### Out Of Africa


At the end of October we completed our month in Africa. Although the trip was focused on spending time at Njelela Secondary School we also managed to enjoy African wildlife in the Ruaha National Park, cool highland towns, and the generosity of African hospitality. I wrote this in Dar Es Salaam where we had a few days to rest and swim before heading home.


I have been very impressed with our children, Amelia, Sally and Charlie, who have risen to every challenge with good will and a sense of humour as travelling in Africa can be confronting. After a trip to the toilet on a train which was just a hole in the floor Charlie commented that "trains do wee mum!". We have all learnt to enjoy the simplicity of a simple African diet consisting mainly of ugali (cooked maize flour) and beans. Life for the students at the Njelela school is hard. After a day of study their time is taken up with cleaning the school, carting buckets of water from a nearby river to water vegetables, pumping water from a well and collecting firewood. Malaria and typhoid are realities of

For us it has been a stark reminder of the luxuries of our own lives and an important lesson for the kids that holidays can be about many things. Sally and Amelia put a lot of hard work into finding opportunities to interact with the students at Njelela. Loom bands and elastics both proved to be popular hits! I found the time quite challenging as the cultural divide was very big and I wondered what I could have to offer.

Paul had already been there for many weeks setting up electricity in dorms, giving presentations to the students and generally achieving an amazing amount in a short period of time. I came to realise however that what I considered to be a small contribution could actually have a big impact.

Occasions that stood out were giving basic computer lessons to an enthusiastic student and discussions with teachers about parenting and teaching styles after it was observed that I was "more than just a mother" to my children. In Tanzania, particularly in rural areas, children can be treated harshly by their parents and teachers, although this is now changing. A particular highlight was a little girl attending a church service in rags and without her parents. She sat close to us sneaking many looks, until she managed to work up the courage to smile and then she touched me again and again until she gained the courage to hold my hand. From there we shared the church service holding hands. She didn't want much from me just a smile and a touch but the reward for me was huge. Njelela is still a developing school with the potential to provide so many long term benefits. A good quality education for a child in Tanzania changes not only their lives but those of their family. There are opportunities for you to share your good fortune with them.





Some of the children attending Njelela are unable to pay their school fees and these fees are needed for the school's running costs. Photos of these students can be seen on the school website (www.njelelaschool.com.au). It costs just \$700 to cover a child's school and boarding fees for the year. 



### And Welcome To Grant



For the fourth year in a row, Roleystone Community College has won the Smarter than Smoking Young Director's Festival for a 30 second commercial about the dangers of smoking amongst the early teen peer group.

At a gala viewing night at Armadale Grand Cinemas, RCC took out the overall winner for secondary schools and also collected the Excellence in Acting award.

Specialist Digital Media Teacher Mrs Bullock congratulated the Year 8 film students, saying they worked in a professional manner to produce industry standard work. The commercial was filmed on site at the College with a purpose built set in the Media suite with auditions for the two male leads, Orion Francis-Roberts and James Usmar, held within the Year 5 – 9 cohorts.

More than 200 community members, students and teachers attended the viewing night, with judges led by a panel of WA health agencies and Murdoch University.





### Auf Wiedersehen

On Saturday 22 November, after many months of excitement and planning, 16 year old Sophie Sallur finally flew out of Perth on a trip of a lifetime to Germany for 12 weeks. Sophie, along with fellow Kelmscott Senior High Senior student Shannai Belton, won a full fee paying scholarship.

Awarded by the Society for Australian-German Student Exchange Inc., GMA Garnett, the Rhein-Donau Club and the WA German Business Association to travel to Germany this allows her to live with a host family, attend a local school, experience a different culture and way of life and also travel within the country.

Sophie will spend a week in Berlin as 'free travel' and a week in Cologne at a winter camp, while living the rest of the time with her host family in Lubeck, which is only an hour from Hamburg.

Sophie was very excited to receive the news she would be 'hosted' in Lubeck, as she had studied and prepared a report for her German class on this very pretty and picturesque town in northern Germany which sits on the river Trave.

Already in a call home Sophie has squealed that the place looks like it's out of a fairy-tale, and she can't wait to explore!

Earlier this month Sophie and Shannai took part in a very important event for the Perth German community – the 40th anniversary of the dismantling of the Berlin Wall. Students from Kelmscott Senior High School performed a special sketch and Sophie and Shannai were officially presented with their scholarships, by State Treasurer Mr Mike Nahan.

