



FAREWELL DYLAN HARRIS

On Saturday 20 July 2014 our beautiful boy, Dylan Christopher Harris, passed away. At the young age of 25, his life was taken far too soon. He was on a trip of a lifetime, watching Australia play at the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil with two of his best mates, Harry and Michael. They continued to travel through South America once the soccer had finished. Nearing the end of their trip they decided to take part in a 4-day trek through Bolivia to mountains as high as 4800m above sea level.

On day two of the trek both Dylan and Michael had severe altitude sickness and the trek was cancelled as they made their way down the mountain to medical assistance. The severity of Dylan's altitude sickness lead to the development of High Altitude Pulmonary Oedema (fluid on the lungs) and unfortunately he stopped responding to medical treatment. He passed away at 6am on 20 July 2014 with two of his best friends by his side. The funeral was held on Friday 1 August 2014 at Springdale Oval. The attendance at Dylan's funeral was overwhelming and we are speechless as to how many people showed their love and support

We would like to say thank you to the whole community for your kind words and support during this devastating time. A big thank you to the Roleystone Football Club for allowing us to use the grounds and clubrooms for Dylan's funeral. Thank you to our friends and family, you have all been our rocks.

A special thank you to Harry and Michael, you brought our boy home and we will forever be grateful that he had you by his side. You and the rest of the boys will always be a part of our family. We had no idea that altitude sickness could be fatal. Please do your research and be aware of the dangers of the places you are travelling to. But travel, go to all the places and take in



all the experiences that this world has to offer. Make sure you always get travel insurance, you don't know what could happen while away. Above all else, tell your family and friends that you love them every day. With love and thanks,







Katy's Dad Needs Our Help

Many readers may have met or read about Katy Jiang's father Lin Zhong Jiang. While on his visit to Australia from China a year ago he was a frequent visitor to the Musicians Club and he played er-hu (a Chinese violin) a couple of times while he was here. Katy is a widely known and much loved member of our community. Please dig deeply to help her out in her time of need. Here is her emotional story:

'Just 3 weeks ago, my dad was diagnosed with bowel cancer. He had surgery immediately. After the surgery, the doctor found his cancer had already spread to his lymph nodes.

There is a 49% survival rates for 5 years or more if he can access chemotherapy. He is 70 this year and lives in China. I am his only child. People at his age in China have very low incomes from a small pension and his retirement savings. He lives off \$350 per month. The public medical system is in chaos and little support is provided for ongoing treatment. If you have cancer, and you can't afford treatment, you are pretty much waiting for death.

My dad is like many of those kind but poor Chinese. If they need to continue their treatment, they have to seek for money. The cost for chemo is \$2000 per time and he will need it 6 to 8 times.

My mother has been borrowing money from friends and relatives. If the cost continues, they will have to sell their home which means they will have no shelter. My family is trying our best to support him.

I love my dad and will not let go of him. I hope people or friends who know me or him will help.

I hope local Roleystone Courier readers will help us to raise the much needed funds to help him continue his life.



Rain in Rolev

Recent good rains in the Roleystone hills brought back memories of the roar that could be heard from the local water ways as the run-off water crashed over the rocky terrain. Each winter we could clearly hear from our home, the passage of the head waters to Stinton Creek, as it flowed through Araluen passed our original property.

In early February 1992, these creeks far exceeded their capacity when more than 120mm of rain fell in a 24 hour period with additional rain before & after that peak fall.

Being a summer rainfall event, the ground was initially hard & dry which made for spectacular run off, resulting in Stony Brook destroying the road at its crossing on Chevin & Urch Roads.

There was also widespread damage on a number of other creek crossings such as Slab Gully at Holden Road and a few close calls where Stony Brook crosses Peet Road. With no bridge, the resulting flood which flowed over the road was strong enough to wash away a number of vehicles.

Phillip Everett

Roleystone's Destructive Following Phillip Everett's timely reminder, I looked back in the archives.

This was reported in the Roleysone Courier twenty-two years ago A timely warning! The weekend of the 8th and 9th February in 1992 brought some of the heaviest rainfall ever recorded in the area. Peter Thompson, the editor of the Roleystone Courier at the time reported on pages 1 – 3 of the March 1992 edition that: 'the event was thought to be in the order of a 1 in one hundred year storm. In Roleystone itself 135 mm was recorded in Simons Drive, 159 mm in Hawkstone Road and 195 mm at Churchmans Brook. Some of the heaviest falls ever recorded in the area'. (This was according to weather man David Elliott who provided great weather stats for Roleystone Courier readers for a very long time....)

