



The April Cover: Our Clubs Are In Good Hands

In 1950 Ken Knuckey and Ray Pound were keen to explore the idea of establishing a local cricket team in Roleystone. The Roleystone Karragullen Cricket Club was accepted into the South Suburban League for the beginning of the 1950/51 season in B Grade. This is the club that still exists today and with multiple teams this club goes from success to success.

Just this month, E Grade won their division and they are the current T20 champions.

But cricket has a far longer history in our area.


In the 1930s The Parkin Cricket Team competed successfully. This team consisted of Mr Arthur Parkin, 8 Parkin boys and two brother-in-laws. They played their home games on the oval at the property in Wygonda (where the current car park in front of the Roleystone Recreation Centre lies today) and rumour has it that Don Bradman and other members of the Australian team came to see them play on their way to England in 1938.

Now it seems that cricket in our area is even older than that. Recently I was gifted the Canning Mill Score Book from the 1907/1908 season. This came from James Roach, an octogenarian living in Dalwallinu and he had it from his father who worked at Canning Mills at the time. A valuable piece of sporting

memorabilia which will now be donated to the Kalamunda Historical Society for long term preservation.

So this month's cover celebrates the old and the new of cricket in our area. The couple on the cover are pictured in front of the original 1950s Clubhouse sign. Current President John Lewis is pictured with his lady Eliza Stockey (who is also a keen sportswoman). This club is in very safe hands.




Welcome Belinda

Gerry Allen Is Rescued Off Indonesia

Gerry Allen is a Roleystone scientist who recently found himself in a harrowing incident. He was among a group of 19 people rescued by the Indonesian Navy after their wooden ship sank in March. They were stranded at sea for over four hours after the ship started taking on water about 9.30pm.

Gerry was working for Conservation International doing research on Indonesian coral reefs near Bintan Riau.

Gerry recently recounted his ordeal: 'The boat was listing as soon as we left port but things started to look ominous after midnight. We sent a distress signal as soon as we noticed a serious amount of water entering the boat; the bilge pump had malfunctioned too. Once the decision to abandon ship was made, the crew launched the two lifeboats. One immediately sank and the other was riddled with holes but we managed to board this one. We had to bale water out continuously to keep it afloat'.

The crew volunteered to hit the water; I was amongst the lucky ones who spent the time in the lifeboat. It seemed that as soon as we left the ship it sank - taking all of our precious equipment down with it. It was the dead of night and very frightening. The worst bit was that even though we were only 20 nautical miles from shore, the rescue party took ages to find us.'

We were very lucky we had a zodiac with us, powered by a 25hp engine. Using this we were



able to keep rescuing the poor folk in the ocean so that when the naval ship arrived we were still a compact group.

The Indonesian Navy spotted the group around 2am and the rescue went without a hitch. The group were taken back to hotels and were tired but OK after the ordeal. Their major concern now is the loss of their equipment and hope that a salvage operation will be able to save some items.

"This one wasn't the worst I have been involved in. Once in Madagascar when I came up from my dive, the boat had disappeared,' he recalled. But that needs to be a story for another time..,

Musings On Other Inhabitants

Isn't the rain wonderful? Driving up the hill under a lowering sky, a few plump drops splashed on the windscreen, but we knew there was more to come. The drops turned into a desultory five minute patter which woke the earth, silenced the birds and washed the trees. I dozed off to the scent of my garden in

By morning the paths were running, the gutters clogged with flooded marri blossom and along the fence top little fly catchers and silvery eyes were attacking the insect bounty the rain had revealed.

Of course the ants were aware days ago. They've been busy colonising new haunts, striding steadily to and fro, industriously gathering and hoarding and shoring up. I heard recently that most ants are females, that the males are born without mouths and are only useful for reproductive services. What an Orwellian picture this

Inside my house the daddy longlegs have been equally industrious; their abdomens plumped to a bead shape with eggs which then hatch into a myriad of spiderlings who remain in close proximity on mum's web, before being eaten or making their way off into the wide world.

The motorbike frogs laid so much spawn in late February that the edges of the pond are black with taddies now. Sadly not all of them have made it to frogdom and because I reduced the bog mass to ensure a fresh water flow in another pond, I'm afraid I have upset their rhythm, but they will return.

In another part of the garden a swarm of bees has colonised a pipe. Conflicted by their fairly benign presence, I sought advice from several apiarists. The results were quite contradictory. Spray them with

Mortein and kill the lot. Keep a watching brief. Pay me huge bucks to remove or kill them.

