

He did return to a lay position for a while, working at Banksia Hill Detention Centre but once again found the confrontational aspect of this role was just not what he wanted to spend his life doing.

He is now overjoyed to be the full time pastor at the Roleystone Community Church. Gareth is glowing in his praise of this church where he believes mirrors the Roleystone community in its awareness of the importance of unity and acceptance.

'This is a church with a rich history and a wonderful presence. The congregation is delightfully mixed with a blend of young and old, families and singles and yet new members are enthusiastically welcomed. The vibrancy in the community Church youth groups is amazing. The acceptance of everyone across the church community is a hallmark of this church,' surmised Gareth.



#### Controlled Burns

During early and middle May we enjoyed beautiful late summer days with little wind and FESA, DEC and many private landholders chose these perfect days to burn off. A unique set of weather conditions resulted in a thick layer of smoke covering many areas of Perth but the hills dwellers were particularly affected. Most people understood the wisdom of reducing the fuel load when the weather was safe and many of us felt blessed that the thick smoke was occurring in May and not January, however there were also many complaints. Social media sites buzzed. The most clear explanation I found came from George Koutlis and it is reprinted below.

Controlled Burns or Prescribed Burns or Hazard Reduction Burns are vital to protect our way of life. For thousands of

years, the traditional owners of the South West, the Noongar people, utilised the process of burning scrub / bush in a fight for survival. Whilst the methods and processes are not the same as controlled burns, the principles are similar.

This allowed them to prepare their land for new vegetation and to meet their needs.

In the 21st century, a lot of us would have seen the sheer devastation from destructive bushfires. People killed, homes and property lost, animals / insects / creatures etc. displaced, injured or killed.

With the issue of Global Warming never far away from our attention, our planet is suffering. This spurs and trebles the potential for devastating bushfires in these dry conditions.

Mitigation strategies to reduce the potential of these bushfires are a number of agencies that have adapted the process that the Noongar people used, some thousands of years ago.

Thick smoke, reduced visibility, ash falling on our property and vehicles during Controlled Burns are a short term consequence in order for us to achieve the long term goal of less intense bushfires and the protection of lives, homes and animal displacement. The weather conditions cannot be controlled in the fast changing climate.

After this year's devastating bushfire season it is critical that we take the appropriate steps to minimise loss of life, destruction of homes and property, loss and displacement of animals in our growing population of WA in the years to come.

Humour: discussions about the ability to see the lighter, funnier side of life, including their own foibles,

#### **Editorial**

#### **JUNE 2015**

Some really cold wintery weather has finally arrived and so my editorial this month is dedicated to events which happened many years ago. This month and this year marks 25 years since Araluen was SAVED.

Araluen had its heyday in the 1920s and 1930s but over the years the popularity of the park gradually declined. By the 1980s the park was in disrepair – the once pristine pool was declared unfit for swimming and was infested with water weeds, and the outer gardens had become overgrown. Araluen was sold in 1985. At this time a small group, led by Mary Hargreaves of Armadale, lobbied for Araluen to be purchased by the Government and turned into a Botanic Garden. She was not successful in her appeals.

After the (then) Shire of Armadale refused the new owners a plan to turn it into a theme park, they decided to sell it. The rumour was that it was going to be sold to a Japanese consortium.

Noelene Drage saw the advertisement on the 14th February 1990. This stirred her into action and she started to write letters to every politician she knew including the Premier Carmen Lawrence in an attempt to get the Government to buy the land. Many wrote back but with non committal responses.



A small group of interested folk gathered at the Chalet Healey to discuss what they could do. Noelene then went to the agent and asked: 'What do we need to do to stop the sale?'

'Put a deposit down' she was told. 'This will give you 45 days grace to seek an alternative purchaser' So Noelene put \$8000 down; this represented a significant amount of her savings! She was also advised to get a lawyer and some publicity. She did

both. On the 8th of May 1990 a photographer met her at Araluen and on the 12th May she appeared on page 3 of the West Australian seated by the pool with her feet in the water, under the headline 'Paying for a piece of quiet', with a passionate plea: 'to those who want to save Araluen Park.'

A Public Meeting was held on the 14th of May and they had over 170 people – many from our local area. All pledged their support and most offered funds. They elected to form 'The Foundation' which was to steer the development of Araluen Botanic Park over the next twenty five years.

The group also started to attract some political support with Kay Hallahan coming on board and a range of other politicians expressing support. The option for purchase was now for \$1.3 million but there were rumours a cash buyer was waiting in the wings. The public donated \$10,000 which was sufficient for a second option ie they were granted another 45 days to find a solution.