It is the third year in a row that students from K.S.H.S. have won the scholarships, which are open for any students in a WA public school studying German. This is a fantastic endorsement of the great work the teachers at Kelmscott are doing.

We are very excited for Sophie – 5 years ago our eldest son Monty also won a scholarship to spend 4 weeks in Germany.

He went in July to Kelheim in the south in Bavaria and also travelled to Munich, Cologne and Berlin. He had a wonderful time and we are sure that Sophie will also have lots of stories to tell us and loads of photos to send us. She has the added delight of a German Christmas and New Year, with all the different customs and sights to experience and be a part of.

Seeing snow for the first time and having a go at skiing are a couple of things she is very excited about. But riding a bicycle to school every day in the snow, which Jan-Henning her host 'brother' says is what they will be doing, does not seem so attractive. We can't wait to see those photos! 

### The Olden Days

On Wednesday November 5th I was invited to talk about 'school life in the olden days' to Mrs Watson's and Mrs Hermanniusson's year two classes. I had been a student at Roleystone Primary School with Pat and I was at Armadale Senior High School with Unnur, so our paths went way back (apparently the 1960s qualifies as the olden days).

Now after I got over the initial shock of realising I would remember 'the olden days' I girded myself up to the challenge. What would year 2's like to know about schooling in the district in days gone by?

Mostly I relayed some of my memories of Roleystone Primary School. Things like: we didn't wear shoes, we had milk at recess, we had no canteen but once a week we had tuck shop: mince on toast (with tomato sauce) in the winter and polony and cheese (yes with the obligatory tomato sauce) in the summer. Our mums were the tuckshop ladies. Pat and I recalled when the school uniform changed to red and white - before this it was pink and green.

Now the youngsters were mildly interested when I spoke about my experiences but they found the stories I told about my dad's school time memories amazing. When I told them about boys taking rifles to school so they could shoot rabbits for tea on the way home, their eyes were like saucers.

In my last story I relayed the true yarn of the Karragullen School mutiny where all of the students decided to go on a picnic rather than go to school. At the time there was a very weak teacher and some very strong minded 'big kids'. Apparently Ken Smailes and Jackie O'Meagher were two of the ring leaders. When they declared that school was boring and that they were off to Boulder Rocks for a picnic - the rest of the school fell in line and went too. This happened for three days. On the fourth day they arrived at the school and found that the weak teacher had been replaced by Mr Oliver, a mountainous man who announced to the quivering assembly as he belted the cane on his leg:

'I believe the last teacher had a little bit of a problem....' The mutiny was squashed, everyone was caned (apparently he used the cane on the students liberally and without mercy for many years to come). Mr Oliver was also widely regarded as an excellent teacher who staved at the school for the next seven years.

And with that tale my recollections were over.

I did enjoy the chat and the children behaved beautifully and were amazing. Thanks so much for the opportunity to spend some time reminiscing ...,

### POLE WALKING COMES TO ROLEYSTONE!

I have recently been volunteering my time at the Shire of Armadale Tourist Information Centre as a group leader for pole walking, (quite unlike pole vaulting & pole dancing!) and more recently you may have seen a group wandering around the streets of Roleystone too.

This form of exercise has been practised since the 1930s by cross country skiers as their summer fitness conditioning and has been adopted by some health professionals as a form of rehabilitation for their patients. It is now practised by tens of thousands throughout Europe since the 1990s. Some of the benefits include burning 30% more calories than regular walking and is healthy for your heart with 20-40% more oxygen uptake. It totally tones your body as every muscle works and has a greater influence on mood and stresses than

regular walking. It's a great form of exercise for the fit and not so fit, so if you would like to join us we leave from the Recreation Centre on Wygonda Road on Tuesday's at 8:30am sharp. We hope to have a group leaving on Tuesday and Friday in the new year but with the warmer weather we'll probably leave at 6.30am. The cost is a mere gold coin donation. ### A Very Great: Sundae Surprise

I saw what I thought was a kangaroo, but on second glance it was a horse, a foal in fact! My first thought was 'where has this poor baby escaped from?'

Then I saw it begin to nurse from one of my mares, Shianne the Leopard Appaloosa had dropped a foal in the night!

How could this be? She had shown no signs of pregnancy. It was a total shock. How could I have not known? I had heard of it happening but never thought I'd be in the midst of it myself one day!

