Roleystone's Geoff Stewart has once again been picked to represent WA in the Ivor Burge State Basketball Team. The competition, held annually during February, was held in WA this year and was run at the Kalamunda Basketball Centre. The competition is for people with intellectual disabilities and is run in conjunction with the National Under 20 Basketball competition.

This is the 6th time Geoff has represented Western Australia. He was first picked to represent the WA Ivor Burge Basketball Team in 2002 which was held in Geelong. Many locals will know Geoff, he has lived here all of his life and went to school at Roleystone PS and Roleystone DHS.

With all the players who take part in the Ivor Burge comp, fundraising is a huge part as most

of the players are on low wages or disability pensions. This year it was slightly easier with the competition held locally, the team members did not have the large travel and accommodation costs.

'I am very proud and honoured to be playing for the WA Ivor Burge Basketball Team in my sixth nationals. This is an accomplishment that has driven me since my younger days, playing basketball with my dad and brothers in the back yard. This helped me develop my game and now I can pass my skills onto my younger team mates,' Geoff said.

The team has an age range of 16 to the oldest player who will turn 50 this year. Geoff at 35, is a veteran of the competition. He is in the leadership group and this year has been appointed Team Captain. Head Coach, Kalamunda's Chris Saligari calls Geoff 'The General'.

'I've been playing basketball since I was 9 years old at my local basketball club here in Roleystone. I have now played over 150 games,' Geoff said.

Geoff now plays for the Kalamunda West Rise team. Last year Geoff did some volunteer coaching at the

Proposal to Create a New Locality To Be Called 'Rowley'

The City of Armadale is proposing to rename the south-eastern portion of the Forrestdale locality in the area bounded by Tonkin Highway, Rowley and Oxley Roads.

This proposal will prepare for the future development of the industrial area and establish an identity; separate to the existing Rural and Industrial areas of Forrestdale. It is proposed to rename the new locality 'Rowley'.

City of Armadale Mayor Henry Zelones says it is important the community has every opportunity to comment on the renaming of the locality.

"The name 'Rowley' has been chosen as the preferred option for the future industrial estate as it will be located on Rowley Road. The name is important to the history of WA, as well as our local history, being the name of an important surveyor responsible for surveying many new development areas in the early days of the State," said Mayor Zelones.

Both Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) and Town Planning Scheme No 4 (TPS 4) amendments are in progress to rezone portions of this area from "Rural" to "Industrial" under the MRS and "Industrial Development" under TPS 4.

One lot within the proposed area is currently reserved "Parks and Recreation" in the Metropolitan Regional Scheme and will remain

It is strange what form, some reminders of years past take.

Harvey Fresh have started selling a variety of milk via IGA Roley, labelled "Jersey Girl" This references the Jersey cow, which was a mainstay of dairy production when I was a kid.

We even kept one as a house cow off and on for a while on the new place before Joe Giglia started delivering milk to Roley. When stonefruit season was in, the oldies had to pull some really long, hard days getting the fruit picked, sorted, graded and packed. Inevitably there would be some fruit which was over-ripe or damaged and had to go in the water drum. Sometimes some fruit was stewed and bottled.

Some stewed fruit went straight into a bowl with some overnight fresh milk from our own Jersey cow. The times were too busy to be cooking up some custard and as for making icecream - forget about it! We only had a kero fridge which battled in the summer heat. I had some Goulburn Valley sliced peaches from the shop and forgot to buy some icecream or custard. So I dumped some of the new milk on top - and - instantly I was reminded.

Here was the memory of the smell of the peaches in the old open-sided packing shed, summer tick-ticks sounding off in the trees in the creek below, the polished paper, the sawdust smell of unseasoned jarrah slats on the halfdump and flat fruitcases, which were all the go then.

I went back in time.....

HISTORY HOUSE MUSEUM 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF WORLD WAR EXHIBITION IN 2015

The City of Armadale's History House Museum is seeking information relating to what life was like living in the City of Armadale during World War I.

The information will be displayed during an exhibition that will be held in 2015 as part of the commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of World War I.

The exhibition will focus on what life in the City of Armadale was like for those who stayed home, while many young men and a few women from the district enlisted to serve with the AIF in Gallipoli and Europe.

The exhibition will delve into many issues of the time, such as how the men who stayed behind were treated and the persecution of non-naturalised residents who were born in countries that were now the enemy. The war caused many Australians to turn against their German and Italian neighbours, even though many had been naturalised and had sons fighting in the AIF; some families had to register with the local police station and were subject to unjustified searches, surveillance and arrest.

The exhibition will also give an insight into the impact on the workforce, when the young men enlisted and left the district, and the contribution of women who had no choice but to take on traditional male roles in the workforce.

Armadale Mayor Henry Zelones said there are still many older residents living in the City that would have a wealth of information relating to this era that needs to be documented to ensure the stories can be captured for future generations.