Damage to property both private and public (bridges) adjacent to Stony Brook, was extensive. In the later case the culverts beneath Chevin Road, Urch Road and Brookton Highway all failed to take the flow of water and caused extensive water damage on the downstream side where a waterfall resulted. The culverts on Urch Road were partially blocked by trees, branches and other vegetation causing a rapid rise in water. This resulted in water flowing over the road and sweeping a stalled car 300 metres downstream along with the bridge balustrade.

For others who walked along Stony Brook on the Sunday morning it seemed impossible for the usually dry summer creek to have caused so much devastation. Yet our eyes did not lie. Large concrete pipes had been tossed up on the banks and the force of the water had cut a new course for the Brook resulting in one householder whose private bridge gave access to their property, facing the enormous cost of replacing, with a much larger bridge, the one that had been

Areas that were flooded included Parkin Road, Holden Road, Taree Place, Robin Road and Heather Road where flood water flowed through houses to a depth of 5 cm or more.....

NB: the above article has been re-printed in part only.

The drainage in the area was shown to be woefully inadequate and extensive drainage works have been undertaken since then.

The stormwater that had collected had no outlet; often the drainage gates were blocked with gumnuts and residual vegetation and when heavy rain occured the drainage could not cope.

A negative result of this storm was that many residents whose homes had been damaged by the flood were not covered for flood/storm water damage. Perhaps this is a timely reminder that this could happen again.


September is here and as you all know that means finals footy!!!







New Propagation Project

Re-establishing local plants in degraded forest in Roleystone has always been a major aim of Roleybushcare. However, many of these species are not available from nurseries. So, Roleybushcare has decided to propagate many of these plants. The Bassendean Preservation Group is a conservation community group that already grows its own plants in a 'Gro-Centre' in Ascot. This group kindly invited Roleybushcare to use their Centre to propagate plants from cuttings. Roleybushcare jumped at this opportunity and eight members spent a morning potting up cuttings of five local species. The final count was 562 plants. Roleybushcare now intends to set up its own propagation centre. In July it received a grant of \$5000 from SGIO to purchase the equipment needed for propagation.

Gardening Notes

Looking back to the sixties I remember thinking August was a favourite time of the year. The cold weather was going and the evening although brisk were pleasant and one only needed a cardigan to keep you warm.

I do not know how many of you lived on farms and could get 'dags' from the sheepyard to mulch around the plants. The wool mixed with manure provided virtually all the food a plant needed and it was slow to breakdown, with the wool retaining moisture and warmth. Mostly now I use pine-fines to restore the acidity into the soil. It is time to lock the moisture into the garden and to apply a slow-release-9-month fertiliser to the ground, not close to the trunk but out to the shadow-line where the young feeder roots grow.

I must admit to being very remiss this year as a lot of my roses have not been pruned. Still by pruning now, as long as you are careful, you can see the way the rose intends to grow and also use your fingers to brush off any pieces that are growing in the wrong direction. When I cut my roses I try to do a mini-prune each time so that the rose gets a nice grow-on.

Another group of plants that are coming into foliage are the syringas or lilacs.

My daffodils from a few years back are flowering but not the ones from last year. I may have missed giving them potato E after they bloomed, I find it so much easier to remember when they are actually flowering, even if it is not really the best time.

The tall bearded iris are just getting a grow on with flower spikes starting to form. The Gardeners' Fair is coming up on Fathers' Day at the South Perth Civic Centre. This is a wonderful opportunity to get plants that are acclimatised to Western Australian conditions, advice from expert growers is readily available and there is no greater joy than to share your successes and failures with people that understand.

In Spring we have the Karragullen Expo and the Kelmscott Show to look forward to. If you are so minded get a catalogue and enter the classes of interest to yourself, otherwise go along and admire what others grow. Oh for the smell of Sweet Peas, Carnations, Roses, and some of the bulbous flowering plants, yes some orchids have a lovely scent.

