If your grasstrees look like this - they shouldn't!

Grasstrees have evolved with regular burning. They need fire to stimulate them to create spikes and produce seeds. Burning also encourages new growth.


If they are allowed to grow for too many years without the dead growth removed they will overbalance and die.

While manual removal makes them less of a fire risk it does not replace fire in their growth cycle.

It is winter and Roleystone residents are being encouraged to check their back yards to reduce fuel loads. If this grasstree catches alight in summer it will explode.

Check out your regulations for the safe burning of your grasstrees; burning them will keep them alive and could save your home and keep you alive in bushfire season.

Are You Switched On?

Low income households urged to take part in electricity trial.

The City of Armadale, City of Gosnells and Shire of Serpentine/Jarrahdale are urging low income

households to register for the ground-breaking Switched on Homes electricity trial commencing in 2015.

The program is the first in Western Australia to monitor energy use in low income households in real time. Results from the study will be used by the Councils to provide feedback to the Government on the electricity needs of Western Australian households at a time when electricity charges have spiked with yet another increase of 4.5 per cent per unit from 1 July 2014.

The trial requires participants to complete a telephone survey in 2014, receive one text message per week in 2015, and then complete another telephone survey in 2016. A qualified electrician will fit participating homes with a metering device that gives electricity feedback during the trial.

Eligible volunteers must live in the City of Armadale, City of Gosnells or Shire of Serpentine/Jarrahdale, have a mobile phone that can receive SMS messages, have a household income less than \$51,000 a year and have lived in their current house since January 2014.

The City of Armadale, City of Gosnells and Shire of Serpentine/Jarrahdale are urging residents to sign up for this trial before September. Eligible participants will receive \$150 of Woolworths vouchers for their efforts.

The trial is provided at no cost to participants through project partners and the Low Income Energy Efficiency Program.

Homes connected to three phase power or public housing homes are unable to take part in this trial.



When Henk Vogels started to advertise in the Roleystone Courier..... In the 1977 September edition of the Roleystone Courier (the second ever)....

- The front page was advertising the 75th anniversary of the Roleystone Primary School with the burying of a Time Capsule on the 17th August.
- The Karragullen Liquor Store (with the licensee, Lionel Portwine) advertised a special with Remy Brandy at \$6.99.
- In Roleystone, the Anile's liquor store was happy to offer free delivery! (That would have been your job Ross).
- There was to be a 10c increase in adult entry to the Kelmscott swimming pool to 30c per time or \$5 family season ticket for the summer season.
- The Daleline Drive-In was showing 'Benjo' and 'Professor Doolittle and the Magic Formula'.
- 'The Boyfriend' was appearing at the Roleystone Theatre and a picture of 'stars' Tim and Tracy Hetherington featured.
- Jim Hay was carting hay, Steven Ghilarducci was doing refrigeration repairs, Gordon Freegard was lawnmowing and Pippa Savill was making 'macrame to order'.
 - There was a proposal to build a



Caravan Park on the corner of Irymple Road and Brookton Highway. (Was this on your block Darren and Emma Weaver?)

- A 16 year old girl offering babysitting was charging \$1.50/hr until midnight and \$2/ hr thereafter.
- The Nicholls family from Palm Road had reported a fox which had been terrorising their chickens, had drowned in their pool.
- Our Councillor Ray Pound was concerned about the future subdivision of orchards in Karragullen.
- Residents from Westbourne and Northward Roads had submitted a petition to stop the bus route moving to their roads from Brookton Highway.

MONKEY PUZZLE PRODUCTION AT JWAC

John Wollaston Anglican Community School will soon be putting on their theatrical production of Monkey Puzzle by Simon Brook. The school will host three performances from 6 to 8 August.


The performance on 8th August will be Auslan interpreted (Australian Sign Language) in order to allow deaf patrons to access the performance, strengthen the school's ties with the wider community, and increase awareness in both the school and local community of deafness and Auslan.

The show will be interpreted using a technique known as 'shadow interpreting'. This method requires the interpreters to 'shadow' the actors on stage as they perform, allowing a deaf audience member's comprehension of the plot, characterisation and themes.