"We are hoping to obtain a variety of information and stories, including photographs and any objects that relate to this period in history from diaries to business ledgers, letters, or any other memorabilia.


"Maybe you knew someone who volunteered with the Red Cross during the war, a family that lost a son, brother, husband or father in the line of duty, or knew of community events that were held to help raise money for the war effort.

"Do you have childhood memories of growing up during the war or knowledge of any families who had loved ones interned during the war, or deported at the end of the war?

"I encourage residents to share their stories and information so that visitors to History House during the exhibition can learn about the war effort and the effects it had on the home front, especially in the Armadale area," said Mayor Zelones.





We've all heard of the Australian Red Cross Cadets and their benevolent and generous work they do for the community and families. There are two units in Western Australia that are both working in their communities to support society and the environment.

Cadets have the reputation for: manning First Aid posts, joining the parade on ANZAC Day, helping third-world countries struggling to get through life, undertaking community service in people's gardens and cleaning up their community and they even take a trip down to local retirement villages to have a good old chat with the residents. The Red Cross team at Southern Hills Christian College are doing exactly this.

I interviewed some Cadets, whilst they were making gift bags to send over to Manilla. Most of the Cadets I interviewed have been in Cadets for two years.

"What made you join Cadets?" I ask them.

And finally, they all said that Cadets has had a big impact on their lives, teaching them values, being able to help people, work with amazing friends and creating stronger bonds.


It is good to know that they are doing something helpful for people who are vulnerable or having difficulty doing something themselves.







WHO MONITORS ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING CONDITIONS?

I have been involved with our natural environment as a volunteer for many years and with numerous organisations both at State and community level. I believe I am not a radical and acknowledge that in the majority of planning applications there is room for compromise but in some there is not. We are given the opportunity to put our points of view and concerns forward on planning applications and are duly advised as to how all those concerns will be addressed and overcome the areas of concern.

This all looks good on paper but who oversees compliance on these conditions? What happens if the conditions imposed do not work and there are major impacts on the environment?

Most Government Agencies have had major cuts to their budgets and therefore staff levels are extremely minimal and the ability to address all the roles required of them is, in most cases, extremely difficult. This includes community concerns

Local Governments have a few compliance officers but these officers also deal with many other issues apart from ensuring environmental conditions are being met. It is left in most cases to the community to pick up these breaches of compliance. Once there are the visual concerns then there are the letters that have to be written expressing concerns and then the long wait for the response.


I must acknowledge however that the City of Armadale have a good record on responses. My main beef is with Government Agencies. It's not good enough!

I can identify a number of times the different organisations and groups I am involved with have identified serious breaches with very few if any positive outcomes.

The Government must be able to show that if environmental conditions are set, then they can be met and achieve what is required. If there is any doubt about their ability to work then they should not be set. There should be strong penalties for breeches of environmental conditions and this is for all land developments both large and small. I believe the environmental conditions set on all development applications after they have been through local government, WAPC and EPA, should be listed clearly on the appropriate Council web site so that the public is aware of what should be undertaken on that site to address environmental concerns.


Those of us who take a very close interest in what is occurring to our natural environment, do so not just for today but for the legacy we are leaving for future generations. It is unfortunate that past generations were unaware of the impacts on our natural environment when undertaking planning and development but today there are no excuses. Pat Hart



HACC Funding Increased

In the September 2013 Courier, I wrote about the great work that our local community assistance organisations do in the area. I am pleased to announce that the State Government funding for HACC (Home and Community Care) services has just increased by almost 8%, putting an additional \$19.3 Million directly into

the local communities where it can ease the burden of those who need it most.

The services that the funding covers allow recipients and, in particular, Aboriginal people and those from a culturally and linguistically diverse background, to maintain their

independence and connection with their communities. It services older people, people with a disability and their carers and people with dementia.

Locally, \$455,000 is going to Uniting Care to expand their social services, and \$286,000 to Southern Districts Support Association to assist with Domestic assistance, Personal Care and Social Services.

ROLEYSTONE LOCALS EXHIBIT AT GENESIS OVER MARCH



GARDENING NOTES

Who thinks a garden lacks colour in the summer! Once the canopy of a garden is established, the trees protect all those shorter plants underneath. We get fewer flowers in the shade but the brilliant colouring can make up

Walking around my garden I notice the plants that are blooming include: Solanam ratonetti, plumbago, geraniums and pelagoniums. The Crepe Myrtles, in shades of white, pink, mauve, purple and red make a wonderful show. So forgiving and beautiful.

About five years ago I had one growing nicely, but whilst it was dormant it got covered in sandy soil. I thought it was gone forever, but this year I noticed it is back, healthier than ever. Other show stoppers are the heavily scented frangipani or plumeria. The old fashioned ones create wonderful shade and many of the new varieties are miniatures, which can be grown in pots, useful if you live in a smaller enclosed space.

