The November Edition Celebrates Our Firies



Matt Plowman, is the Fire Control Officer for the area of Roleystone. He has a busy life having a family, running his own business and has been fighting fires for nearly 15 years. He and his crew are getting ready for the coming fire season. They will continue the controlled burning until the official start of the fire season.

Two weeks ago, while they conducted a controlled burn I was able to take some photos of the operation. There were two burns planned for that day. I followed Matt and his crew: John Anderson, Michelle Thomas, Ryan Maughn, Ryan Sutherland and Beau Moulton from Station 198 to one of the locations in Roleystone. The conditions were perfect that day, I was told. Light wind and no rain. One spark was enough and the first grass tree was on fire. It was spectacular to me. The area Matt and his crew were burning was surrounded by family homes thus special care was required.

While Matt's team kept an eye on the fire for the whole time I had the chance to talk to him for a few minutes. He clearly remembers our bushfire on the 6th of February 2011.

'It was a very scary feeling for many people,' he said.

Even if he has longstanding experience in fighting fires, every fire is different. And if the "conditions are right" for a fire it will travel fast; much faster than most people would expect.

Then he explained the reasons why controlled burning has such an impact on the safety of our bushland. Natural rubbish such as dry leaves and fallen branches create great fuel to make it easy for a fire to spread. So everyone can contribute to the safety of our bushland by simply cleaning the gutters from leaves and keeping the lawn short during the warmer months. Those who have firebreaks need to maintain them keeping them clear and accessible. Trees close to the house need to be pruned in an appropriate way. We can all help.

The crew from Station 198 is getting ready; all their preparations have started now. So please walk around your property and make sure you are prepared too.

And if you would like to go one step further to help our fire brigade, simply join up. They will provide you with the training you will need. And don't forget the fire brigade has its season all year around. You need to be over 17 to fight fires but there are plenty of opportunities for younger members too as they can join as cadets. The Pioneers' Reunion is hosted by the City of Armadale every year to acknowledge those who have lived in the City of Armadale for 50 years or more.



My grandparents settled in Roleystone in the early 1920s on a property in Sawmill Place. Over the years the extended family has held property in Peet Road, Mackie Road, Hall Road, Glebe Road and Hawkstone Road.

My mother and siblings attended the local schools when they were located firstly at Brookton Hwy (it was then part of Croyden

Road). My mother would drive a horse and cart down Peet Road (then gravel) to Kelmscott twice a week to take and pick up my grandfather from the station as he worked in Claremont and only came home to Roleystone on the weekends. All her brothers served in the army during the Second World War. Fred perished whilst a POW on the Burma Railway.

After 32 years in Roleystone we have downsized to Port Kennedy. Although very happy with our new home we regret having to move out of the area. We were anticipating moving into the Seniors Village that was proposed at the Robin Road site. Unfortunately this now appears very unlikely to happen and if it does it is too late for us. There is a need in Roleystone for this type of facility.

Millie, our 13 yo faithful dog came with us. Although very frail she still enjoys a morning and afternoon walk (stroll) at the local parks. We have to drive her to the park, we help her in and out of the car as she is becoming very weak in the back legs.

There are very few regular dog walkers where we exercise her now. Not like at Cross Park where at times there would be up to 14 dogs socialising in the morning. We will miss all the friends we made in Roleystone. Millie says 'Hi' to you all.

Farewell Curnow Knuckey; A Pioneer Passes

The recent sad passing of 91 year old Curnow and was one of the Hilarions, a well Knuckey marks the end of a pioneering era. known musical group that played Curnow was the eldest son of Mary and Richard (Dick) Knuckey.

Dick was the postmaster and blacksmith and arrived in the district in the late 1880's. He married Mary Parker (the first school teacher and a significant contributor to Roleystone life throughout her life) and they set up their orchard on the hill that makes sons: Lloyd, Ken and Curnow up the lower west side of Peet Road.

Curnow married Dorothy Bettenay (and his brother Lloyd married her sister Elanor!!!) and they lived in Roleystone until they left the district in the early 1950s to pursue lives elsewhere. Together Curnow and Dot had four children Rex, Geoff, Kevin and Jennifer.

Curnow had a long and illustrious life but never forgot his early life in Roleystone. In two main ways he has left a pioneering legacy.