We have opted for the possibility of rehousing them, they are quiet and healthy and make lovely honey.

It is difficult for many people not to resort to the spray and the ant rid to repel nature. So much of this modern world expects a pretty garden [and clean house], totally sanitised and purged of the very things which make it work: the eco-chains or webs of life. A eats B, B relies on C and so on. When we cut that chain the system begins to collapse. I despair when I see the pallets of weed killer and rows of garden poisons in the big hardware shops come spring. Do people read the labels? Do they know that some products which kill cockroaches for example, also take out vulnerable bees and wasps?

Cockroaches are food for huntsmen. Huntsmen are food for red and black wasps and vital for the latter's reproduction. If you freak at the sight of these large harmless hairy creatures and resort to the spray, not only do you give them a truly painful death, but you break the chain.

Parrots and cockatoos need 50-100 year old trees to nest in. Think about the vast cleared expanses of paddock and the reason why these birds attack the grain silos and orchards.

We have broken the chain.

So I nurture my daddy longlegs, wage battle to keep the marri trees untrimmed and watch the progress of the bees with

And I revel in the renewing energy and life rhythms of the rain.




Unsightly Mess Near Clothing Bins



Peppa Says GOODBYE

Sometimes life throws us a curve ball and you don't see it coming. If you are lucky enough you duck or you face it head on and you pick yourself up and play again. I'm playing again.

On the 5th March, exactly two months to the day, since I lost my best friend and love of my life Mick, we sadly had to put our beautiful Dalmatian to sleep. Peppa was in our lives for nine years and like everyone who has a pet, they play a big part in your life and was a member of our family.

A week before Mick died, Peppa had an aggressive tumour appear on her leg. It was benign and we had it removed. Last month it came back again and more surgery was needed.

I think that Peppa never got over losing Mick. Some days she would sit and look at me and I could see the sadness in her eyes. There were three reasons for this. One she was actually dying, two she missed Mick and three she was saying goodbye.

On Thursday she had to get her stitches out but I knew then there was something wrong. She had gained a lot of weight in 3 days and she was quieter than normal.

After going to the Roleystone Vet and then travelling to the emergency animal hospital, she had an ultrasound. Her spleen had an aggressive tumour which was bleeding and her stomach had filled with blood. She was slowly dying in front of our very eyes and we had to make a decision to let her go or keep fighting. This wasn't even an option. I couldn't put her through the pain and suffering when she had

To see the pain in my daughter's face when I explained to her that we needed to let her pet go was heart breaking. We were both there through the whole process and we got to say goodbye.

I couldn't believe that this was happening but at the same time I wasn't surprised. Peppa was sick for quite a while and I think she knew Mick needed her more than we did and she knew that we were going to be OK without her.

I am a very proud person and I get up every morning wanting to scream at the world for being so unfair and wondering why us? There is a reason for everything in our lives and we all have a path to tread. I'm in 4WD at the moment but I'm carrying the most precious cargo in the world my daughter.

At least I have some precious memories. My pet was always happy to see me no matter how late it was and was always happy to have a hug or wake me up in the morning. Peppa was never grouchy. Those memories are what I hang on to and get me through each day.

I want to thank the Roleystone Veterinary Surgery and Waves for all their help and support.

And I want to say thanks to my amazing group of friends who are watching out for me. I'm just waiting for the next curve ball and when it comes I'm going to slam it out of the park and hit a home run.



Helpful advice for backyard fruit growers on fruit fly control has been provided by the Department of Agriculture and Food in a short video.

Mediterranean fruit fly (Ceratitis capitata) is a serious horticultural pest which attacks a range of cultivated fruits and some fruiting vegetables in Western Australia.

Department Senior Research Officer Darryl Hardie said fruit fly had been established in Western Australia for more than 100 years and it was vital growers continued their efforts in controlling the pest.

"Publication of the video is timely because the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) has banned the use of the insecticide fenthion by commercial orchardists, effective October 2015," Dr Hardie said.

"Once the ban is implemented, it will be vital for backyard gardeners, commercial growers and community groups to work together to control fruit fly populations in their areas."



Dr Hardie said there was now no silver-bullet approach to Medfly control.

"Strategies suggested for backyard fruit growers in the video include baiting early and often, trapping fruit fly, preventing fruit fly access to fruit, and disposing of fly-infested and unwanted fruit."

