In preparation for the enforcement of new cat laws beginning 1 November 2013, where all cats over 6 months of age are required to be desexed, microchipped and registered with the local area councils; *Roleystone Animal Hospital* would like to make all of Roleystone Courier readers aware of a low cost cat desexing & microchipping scheme called "Desex in the West", that is being provided by Australian Veterinary Association (AVA) member clinics in partnership with the AVA and supported by the Department of Local Government and Communities.

Many veterinarians believe that desexing (surgically removing reproductive organs under a general anaesthetic) not only helps solve the serious problem of unwanted pet overpopulation, but also makes for friendlier, easier-to-live-with pets. Spayed cats are more relaxed, whilst castrated males are less likely to roam, urine-mark their territory, or fight with other cats. This not only reduces the number of fight wounds that require veterinary attention, but also reduces the chances of cats contracting feline AIDS. Desexing also has other health benefits; it helps to minimize the risk of cancers, not only of the reproductive organs in both male and female cats, but also of the mammary glands in females.

At *Roleystone Animal Hospital*, all of our desexed patients receive pain relief at the time of their surgery, and female cats go home with easy to administer pain relief as well, to ensure they have a speedy & comfortable recovery.

This scheme is offered to low income cat owners, who have a valid pension or healthcare card. Participating vet clinics provide a **\$50 discount** off the normal price of female cat speys and male castrates, and provide a **FREE** microchip (approximate value: \$66) at the same time. There is no limit to the number of cats per owner or household

who are eligible for the discount. The "Desex in the West" scheme is only available for a limited time, so we urge you to take advantage of this offer before funding runs out.

## Roley Bushcare Notes Marri Canker Workshop was very informative

A workshop was organised in Roleystone recently, to discuss the worrying trend with marri (Corymbia calophylla) in our area. Roleybushcare invited Professor Giles Hardy and his associate, Dr Trudy Papp to give a presentation to our community.

Professor Hardy is the Director of the Centre of Excellence for Climate Change Woodland and Forest Health at the School of Biological Sciences and Biotechnology Murdoch University, Western Australia.

Before the workshop, Dr Ian Colquhoun (Chairperson of Roleybushcare) and Pat Hart (Chairperson of SERCUL) took our guests to see the marri trees along Croyden Road. At the workshop we were given an outline of the disease and an explanation on how they were progressing. Many years of work are ahead for the researchers.

Some "Citizen Science" help will be requested at times. They are preparing an App for mobile phones. The broad community will be able to take a photo of a marri tree and then log some information into a prepared form directly on your mobile phone. This will automatically give the GPS of the tree and then it will be sent to be processed by Murdoch researchers. We will promote the app on our website when it is finished.

Apologies to any volunteers who turned up at our last field day.

We had to cancel the September field day. Ian checked the area at 7.00am and found the ground was too muddy and we risked spreading dieback disease. The decision to cancel is always hard but sometimes the weather makes working under trees unsafe for our volunteers. At other times the decision is based on whether the reserve is diebackfree or not.

A cancellation notice was posted on our website and an email was sent to registered people.

This will be a dieback treatment day. It will be held on Sunday 13th October between 9.00am and noon at Warwick Savage Park. Go to Simons Drive, Roleystone. A sign will be on the road.

#### The Threat of Marri Canker

In Roleystone/Karragullen and throughout the hills we are seeing mass deaths and declines of Marri trees of all ages. Last Saturday we had Professor Giles Hardie here, advising us that at this stage, they do not know how to stop or slow down the Marri canker. This is endemic but for some reason it is killing the Marri trees.

Even worse was his information that there is also a more insidious disease than marri canker that is adding to the fast decline. They believe this pathogen came in from the Eastern States on the blue gums used for the plantations down south. This affects the new shoots and leads to the thinning of the leaves which is clearly seen on the Marris. Once again there is no known method to stop it.

The whole landscape is changing and in the next 10 years we will see a massive change with mainly under storey and some Jarrah.

We are absolutely concerned and hope the scientists will find quickly some way we can save at least some Marri trees.