I believe the open garden season is with us now, enjoy, but do not pick the flowers. Whatever you choose to do in your garden take time out to enjoy it and even get a good book, a cosy spot and a drop of whatever thirst-quencher you enjoy.



Political Support Required To Keep Primary School Site For Seniors' Housing

The Roleystone Primary School site in Robin Road has had very little interest shown by developers to create into seniors' housing. This is extremely disappointing given the very keen interest shown by numerous developers prior to the sites rezoning. We have been advised that this is due to the requested purchase price, demolishing costs, asbestos issues and various other constraints with developing the site.

Given the huge effort over many years by our community to have this site rezoned for seniors' housing and the many hurdles that had to be overcome we were disappointed that, without any advice to the Roleystone community, the Minister for Education has lodged an application to rezone the site to normal housing lots with the City of Armadale. NB: this application has yet to be processed by the City.

The Roleystone Seniors' Housing committee believe that this site is suited

for seniors' housing due to its level ground and its centrality to the heart of Roleystone. If it is rezoned for normal housing it will be a great loss for current and future seniors. It will mean those in our community who have contributed so much over many years will have to move to other areas to live out their lives without the support of the Roleystone community. The committee believe there are answers to the many constraints on the site and that the proposed rezoning should be placed on hold and investigations undertaken to work through the various issues.

We will be calling on our political representatives and the City of Armadale to support our ongoing attempts for seniors' housing on this site. If you can put your support for this to our political representatives it would be very much appreciated.





Botanical Jewel Found Armadale Wildflower Society

Anstey-Keane Dampland is located in Forrestdale and is a botanical jewel! It is the second most floristically diverse Bush Forever site on the Swan Coastal Plain and has more plant species than Kings Park. More importantly, its vegetation is in excellent to pristine condition. It is an area of high biological importance.

The 311Ha of bush harbours over 380 plant species including the swamp fox banksia (Banksia telmatiaea), one-sided bottlebrush (Calothamnus hirsutus), swamp cypress (Actinostrobus pyramidalis), sand bottlebrush (Beaufortia squarrosa), and Regelia ciliata.

Because of its size, this area also supports a rich representation of birds, mammals and



reptiles including the western grey kangaroo (Macropus fuliginosus) and quenda (Bandicoot). Several species of bird are attracted to the flowering heathland shrubs such as the white-cheeked and tawny crowned honeyeaters, along with insectivorous birds such as the splendid blue wren, whitewinged triller and black-faced wood swallow. Raptors include the little eagle, wedge-tailed eagle and nankeen kestrel.

Access to Anstey-Keane Dampland is via the stile at the corner of Anstey and Keane Roads. Sandy tracks fan out from here north and west. The best time to visit is early in the morning in September or October when many plants are flowering and birds are prolific.

This dampland is under threat from urban development. Members of the Armadale Wildflower Society together with other groups are winning a fight to protect this area from development. The fight is not over! For more information visit www.forrestdalefriends.com.au.



The City of Armadale Technical Services has supported this decision and applied for a national and state supported renewal grant for 2015 - 2016, the earliest possible available time for assisted grants.

Based on the deterioration of the culvert/bridge, Main Roads was forced to rate the bridge to a GMV load of 13 tonnes for the next 18 months or so. Information signs are installed at Brookton Highway, Gardiner Road intersection with McNess Drive as well

as load limit signs near the bridge from both approaches.

A "pop-up" Visitor Information booth will be operating in the Grand Marquee at Araluen Botanic Park during the "It's Yates Springtime at Araluen" tulip festival. The booth will be open seven days a week during the month of September between 11am to 3 pm as well as the two weekends prior and proceeding the month of September during similar hours. Anticipated visitor numbers to the Festival over the six week period are in excess of 60,000 people. This will provide the Armadale Visitor Centre with an excellent opportunity to provide information on the City and to promote the Armadale region to the wider Perth community. I was interested to see the results of the Armadale Volunteer Services review of the contribution to the City's groups and initiatives.

- Landscaping on Jarrah Road
- Cross Park works to be completed
- Electrical upgrades to sports pavilions at Cross Park awaiting Western Power approval
- Upgrade of Springdale Park site main switchboard The City supported an application for funding for the refurbishment of two courts at Cross Park including line marking, adjustable goals, drainage at the rear of the courts and upgrade of the cyclone fencing. This would provide a total of four courts being available for netball and basketball sports.