On the 1st of September 1990, Kay Hallahan announced that the Government had purchased the Park 'for the People of Western Australia'. Araluen is planning to celebrate this significant date 'The Saving of Araluen' at the beginning of September this year. This year's tulips will be a testiment to the wonderful work done by Noelene Drage, Mary Hargreaves and the many folk who got behind this wonderful initiative and have done so ever since. Noelene, Mary and a small group of interested individuals determined that the park was worth saving. They had the initiative and drive that convinced the public and the WA Government to purchase Araluen and to develop it into a world class botanic park. In September 1994 Noelene Drage was awarded the first life membership of the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation. Recently Noelene commented: 'People ask me how I feel when I see the park today – I can say I feel very relieved. It has grown into everything I wished it would be.'

We sincerely thank these folk for their efforts and dedication and consider how lucky we are to have Araluen on our doorstep. I hope you enjoy reading this June Courier.

#### **Rejecting Liquor Licence Application**

As an adjoining neighbour to HopsScotch Restaurant in Karragullen, and having enjoyed this quiet, rural lifestyle for 29 years, I am now responding to the HopsScotch Manager's letter in the May edition of The Roleystone Courier.

The owners have now re-applied for a (Tavern) liquor license, supposedly to sell locally produced wines and beers. What they have failed to mention is that they probably plan to eventually set up a Micro Brewery on site to produce these products. This was their original plan in their first application to Council.

There was major opposition at that time from all adjoining neighbours who objected to having a "brewery" next door to where they live. However, with "professional" help from a consulting company this application was passed by Council without any of our concerns being considered.

The Restaurant was passed with certain conditions. I tried to find out what these entailed but due to the Privacy Act I was denied access to them.

The Council told us the Brewery wasn't

going ahead and was put on hold. This we were pleased to hear.

Now, a few months later, apparently with the support of Council, the owners are reapplying for a "Tavern" license. The owners also say they have 450 respondents, with 99, including the "immediate neighbours", who support their application.

This is a complete fabrication as none of the immediate neighbours have been approached and were unaware of the new application until they read it in the May edition of The Roleystone Courier.

We didn't want the Restaurant, but now that it has gone ahead we have to live with it. We have nothing against a license that allows patrons a wine or beer with their meal, but not for a Brewery with its associated odours and noise in our backyard.

I suspect the 450 respondents in favour of this proposal may be "patrons" and "friends" of the owners and live some distance away, NOT NEXT DOOR!

The gentleman in question is also seen around riding his bicycle as part of his keep fit routine.

Another is a fine artist & who is a participant in the Nordic Skiing exercise program. I use mind and exercise programs to maintain my own cognitive function.



Four cars, driven by Sarawakians, arrived at S&C Fiolo Orchards in Karragullen, Perth, Western

Joyously the 'tour leader' who hails from Bintulu, alighted from her car to be greeted by a warm handshake and 'almost a hug' from Mr Fiolo Senior. Obviously, they know each other very well.

"Good morning, my friend, Mr Fiolo. I'm bringing another group of Sarawakians to visit your farm," she enthused.

With a broad smile, he said in a baritone: "You know Yian, Sarawakians are always welcome here."

Yian has since been bringing many groups of visitors to this farm - at times, once a week.

This was comforting news for the group, some of whom had just landed in Perth. They formed a very lively group of visitors to the orchard this very special morning. 'This is the kind of outing a close group of us Sarawakians get to do to enjoy the beautiful countryside,' said the lively and exuberant Yian, The women immediately asked Mr Fiolo to get 10 boxes of persimmons and 10 boxes of apples ready. These would be paid for and then shared among the women.

"It's so tempting to bring a whole box of persimmons and beautiful apples back to Kuching," one of

Amidst the chatter and the whoops of delight they examined the fresh fruits waiting to be sorted out and those already packed and ready to be shipped out to the wholesaler.

The smell of the fresh apples and persimmons was everywhere in the packing shed.

The air outside was crispy and wintry while the sunshine was just right for some good photography. Perfect for fruit trees.

The S & C Fiolo Company was founded by Salvatore (Sam) Fiolo in the 1960's, when the family discovered the area has perfect soil for growing fruit trees.

Sam Fiolo has been joined by his son Sebastian, daughter Sarina and son-in-law Rob Russo who are all still working on the farm. It's very much a family business.


"We do hire extra workers for harvesting," the elder Fiolo said with a twinkle in his eye. He was obviously very fond of the visitors from Sarawak.

The visitors were shown around the packing area where the persimmons were washed, sorted out and boxed, according to their size. The large persimmons were really large. The visitors were given apples and persimmons to try. One of the women could not believe Australian persimmons could be so sweet and seedless.