When in 1950 his brother Ken Knuckey and Ray Pound were attempting to establish a local cricket team in Roleystone, they were told that Curnow, who had played for a few seasons for Kelmscott A Grade, was not allowed into the team as he was 'too good'. This decision was later reversed and Curnow and his brothers Ken and Lloyd played for Roleystone for many years. Curnow never forgot his alliance to RKCC and came to Old Buffers Games as often as he could.

Curnow's mother Mary Knuckey was a formidable musician and the driver behind the establishment of the Roleystone Theatre. In most of the productions in the 1930s and 1940s her own children and nieces and nephews played roles. Curnow was a very talented violinist and singer

around the district for many years. The Knuckey's have certainly left a valuable legacy in our District.



Shannan Achieves 6th Place In National Equestrian Event

The Tom Quilty Gold Cup Horse Endurance is one of the toughest endurances races held in Australia. It is 160km and must be completed in 24 hours. The riders start at midnight and must be across the finish line before midnight the following evening. There are 5 compulsory vet checks throughout the race.

This year the national event was held in Wagin W.A. on the 3rd and 4th of October. Riders and their horses travelled from around the country to compete in the annual race. There were over 120 entries for this year's event. At the completion of the event only 36 competitors and their horses managed to cross the finish line successfully.

Shannan Parker first did a Tom Quilty in 2007 when she was 13 years

old. She finished 2nd in the event, in the junior division, and was the youngest rider to finish and she was riding the oldest horse, Kagre Naadin. This year Shannan was riding Jordaan, and they managed to complete the race and finished 6th in the lightweight division, winning one of the much coveted Quilty belt buckles. The ride had a few

hiccups and Shannan badly sprained her ankle at about the



50km mark. They went on to cross the finish line at 6.40pm. To complete this race is a huge achievement and shows great management skills of both horse and rider.

Shannan has been a member of WAERA since she was 12 years old and has clocked up over 3200km in her log books. This does not include all the hours spent riding in Roleystone to keep her horse fit. Shannan would like to say a huge thank you to Ross & Jenny McCamish. They not only have trusted her with the beautiful Jordaan for the past 3 years, but Ross who could not ride any of his other horses due to injury, selflessly became Shannan's official strapper for the event. Without his vast knowledge and experience the race may have had a different outcome.

She would also like to thank her Mum and Dad and her partner Karel, who were there and supported her throughout the event.

Cat Enclosures To Protect Our Wildlife and our Moggies

After my husband Mike died I wanted a companion pet so I opted for a cat. Although 1 love cats, we couldn't have one before as Mike was allergic to them. We also felt that cats and Roleystone's wildlife don't go together.

I decided that my cat would be an indoor cat and allowed out only into a cat enclosure. I purchased a sterilised, micro chipped young Snowshoe cat from the Cat Haven.

Then I had an enclosure erected in the garden. It's about 4m by 2m by 2m high with a zip entrance and encloses a little peach tree and a white buddelia that were growing there.

As I wanted easy access around my patio I had a tunnel put in from the enclosure to my bedroom window. I took out



the window and replaced it with wooden boards with a cat flap inserted. I made up a ramp with carpet stapled to it on the window sill so the cat can race up and down and in and out of the cat flap. An old wooden step ladder in the enclosure gives her access from the tunnel to the ground.

My cat is not allowed outdoors except in her the enclosure. Sadly she still catches lizards that go into her cage but birds are safe and she is safe from other cats and can't go out on the road to be run over.

Perhaps more cat owners should invest in such a structure: it's not cheap but then neither are cats these days when you take into account the initial cost of sterilising, micro chipping and vaccinating plus the cost of registration with local government.



Message from the Roleystone Bush Fire Control Officer- Matthew Plowman

October marks the start of the Bushfire Restricted Burning Periods for 2014-2015. This means that you must obtain a Permit to Burn prior to lighting any fires in the open air from the 1st of October until the 31st of November 2014 inclusive, and then again from the 1st of April to 31st of May 2015 inclusive. These dates may be extended or shortened in the event of unseasonable weather conditions. You must check with local Fire Control Officers or call Ranger Services on 9399 0111.