Department Irrigated Agriculture Executive Director John Ruprecht said the video reflected the department's commitment to work with the broader community to prioritise biosecurity issues that threaten the State's agricultural industries.

"By providing Medfly control advice to backyard fruit growers, the video is helping ensure the productivity of the local fruit industry is not unduly constrained by the pest fruit fly," he said.

RKCC Steal Memorable Flag

Before we get to the good part, let's recap on the final round of the season across the grades.

A Grade needed a victory in the final round to pip eventual champions Ellenbrook to 4th spot but it wasn't to be. A repeat of last year's final was expected to be a close affair and it was but things got off to a shaky start with the RKCC being bowled out for just 53. While the response from our formidable bowling attack showed signs of a comeback, Lesmurdie-Mazenod took first innings points after being bowled out in a slow paced innings of just 73 off 43 overs. Unfortunately we fell short and were bowled out for 148. With time to play and a fired up Greg James bowling Lesmurdie-Mazenod out for 106 with his fantastic figures of 8/31, the RKCC were set a target of 175 but with only 4 overs left to play, the result was foregone. The boys had a quick hit out and finished with 3/36 off the 4 overs but just like A Grade, the B Grade side end their season with a first innings loss. 5th spot also for B Grade, just 3 points shy of 4th. Matters got worse for RKCC as the club was facing

Matters got worse for RKCC as the club was facing down the barrel of a Lesmurdie-Mazenod clean sweep across the grades with C Grade also being pitched against the boys in yellow. The Maylands response was a resounding one as they made the score having only lost 4 wickets. In the case of one-day games of course the winning side continues to bat the allotted overs and despite this we did not manage to take any more wickets with Maylands finishing the day 4/194. After some good wins in the season, the lads will find themselves unfortunate to have finished 7th on the ladder.

Now to the good part! Perennial battlers E Grade finished the regular season in 2nd spot thanks to a victory over, you guessed it, Lesmurdie-Mazenod in the final match of the season. It was a close match with Roley being bowled out for 181 on the 2nd last ball but found themselves lucky to get there if not for a Jon Stapleton 76 and a captains knock from



Steve Reeves of 41. The wickets were shared in the defence but 3 wickets for both Dan Faranda and Vince Baeli pegged the visitors down to fall short of the target by just 16 runs. A 1 v 2 semi-final was to follow in the next week against first placed Glen Forrest who had only lost one game in the season thus far and were looking the goods. They proved this form in the semifinal by bowling RKCC out for just 99 and losing only 5 wickets in the chase. Having finishing 2nd however we had a second chance against the winner of 3 v 4 which in this case was Maylands. On a rainy Saturday at Cross Park in a reduced overs match, Maylands finished their innings 7/117 (29 overs) thanks to Paul Manning, the man with a million medals, who bowled 7 overs 4/24. The match was called off just 6 overs in to the chase but with RKCC finishing higher on the table it meant a default victory to the old boys and yet another Grand Final berth. Again up against a dominant Glen Forrest side, it was the home side who won the toss and batted first. Politics is often not what is said, but how it is said, and the intent behind it. It is the job of oppositions to ensure, where possible, that legislation that the government of the day is trying to move through the Parliament is in the best interests of the community, from whatever political perspective they have. Sadly, often, the chance to throw mud at the government seems to take first place in the minds of those opposite.

There was a debate in the Upper House recently that focussed on the work that has been done to improve our rivers and waterways, and I was disgusted in the direction

Labor members for the East Metropolitan Region individually spoke against a motion to support ongoing action to improve the Canning and Swan Rivers in Parliament. They were dismissive of action to date; of the hard work that community groups, Government and local individuals have put into improving the quality of our rivers and waterways.

Then the Hon Sally Talbot MLC went one step further by personally insulting everyone who works with the important oxygenation plants that have been set up as part of the waterways improvement strategy, saying, "every time a minister, a parliamentary secretary or a member of the government goes out to look at the oxygenation plants, the staff get a memo stating, 'Turn the bubbles on because the pollies like the bubbles?!" (from Hansard)

Really, such a slur needs an apology. I would like to think that the Honourable Member can step past her automatic dismissal of anything the government says to offer one, but time will tell.

Recently, the Government have added an additional Oxygenation plant to the Canning River, have allocated \$2 million for foreshore protection and rehabilitation,

and funded 25 groups to the tune of almost a third of a million dollars for 58 landcare projects.