The Roleystone Netball Club currently has twenty teams and one hundred and seventy two registered junior and senior players. Roleystone Basketball Club, who also use the existing two courts, have sixteen teams and one hundred and twenty registered players. Roleystone Netball Club and Roleystone Basketball Club are currently the only community based clubs in the City of Armadale for their respective sports. Clubs are required to allocate up to four teams on one court for training, creating a level of overcrowding and both clubs have to limit training times to accommodate all teams. The refurbishment of the two additional courts would provide both clubs with the opportunity for further growth in membership and improved training facilities with potential for inter-club games.

I hope the application is successful as the clubs obviously need the extra room.

An emergency kit is essential for short term survival whether you choose to stay at home or need to relocate to safer accommodation. An emergency kit is a collection of items that are essential for your household's needs in the event of any emergency.

Having an emergency kit is an important step to prepare and protect your household for an emergency.

It is important that household members work together to complete a checklist to plan and prepare an emergency kit for the whole household.

Kits should be stored in a waterproof storage container, kept in an accessible place and clearly visible to everyone in the household.

Supplies should be regularly checked and stocked to ensure provisions are fresh and safe to use.

Copy or scan important documents onto a CD or memory stick to include in your kit (i.e. Passports, wills, marriage and birth certificates).

Consider how you can protect sentimental items, this may include making copies of valuable videos and photos and how to store them in a secure alternative location.

What's in your emergency kit?

Items to consider:

General items could be a portable battery operated AM/FM radio, waterproof torch, new spare batteries, mobile phone charger, a first aid kit with manual and woollen blankets.

Consider having enough drinking water and food for four days. Canned or dried food is a good alternative. Remember to include, cooking gear and eating utensils, a portable gas stove or barbecue and a water container (for washing and cooking water).

Last July we spent some time in France with our daughter Sarah and her young family. We were staying in a holiday cottage in the south west of the country.

Each morning I would walk into town with Sarah's two older daughters, bringing back fresh croissants for breakfast. The path took us passed a car wash facility.

This prompted a story Sarah told us one evening about a friend of theirs, Andy, back in Scotland who had cycled to his local supermarket. On the way there was a cloudburst and he presented himself as a dripping mess at the check-out. The operator took one look and asked if it was raining outside. Quick as a flash, Andy replied, "No, I've just been through a car wash."

The following morning, the two girls and I passed the car wash as usual and it was in use. In France, the driver can't stay in the car and he activates the machine from a console beside the machine.

The machine had done one pass with its huge roller mops revolving down each side and over the top. We stopped to watch. The rollers reached the back and started to return. Just then I saw the car also begin to move forward.

The driver had obviously not applied the handbrake properly and the car was now being squirted out of the front of the machine by the rollers. Disaster loomed as the unpiloted car would end up in a concrete wall. The owner of the car saw the problem at the same time, dashed to the front of the car and tried to push it back over the

stops. He was making little progress and the rollers were coming towards him. He obviously needed help. Leaving the girls, I leapt to his assistance. Both of us were nearly horizontal pushing the car back into the machine as the rollers progressed forward. And we did it! The car slowly bumped back over the stops just before the rollers reached us and the situation was saved. Of course what we both knew and anticipated was that preceding the rollers was a curtain of water and soap at 150 psi, spraying the car in front of the rollers. This deluge hit us just before the car reached safety. We were drenched! The Frenchman's thanks were profuse and heartfelt although I couldn't understand much of what he said. His last sentence stuck with me though.

When we got back to the cottage, Sarah took one look at us – two dry girls and their dripping grandfather – and asked the inevitable. "You haven't been through the car wash too, have you?" There was only one way to reply.

Those last words of my drenched co-pusher were, "You are my saviour!"

Now, as a pastor I regularly introduced folk to their Saviour but I've never before been identified as that sort of man myself. It was a bit overwhelming and made me stop and think. I knew I was going to get a severe soaking but stayed on to help anyway. Saving somebody always seems to involve some self-sacrifice, usually with foreknowledge too.