It is a requirement of a permit holder to ensure fire fighting equipment is present at all times during the burn, and a minimum of three able bodied persons are in attendance until the fire is completely extinguished.

When conducting a control burn it is important to abide by all conditions on the Permit and make sure you notify your neighbour's at least 24 hours prior to lighting a fire. You must also advise your local Bush Fire Control Officer, the Department of Fire and Emergency Services and Department of Parks and Wildlife.

Please note, the lighting of fires in the open air is prohibited from 1st December 2014 to 31st March 2015 inclusive. Important things to remember are: No burning on Sundays or public holidays No burning on days of very high, severe, extreme or catastrophic fire danger

A burning permit may be obtained at the City of Armadale Administration Centre 7 Orchard Avenue Armadale between 3pm and 4pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Permits are also available from the Roleystone and Bedfordale Fire Control Officers.


There is no charge for obtaining a Permit to Burn, however burning without a permit is an offence under the Bush Fires Act 1954 and carries a Penalty of up to \$10,000.



REZONING APPLICATION OF SCHOOL SITE REJECTED

On Tuesday 21 October, I made a presentation to the Development Services committee requesting that Council not approve the rezoning application put forward by the Department of Education. This would have changed the current zoning that we had achieved previously which allows for 'small lot - seniors' housing only'. The zoning applied for would have allowed a small amount of seniors' housing mixed with normal housing. With excellent support from the Mayor Henry Zelones and Chair Cr Donna Shaw the committee declined the application acknowledging that the Council wanted to see Seniors' housing only on the site and added a second recommendation that a task force be set up by Council to investigate the current constraints holding back prospective developers. This appears to be related to sewerage and the State Health Authorities.

This recommendation has to go to a Council meeting on 27 October for final approval but I feel very confident it will go through. So our journey for Seniors' housing in Roleystone continues with excellent Council support. Now we need support from the State Health Authorities to achieve success.

Farewell To A Cricketing Pioneer

Curnow Knuckey

The results and the kicking off of the cricket season takes a back seat in this month's article as we mourn the loss of one of the pioneers of our great club and a true gentleman.

The eldest of the three Knuckey brothers, Curnow together with brothers Lloyd and Ken and Ray Pound amongst others decided that our community needed a cricket club. Unfortunately the association wouldn't let Curnow play in a B Grade Roleystone-Karragullen side when the club started in 1950 due to his already proven experience playing 1st grade for Kelmscott, so it wasn't until the 1952/53 season that Curnow was able to play for the club and did so up until 1965.

Much like many members of the Knuckey family, Curnow was a talented musician, forming part of local band 'The Hilarions' that comprised Phil Martin, Shirley Brown (nee Winstanley), Joan Richards, Lloyd Knuckey, Mavis Fuller, Mary Knuckey and Fred Pound. His appreciation for song and camaraderie formed an integral part of the Roleystone-Karragullen Cricket Club and continues to do so today. While the songs may no longer be sung, they remain on the walls of our club in memory of legends past and the club continues to be a place where "we don't care what the critics say if we get a frothing lager at the close of play".

But Curnow's spirit lives on at the club and did so on the weekend of his passing. With black arm bands on arms, one of the great comebacks was witnessed at Karragullen Oval.

While not necessarily at the beloved turf at Cross Park, our D Grade side were hopelessly trying to defend a meagre total of 144. With the opposition at 2/109 after 20 overs, things weren't looking great. We won that game and did so with about 20 runs to spare. A truly remarkable feat. The annual Knuckey-Pound Memorial Shield (aka Old Buffers Match) will be ever more important this year as we pay tribute to and commemorate the lives of Curnow and the founding members of the Roleystone-Karragullen Cricket Club.

Survived by his wife Dorothy, sons Rex, Geoff and Kevin and daughter Jennifer, our sincerest and wholehearted condolences go out to all the Knuckey family. May Curnow rest in peace. *Todd Bendall*





Fruit Growers Get Lifeline From One Year Extension To Fruit Fly Spray

The Hills orchardists have welcomed a one-year extension to access the only pesticide that kills Mediterranean fruit fly in all stages of the life cycle. The decision by the Australian Pesticides and Medicines Authority has thrown a lifeline to the industry which is starting to harvest their stone fruit now.