Shadow interpreting requires more interpreters for each performance, a substantial amount of rehearsal time, an alternatively blocked performance from the director and actors, and significant communication between interpreters and actors.

Monkey Puzzle is recommended for children over 13 years of age as it deals with some serious adult themes and is dialogue driven. The characters are monkeys, which are appealing and quite amusing, but they discuss issues such as existentialism, the nature of performance and the reality of death.

The school will host three performances from Wednesday 6th to Friday 8th August, commencing at 7.30pm at the David Williamson Theatre, Victoria Morgan Arts Centre, Centre Road, Camillo. FROM THE ARCHIVES Western Mail 25th August 1938 BEAUTIFUL ROLEYSTONE

SELDOM can it be said that the absence of a railway service is an asset to any town or district, but there are many West Australians who would not be overjoyed to see a railway station erected at Roleystone, a rambling, picturesque district through which roads meander around the hills and gullies of the majestic Roleystone Valley.

Lovers of the peace and charm of natural country find all they desire in the old-world charms and in the peaceful aspect of the little village of Roleystone, and they attribute much of the magnet of its attraction to the absence of some of the modern facilities upon which perhaps too much reliance is placed these days. But it must not be imagined that because of the absence of a rail service Roleystone exists in selfish isolation.

True, Kelmscott, five miles away, is the nearest railway station, but a frequent service of buses leaves the main Bunbury-road to



make the brief journey through the foothills to the village of Roleystone.

Views which cannot adequately be described with a pen greet the eye of the visitor to Roleystone from almost every angle. Visits to Stoney Gully, Churchman's Gully and to the Canning Dam our most ambitious water supply undertaking should not be missed, and for the athletic holiday-maker bracing dips may be had in the cool pools of the Canning River. Then, too, invigorating exercise may be obtained if one is energetic enough to tackle climbing.

Not far from Roleystone (perhaps a mile or two) we find Araluen, the hills home of the Young Australia League. The league's impressive and natural memorial to members who lost their lives in the Great War, "The Grove of the Unforgotten," is at Araluen, amidst the babbling streams and ferns of a valley whose beauty it would be hard to surpass.

Although Roleystone is a quiet and peaceful spot, the essential services of today are well maintained in the little town so full of charm.

ORCHARD RENEWAL

Winter means a lot of things in the Perth Hills and locals may have noticed a lot of orchardists removing trees. Large fires over the last two months are signs of their removal.

In many cases this is because orchardists have found certain varieties uneconomic. Some have opted not to replace at all as competition in this industry with imports is just too tough, others are just altering varieties.

The very low prices seen in apples and pears and the looming threat of dealing with fruit fly and other insect diseases without chemicals, have forced many growers to think of alternatives.

Quite a few apples & pears are coming out, as well as stone fruit varieties that have been replaced by newer, superior varieties or where the trees have passed peak levels of production and are now in decline.

It seems that a lot of growers have decided that the relatively pest free Avocados are the way to go. Large numbers of these trees have gone in the ground in the Perth Hills over the past 3 years and that trend is continuing this year.


VALE PAT PEARCE May 6th 1925 - July 1st 2014

Patricia Margaret Pearce was born on May 6th 1925 and died on the 1st of July aged 89 years. Along with her husband William Pearce (Bill) whom she married in 1948, they spent most of their lives in Roleystone.

They were founders and life members of the Roleystone Country Club.

In 1950, Bill's brother in law, Vic Every, told him that he had found land in Roleystone which was being sold for £100 per acre, they were nice blocks and so he told Bill to come and have a look. Vic had married Bill's sister Gwen in 1948, and they purchased their block on the corner of Raeburn and Holden Roads, while Bill and Pat purchased a block in Holden Road.

The Pearce family lived in the shed for about 3 and a-half years before building their home: a war service home with a timber frame, asbestos sheeting and wooden floors built upon stumps. As a young woman in Roleystone, Pat played tennis on a regular basis & would walk the couple of kilometres to the courts. The family was heavily involved in the Roleystone

There was however a two week appeal available which fortunately the City of Armadale Councillors voted not to take up, something that we who value this wetland very much appreciate. I am sure generations in the future will be thankful for this. Whether anyone else appealed is not known as it is the Minister for Environment that has the final say in this application. As the City of Armadale was the proponent of the application there is real confidence that the EPA's decision will be respected by the Minister.