There are many kinds of persimmons - some sourish while some are really sweet. But the fruits from the Fiolo farm are really succulent and there is good quality control in fruit tree selection. After a short while, the group visited the area where the persimmon trees are grown and then the group left with the promise to be back soon.

"You're most welcome to return anytime. We have lots of Pink Ladies and Granny Smiths for you. And, of course, lots of sweet persimmons."





It is common knowledge that fruit fly is prevalent during spring and through summer but where can they be found over winter? The answer is lurking in your backyard in the foliage of citrus, loquat and other non-deciduous trees. The Mediterranean fruit fly loves the thick protective foliage of these plants to 'over winter' and with our mild winter temperatures they remain active all year round. Loquats particularly, provide a stepping stone from citrus to other fruits as the seasons move from winter into spring. It is important to be aware of the key part these trees

play in perpetuating fruit fly populations.

Winter is a prime opportunity to reduce fruit fly populations. Although fruit fly needs to be controlled year round, growers should take advantage of winter by implementing heavy baiting and trapping on their properties. The fly's vulnerability to baits and traps is increased due to the lack of fruit and reducing numbers of fruit fly over winter minimises the population spike that follows in spring. Eliminating adult fruit fly in winter means fewer eggs and maggots that will damage fruit in spring and summer. In addition to protecting your own fruit, your efforts will also assist local orchardists to protect their crops.

How do you tell if your fruit has already been stung? Look for small dots on the fruit skin and a 'halo' affect around the spot. Fruits likely to be affected at this time of the year are quince, lemon, lime, mandarin, oranges, kiwi fruit, olives and walnuts. Weekly removal and disposal of infected fruit by freezing, cooking or bagging to be left in the sun for a few days helps break their lifecycle. Talk to your neighbours.

The more people implementing fruit fly control on their properties during winter will provide better results in the next fruiting season.





#### Help - I've Discovered Housework

#### Free Mammograms Available In Armadale

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Armadale. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be at a new location at the Haynes Shopping Centre carpark, corner Armadale Road and Eighth Road from now until the 04/09/2015. Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group. BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect up to 90% of breast cancers. Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately. The mobile service will then be moving to Northam and Narrogin. BreastScreen WA encourages women to make an informed decision about having a mammogram. For more information please visit the BreastScreen WA website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au Ring 13 20 50 to make an appointment. Early detection is your best protection.

#### Controlling Mediterranean Fruit Fly in the Backyard

Mediterranean fruit flies are an incredibly annoying pest in the Perth Hills and southern regions of Western Australia - they can destroy a range of fruit and vegetable crops in a very short space of time. It is heartbreaking to be nurturing a fruit tree for years, sustained by the anticipation of your first juicy fruit only to have your dream shattered by a tiny, flying bug and its larvae. The first sign of Medfly damage is often larvae-infested or 'stung' fruit. Stinging is caused by the female laying eggs into unripened or ripe fruit. Larvae may develop from the eggs, depending on when they are laid and the fruit type. For example, stings can occur in apples and peaches when they are unripe, but the eggs do not hatch at this stage. As the fruit ripens the eggs can

Fruit trees such as stone fruit (apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines) can be difficult to grow free of fruit fly in areas such as Perth, where Medfly populations are high. Backyard fruit can be a significant source of Medfly to commercial orchards where they occur close to each other. Therefore, it is vitally important for everyone to control Medfly.

At the June meeting of Roleystone Organic Growers, Rachel Davison will be discussing a variety of strategies to control Medfly, including hygiene, traps, etc. This presentation will cover the when, where and how to control fruit fly in your backyard.

Rachel is a university student working on a Project towards her Bachelor of Sustainability in conjunction with Isabel Arevalo-Vinge a PhD student from the University of Western Australia

Together they are trying to actively involve

the community in the control of fruit fly in their backyards. This collective involvement is critical for the whole community to successfully grow their own fruit and support our local orchardists



in the production of their fruit. Without community wide support for control, fruit fly numbers will continue to escalate making fruit growing unviable for everyone.





#### Gardening Notes with Jean

Recently I have done a few nursery crawls. At one nursery I discovered a lot of plants that are hard to find which have been on my sought after list for some time. These included some daphnes, both the odora and the alba varieties, both renowned for their outstanding perfume. Also, the chocolate cosmos which is supposed to be a perennial but in the past I've obviously not positioned it in the correct position.

Another variety was Stevia, a sugar substitute which leaves a funny aftertaste but it is quite an appealing plant. One plant I've tried several times to get is the Mexican Rose, a pretty sprawling pink flowered creeper. This reminds me of one of my aunts who had it in her garden in Shenton Park.

Driving home up Brookton Highway into Roleystone, is such a joy with all the different autumn tones, So many types of trees all making a glorious palette of colour. We do need the various greens to complement the scene. I love the seasonal changes that take place.