The cannas bring brilliant colours to our gardens. These can grow in wet or dry conditions and they thrive on neglect. They come in so many different colours (some are bred as miniatures) and can make dramatic showings with their foliage too.

Some of the daylilies are quite dramatic and many of these are edible. I have a tall variety which flowers almost all year with orange and red striping called Borderline Gold. I have had this variety over twenty years.

I try to alternate them with bearded Iris and then you get masses of flowers. A few years ago I interspersed Agapanthus, these were late flowering in fact they are flowering now. The flower spikes are standing about five feet tall.

The vincas are the real show stoppers for low down beauty at this time of the year and there are so many colours which can be clumped in one colour for a dramatic display.

These forgiving plants are drought tolerant and will last more than one season. Think too of how many roses are in bloom. If you clip over them now and give them a feed with a potassium rich fertiliser you will have a lovely flowering in six weeks.

During this hot weather I endeavour to hibernate, find a good book and a cool spot and read between ten and five. Before and after this, I do a bit of watering or weeding and give the dogs a chance to run free.

For now keep the water up to the plants. Most weeks I only get to use the reticulation once a week and hand water in between. Water well, this lets the water penetrate to the roots.

Enjoy your garden but wait until the rains before planting any new plants you buy.

West Australian 5th Dec 1929

Letter to The Editor: Cremation

In response to an interview I listened to the other day on the ABC, where a terminally ill gentleman was requesting the right to choose his own time of death, I was reflecting on how public attitudes can so quickly change. And how public opinion often doesn't reflect Public Policy. I was looking back recently while doing research for my latest book, into 'publicly acceptable policy at the time' and I noticed the huge debate that existed prior to the 'introduction of the right to be cremated' in this State.

Interested readers should look back on TROVE, The West Australian, around December 1929 and check out the letters to the editor. They make quite interesting reading.

The debate included diatribes on the evil of this 'heathen practice' to complaints about the 'public nuisance that would be created by the smell that would ensue'.

Today, cremation makes up the majority of funerals in this country.

I have included one letter from a resident of this district.

The Hanburys lived in Karragullen from around the turn of the century until the mid 1940's. The Hanbury Barn on Casotti Road was built circa 1890.

I do not know if he got his wish and was cremated on his orchard but I certainly hope he did.

CREMATION

To the Editor, 'The West Australian.' Tuesday 5th Dec 1929

Sir,

An important Bill is now before our State Parliament; but the general public is apparently unaware of its scope and purpose. So far as I can gather it seems likely to encroach on the liberty of the subject. If cremation is to be merely a prelude to ceremonial internment of calcified remains, one is at a loss to know what useful purpose it can serve or what public sentiment it can satisfy.

Acting under official advice I recently exchanged letters with the Registrar of Births, Marriages and Deaths, to whom also I imparted legal opinion obtained in 1916 from Mr (now Mr. Justice) Draper, vindicating the legality of rural cremation. The subjoined transcript of that correspondence might now interest the public in general and legislators in particular.

Yours, etc.

J. A. S. HANBURY. Karragullen, Nov. 4.

To the Registrar.

Being in my 79th year, long here resident, and expecting to end my days in this secluded locality, and desiring moreover to facilitate the office of my executors, I solicit advice as to the legality of the alternative methods prescribed in my will for the disposal of my mortal remains, viz: —

(1) (Preferably) by burial at sea, or

(2) By cremation in this locality where waste timber is abundantly available for the purpose, and without intervention of undertaker or of minister of religion: the cremation to be performed by willing kinsfolk and neighbours under conditions in no way publicly objectionable, and the calcified remains to be forthwith pulverised and mingled indiscriminately with adjacent soil.

In this matter I have been partly guided by professional legal opinion as expressed in transcript enclosed herewith for perusal. An account appears in 'The West Australian' of July 16 telling of similar permission granted to resident aliens, whence I surmise that my testamentary directions may be legally fulfilled.

The Registrar's Reply.


In reply ... I have to inform you that there is no law dealing with cremation in force in this State. The opinion submitted appears to be correct.

It might be an interesting extension when looking at the Euthanasia debate (or perhaps Gay Marriage or shark culls) - in fact any debate when Public Opinion doesn't align with Public Policy. Ed.



Local Government Reform

The Local Government Reform is one of those decisions which affects all of us and takes an inordinate amount of time to implement. It started back in 2011 with a review that was branded as "A once-in a lifetime opportunity to transform our local government scene..." This became a report that had 30 recommendations including the option to reduce the number of local governments.

Our submission to the Robson report did not support an amalgamation of the whole of the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale with the City of Armadale.