I have recently heard that the State Government is allowing the destruction of Marri Trees in our State forests in order for the Jarrah trees to grow stronger so they can then be used for Forrest products. Professor Giles advised us that the Marri trees growing in the forest away from man's impact eg roads, housing etc do not at this stage appear to be impacted by the Marri canker and yet here we have these strong healthy Marri trees being ring barked. This is outrageous; words fail to describe what is occurring.

What legacy are we leaving for future generations?

#### Fire Breaks and Burning Permits

Even though it is still bucketing down with rain, now is the time to start the preparations for making your property fire safe for the coming hot season. Three metre fire breaks must be installed around properties by 30 November.

If your property has rocky outcrops, or some other odd areas that a fire break can't be installed, then a variation needs to be applied for in writing before 1 November.

This gives time for a Ranger to inspect your property before a variation is granted. Burning permits must be obtained from 1 October until 31 November after which all burning is prohibited.

#### **Borello Park Toilets**

After nearly three years of discussion, Borello Park is going to get a toilet. This has been a hotly debated item with surveys, petitions, a toilet strategy and comments occurring before finally being passed at the latest council

With new locally designed and constructed toilets now available here in WA, it has been possible to free up an amount of \$114,000 for reallocation to other projects.

This means we can build the toilet, improve the existing facilities at Borello Park AND rehabilitate Warwick Savage reserve with the Public Open Space funding available.

Some of the upgrades suggested are improved play equipment, barbeques and shade sails.

#### **Asset Management Plans**

The City has just completed Asset Management Plans covering Roads, Stormwater Drainage, Pathways, Public Open Space and Buildings. Our population in the City of Armadale was 71,238 at the end of 2012 and will increase to over 122,000 people in the next 15 years. This increase in population will increase our assets from \$795 million to \$1.3 billion.

These documents should provide a solid foundation on which to base improvements, and funding of operations, maintenance, upgrades, renewals and replacement of infrastructure assets over a 15 year period.

As you can see from these amazing numbers, these documents (375 pages worth) have taken our officers lots of research, time and effort to write but they form such an important tool in the City, managing our money, and our assets, to the levels of service we expect.

#### ROLEYPOOL - COLLINS WAY by Pat Hart



Collins Way, the one way street that sits above Roleypool, was named after a Roleystone resident who spent many years teaching children and adults how to swim at Roleypool.

Mr Harry Collins played a significant role in the late 1920's and 1930's at Roleypool gaining his certification as a teacher of Life Saving from the Royal Life Saving Society at Roley Pool in 1922 and remained a member of the Society until his death in 1945. Mr Collins was born in Victoria 1877 and later made his way to Western Australia. He purchased an orchard in Roleystone on the corner of Brookton Highway and Holden Road which he called 'Waitangi' where he lived with his wife Hannah. They had two children - Bessie and Reg.

Mr Collins was involved with the Roleystone Progress Association for many years and was at one time the Chairman.

Mr Collins married Hannah Buckingham, the daughter of Thomas and Hannah Buckingham, the first family to take up major land holdings in Roleystone. Mr Collins worked his property until his death on 11 October 1945 at the age of 68. He is buried alongside Hannah in Kelmscott.

The Roleystone Swimming Club was formed during Mr Collin's time and he was their official instructor. Many swimming carnivals were held there over the years with teams from Pickering Brook, Kelmscott and other metropolitan clubs competing.

In 1936 the Armadale Kelmscott Roads Board spent 40 pounds deepening the pool by blasting. Roleypool continued for many years as the key summer venue for Roleystone, Karragullen and surrounding communities. The Roleystone Progress Association had a close association with Roleypool and were responsible for the diving board replacements and also built change rooms at the site.

The Canning Dam construction in the late 30s and early 40's, did impact the summer flow, but it was still enough for the community to enjoy swimming at the site. Once Canning Dam was connected to the Wungong Dam and was not allowed to overflow, this reduced the scouring of the Pool and reduced flow considerably and the quality of the water for swimming declined. In the mid 60's the Pool was closed by the Road Board due to health issues and the weeds took over the site. In the mid 90's, Armadale Gosnells Landcare chose the site as a focal point when they set up their organisation.