Without the protection of fenthion as a cover spray, orchardists fear devastating losses from fruit fly maggot infestation. The Australian Pesticides and Medicines Authority still plans to ban the use of fenthion as a cover spray in 12 months; a decision that leaves the industry scrambling for effective alternatives.

Hills growers produce \$40 million of stonefruit, apples, pears and cherries for the Perth market each year. Industry efforts to develop effective alternatives to fenthion spray are underway but are still two to three years away.

The decision by the APVMA to ban fenthion took little notice of its safe record over decades of use in Australia and that there is no other product on the market to control fruit fly in all life cycle stages.

HOIG spokesman Brett DelSimone said that Perth Hills stonefruit growers and other growers in Western Australia face massive commercial losses when the ban takes effect.

The one year extension is the result of the efforts of many people and organisations Australiawide that have supported HOIG's stance on the continued use of fenthion. Industry associations and individuals have been arguing for some time that the APVMA system for registering agricultural and veterinary chemicals needs reform.

Governments of both persuasions have listened to decades of complaints and made some peripheral changes. The APVMA's arbitrary approach to science, Australia's agricultural future and the damage it causes to primary producers is a national disgrace. *Brett Del Simone*

Neem & Carob Solutions

Ainsley Agroforestry and Aquaponics is now in Clifton Hills Some readers may have seen our stand at the Karragullen Expo, where the benefits and uses of the Neem and Carob trees with their products were displayed.

We are promoting Neem and Carob products from trees grown locally in West Australia.

We make an aqueous extract from the Neem leaf and woodchips for plant protection and fertilizing; towards the end of summer and after fruiting, we also expect to start making Neem oil from the fruit of our trees.

The fruit from our Carob trees along with that of neighbouring farmers' trees is "Kibbled" in our Carob "kibbling" machine and sent to a local miller where it is milled into gluten free Carob flour. We have almost completed making a

Gardening Notes November

The sun is beating down with a real vengeance but I'm afraid this is just a precursor to what is to come.


Local tree pruning expert Chris is still working on the rehabilitation of so many of my trees, trees that have for the last ten years been poorly cut back, or had branches just broken off. My beautiful almond tree, the reason we bought this property, had been badly butchered. It has now been shaped and champhon has been applied to the cuts so the cambium layer (the green bit just under the bark) can callous over the mutilated areas. It is hard to realize just how much harm is done by poor pruning.

I still have weeding to do - to liberate all the plants that the kikuyu has engulfed. We got one of the ti-tree bushes free and raised its height so the lawn-mower can get through. Up the top of the yard the weeds are struggling to take over and we are trying to beat them. Sad when the roses look and smell so beautiful and it's hard to access them thru the long grass. It's amazing what a difference a mow makes.

I am turning the old chook-house into a potting shed. The garden will benefit from taking all the droppings out for other plants to utilise.

My team of little helpers have outgrown the stage of their lives when they willingly worked in the garden, in fact they have not come here this last two holidays except for a half hour visit. Picking Mulberries and Mandarines is the main chore for them now.

Last weekend, Denise from Carmel had plants for sale at the Karragullen Expo. I bought a number of the small perennials and annuals that will self seed again next year. She had a selection of seed packets too including white cosmos and also red yarrow (Achillea millefolium.) There

were also white cornflowers and larkspurs, all old favourites mum used to grow on the farm. As I look back I am amazed at the beautiful garden she used to have. She did not have much excess water and certainly very little time to spend out in the garden. On the plus side, they had plenty of sheep and cow manure.

Everything hardy from fifty odd years ago is coming back into fashion, especially geraniums and pelagoniums.

Wandering around the garden with a hose in hand I am so pleased with how the tall bearded irises have grown. So many different colours and combinations of colour. I especially like the blue and white combination and the mauve white, with a picotee edging.

Sometimes it is design and lots of times just happenstance. Still nature doesn't really clash. The annual Iris display is on in October at Forrestfield. At that time you can actually see the flowers of the varieties that are available for sale. How can I resist just one more?

The beauty of these plants is they do not need a lot of care and will grow in full sun. Given a modicum of care, you will be rewarded for years to come.