I spent from 1963 to 1974 living in Victoria and I learnt to appreciate the different seasons. Here autumn is very pleasant but over there the slush under ones feet used to put me off. Also the ground got so cold and for the first time in my life I had chilblains. Our yards are full of flowers now, including chrysanthemums, camellias particularly sasanquas with a few japonicas, roses, daisies, mushrooms and even some of my lilacs are blooming.

I've noticed that there is a movement to sustainable gardening and a return to a lot of the old favourites that were almost

unkillable - like geraniums. These have undergone many transformations and they range in colour to almost black, red-black and purple-black, through to whites. I haven't seen yellow geraniums but apricot and orange colours soften all the other shades, including big red and big pink. These easy to grow perennials have been around forever and shine out in the garden making attractive borders or just as specimen plants. In my opinion they are some of the most forgiving plants to grow. Rockeries are now very much back into vogue. Remember, when you plant the alpines don't jut your rocks up into the air but to lay them flat as in the mountains where the rocks have been smoothed over many years with algae and mosses in the small indents. As you plant, plant for the eye to see but the heart to feel. Try not to let plants or rocks dominate but have a successful marriage of both composites.

Outside we have had lovely drenching rain. It is not only the gardeners who appreciate it. All farmers need this ground drenching to free the soil up and let the seeding begin. Our water catchment areas are getting more vital as the water table drops and our population grows. By having contours running across your property the water flow slows down and the ground can absorb much more of the dampness. This way the water does not remove topsoil when it flows into creeks and streams.

Hope the book reading is going well and your seedlings start to sprout.



Just a reminder that the AGM will be held on Sunday 28th June at 11.00am. As our membership numbers are well above last year members around the 15th June.









# The Armadale Wildflower Society Getting Birds Into Your Garden

#### WA Plants for WA birds

Western Australian birds prefer Western Australian flowers. The next time you are in a garden that does not have any native plants, look and listen for native birds in the garden. The chances are that there won't be many birds. Then go to a garden that has native plants, the difference will astonish you – not only the number of birds but also the variety.

A bio-diverse native garden will attract many different birds to your garden. A combination of tall trees, a range of different size shrubs and ground will provide an ideal habitat for our native birds to feed and nest in. A range of different coloured flowers will appeal to a wide range of birds. Generally red, yellow, orange flowers will attract nectar eating birds. Blue coloured flowers will attract insects and so you will have more insect eating birds.

Birds love water, a bird bath located near a shrub will provide protection for the birds if they feel threatened. Watching the visiting parrots, honey eaters, wrens, wagtails, wattle birds and many more drinking and bathing in the bird bath will give you hours of pleasure.

Avoid using chemicals and non-organic fertilisers in and around your garden as they may harm birds. As birds eat insects and plants, if these are contaminated birds may become ill. Use environmentally friendly alternatives.

Members come from all sections of the community, from professionals to backyard gardeners to bushwalkers. All of us share one thing in common – a passion for the Western Australian bush and its beauty.

#### Wild Gossip

I have had quite a busy month with lots of wildlife enquiries and admissions.

One couple arrived with a bandicoot that had obviously had a traffic encounter. As it was contained in a jacket I transferred it to my trusty bucket, which I always keep by my door along with a pair of welding gloves - to prevent bites and scratches.

After a quick look I decided that the bandicoot was quite seriously injured and told the couple that it needed to go to a vet. Unfortunately my husband was out for the day leaving me without a car until 6pm. I explained this to the couple and they said that they would take the Bandicoot to the vet.

They left with the Bandicoot in my bucket and with my gloves promising to return the bucket and gloves later - I am still waiting. I can buy a replacement oblong bucket at the local shops but as Colli has closed I would need to go to Bunnings to replace the gloves, which is quite inconvenient (I only have the car on Monday and Friday). I am retired yet continue to pay for all the costs involved in my wildlife caring and

now it seems I must stretch the budget further and pay to replace my bucket and gloves.

Another recent admission was a Kookaburra which was found on the ground near the Armadale Reptile Centre. The bird looked stunned, had a small amount of blood on its beak but had no other obvious injuries. I placed it on a towel in a hot box to let it rest and relieve as much stress as possible. Always remember that stress is a major killer of birds.

When I went to check it the following morning it flew straight over my head and landed on a nearby tree branch. It was far too high for me to reach it even with a ladder so I put food and water out for it and observed from a distance. After about ten minutes it flew away showing no apparent injuries or other problems. It must have only suffered a bit of a knock or a very mild concussion. It is lovely when that happens and a bird can return to its natural environment. Please contact me for help for or advice about all orphaned or injured wildlife.