Congratulations must go to the Friends of Forrestdale Lake and their supporters who for the past six years have spent thousands of hours highlighting the beauty and the amazing biodiversity of this magnificent wetland. They showed what the risks would be if this road was built. With over 380 flora species, Anstey Keane is the second most floristically rich Bush Forever site on the Swan Coastal Plain. I have nothing but admiration for the amazing commitment by this group. It takes real tenacity, courage and dedication to protect our natural environment, to face these challenges and last this distance.

If you have the chance in spring to visit Anstey Keane wetland, I encourage you to do so. Look up Friends of Forrestdale Lake website and go into their newsletters section-you will absolutely amazed by the beautiful photographs and information.

I will endeavour to get some pamphlets on this wetland and make them available from the Roleystone Family Centre. *Pat Hart*



Mission possible!

Last time I wrote in the Courier it was about my family dealing with my cancer.

Well, it seems that God has some unfinished business for me on earth for now, and I am extremely grateful for the prayers and encouragement of people around me. When I was struggling with cancer, the Philippines were struggling with something much worse, entire families were being wiped out in one of the strongest tropical cyclones ever recorded, Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda).

A young lady in our church, Irene, felt that God had asked her to take a team of people to help in the severely hit community of Tacloban. When Irene asked me if I could come on the trip and baptise her in the Philippines I thought it would require a medical miracle. It's important for you to know right now that Jesus said, "What is impossible with men is possible with God." (Luke 18:27)

After a series of tests my doctor gave the ok for my family to go with a team totalling 23.

The team commenced a series of fundraisers towards the outreach. When we finally arrived in Tacloban, the effects could still be seen of what happened last year. A number of large steel ships still lay up to 200 metres from the shore, where the water remains littered with jumpers, shirts, shoes and many household items.

The local children helped put life in perspective for us on occasions like these. They splashed around in these waters despite the devastation with a joy and hope still in their eyes. The team didn't know whether to take photos, to laugh, or to cry, it was a bundle of mixed emotions. We visited a mass grave site and again we

were overwhelmed, but we knew we were there for a reason. "...to visit orphans and widows in their affliction..." (James 1:27)

The team spirit was emotional but ever so powerful. We alternated between feeding programmes (distributing food and vitamins in poorer districts), and construction work (moving mud, rocks, and laying the concrete foundation for outreach purposes in the new lighthouse ministry centre in Tacloban).

This kept us focussed and united, including my children, who weren't afraid to get their hands dirty and adopt the local kids as brothers and sisters. Thank you Irene, Eva, Jamie for leading the team. This is an experience none of us will ever forget.

Why would we do this? "...that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God" (2 Corinthians 1:4).



Gardening Notes

This is a photo of a brand new camellia variety from Jean Evans. It is a now a registered variety but Jean has produced a white sport from the pink variety. Other locals have also had some luck growing different flowers arising from sports (Diane Johnson from Karragullen has one from a bush of Chows Han Ling).

I would love to know how many people around here have discovered the ease and simplicity of growing beautiful camellias. They do not have to be left to grow up to their maximum height, but if people choose to all they have to do is rake the leaves and petals under the bush, give them a handful of slow release fertiliser once a year in spring and just enjoy the bush for its beauty and the ability to cheer us up in the dullest of winter days. I would guess that there are at least 1,000 different varieties growing in Western Australia. The oldest arrived here in the 1830s. Many of these old bushes are still thriving.

Recently I went to the Spencer Garden at 2 Holden Road where Wendy is now selling off plants and gardening books. Most of the camellias were easy to identify but there were two that completely stumped me. These were probably the first to be grown on the property. To compound the identification problem in early days they were just sold as a red or a pink or white and the flower type. Then the trees also drop seedlings.