I hope by now you all have your mulch in place for the summer and that whatever type of watering system you are using is going well. I have found the aquapore style dripper hoses are very good and do not waste water, as the water is applied to the roots of the plants.

Time soon to get out the books and just enjoy the fruits of your labour. Get the cameras out too.

Vera Naylor would regularly visit the chemist and tell Michael the latest, and when he shared his desire for a "kids' area" in the store to entertain children while parents waited for scripts, the idea of a rocking horse made by Charlie seemed appropriate for the "kids' corner". A desk and writing pad were designated for the children to play with, and in came the rocking horse named "Giddyup" by Charlie himself. The unprecedented popularity of the horse surprised everyone.

"Kids came screaming in, dragging their mums with them!" said Michael. The children would literally push each other off the horse out of desperation to have a ride. Michael noted how well-made the horse was, and unbreakable despite kids as old as 12 having a turn.

Charlie took the horse away every two to three years to service and repair Giddyup. 

'Wishes for Starlight' by Linda J Bettenay

The appallingness of the Aborigines Act 1905 is at the heart of Roleystone author Linda Bettenay's second novel 'Wishes For Starlight'.

The Act saw a chief protector appointed as legal guardian to all Aborigines in WA and it spelled the end of civil rights for Aborigines with discrimination, segregation and the loss of the right to move around the state freely. Bettenay tells the fictionised story of Starlight, a mysterious deaf mute Aboriginal boy rescued from abhorrent living conditions by three children, who vow to make it their life's journey to look after his welfare.

His greatest ally is Mary, a strong willed white girl, battered by her philandering father, but determined not to let each and every hurdle life throws at her keep her down.

Mary and Starlight's lives entwine as they endure life without parents, war, depression, death, discrimination and separation from each other.

With her acceptance of Starlight, her attempt to run a business alone when estranged by war and her friendships with men who are not her husband, Mary's life defies what is expected of women of the day. She shows that injustices towards women ran parallel with those of Aborigines.

An array of lovable and evil characters join Starlight and Mary to bring the hills of Canning Mills, Karragullen and Roleystone in the 1900s alive with prejudices, sexism, racism and rich discussions about what is right and wrong in their world.

Through it all Mary and Starlight give breath to loyalty, strength of character, overcoming adversity and challenging the conventions of the day.

Bettenay is bold in her storytelling, she does not shy away from what life must have been like for Aborigines at that time and bravely includes fictionalised accounts of people and places with which she is most familiar, having grown up in the hills where she still lives today.

Take delight in reading a WA author writing about the part of WA she knows and loves.

It will entertain you, affront you and compel you to talk about what life was like 100 years ago in suburbs we all know.

Readers of Bettenay's first book 'Secrets Mothers Keep' will enjoy the reappearance of Bluey, Macca and the now mellowed newspaperman Eustace.

Bettenay's fans can be rest assured 'Wishes For Starlight' has as many shocks and even better storytelling than her first novel.

We live in an area that is relatively safe from crime, has large blocks, free of unnecessary traffic and clean air to breathe.

The new areas being developed have small blocks, large houses, almost no back yards and no room to grow trees. In my street most people know each other but are there only when needed. The day the mini tornado went through our street everyone was out helping each other clean up the mess. We have a great shopping area that supplies the basic goods and services at a reasonable price but also puts so much back into the community through employment and sponsoring all sorts of local events.

This shopping centre and Cross Park across the road, is the centre of the community, our community hub.

In the end I believe it's the interaction of the local people which makes our community good.

The area where we can improve is in looking at our own blocks and assessing the amount of trees, rubbish and undergrowth. If we had a fire emergency would our block pose a risk to our friends and neighbours and their properties? It is not good enough to decide to evacuate when a fire comes and leave your neighbours who are going to stay and fight but have to look after your place as well or suffer the consequences.

We have a great community. Let's keep it safe.

COUNCIL BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT

The Minister has confirmed that the boundary adjustment between the City of Armadale and the Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale will take place on July 1 2015, at which time the Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale will be abolished.

Our new southern boundary will be along Mundijong Road with the northern half of Serpentine Jarrahdale going to the City of Armadale and the southern half to the Shire of Murray.