We suggested that the Government's objective for the City of Armadale and Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale (SJ) could be achieved and enhanced by a

boundary change rather than amalgamation.

This would mean that the part of SJ north of Mundijong Road becomes part of the City of Armadale and the area south of Mundijong Road, becomes part of the Shire of Murray.

This would retain the system we have currently: 14 councillors, the Mayor to be elected from and by the Council, 7 wards (to have new boundaries early 2015 prior to elections) and with equal representation of electors in each ward having one vote-one value apply.

The Minister has confirmed that, where possible, the Government's preference is for boundary adjustments rather than amalgamations as this allows for a smoother transition.

In choosing the continuing

Council, the Minister will take into account the local government least affected by boundary changes, the location of activity centres and how best to ensure the ongoing provision of good government and the community. Stability, continuity of leadership and the retention of expertise are the key elements to achieve that smoother transition on changeover day.

The Transition Plan has four stages with defined milestones.

- Stage 1: Review From now to July 2014
- Stage 2: Plan August 2014 to March 2015
- Stage 3: Mobilise April 2015 to June 2015
- Stage 4: Implement July 2015 onwards

We are pushing for the decision on the boundary change to be made before August 2014 to allow for the earliest possible implementation. As you can imagine the amount of work happening at the moment, especially by our senior officers who have to effectively lead and manage such change while still continuing with the dayto-day running of our City, is huge.



Astro Highlights March Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

March, the month of Mars: the Roman god of war. A quick search on the internet reveals that in early Roman times, March was the first month of the year and the time for the resumption of war. It's interesting, but not totally unexpected, to find that a powerful and successful nation should want to start the year on a high note by rejoining battle, presumably after the winter layoff.

On a more civilised note, we'll be able to see the Red Planet this month, and all 4 of the other eye-visible planets, at some time of night and at some period of the month. Jupiter continues as the dominant evening planet, the brightest starlike object to be seen at nightfall. You'll find it in the northern sky at dusk and it'll move westwards as the night draws on. Jupiter's setting times go from about 1:10am in the first days of March to 12:10am mid-month and 11:15pm at month's end. It goes down in the WNW.

Mars comes next, characterised by its reddish colour. Its brightness is steadily increasing as it heads for opposition next month. At its best, Mars can rival Jupiter in brightness. It won't quite get there this year. In early March it's rising in the east at about 9:20pm. By mid-month it's up by 8:15pm, and at month's end it's rising at the end of twilight, around 7:20pm. It culminates (reaches its greatest elevation) high up in the north at about 3:30am early in the month, 2:20am mid-month, and 1:10am by the end of the month. At daybreak you'll find Mars very high in the NW in early March, high in the WNW mid-month, and not so high in

the west at month's end.

Saturn follows along, an hour or so after Mars. It rises in the ESE at about 10:40pm in early March, 9:40pm mid-month, and 8:40pm at month's end. Dawn finds it high overhead. At the end of March it'll be featuring in the Observatory's public viewing sessions.

Brilliant Venus is rising in the ESE around 3am. It dominates the eastern sky as the "morning star" and will do so until August. On the 27th and 28th Venus and the waning crescent moon will offer fine viewing to early risers. If you have an unobstructed view low down to the east, you may also be able to spy Mercury above the horizon just to the south of east at first light. It's rising at about 4:20am in mid-March.

The Moon's major phases are new moon on the 1st, first quarter on the 8th, full moon on the night of the 16th (1:08am on the 17th), last quarter on the 24th, and new moon again on the 31st. On the 10th it's near Jupiter. From the 18th to the 19th it passes by Mars, and from the 20th to the 21st it passes by Saturn.

The autumn equinox occurs on March 21st this year: approximately 12 hours from sunsite to sunset, and 12 hours from sunset back to sunrise. I say "approximately" because the bending of the sun's rays by the atmosphere lengthens the day by several minutes. When the Sun seems to be sitting on the horizon, it's actually just below the horizon - we can see a little way "around the corner". That's atmospheric refraction for you.

Wild Gossip

What an unusual summer it has been so far with the mild weather obviously confusing our wildlife. I have taken in many baby birds (which normally only happens in spring) and various other 'out of season' wildlife.

A major concern that I have at present is people leaving boxes containing birds or

other wildlife at my gate or by my front door without ringing the bell or knocking to see if I am home. No car in the driveway does not mean that I am not home so please phone me on either my home phone or mobile.

If I can't be contacted then look carefully and think which way the sun is going to move, leave the bird or other wildlife so it will not be in the sun.

The bush to the left of the drive near the garage is a good spot and leave me a note telling me what you have left, where it is and where it came from. Sometimes as a result of the sun moving Syl Cooper 9397 6184 0417972930

throughout the day the poor bird or other wildlife ends up in full sun and dies. It is also a good idea to provide water in a shallow dish in case I am out for a while. Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.