In addition, the introduction of the hugely popular and important River Rangers Primary Cadet program is ensuring that the next generation has a critical understanding on the importance of our rivers.

There is still more work to be done, everyone agrees with that, but with recent a Murdoch university study (The 2014 Fish Community Index) showing that the rivers' health has improved since the mid 2000's, the ongoing hard work is having a real effect, and will continue to do so.

Gardening Notes with Jean

What a difference a bit of rain makes! Everything in the garden seems to grow and flourish, things we thought might have died all appear again. Even the will to be outside returns. Gardeners are an optimistic hardy breed and they just hibernate when the weather demands, only to bounce back with renewed vigour.

As we look around the garden trying to get just one more flush of the roses we discover the first of the sasanqua camellias coming into flower and the buds forming on the japonica bushes. Some quite large but not yet ready to burst into colour.





COUNCILLORS' COMMENT APRIL

The City of Armadale is growing quickly. It is one of the top three fastest growing local government areas in Western Australia, and one of the top growth areas in the nation. Twice the average of Western Australia and almost four times the national average.

WA Tomorrow (population forecasts done by Planning WA) is predicting a population of 79,600 by July 2019 for Armadale although population forecasts calculated on behalf of the City using Census data result in a forecast population of 82,615 by 2016 and 94,271 by 2019. This figure is considered a more accurate forecast and is backed up by actual population growth and future population modelling.

To put this into perspective, an average of 10 people a day move into the City of Armadale, with 30 new homes being built every week, or the equivalent of one new residential street every week.

The South East Corridor has the highest number of new dwellings for the 2013/14 period (6,519) followed by the North West Corridor (6,302), mainly attributable to the City of Wanneroo.

Local jobs are an important indicator of work opportunities in a given area and provide employment as the local population grows. Once again, the South East corridor provided the largest

proportion of jobs, with 246,109 (36.3% of total).

This new growth is also affecting Roleystone with applications lodged for the subdivision of some orchards. This has already changed the face of Roleystone. It only seems a few years ago that we passed orchards on either side of the Brookton Highway approaching Holden Rd.

With the pressures on orchardists from imports, rising costs, med fly and the encroachment of housing affecting traditional work practices such as early starts, bird scarers and spraying, it all becomes just too hard. It will be a sad change to the look and feel of our area but one that I understand.

We choose to live in these areas because of the community, the ambience of waking in the mornings to the mist and the peacefulness amongst the valleys and the trees. Unfortunately these days I get many calls from people concerned about bushfires, or wanting to cut down more trees so they can build bigger and bigger houses, and also not wanting the ongoing maintenance of having to continually rake leaves. It does make you wonder why some people actually want to live in the hills.



ANZAC DAY David Bardsley

It's a bit of a puzzle to me how and why ANZAC Day has morphed into something rather more substantial and serious than it used to be. When we first arrived on these blessed shores, the public holiday on the 25th April 1982 was little more than a day off work with a social footie match in the afternoon and a beery BBQ well into the night. The war memorial reflections were limited to a few ex-Vietnam vets meeting in the morning. Granted we were in Pannawonica at the time – a town with no senior citizens at all - and perhaps events there weren't typical. But it seems that the profile of the day has gradually changed since then. This year is obviously special being the centenary of the Gallipoli landing and the national interest has attained epic proportions.

Whilst reflecting on all this it dawned on me that I actually knew very little about the "Great War" even though I had several relatives from my grandfather's generation who had served in France and Flanders. I knew it was triggered by the assassinations in Sarajevo and that the conflict rapidly escalated to involve just about every nation in the world in the most horrendous and bloody battle imaginable. But how did that happen? Why did Britain get involved in what started as a Balkan issue? How come thousands of men from colonial territories volunteered to fight in what was essentially a European matter? Consequently, I have spent two months reading up on it, two books in particular proving very informative - "The Sleepwalkers" by Christopher Clark, a recent publication tracing the origins of the War in some detail and "A Short History of the Great War" by A.F.Pollard written in 1920 and anything but short! It's all much clearer now.