Some of these seedlings get names but most just become an unknown seedling. If you have seedlings under your plants you can dig them out, pot them up, cut off a little bit of the tap-root, so the plant doesn't circle in the pot but forms a matted root system which gives a good solid plant. Once the seed pod drops off or is used up then you can start to lightly fertilise the plant. These seedlings can then establish and flower. Once you know the quality of the plant, you can

Making simple pictures is fun, and might stimulate some young or old minds. Learning the Greek alphabet is useful in higher mathematics. My next picture will be about Pandora and hope (elpis). Minh Wants MDSS to Check You Diabetes Risk potting people with diabetes

Readers visiting our local Roleystone Chemist may have already met Minh, an intern pharmacist who will be in Roleystone for the next 4 months. Part of his course work requires him to complete a health project important to his local community.

Minh has elected to cover Type 2 Diabetes. The number of people with Type 2 Diabetes in Australia has doubled over the last thirty years. It is a leading cause of death and yet it is totally avoidable by changing your lifestyle.

Minh is asking volunteers to come into the Pharmcy and be part of his focus group. The process is simple: complete a simple questionnaire and after the results are tallied have a brief chat with Minh about your risk levels and what you can do about any elevated risk.

Eligible people should be over 35 years of age and can be in any state of health . 'It would be especially good if people who have a family history of Type 2 Diabetes are tested.

Also those who have other risk factors such as: a poor diet, high blood pressure, overweight (especially in the waist area), lacking in regular exercise or smoking. Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders



are particularly encouraged to come and be tested. This will be limited to the first thirty people who come in,' said Minh.

So if you want to help Minh with his research and have a very useful Diabetes check, come into the Roleystone Community Chemist any time between Wednesday 13th August and Wednesday 20th August. The whole process will only take 10 - 15 minutes; it can be conducted within the store and is not invasive.

August is Pet Dental Month

Roleystone Animal Hospital will be running a pet dental month promotion throughout August to raise awareness of pet dental problems, prevention and treatment.

An initiative of the Australian Veterinary Association (AVA), the aim of the campaign is to educate pet owners about the benefits of annual dental health checks and regular tooth brushing.

Roleystone Animal Hospital Manager Dr Yoko Clinch said that four out of five dogs and cats over the age of three years have some sort of dental disease. This may go unnoticed by their owners.

'Pets often won't show pain. Even pets with sore gums, infected mouths and broken teeth will continue to eat so owners may not see any problems,' she said.

So how can you tell if your dog or cat has a toothache?

'Your pet's breath may smell bad. Bad breath is a sign of infection. Gums may be red and inflamed and the teeth stained with tartar or they may start dropping food.

'Annual dental health checks are an ideal opportunity for owners to find out if their pet has problems which have gone unnoticed. Dental health checks also help ensure bacteria and poisons from dental infections do not spread to the heart, liver and kidneys through the blood stream.' 'We also recommend regular tooth brushing and many cats and dogs can be trained to enjoy having their teeth brushed.'

'About 80 per cent of adult animals have some degree of dental disease, which becomes worse with age.'

During August, Roleystone Animal Hospital will be providing free AVA resource packs to pet owners containing information brochures on animal dental health.

Alert: About Door to Door Tree Loppers

Some reports in from up in the hills area, particularly Roleystone and surrounds, regarding the presence of people (ranging in age from young teenagers to adults and male and female) attending at the front door of houses inquiring about whether you want trees lopped. They are handing out business cards with a mobile number on them but we have now had several reports from people who are concerned that the people are not above board and are using the tree lopping inquiry to explain their presence when they find people at home. No one has sighted any tree lopping equipment in the inquiries we have made to date.

We have not had a spike in reported crime in the area so it may be that they are legitimately looking for work – we have not been able to engage the people on the phone but we do have the number and inquiries are being made.

Please be aware that these people are getting around; if you intend to

get your trees lopped I expect there would be a need to make sure that insurance (liability and property) is in place and that the people doing the work are not some fly by night arrangement like the much publicised 'Bitumen Bandits" of the last couple of years. Hard to explain to your own insurance company how you paid someone to put that 40 metre White Gum as an unapproved second storey extension on your house

The business name being used on the card is not listed in the book but is very close to some that are. Our advice to all our Facebook followers is to be careful who you pay money to, particularly when they come knocking at the door unannounced.