My concern is that the Advisory Board has recommended that the CoA do away with the ward electoral system. In an area as diverse as the CoA this ward system gives great representation to all areas from the hills of Karragullen to the flat lands of Harrisdale and Piara Waters. But these area's needs differ greatly and need separate representation. The CoA will grow in area to 809sqkm and the population to 102,000 in 2015, 139,000 in 2026 and 209,000 in 2050, as we are one of the fastest growing local councils in Australia. The City has already been working hard on planning for the changes with the challenge being to keep the level of service to us while the transition takes place. *Cr Grant Nixon*

Astro Highlights November Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

November's a funny old month when you're in the business of entertaining people on a hilltop, under the stars, with telescopes, and your victims (sorry, customers) are expecting to see amazing cosmic marvels unfolding before their astounded eyeballs.

If there's no moon and no bright planet to start the ball rolling, you have to start with fairly faint objects and steadily go fainter. That quickly becomes a challenge for those whose vision aint what it used to be. I'm getting a bit that way myself.

At present there's only one easily visible, though rather forgettable, evening planet: Mars.

It's in the constellation of Sagittarius and in early November you'll find it quite high in the western sky at nightfall. Mars is unspectacular: it just looks like a medium bright star with a slightly orange colour.

The best fun you can have with Mars this month is to keep track, at least for a week or two, of the way it changes position relative to the stars.

If you can be bothered to make a simple sketch showing the location of the planet compared with nearby stars, you'll see within 2 or 3 days that it's shifted. "Planet" is a word with a Greek background, meaning wanderer.

Mars is the closest celestial object you can see in the early evenings now, and its movement is apparent. It's also the only planet that earthlings are planning to visit in the foreseeable future. It's not too far, it's solid, and it's less inhospitable than all the others. However, the plan to send a manned (humanned?) mission to Mars may be shelved for decades to come: the Sun's current low level of activity looks like reducing the shielding effect that the solar wind usually provides against cosmic rays. Jupiter is the only other easily visible planet, and it's a morning object, a bright one at that - Jupiter's much brighter than any of the stars we can see. It's in Leo and rises in the ENE at about 2am in early November, 1:10am mid-month, and 12:15am at month's end. At daybreak it stands out, well up in the NE sky. The last quarter moon (morning half moon) will visit Jupiter in the early morning hours on the 15^{th} .

The moon's waxing in the first week of November, having gone through first quarter (evening half moon phase) on October 31^{st} . So the waxing gibbous phases – half moon with a hump – will lead on to full moon on the 7th, when the moonrise time will be about 7:20pm. After the 7th, the moon's officially on the wane, though it looks for all intents and purposes to be full on the day before and the day after full moon. Last quarter's on the night of the 14^{th} . New moon's on the 22^{nd} , after which the waxing crescent moon will feature in the early evening sky. First quarter will occur on the 29^{th} .



Wild Gossip

Spring is definitely bere and baby birds are in abundance unfortunately a lot are coming to me for care.

Whenever anyone phones me about a baby bird I always go through the same routine. First I ask the caller to look at the bird to see if it is injured, this includes

gently fanning out the wings and looking on the underside for any damage. It is usually very obvious to spot.

If the bird seems uninjured I suggest placing it back outside on a Y shaped branch in a place as close as possible to where it was found. If no branch is within reach then I suggest placing the young bird on a fence, wall or similar and if this option is unavailable I suggest a wheelie bin be moved to the location and the baby bird placed on it.

The baby bird should be observed from a distance to see if the parent birds come back to attend it and start to feed it. Parent birds have a wonderful way of returning babies by using their wings to flip the baby up in stages to return it to the nest. If a baby bird is in danger from cats or dogs please confine them for a short time to enable the parents to rescue their baby. If by dusk no parent birds attend the baby it will need to be gently taken inside and kept in a warm, dark, quiet place until morning when the attempted relocation can resume. If the bird in question is a night bird such as an owl or tawny frogmouth, the process needs to be reversed. It needs to be cool, dark and quiet throughout the day and then try the putting out procedure at dusk.

Again you will need to observe from a distance to ensure the parents are attending. Young birds have a much better chance of surviving with their parent teaching how to live and feed than they have with us so please try to reunite them. If a baby bird is injured it will need to go to a vet and be cared for until it is well enough for release. Your local wildlife carer will be happy to assist with this.