Lots of colourful language followed by phone calls to those near and

dear to me then took place. No one believed me at first and some of the replies included "shut the front door!" (Julia Hoareau) and then tears of joy from others. It was such a special surprise and everyone who knows the lovable, sweet natured mare agreed that it was a true gift. Being pregnant has meant that I stopped riding a few months back and leased this horse out to Julia and Meaghan.

Now the thought running through everyone's heads now was 'did we push her too hard in her final days of pregnancy?' The guilt factor was consuming poor Julia who had recently participated in a show jumping and cross country training day and Meaghan who had taken her to a show just 2 weeks prior. Not to mention

all of the trail rides through the Roleystone hills and valleys.

The vet was called and carried out a blood test to ensure the new filly's antibodies were of a high enough level to ensure strong immunity which thankfully they were. Whilst present we all bombarded her with the questions on our minds;

How does this happen? Vet: Happens at least 10+ each year.

Shianne was in full work right up until the birth, was this ok? Vet: Yes, just like humans it probably did her a world of good.

With our minds now at ease about the foal's health and Shianne's wellbeing, we then began to think about who the father of this filly could be? I bought Shianne in December 2013 and the vet mentioned that the foal was full term so gestation would have been 320-340 days, meaning she was pregnant prior to me picking her up. When I called the previous owner to discuss the 'immaculate conception' she confirmed that the Quarter Horse stallion on the farm had actually escaped around 10 days prior to me collecting her.

Well it was all making sense, apart from the whole: 'How did we not notice' part?

During the time I have owned her she had been seen by many horse experts. Not once did anyone mention that she looked pregnant. To top it off that day my Dorper ewe Dolly gave birth to a healthy happy lamb too. Unfortunately Dolly didn't make it so we are left with the little guy who is being bottle fed and truly believes he is a human.

We called the new filly Sundae Surprise. We know that this little filly will be special. I look forward to watching my children, nieces and friends children ride her one day.



### Armadale Hall Refurbishment

The community needs to be made aware that the planned changes for the Armadale District Hall include the removal of the gallery/balcony and demolition of the two outer front wings of the building.

Another lesser hall is to be added to the eastern side, removing from view the beautiful art deco hall from the heritage/tourist precinct. One might ask how can so many changes be made to a heritage listed building. Perhaps your local councillors could answer that, or the Heritage Council of WA. The City of Armadale is about to spend \$3.5 million on the hall with a view to turning it into a performing arts centre.

Only 315 patrons can be seated in the hall at the moment.

That number will not increase with the new developments in place and our Heritage Listed Armadale District Hall will be changed forever. There is no plan for extra parking at the hall. Why not have refurbishment and an upgrade of facilities rather than spending \$3.5 million on a hall which will not be suitable as a performing arts centre?

### Armadale Town Hall Heritage Integrity Under Threat

The Armadale Town Hall is one of the oldest State heritage listed buildings the City owns and is an iconic feature of the City Centre. The question many would like answered is: just how many changes can occur to a heritage listed building before it loses its integrity?

The City of Armadale has a draft plan for the upgrade of the Armadale Town Hall that has recently gone out to public comment. If permission is given to proceed the additions and alterations proposed will ruin the high quality heritage values of this historic building and reduce it to a very basic looking upgraded old hall. The iconic values that it now has will be gone. This building is an important part of our heritage.

The final report is yet to go to Council for their approval. If approved by Council it will be referred onto the Heritage Council of WA for their permission to proceed. One can only hope that the majority of Councillors will acknowledge the outstanding historical significance of the building and reject the proposal. If it does get through then one can only hope that the Heritage Council does what it is supposed to do.

I think this historic building needs to be saved!



Our family thanks the Roleystone Community for the wonderful years of friendship it gave to her and for their many expressions of sympathy.





### Western Power Work Around Roleystone

Thanks Michael and Pearl Sibley for providing this explanation about the work occurring on the powerlines around Roleystone:

We are committed to providing a safe, reliable and affordable supply of electricity to Western Australians, and take seriously feedback from the community, such as you have shared.

Western Power has begun a number of projects to enhance the safe and reliable supply of electricity for our customers in the Perth Hills including Roleystone. Western Power is selectively installing heavily insulated powerlines, called Hendrix, in high and extreme bushfire risk areas where it is difficult and costly to lay underground cable and when vegetation cannot be adequately maintained to ensure public safety. Hendrix powerlines are also used over river crossings, and where other network solutions cannot be achieved.