Buyer beware and be wary.

Planting in Bungendore Wildflower Society

Armadale Settlers Common in Bedfordale is a 383 ha bushland reserve on the Darling Scarp. The area is highly important for flora conservation, with a total of 318 plant species found in the Common, along with two 'Declared Rare and Priority Flora Species'. A diverse array of fauna and flora can be observed year-round.

Much of the bushland is in good condition and its network of walk trails invites recreational activities such as walking and hiking, orienteering, nature appreciation, picnicking, exercising and nature photography. The Common offers expansive views of the City, large areas of intact vegetation and public use facilities.

The Armadale branch of the Wildflower Society of Western Australian is always looking for new members and volunteers. Members come from all sections of the community – from professionals to backyard gardeners to bushwalkers – all share one thing in common – a passion for the Western Australian bush and its beauty.

According to Richard, approximately 78 million people visit public gardens in the US, which is more visitors than Las Vegas or Disneyland and Disneyworld combined. And in a survey just released by VisitBritain, garden visits by overseas visitors is the third most popular activity ahead of visiting a museum, castle, historic house or art gallery, although perhaps not surprisingly Shopping and "Going to a Pub" are more popular than any other activity.

Garden tourism is one of the fastest growing tourism activities, although it is often not understood and poorly promoted.

Research indicates that a garden tourist is also a tourist interested in food, heritage and the culture of an area.

When Richard talked about gardens he was not only talking about gardens like Araluen, but the golf course, the orchards, the nurseries, the bush, parks and reserves.

Some interesting statistics in relation to garden visits are:

- Visits to the individual gardens are part of a regional visit
- An average visit to a garden lasts about 2.5 hours
- Interest in gardens starts at 24 years of age and never diminishes
- There is a strong cross over between garden and historic visitation
- There is strong repeat visitationGarden visitors spend between
- \$390 to \$400 per annum
- 43% of all tour operators have a garden visit included in their tours

We need to work collaboratively on how garden tourism can help our local economy in areas such as:

- What the visitor is looking for.
- How to build garden tourism in the community.
- What lessons can be learnt from overseas.
- How we can improve the sector in WA.

One of the upsetting points to Richard's visit to Western Australia was that when he visited Tourism WA to find out what he could about gardens in WA, there was no information available on garden tourism in WA.


There was some great information on wild flowers, but under gardens they didn't even mention Kings Park, let alone anything in the Perth hills area.

I have had a meeting with the City of Armadale officers tasked with promoting tourism and economic development for the City, who already strongly promote local gardens to visitors.





Our exilic travels recently took us to Romania to our friends managing a charity project in the SW of the country.

Driving back to the UK we passed near Bolzano in Italy, the scene of one of my more memorable experiences.

It was almost fifty years ago whilst touring Europe with a friend, Bob, in a Ford Popular car. Hardly the ideal touring vehicle but as students, we thought it would be a great adventure.

We drove from Amsterdam through to Austria, crawled over the Grossglockner Pass at the third attempt and Bolzano was our first experience of Italy.

Whilst excited at the prospect of exploring this new country generally, I was somewhat dreading the local sanitary arrangements.

Back then, the Italians had a reputation amongst the Brits for making do with little more than a hole in the ground...for squatters only, something I had never encountered in the flesh, so to speak.

We set up camp, consumed a beer or two and relaxed by the pool. Inevitably I had to "go". There was a row of identical cubicles by the pool and I chose one at random. My heart sank. There it was. The anticipated hole in the floor glared up at me.

Still, the requirements of the moment did not require bent knees so all was well so far. But I was dreading the morning visit. I left the cubicle feeling somewhat subdued. But then I became aware of critical eyes following me and I became very self-conscious to boot.

This turned to outright anger when I met Bob who was rolled up in hysterics.

"What's so funny?" I demanded. That's not exactly what I said but it's close enough for this refined publication which would not permit verbatim student vocabulary.

"Didn't you look up?" he finally gasped. "No ... why?"