Many, many points made me stop and think but, of all those, two in particular stand out. Firstly, underlying the Empire building, which resulted in the fear of being left out in the global jostle for territory, was greed. It was the race for more resources and trade which led to an international state of fragile equilibrium, about as stable as a set of plates spinning on canes. Not much was required to upset the balance and inevitably the whole shebang collapsed into a nightmare of destruction and bloodshed. But that national greed was the outworking of individual and personal greed. The distressing bit is that I don't see much change in that. For sure we have introduced mechanisms to limit the consequences of national belligerence but the underlying human failing remains. When will we ever learn that our society, both personal and global, works best when the tenth commandment is upheld? "Don't hanker after that which isn't yours!" wasn't a spoilsport directive from God. It was a guiding rule which minimised conflict. Secondly, Britain had no great quarrel with the German/Austrian alliance until Germany trampled neutral Belgium underfoot in the attempt to defeat France in quick time. The violation of a moral understanding led Britain and consequently the British Empire including Australia and New Zealand to defend those oppressed and destroyed through decisions made by greedy, aggressive and immoral national leaders. Furthermore, every man and woman involved in that initial stage of the war – and for many that was a brief and terminal involvement was a volunteer. Nobody was conscripted until later on. Indeed, Australia and South Africa stand proud as the only nations never to introduce conscription in that war. All those who embarked on the transport ships did so without coercion. They responded courageously to reverse a moral outrage. To say that they didn't know what they were in for belittles the bravery of these people and many like them whom we honour on ANZAC Day. My concern is whether or not we still have the moral fortitude to resist immoral activity as did our forebears. I remain to be convinced and the way we treat underdogs underlines my concern. The Christian mandate to "feed the hungry, clothe the naked and speak for those who have no voice" has been provisioned with the rider "as long as it doesn't cost me anything." I am really delighted that ANZAC Day has become a more responsible commemoration. And I hope and pray that this movement will result in a deeper reflection on how we run our lives and our country. After all, if the edict to "love your neighbour as yourself" had been taken more seriously throughout history, no country would have to commemorate "the fallen".



Wild Gossip

I have several kookaburras and a lot of magpies that come in every morning and wait on the garden wall, looking at me appealingly whilst I prepare food for my

birds, chooks etc. Recently the wall was full of millipedes yet the birds totally ignored them; obviously they taste as bad as they smell!

I have been kept quite busy with admissions of assorted wildlife and many phone enquiries and questions. Recently I was in Cottesloe at Sculptures by the Sea when my mobile phone rang. The caller told me that a possum had fallen down her chimney and was stuck behind her fire. I made a few suggestions as to what could be done such as lowering a rope down the chimney to give the possum a way to get out (although this wouldn't happen until dusk) or pulling the fire out to allow the possum to get out that way.

The whole call was very difficult as my mobile signal was really poor and kept cutting out bits of conversation. The caller didn't seem keen on my suggestions and then the line went dead. At first I thought the caller had hung up on me

then I realised that I had lost the signal and my mobile phone no longer worked. This continued down the remainder of the beach, obviously I was in a dead spot. A few days later I received a call from the Department of Parks and Wildlife as the lady had complained that I had hung up on her. Obviously I explained what had happened.

As a volunteer carer I spend a lot of time caring for wildlife and cover all the expenses of food, bedding, medication and vet bills. Sometimes I wonder why I continue to do it and then the next phone call comes in for advice, or some wildlife arrives at my door, and I know why I continue. Our wildlife is unique and very precious and sometimes needs help and care so that there will still be wonderful wildlife for future generations to enjoy. The Armadale Wildflower Society Anstey Keane Reserve has been SAVED!





In November 2014 the Minister upheld the EPA's recommendation to reject the City of Armadale's proposal to extend Keane Road through Bush Forever Site 342 part of Jandakot Regional Park. This is a big win for conservation in general and of a very bio-diverse site in particular. The Friends of Forrestdale are grateful to all our friends and supporters for their support during the six-year campaign to stop the construction of the road.

However the fight is not over - we now have to stop the Water Corporation from constructing a sewer pipeline in the same road reserve. Another common problem in all reserves, including Anstey Keane, is the illegal dumping of rubbish, horse riding, and driving off-road vehicles through the reserve. If anyone spots any of this type of activity please report it to the Ranger or Police.

Over 300 species of flora has been recorded in the reserve, flowers appear all year round. A recent walk through the reserve spotted a spectacular display of Beaufortia squarrosa (Sand Bottlebrush) in flower and many other winter flowering plants coming into bud.

Not only were numerous wildflowers spotted, tracks from a family of kangaroos and bandicoots diggings were also seen on the ground. In the air birds of prey were circling above looking for their next meal, not forgetting the numerous smaller birds and insects.

Work is required now to improve and protect the reserve including sourcing funds to fully fence the reserve. Future plans are to construct all season paths, signage, picnic and barbeque areas.