In Roleystone, 1.45 kilometres of powerline and a total of 36 poles are being upgraded to support the new Hendrix powerline. Hendrix requires larger power poles because it is a heavier powerline. As a result, a small number of power poles are required to be replaced.

In 2009, Hendrix had not been widely installed in the electricity network, and another type of powerline was installed in the Roleystone area.

It has since been decided that the benefits of Hendrix powerlines for this particular section of network in Peet Road outweighed the sooner than expected replacement of the current powerlines. Installing Hendrix cable in the Perth Hills is one example of how Western Power is preparing for the coming bushfire season and reducing the risk of bushfires this summer.

We thank you for your interest in the electricity network as we enhance our infrastructure in your area.

### Progress on Seniors' Housing for Roleystone

The following letter has been received by the Roleystone Karragullen Seniors' Committee from Minister Kim Haymes advising that special provisions to the sewerage policy have been made to enable the old Primary School site to be developed for Seniors' Housing, subject to one condition.

Thank you for your letter of 30 October 2014 regarding housing for seniors at the old Roleystone Primary School site.

The Government Sewerage Policy - Perth Metropolitan Region recognises the need for aged home accommodation in the community and has made special provisions for such development. The Sewerage Policy normally requires residential lots to be a minimum of 2000m2. However, an aged home development may have a minimum lot size of 700m2 without the need to connect to sewer on condition that the site must be proven to be suitable for onsite effluent disposal through an appropriate geotechnical report.

Based on the size of the subject land, 44 lots can be developed for aged home accommodation if site conditions permit.

In addition, the Sewerage Policy requires the support of the local government for such a development at a given unsewered site. In this regard, the City of Armadale has recently advised the Department of Health (DOH) that it believes that there is a need for an aged home development in the area and that this is the most suitable location for such a development.

The DOH has similarly advised the City of Armadale of its support for the development as outlined above.

I trust the information provided is of assistance to you and the Housing Committee.

### **Unscrupulous Tree Loppers - A Community Alert**

Various tree lopping contractors are currently door knocking around Roleystone, offering tree lopping services to residents. Here is a word of caution about one of these operators.

Recently a Roleystone resident was approached by an amiable man offering tree lopping services. He passed her a card and told her a heart wrenching story about trying to get work to support his young family and get established in WA. He stated that he had full insurance and all of the equipment necessary (including a cherry picker) and then offered her the clincher - a very cheap price. This is her story:

'He arrived with his wife and toddler and the only equipment was a large ladder and a rope. The job was a disaster. He proceeded to climb and cut using no safety equipment - the wife was instructed to use a rope to try to give the falling timber some direction. He demolished an expensive aviary and

my rose garden was ruined.

He was now quite aggressive and demanded to be paid in cash. He showed no remorse about the damage and stated that his insurance had lapsed.

I am now left with a mess and a quandary. Should I attempt to get financial recompense from a person who has probably little ability to pay compensation? At least I have learnt a lesson.

My advice: if you must employ a transitory door knocking tree lopper - check out whether they are insured with your own insurance company - they can easily check whether a policy is active.'

The City of Armadale advised that work done by these contractors is not endorsed by Council. If residents are in doubt about the credentials of these companies, it is recommended that they contact ASIC on 1300 300 630 or DOCEP on 9282 0777 and ask for proof of public liability insurance.




### How's This For Amazing Service?

The need to get to know your neighbours, including their phone number, is critical whether there is a fire threatening, if you have been broken into or if you believe there is a threat from persons nearby.

Obviously with the threat nearby the Police are the to first call but knowing there is someone next door who is aware of your situation and maybe able to assist would be reassuring.

With Bushfire Ready it is suggested that you photograph all your belongings in your home and note details of their value so that you have proof of your loss when you make claims with your insurance company. This information is required when your home is burgled. Bushfire Ready encourages home owners to check insurance premiums to ensure they cover the real replacement costs of assets which relates also to the losses experienced with robbery. Neighbourhood Watch support includes a 'Home Owners Property Register' with excellent guidelines for information required to note on key assets. Plus they recommend a UV ink pen to mark your property which makes items harder for burglars to sell.

Armadale Neighbourhood Watch has numerous other pamphlets with advice and information that is vital if we want to gain a real understanding of crime prevention for ourselves and our community.