"You've just used the shower!"

It's a bit of a truism but we do see what we expect to see - illusionists and magicians depend on it. And of course all I expected to see was a hole in the floor and there it was!

I still blush at the possible consequences if my visit had been for more serious business. But seeing only what we expect to see can confound us in other really serious circumstances. And of course I'm thinking in spiritual terms.

Our education and the way we live for the most part excludes any real impact of the spiritual realm on our everyday life. We don't *expect* it to impact on us and that perception can be self-fulfilling.

I find it rather odd because very few of us are comfortable with the thought that the material world is all that there is to life. Indeed life's pretty pointless if that's absolutely true.


It's my view - and the view of millions of rational folk like me - that we are made with purpose in mind by a loving creator God who does have an impact on our lives.

Astro Highlights August Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

With Jupiter out of sight behind the sun, we don't have any very bright, obvious planets in the evenings now. Nonetheless, there are two planets that you should be able to locate - Mars and Saturn - they're not mighty bright, but they're certainly not faint. Over the next three weeks or so, they'll be getting nearer to each other. In late August, they'll be within a few degrees of one another for a period of a week or so. It's actually Mars that's doing the moving: it's not far from us and its orbital motion is quite apparent. Saturn's much further away and its movement is slow.

Early in the month, look for Mars high up in the NW sky at nightfall. It's medium bright and has a slightly orange colour. To the east (right) of Mars and somewhat higher at dusk in early to mid August is Saturn. When they seem quite close to each other, later in the month, their distances from Earth will actually be about 200 million km for Mars and 1,520 million km for Saturn. It's deceptive: they'll be in the same line of sight, but really nowhere near each other.

An aid to the identification of Mars and Saturn (if you need a bit of help) is the waxing moon which will be near Mars on August 3rd and near Saturn on the 4th. Well, not really near, but in the same direction. The moon's only 380,000 km from us. On the 4th at dusk, Saturn will be occulted or hidden by the moon - a good event to observe with small 'scopes or even binoculars. Saturn will disappear behind the dark right-hand edge of the

first quarter moon at about 6:15pm, and it'll reappear at the bright left-hand edge about an hour later. This shows (among other things) that the moon moves its own width, half a degree, in approximately one hour.

Another lunar event in August is the socalled "super moon" on the night of the 10th-11th. The moon will be at its fullest at 2:09am on the 11th, and at perigee - its nearest point to the Earth. When perigee coincides with full moon, the apparent width of the moon is about 12% bigger than at apogee (the furthest point). It's nice, but not life-changing. This effect is not to be confused with the more exciting "lunar paradox", the way that the moon (especially when full) looks huge when it's close to the horizon. That's an optical illusion, which can be illustrated by taking a series of photos of the moon - low down at first, then higher and higher and higher. All the images are the same size!

The major moon phases for the month are first quarter on the 4th (occultation night), full moon on the night of the 10th, last quarter on the 17th, and new moon on the 25th; with the next first quarter phase being on September 2nd.

Venus is still visible at dawn, but not against a dark sky - it's rising about an hour ahead of the sun in early August, and by the end of the month it's only some 35 minutes ahead of the sun. We won't get good views of Venus again until December, when it'll do its "Christmas Star" impression.

Wild Gossip

The recent weather patterns have resulted in quite a variety of wildlife being brought to me. The one thing I need to stress is most of them arrived cold - you can wrap a cold animal / bird etc in 10 blankets and it won't work as all you are doing is wrapping in the cold so the creature can't get warm.

It is absolutly vital to use a heat source for warmth - it can be a warm hot water bottle, a normal bottle filled with warm water and secured so it doesn't roll, a warm wheat pack or very simply put it up your shirt and use body heat for warming - ladies have a slight advantage here as they can tuck the baby in their bra but being sure to tuck in your shirt as this works as well.

Our wildlife has a serious battle to survive but we can all help by ensuring that fresh water is always available in a shallow container to prevent drowning, cats need a collar with a bell to alert our wildlife, dogs need to be discourage from chasing and mauling wildlife and feeding can be done to help out our precious wildlife in hard times. 