On the biggest canvas of all, Jesus knew full well the sacrifice needed from him for spiritual salvation for the whole world. His death was anything but an unfortunate accident. Indeed it was premeditated and determined well in advance...as was his resurrection. It was the only way it could be done. Using a silly incident in France as a parallel to illustrate a massive truth might seem a bit trite but, hey, Jesus told stories about widows giving tiny offerings, virgins who forgot to stock up on oil and folk who planted mustard seeds. These are pretty good precedents. In fact, they're the best. Why not look them up sometime? You might be surprised at what else you will find there too. Yours in Christ,



The Coffee with a Cop Team



Astro Highlights September Greg Lowe, Perth Observatory

The spring has sprung. Actually, it felt like spring had sprung weeks ago. Don't blame us astronomers. All we can do is to predict equinoxes, solstices, all that stuff. The relevant equinox this month is on the 23rd at 10am. That's when the Sun's in the plane of the Earth's equator, the days and nights have equal length, and the Sun passes exactly overhead at local noon if you happen to be on the equator. Bali would be near enough, at 8.6 degrees south.

When I was a kid people used to talk about the Sun being overhead at noon - people such as writers, poets, teachers, parents and so on. People you'd trust. It took me years to work out that the Sun can only ever pass directly overhead, and only at certain times of year, if you're somewhere between the Tropic of Cancer in the north and the Tropic of Capricorn in the south.

Here, Down Under, it can never get to be right overhead. Pretty close, but not right overhead: at the summer solstice it's about 8.5 degrees north of the zenith. Near enough, you say? In Tassie the offset to the north would be more obvious; and more so in the South Island of New Zealand.

The major phases of the Moon in September are first quarter on the 2nd, full moon on the 9th, last quarter on the 16th, and new moon on the 24th. After that, the next first quarter phase is on the night of October 1st. The full moon on September 9th should look good, rising in the twilight about 25 minutes after sunset.

Forget all that twaddle about "supermoons" last month - just enjoy the rising moon without the need for labels. There aren't any bright planets in the evening skies in September (or October, or November).

Mercury, Saturn and Mars can be found in the western sky at dusk. Mercury's low down, near to the western horizon at nightfall early in the month. It gradually gains a bit of altitude, setting at about 8pm from mid to late September. Saturn's in Libra, high in the west at dusk in early September, and gradually loses height as the weeks pass. It sets in the WSW, with setting times that go from about 11:10pm at the start of the month to 10:15pm mid-month and 9:20pm by month's end. The waxing crescent moon will be close to Saturn on the 28th.

Mars begins the month in Libra as well, just above and to the left of Saturn. Unlike Saturn, though, Mars seems to hold its altitude while the stars slowly slip by with the passing of the weeks. It's in Scorpius by the end of the month.

It sets in the WSW, with setting times that go from about 11:30pm in early September to about 11:10pm by the end of the month. Not a lot of variation, compared with Saturn.

Jupiter is the brightest starlike object in the dawn sky. At first it's not far ahead of the Sun, being positioned low down in the ENE at daybreak. By mid-month it's somewhat higher. By late September Jupiter's well in view, rising around 3:45am and dominating the NE sky at dawn.

Wild Gossip

The recent mild weather has obviously confused our wildlife and resulted in some non-seasonal admissions.

At my home I can hear young birds in nests in the trees and see the adult birds dashing around looking for food for them. I

have also seen young on the ground being taught by a parent bird how and where to find food.

It is important to protect these beautiful birds by ensuring that predators such as cats wear a bell to alert the birds of their presence.

I once had a lovely cat (Domino) who I taught by watching and scolding to leave our lovely wildlife alone. One day my neighbour knocked on the door and told me I should go outside and help Domino. My first thought was that there had been a road accident but when I got outside the cat was lying on his back in the driveway being attacked by magpies. Obviously he

had remembered not to hurt Mum's birds! But by the number of injured birds I take into care, not all cats are so well trained. Dogs also love to chase and attack birds but can easily be trained not to do this or if young birds are on the ground they can be restrained for a short time.

If you come across a young uninjured bird it should be gently picked up, placed in a nearby tree and observed from a distance to ensure that the adult birds are caring for it.

If you find an injured bird it will need to be gently picked up, placed in a box and taken to the nearest carer, shelter or vet. If the bird is young you may need to put a warmth source in the box such as a wheat pack or a warm water bottle (secured so it doesn't roll onto the bird).