You can also link into **ewatch** an email based system that connects residents to their local police and Council **www.ewatch.com.au**.

I encourage your Bushfire Ready Group to consider joining up with Neighbourhood Watch. If you are not with a Bushfire Ready Group (and you really should be) consider joining up with your neighbours for Neighbourhood Watch. There is nothing to lose

### LAUNCH OF WISHES FOR STARLIGHT

A large and enthusiastic group of friends, family and book lovers enjoyed author Linda J Bettenay's Book Launch of Wishes For Starlight. The event was held in the Mary Hargreaves Pavilion in the rose garden at the amazing Araluen Botanic Park on Sunday 16th November.

Over 100 friends took the opportunity to socialise and of course buy a copy of her latest book. In her talk Bettenay revealed her newly released novel: 'Wishes For Starlight' is a story from our local area. The dastardly deed happens in Moondyne Joe's Hollow in Araluen Botanic Park.

In Bettenay's talk she explained how this story came from her father's and grandfather's memories and although it is historical fiction it's also grounded in factual events. The central character, Starlight, was a deaf mute Aboriginal, born in the 1890s in Canning Mills, a thriving timber town.

'Starlight was discovered living in a chook pen and fighting dogs for scraps by three remarkable children. Their actions result in the aboriginal boy being adopted by the community and over the next thirty years their friendship and loyalty enabled Starlight to survive in this time of prejudice and disadvantage,' explained Bettenay.

'Wishes For Starlight' is steeped in our pioneering history: when the orchards, the dams and the timber mills were being established, when typhoid epidemics threatened daily survival and fears of forest fires, destitution and starvation were very real. A time when the Zig Zag railway was built, the horse and cart reigned and barn dances provided entertainment.'

Bettenay has tied in many themes and events of the time into her novel; the difficulties of migrants, the challenges faced by women and the marginalisation of anyone who was not 'normal'. She explained that in this period 'The War to End all Wars' accounted for the loss and mutilation of many soldiers while also seriously impacting on those 'left at home' but it also allowed for the blossoming of mateship. 'My launch was lovely and I thank everyone for coming along. Special thanks to Liz, Grant and Rod from Araluen Park for their support, my brother Kim for playing delightful music all afternoon and my family and friends for making it all possible. Plus of course veryone who has come along to share this great day with me. Writing my books has been a fulfilling experience - I am hoping that they contribute to the understanding of the history of our amazing location.'

### Gardening Notes with Jean

was! The Roleystone Garden Group met in Reed Rise here in Roleystone, and what a lovely group of people they are.

We wandered the garden then had a scrumptious morning tea. Then the rain came, not a lot yet just enough to encourage us to get out and get rid of any snails that appeared out of the crevices and rocks. There are certain plants that are most attractive to them. My Madagascan Hemp makes it very easy to spot them. I do not mind picking up the snails but hate the slimy bodies of slugs. A word of caution if you find really fat huge slugs these are our friends and they eat the other slugs. So please do not squish them.

A friend and I ventured off to a geranium and pelargonium display this month. She suggested that if we left at 9-30 we would be in plenty of time. Lo and behold we arrived at 10-30am only to see crowds everywhere. It was like a bunch of locusts the way the plants disappeared out of the hall. It was truly evidence of the popularity of these species. I feel they are amongst the most popular of all plants especially as our climate dries.

Another plant that puts up with dry very well is the begonia. There is a lot of variety and the growth habit of each type is so good. Some are virtually groundcovers whereas some of the cane varieties will grow to eight feet.

I find it necessary to walk around the garden at least once a day to see which day lilies and bearded iris are flowering.

What a lovely morning it Today there was a large butterfly on the Buddleja bush which is covered in lovely big soft mauve blooms. I must have lingered for quite a while wishing I had my camera with me. These plants are very rewarding and there are a lot of different colours from nearly black to white.

> With verge pick-up occurring now, I hope you took the opportunity to get rid of a lot of the flammable waste that accumulates over the in-between months. I mostly get a chipper in, but this time I have collected a lot of prunings, trying to get the garden tidy and keep it in flower. Your own wood chips are a great idea, they inhibit weed growth and keep the garden moist, also you are not bringing in weeds from other properties.

> Last year I bought lots of Frangipanis and most survived and I notice buds forming nicely on them. Pioneer Gardens have just got in a lovely stock of new releases. Maybe if you are not giving Linda's new book 'Wishes For Starlight' as a gift, then a frangipani might be a good alternative.