Roleypool and its surrounds leading out to Soldiers Road are now looking great although swimming is not recommended due to the many snags in the pool and low flow in summer.



#### October begins with moonless evening skies.

Early risers will see the waning crescent moon in the morning sky. New moon (no moon) is on the 5th. After that comes the waxing crescent moon, the evening crescent. The thin, new crescent moon should be visible low in the western sky at nightfall on the 6th. Thereafter, it'll become a progressively fatter crescent and will be setting later and later, day by day. First quarter, evening half moon phase, is on the 12th. Full moon's on the 19th, when moonrise will be about half an hour after sunset. Last quarter's on the 27th the morning half moon phase. Then the waning crescent phases lead to the next new moon on November 3rd.

In the early evening of October 7th, the skinny crescent moon forms a triangle with Mercury and Saturn; Mercury being the object at the left corner of the triangle. On the 8th the moon's up higher, near brilliant Venus.

On the 9th it's up level with Antares, the principal star in Scorpius. Note the phenomenon of "earthshine" dimly illuminating the shadowed portion of the moon, early in its cycle i.e. on the 7th to the 10th.

Earthshine is sunlight that reflects off the Earth and reaches the moon, and the effect is most pronounced when there's a fairly small angle from the sun to the Earth to the moon.

If you hear news of a lunar eclipse at full moon on the 19th and/or a solar eclipse

at new moon on November 3rd, don't get revved up. Neither eclipse is visible from Australia.

Venus is the dominant evening planet, standing quite high in the western sky at dusk. Its setting time goes from about 9:40pm in early October to around 10pm mid-month and 10:15pm late in the month. Mercury's also visible - it's low down, just to the south of west, in the early evening. Its setting time is about 8pm in early October and around 8:15pm mid-month. It'll disappear into the solar glare in the last week of the month.

Jupiter is the dominant morning planet. It rises from the ENE horizon at about 2:10am at the start of October, then steadily earlier: 1:15am mid-month, and just after midnight at month's end. Mars is visible in the early morning sky as well: look for it fairly low in the NNE at first light. The silly story about Mars looking "as big as the full moon" is still doing the rounds on the internet, and it's no more correct than it was 10 years ago. Mars is never ever going to look as big as the full moon when you're standing on Earth and eyeballing it.

Will the wintry, cloudy, wet weather stop soon? At Perth Observatory we really hope so, because our public star viewing programme has just started up again. Phone 9293-8255 for info and bookings, or check our website www.perthobservatory.wa.gov.

#### Wild Gossip: Snail Pellets Kill

I have admitted a lot of dead and dying bandicoots recently and have also found 4 dead and two dying on my own property.

This makes me think that somebody is putting down snail pellets, which along with killing snails, most certainly kills our precious wildlife.

Snail pellets kill bandicoots, possums, bobtails and a wide variety of birds including magpies, ravens, kookaburras, all of which (except the possums) would have eaten the snails and solved the problem!

Snail pellets also kill dogs and cats and can make children really sick. This poison remains active on the ground for quite some time. I have suggested natural solutions before but will try again in an attempt to stop this ongoing carnage of our precious wildlife.

- Stop poisoning the wildlife that would naturally eat snails.
- Scatter crushed egg shells or sand grit around plants to protect them.
- Use other natural barriers such as wood chips, ash, wood shavings or

- sawdust.
- Garlic or wormwood sprays are a natural deterrent.
- Beer in a shallow dish is a good trap as the snails go in for a drink, get drunk and drown.
- Free range some poultry and have the benefit of fresh eggs.
- Inverted grapefruit or orange halves, pots or boards placed in the snail area, make an excellent trap but will need to be checked each morning.
- Copper banding or barrier tape round plants will give snails a sort of electric shock to deter them.

There are many other natural remedies that can be used instead of deadly poisons which kill unintended things and pollute our environment. Once you start to use the natural remedies a balance is restored and everything starts to work together so all problems decrease. Our wildlife is very precious and needs to be protected for future generations to enjoy.