#### Agriculture Department Funding Fails Hills Fruit Growers

The decision by the Department of Agriculture and Food WA to spend just \$1 - \$2 million of non-Government money on Area Wide Management (AWM) to control Mediterranean fruit fly across the Perth Hills will devastate local fruit growers, Perth Hills orchardist John Della Franca believes.

Mr Della Franca said that the Department had been studying the fruit fly problem for 20 years but was still only offering growers in the Hills another trial with no new money for a large scale control program.

"The time for trials should be over – we need a full scale Area Wide Management program or fruit fly will destroy our industry," Mr Della Franca said.

This was despite DAFWA announcing, this week, a program to release 5 million sterile Mediterranean fruit flies per week in Carnarvon in 2015 and a biosecurity officer for inspection, hygiene and enforcement duties across commercial and residential properties. Mr Della Franca commented:

"This is the exact course of action that local growers have asked the Department to implement in the Perth Hills. We are happy for and supportive of the producers of Carnarvon, but we are disappointed that Hills growers are viewed as second class."

Fruit growers will lose the use of the fruit fly pesticide fenthion in less than 12 months. The Agriculture Department had advised the Federal regulator and a Senate inquiry into the impact of banning fenthion that Area Wide Management, trapping and baiting was a successful alternative method of control.

But the Department's response to the ban is another watered down trial in Karragullen leaving Karragullen marginally protected but the rest of the \$40+ million-a-year Perth Hills fruit crop vulnerable.

Mr Della Franca said Area Wide Management required joint action by the state and local Governments and the community, as well as growers. Industry was prepared to contribute funding to a fully developed control program.

"Growers have no power to enforce hygiene and control measures on residential properties where backyard trees can be the breeding ground for the pest," he said.

DAFWA's Senior Entomologist, Darryl Hardie, told Perth Hills growers at a meeting on November 5:

"There was not one extra cent in the State Government budget for Area Wide Management in the Perth Hills". And most of the \$1-\$2 million trial budget would be swallowed up in "in kind" assistance including paying public servant salaries and vehicle hire.



Dr Hardie told growers it was not the Government's role to run Area Wide Management and that growers "Had 12 months to get their act together".

"If that's the case why has the Department been spending millions over 20 years on tests, trials and overseas trips?" Mr Della Franca said.

The Department also breeds sterile fruit flies for sale to South Australia but not for release in the Perth





In the early eighties we spent several years living with 1100 other souls in an isolated Pilbara mining town. Nothing of life in those years could be described as normal!

Professionally, I had total site responsibility and that brought some incredible highs and lows. Believe me, it was all very different from the current situation - FiFO was unknown then.

Operations were on a scale way beyond anything I had encountered before and commercial pressures led to some ridiculous industrial relations situations.

But perhaps the most bizarre aspects of life were displayed in the social landscape. The overwhelming influence of heaps of young single blokes living for months in dongas of various levels of "luxury" sure distorted ordinary community life. There were some unbelievably hilarious scenes and some really sad ones.

But memories of this time have become fossilised beneath sedimentary layers of adventures lived in a very different context. I am writing this at Coral Bay,

our first return to the Pilbara since those crazy days and I was surprised to find that, away from the glorious Ningaloo coast, the physical landscape started to mess about with these mental fossils.

Driving through the miles of spiky spinifex in the forty degree heat, spectres of times past intruded unbidden.

The humanoid termite nests by the roadside became animated in my imagination, assuming the form of individuals acting out events long since consigned to the "previous existence" bin for obsolete memories.

For sure some of these made me smile but there is such a shadow over the time that more than once I have sincerely wished them all obliterated. Omitting the excuses, it's sufficient to say Hilary and I, separately and individually, conspired with a couple of these ghosts to stab our marriage deeply in the back. By human standards, these bleeding wounds should have been fatal. But what transpired has been amazing.

Just as things were at their worst, we left the area and moved down to Roleystone. Cutting out the details of a remarkably beneficent series of circumstances, we were taken in hand by a few precious people in what was then the Roleystone Congregational Church.

Through prayer and down to earth practical care, we became transformed. I now look back on life prior to this break point and wonder if I am indeed the same person who messed up so spectacularly all those years ago. The answer is "no". The things that make us who we are have been radically altered. In fact both Hilary and I at different times became new creations, to use a Biblical phrase. And I have no hesitation in saying God's hand was instrumental in all the changes.

I am sharing this with you for two reasons. Firstly, I want to give hope to anybody who is struggling.

Our marriage was not only saved but transformed into something joyful and precious to both of us. If that can happen to us, it can happen to anybody.

Secondly, I want to affirm that God's desire and ability to put things right has no limits, no matter how badly we may have behaved.

We were as unworthy and hypocritical as you could get. Yet we were sought out and welcomed by Him. Of course there are provisos and caveats to these statements, mostly concerning our own motivations and openness. But there is fundamental truth in them both.

Christmas is just around the corner and the first Christmas underpins all I have been trying to pass on to you. Jesus came not just to sort out the hereafter. I am convinced he was and always will be just as concerned with the here and now. Hilary joins me in wishing all of you in Roleystone a very happy Christmas. Yours in Christ,



#### Astro Highlights December Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

If you're looking for the right Christmas gift for the astro-nut in your family, consider getting a copy of *Astronomy 2015*, the astronomy almanac.

Or a nice Australian planisphere - a gadget to show what stars are visible and when, at any time of night and on any date throughout the year. Your smartphone app can't do that.

The Observatory has a range of astronomical items in its little shop - books, posters, puzzles, globes and planispheres.

Now, with the summertime stars coming into view, we're hoping for more clear nights; the last couple of months have been pretty cloudy. The public viewing sessions will really take off after New Year. Early in the month the moon is the dominant evening object. Full moon's on the 6th - on that date at 7pm, the moon will be coming up in the ENE as the sun's going down in the WSW. After the 6th, the moon's on the wane. The major phases for December are: full moon on the 6th, last quarter on the 14th, new moon on the 22nd, and first quarter on the 29th. The first full moon of the new year will be on January 5th.

The longest days of the year are heading our way. The summer solstice is on the 22nd. While that's the longest day at 14 hours and 15 minutes, the day length is over 14 hours from sunrise to sunset for the entire month.

Actually, for Perth the day length is 14 hours or more, from November 27th right through to January 16th. Not good news for those of us who aren't fond of summer.


If you should wonder what the evening skyscape will have to recommend it at Christmas time, there'll be the waxing crescent moon to the right of Mars at nightfall, with Venus low down in the WSW. On Christmas Night, that is.

On Christmas Eve the skinny crescent moon will be visible, but lower down. The shadowed dark side of the moon the side where the sunlight isn't - will be dimly illuminated by "earthshine" which is simply sunlight that's reflected back off the Earth. Our planet, with its oceans and its clouds, is quite reflective. The moon's not: its surface is dark rock which reflects less than 10% of the sunlight that falls on it.

Venus will be setting about an hour after the sun from mid-December on, and it's more than bright enough to be seen through the western twilight. It'll be further from the sun and easier to see in January, and will be the "evening star" until next August.

Mars is higher up in the western sky at dusk, but only looks like a medium-bright star with a slightly orange hue. Jupiter will come into the evening sky soon, though not in the early evening. In early December the giant planet will rise from the ENE around midnight and be high in the NNE at daybreak. Mid-month will find it rising an hour earlier and standing high in the north at first light.

By month's end Jupiter will be rising around 10pm, culminating high in the north at about 3:15am, and standing out in the NNW at break of day.

### Wild Gossip: Water For Wildlife

Spring has been a busy time with lots of bird enquiries and admissions. Summer is now here and we need to be aware of our precious wildlife and do all that we can to assist it.

Water is vital for survival and we can help by placing shallow, non tipable containers around our property. Shallow is very important as we don't want anything to drown in the water and non tipable is good to ensure a constant water supply. I find terracotta plant pot bottoms are very good. They can be purchased without the pot at garden centres and variety stores.

Feeding of native birds is not recommended as they tend to become reliant on it. I do feed the birds as I think it is sometimes hard to find food, especially with demanding young in the nest.

I feed them dog sausage which is readily

available and it contains nutrients that are not available in mince. If you feed mince you must add calcium - this can be purchased at stock feed stores or your local chemist and is essential for strong bones. Feeding of native birds is not recommended but if you choose to do so, please do it properly and if you are going on holiday make sure you get someone to continue the feeding.

I recently had a call about a baby magpie and offered all the advice I could. The caller then told me what to do with the baby magpie. Her advice was incorrect but left me wondering why anyone would phone me at 7am to tell me what to do with the baby magpie she had found!
